Fire Destroys Galston High School Library

During the early hours of Monday 19th May an electrical fault started a fire within the library of Galston High School. Following calls to the RFS by neighbours and passers-by, emergency crews reached the school to discover the fire had already destroyed most of the building. By the time the fire was extinguished the roof had collapsed and it was necessary to demolish the remaining walls the next day for safety reasons. The school was closed for two days whilst the area was made safe and workman still remain on site removing and clearing the debris.

School Principal Jillian Tourlas and her staff, together with the Department of Education, now have the task of rebuilding the library. We are pleased to report that the building and contents of the library are fully covered by insurance.

Initially the priority for the school was

Early morning light, shows

to get the power and communications infrastructure working. Firstly power, then phone lines, internet and then Wifi for the students. Short term plans are being drawn up to install a demountable building on the school grounds to accommodate a temporary library. Computers and servers will also be replaced. All data on the servers was backed up to an off site location, so no data has been lost. The loss of the library building was a significant blow to the school and it's students, however good can come out of this terrible event. As the building was completely destroyed, the building and contents can be replaced by modem and more technically advanced equipment. Items such as trophies will be replaced by the original suppliers who fortunately keep very good records.



The community has rallied around the school with offers of help. Other local schools have offered replacement books to assist in the short term. 

"The clip is hilarious, I laugh every time I see it, but it also has a very serious message," Hornsby Mayor Steve Russell says.

"It's very important that dog owners make sure their yard is secure, for the sake of both their pets and the broader community."

Last year Hornsby Shire Council's officers captured 211 stray dogs, of which 171 were returned to their owner and 40 were transferred to the Sydney Dog and Cats Home.

"Sadly, many of those that were transferred would have needed to be put down, which is the last thing anybody wants," Mayor Russell says.

The filming and puppetry was done by Hornsby Shire Council staff, while the music was written and performed by professional musician Denis Carnahan.

"We were very lucky to have somebody of Denis' calibre working with us on this," Mayor Russell says.

"You've likely never heard his name, but there's a strong chance you've heard his music on everything from 2UE and Triple M to The Footy Show and Australia's Next Top Model."



Early on Sunday morning, Ex Galston High School Student, Julian, was involved in a bike accident along Bay Road Arcadia. Following on another bike was his friend Scott, who called the Emergency services. Julian's injuries were serious, but fortunately we understand he is now out of hospital.and making a good recovery.

On the same day, at around 10am, local resident Annie Gleeson and husband Peter Primmer, were parking in the Berowra Waters car park when they noticed a ute on fire. Both rendered assistance to the ute owner. Annie rushed to get a fire extinguisher from next to the fish cafe, and other bystanders rushed to get fire extinguishers from nearby boats. Unfortunately the fire hose located in the new car park, was not long enough to reach the fire.

Despite some heroic efforts by locals, they could not contain the fire and had to stand back and wait for the local Arcadia RFS, who arrived shortly afterwards. Due to the ferocity of the blaze the two cars parked next

Glenorie Rural Fire Brigade News

It was with great pride the Glenorie Brigade along with members of Middle Dural assisted and took part in the ANZAC parade and service on ANZAC day this year. The brigade Snr Deputy Captain, Sean O'Brien acted as Parade commander and Brigade President Mark Bluett, who is also secretary to the Glenorie RLS sub



branch, was MC on the day. Several members marched and others were ushers and parking assistants. Over 1000 residents, friends and family attended the service held in the grounds of the Glenorie RSL.



The following Sunday was Glenorie Growers Market. Once again brigade members crewed the stand talking to residents about fire safety, showing the local and "not so local" families the fire truck and equipment. Among the inquires was a prospective new member who is now coming along to the station to learn more about a commitment to the RFS and to decide if he would like to join this great organisation.

The Brigade assists at Glenorie Public School with their regular emergency, fire and lock down drills. This term was Emergency Evacuation drill and as always the children and staff did a great job. It is very good experience for the brigade members who attend as they gain valuable knowledge of the school. The children and staff value the brigade's input.

Brigade training this month has focussed on the safe handling of Asbestos materials. There are very strict protocols brigades need to follow at incidents if the presence of asbestos is suspected. Just a reminder - it is illegal to dump or burn materials containing asbestos.

We are now in winter fire safety mode so a quick reminder:

- Check your smoke alarms are working well.
- It is really important to be careful with indoor fire places. Check flues are clean with no leaks, make sure a screen is placed in front of open fires and remember to store wood a safe distance from fire.
- · Never leave washing to dry too close to heaters or fire places.
- Don't leave electric blankets turned on.
- Check the filter in the clothes dryer is cleaned regularly.
- Revise your emergency evacuation plan should you have a house fire. Where is the safe meeting place for all members of the family to go to? It is a good idea to practice the drill with everyone who regularly sleeps at your house.

