Replacement of Pitt Town Rd Bridges Running on Schedule

The replacement of two old timber bridges on Pitt Town Rd is running on schedule and beginning to take shape.

Concrete girders have been installed at the Cataract Creek Bridge (pictured) and are expected to be installed at the Cattai Creek Bridge over the coming week.

The new bridges will be higher and less prone to flooding than the old timber bridges.

The road is expected to be re-opened by the end of March as planned, provided the weather is favourable.

Motorists driving light vehicles can use a detour along Maguires Rd and McClymonts Rd, however this detour is not suitable for heavy vehicles. Truck drivers should consider alternate routes.

Residents are thanked for their patience throughout the construction period.

Dural Rotary Needs Your Help

The Rotary Club of Dural wishes to support the ongoing care and treatment of Avalon Jade Chambers, who lives in Glenorie.

Avalon was born prematurely via an emergency caesarean operation. She suffered damage to the white matter in her brain which is known as Periventricular Leukomalacia (PVL) and Cerebral Palsy.

Currently there is no known cure for PVL.

A very bleak future for Avalon.

She will need much care and ongoing treatment. This will include physiotherapy, occupational therapy, vojta therapy, together with annual three week visits to Neurological and Physical Abilitation Centre (NAPA) for treatment in Los Angeles USA. This would be followed by two intensive vojta therapy (vojta therapy activates inborn automatic movement) sessions annually in Brisbane.

For Avalon to have the best chance of having an independent life and a chance of ever walking, these treatments would be needed to provide her with a fighting chance to give her the opportunities to grow and achieve the normal things available to the average child.

Overall treatment costs and associated expenses will be in excess of \$50,000 per annum. The family has limited resources with only one income earner. The parents have had to sell their home to provide treatment for Avalon.

Over the next two months, Dural Rotary members will approach the majority of business houses in the Glenorie, Dural, Kenthurst and Annangrove areas to request them to donate to this worthwhile cause. All money raised will be deposited in an account- namely Avalon Jade's Journey Inc.

Farewell, Jessica - 25/12/1998 - 22/1/2014

It with great sadness we report the passing of Jessica Barbara, youngest daughter of Robin Barbara. Robin is known to many residents as the previous editor of the Galston News and more recently the friendly face of Goodies Bakery.

Jessica was born with Smith-Lemli-Opitz syndrome, a rare genetic condition of which only 48 other cases are known to exist. Thoughout Jessica's life Robin fought hard to ensure her life could be as normal as possible. She attended Karonga House Special School at Epping from age 4 to 18. At 18 she left with her HSC Certificate where she came top of the class of children with special needs. Once Jessica reached 18 she moved to Minimbah Day placement.

Jessica, despite her disabilities, was a happy child. She would only get irritable when the discomfort of her condition flared up. Like any mother, Robin was always there to look after Jessica's needs and she inately understood what she wanted, despite Jessica's inability to talk. Caring for a disabled child is a 24 hour, 7 days a week, 365 days a year commitment and Robin was a fantastic, caring and courageous mother, campaigning where it was necessary to get the help and support her daughter needed. In the later years she did this single handedly as her marriage broke down due to the stresses and strains on the family. Her oldest daughter Carla, was always there to help. To Robin and Carla, Jessica was their daughter and sister, no different to any other family, they just had to adjust to a "different" way of living.

Robin and Carla would like to express their sincere thanks to everyone who has helped them over the years. The community support has been just amazing. Special thanks also to Bendigo Bank for their assistance with Jessica and her special needs schools.

Galston Heights or Arcadia...





Arcadia PS 1896 first class room

Arcadia PS location of the first school at Mrs Norquay's

Lucky for us living in Arcadia, Mr John B Shearston had travelled to Arcadia in Southern Greece in the early 1890's and felt the local area, what was known as Galston Heights, to be equally idyllic. Hence the name Arcadia was accepted in a public meeting on October 28th 1895, after the local public school had been operating for a year under Galston Heights Public School. And so as we enter 2014, Arcadia Public School will celebrate 120 years in the district with amazing stories during its rich history.

Arcadia Public School P&C won a federal grant last year to research, preserve and interpret the school's history in various ways. All of which will be launched at the school's Celebration Picnic on 17th May 2014 within the school grounds. More on this event will be forthcoming in future editions of the Galston News and on the schools Facebook Page www.facebook.com/ ArcadiaSchool. However here is a sneak peak of some of the events that made this area and the school what it is today.

- Application was first made in 1891 for the establishment of a school at Galston Heights (now Arcadia). The proposed location was originally opposite Calabash Road and was designed around the access for the children of 'school age'.
- In 1893, Mr David Hall donated half an acre of land on the corner of Geelans Rd and Arcadia Rd for a building to be erected. By January 1894 a weatherboard Hall was erected and this became Arcadia's first public building which would be known as The Union Hall was used by many local groups including local churches.
- The first school for the area was a house-to-house school taught by Mr Edward Aubrey from the 28th May 1894 with 25 children. Mrs Norquay's house was the first station, the Dowdling's house (near Calabash Rd) was the second and Pocock's house at Calabash Creek was the third.
- Galston Heights residents were initially given permission from the Department of Education to establish its own full-time school on the 20th August 1894, three years after the initial application. The first Headmaster was Mr David Johnston from November 1894 till April 1897 with 35 pupils and used the Union Hall