History of Arcadia Telephone Service

From "Patsy Boliver" writing in the Galston News in "Know your Village" of December, 1972. (Vol 2, no. 12)

"Postal records disclose that in April, 1918, consideration was being given to the construction of lines to Messrs. Carr and Trethowan's premises, and for the provision of a telephone exchange at Arcadia. From1910 a small allowance post office had been constructed in the school residence by members of school teacher J.R Calov's family. The Department of Education gave permission for the installation of a small telephone exchange. The Arcadia Telephone Exchange was opened on 9th May, 1919 with three subscribers; W.A. Bennett, Mrs A.G.Roughley and A.H. Trethowan.

The hours of service were; Mon-Fri, 9 a.m.-1 p.m. 2 p.m.-6 p.m. Saturday, 9 a.m.-1 p.m. The hours of service were extended to 8 p.m. Mon-Fri in July 1924 when Miss Emmie Calov was in charge of the post office and exchange. There were 25 subscribers. Mr. Calov retired in 1927, when he and some of the family moved to Cronulla for a time. For a short period, the new headmaster, Mr. Hilton Rivett, thought he might take over the Post office and Miss Calov assisted him. Finally with the completion of a new cottage beside what was then the Arcadia School of Arts, the Post Office and Miss Calov moved to the new premises.

By June 1929, 56 subscribers were connected to the exchange. Continuous service was provided as from $1^{\rm st}$ January. 1937.

With the introduction of the Extended Local Service Area (ELSA) system on 1st May, 1960, Arcadia was provided with local call access to the Sydney telephone network

The telephone exchange operated from the new site until its closure in 1964. The Post Office closed in 1974. Miss Calov, with some of her family lived on in the house till her death, at the age of 98, in 1990. The building is still a family home, but the old school residence was demolished in the 1990's.

Hornsby Shire Rural Area – Rezoning?

Hornsby Shire Council is about to initiate a Community Consultation program aimed at seeking views and approval for a complete review of the entire rural area (Dural to Wisemans Ferry).

As it has been 45 years since the last major review (establishment of the Galston and Glenorie Villages), it could be said that it's not only about time, but none too soon!

The pressures on all Local Governments from our State Government (trying to cope with a significantly inadequate supply of housing) are immense – each Council has a housing objective that it is expected to fill.

Hornsby Council is trying to prevent the wholesale subdivision of its rural area whilst still showing growth and, at the same time, stop a lot of the ad hoc development that is occurring now due to the lack of a good overall plan for the area.

Council wants to develop a plan that has the backing of a majority of the residents in the Rural area – thus the Consultation Survey that is due to come out early in June.

It is envisioned that the 5 acre allotments within a reasonable radius of the Villages (possibly 1-2km) be rezoned to 1 acre lots (to prevent further subdivision by SEPP5 initiatives); that other areas be allowed to have development zones for small undertakings e.g. Retirement Villages; that 25 acre lots be rezoned in some areas to 5 acre allotments; as well as reviewing

Council is now waiting for word from the construction company as to when the new state of the art facility can open.


An opening date is expected to be announced by the end of the month. 20 other considerations relative to protected areas and the use of the surrounding lands, where these occur.

Prince William and Princess Catherine Visit a Glenorie Family

"You're Cinderella Kate and you have a George. Mummy and me are in our Cinderella dresses"...

Have you ever bent down to have a chat with a young child and immediately be won over by how adorable they were?

A couple of years ago I heard that a family in the Glenorie area had the horrendous experience of having their young child Lauren, diagnosed with a brain tumor. As I am sure it would be the case with most people, the news made me feel like I had been punched in the chest and I gasped for breath at the thought of "How would I feel if that were my child?" But the weight of that question was just so enormous I was unable to give myself over to it. Instead, I went into my kitchen and I baked and I baked and I baked. What else could I do? I felt I had to do 'something' but what on earth could I do? I hadn't even met the family.

I asked a mutual friend if it would be ok if I cooked them some meals and was told it seemed like a good idea. So I delivered enough meals to their home, to feed the hospital their child was at (some was even shared with the hospital staff looking after Lauren).

A little while later Lauren was allowed a rare home visit from hospital, Lynne (Lauren's mum) quickly found her way to me, with little Lauren on her hip and a huge smile as she sincerely thanked me for the meals. It was then that I met Lauren. She was adorable, intelligent and obviously a little cheeky. Instantly I knew she was truly special. But truly special doesn't stop you from getting a brain tumor.


I have not been privy to all the technicalities of Lauren's health, but suffice to say; the road she and her family have traveled can only be described as 'hell'. Time after time after time they were told "We have this one last thing to try and if this doesn't work, there is nothing else we can do". Then months of

Then weeks of ill health caused by the treatment, requiring more medical intervention and numerous medical specialists having to consult together. Followed by the cycle of overwhelming concern as the family waited for the results of tests. Sometimes the results initially seemed positive, other times they were informed that the treatment didn't work. Then again they would hear, "But there is one last thing we can try", over and over and over and over. The family has

done everything possible, every chance they have been offered they have accepted. So many hopes so many disappointments. How many times can you grieve the loss of your child when you haven't yet lost them? My stomach lurches and my chest heaves when I see the look of despair on Ed's (Lauren's dad) face and the conversations with Lynne; the hope, the hope lost, the new hope, the new hope lost, for two years, a living hell.

During this time there were many ups, where Lauren appeared perfectly healthy. At one of these times little Lauren and her adorable brother came to my child's party at Fagan Park. I took some photos of the children playing and they all had huge smiles on their faces. They laughed and played, we all had a perfect day. A day I felt blessed to share with them, during one of the good times. But the good times never lasted.

Finally, the chances dried up. *Finally*, they were told that every avenue had been exhausted and the tumor had won. That was just before the end of last year, they were given the news they never ever wanted to hear. "Take your daughter home, make her comfortable and enjoy the little time left, you will be lucky if she spends Christmas with you". On December 17, 2013 Lauren moved into Bear Cottage, a palliative care facility for children in Manly. Lauren survived the first week, then the second and her family was blessed



to spend Christmas with her. Then she saw the new year and then February...

This part of Lauren's life continues to be a roller coaster with severe ill health taking its' toll, yet her good spirits return and her family can still enjoy many magical moments in between. As I write, we are heading toward the middle of 2014 and Lauren's latest MRI gave a grave prognosis. Every day, they live with the haunting possibility that today could be the last day. Lynne has said the care they receive

at Bear Cottage is wonderful. But wonderful care will not remove the ache in their heart.

A little light was shone into their dark world when the Royal couple recently visited bear cottage and Princess Catherine spent time speaking with Lauren, it was then that Lauren made the above comment to Princess Catherine, who's facial expression was similar to mine, the first time I met and was won over by Little Lauren.

So many times I have wondered "What on earth can I do?" and then the answer came when I received an email from a friend who has organized an on line fund-raiser. In late 2012 Rotary ran a fundraiser in Glenorie which was very well supported. But the family is again in need; as Lynne has been living in hospitals for the past two years, thus unable to work and now Ed casually works so he can try to spend as much precious time with this wife and daughter, whilst Lynn & Lauren live at Bear Cottage; in which time, the bills continue to roll in.

Myrtle, our leggy border collie, discovered an abandoned Manchurian pear and delighted in gnawing its crunchy texture.

At this time of the year, the garden spreads a diverse menu of insects, larvae, fruits, and even seeds. As I trundled the wheelbarrow towards the compost heap I acknowledged, without surprise, the yellow robin poised on the garden fence post. He had discovered, and dispatched, two tiny pieces of cheese I had left for his deliberation. Good things come in small parcels!



THE HILLS STEINER SCHOOL



Come forth into the light of things, let nature be your teacher. ~ William Wordsworth ~

Richard Louv, child advocacy expert and author of 'Last Child in the Woods: Saving our Children from Nature Deficit Disorder' recently completed a national speaking tour. Supported by a growing body of research, he claims that direct exposure to nature is essential for healthy childhood development and for the physical and emotional health of children and adults.

At his recent talk in Sydney, Richard was asked if he knew of any schools that were taking on this back to nature approach. His response was that "Waldorf" (Steiner) Schools embrace the philosophy of connecting children with nature.

Outdoor activities are imbedded in the Steiner curriculum, reflected in projects throughout our school.


Class 2 took on the demanding task of reclaiming the garden and re-establishing the ecosystem near their classroom, relocating large rocks to form a new garden edge. This was a great exercise in engaging will forces, co-operation and teamwork skills, and physical effort! Hard packed soil was turned over, many loads of mulch barrowed in, and plants bedded down in their new homes. They also cleaned out the pond, carefully transferring frogs, tadpoles and eggs.

Class 3 rejuvenated two beds in the large vegetable garden. They were weeded, dug out, fed with compost from our animal enclosure, covered with newspaper and cardboard, then topped with rich aerated soil. Students were guided by 'Farmer Phil' in preparing Biodynamic 500 solution to enhance microbial activity in the soil, aiding growth of the newly planted seeds.

Classes 5, 6 and 7 have been participating in Birdlife Australia 'Birds in Schools' programme, investigating and monitoring the bird habitats in our grounds. They will develop and implement a plan to improve biodiversity in the school.

The 'Eco Warriors' High School student group continue their environmental work within the school and surrounding areas.


Arcadia Public Schoolcontinued





Going Without in a Time of Plenty Anglicare Food Drive June 15

Yes, another year has passed and it's time for Dural District Churches annual Anglicare Food Drive. After 10 years our community has fully embraced this initiative of giving food to those in need, especially over winter.

Our collection of non-perishable items; cans, cereal, rice, pasta, long life milk, toiletries, has grown to over 30,000 items in the district last year. For more information go to www.ddac.org.au



Watch out for our collectors in local supermarkets or if we come knocking at your door on Sunday June 15, please have a few items ready. If you miss everyone you can drop items off at St Jude's Dural, St Columb's Arcadia and Christ Church Kenthurst. Of course all the schools in the area also participate.

Joint research launched by ANGLICARE Sydney, the Samaritans Foundation and Anglicare NSW South, NSW West and ACT has revealed the extent of hardship for low income households accessing their Emergency Relief (ER) services.

Of the people surveyed who accessed these ER services, 98% were found to be food insecure and 82.2% were severely food insecure. This means that they were not sure where their next meal was coming from or they were unable to provide food for their family on a regular basis.

Households also reported that they worried about running out of food (87%), actually ran out of food (68%), cut meal sizes (82%) or skipped meals entirely (68%) on a recurring basis.

Findings for households with children were particularly concerning:

- Children in 70% of households were regularly eating low cost food because there wasn't enough money to buy good quality food.
- Parents in 30% of households were regularly cutting their children's meal size to make food go further.
- Children in almost one third of households (31%) were regularly not eating enough because parents couldn't afford to buy sufficient food.
- Children were regularly going hungry in 24% of households.
- Children In 7% of households did not eat for a whole day on a regular basis.

Those at highest risk of food insecurity were low income earners, people with a disability, single parents, people experiencing rental stress and people from an indigenous background.

"The biggest constraint in food insecure households was inadequate income," says Grant Millard, ANGLICARE Sydney CEO.



Going Without in a Time of Plenty Anglicare Food Drive June 15continued

"People were often making the difficult choice of going without food in order to pay for other more pressing expenses.

"Some 95% of the people surveyed in NSW and ACT indicated that they had run out of food in the last three months due to unexpected expenses like medical bills, car repairs, large power bills and sudden increases in rent.

"We found that parents were often protecting their children from food insecurity by going hungry themselves. However, it is deeply concerning that in one in four food insecure households, children were actually going hungry too."

Last year, more than 26,000 people accessed ANGLICARE's Emergency Relief services across NSW and the ACT at a total cost of \$4.85million, 40% of which was funded through donations and support provided by local communities.


Galston Garden Club

Dealing with those nasty Ticks

I love living in this area but I don't like the ticks!

Introducing Ticks. There are about 80 types of ticks in Australia, but

the paralysis tick (*Ixodes holocyclus*) is responsible for most bites to humans in our area. It has 3 life stages – larvae (commonly called grass tick), nymph and adult. It needs blood from animals or humans to move from 1 stage to the next. Only female ticks bite.

Tick removal. Ticks can transmit diseases by injecting toxins, so try not to annoy them by scratching, or putting irritants like metho, essential oils, kerosene, liquid soap or flame on them. When removing, don't squeeze their body. **Adult** ticks can be removed by pulling with fine tweezers under the body, or various tick removal tools available from chemists, camping shops or



the Vet, or by applying suitable chemicals. For larval and nymph ticks, chemical methods are usually best. Chemicals include Aerostart (contains ether that freeze dries the tick, killing it instantly), aerosol insecticides containing pyrethrin, or Lyclear (a scabies cream containing Permethrin available at chemists). I have used Lyclear for years – a blob placed over the tick will kill it in a few minutes. There is no need to remove the tick – it will usually fall off in a few hours, and there is little itching after. Bicarb soda in a bath is also useful for small children. All chemicals come with risks and some should not be used on small children.

Tick repellents containing DEET or Picaridin are effective. Spray clothing rather than large areas of skin – it is safer. Light-coloured clothing makes ticks easier to see. Tuck trousers into socks and shirts into trousers. Clothing treated with Permethrin is now available. Treatment lasts up to 70 washes. See www.safarilifeworld.com. A product called "Debugger" can be used to treat your own clothes – available at BCF shops.

Tick-borne diseases can cause Lyme-like symptoms that can have serious long-term effects. Diagnosis is difficult because the disease mimics the symptoms of many other diseases. If confirmed, antibiotics are usually prescribed over a long period.

Bandicoots are commonly believed to be responsible for most ticks in our area. This is not true – they carry no more ticks than any other animal. So defend the humble bandicoot – it has had enough bad press!
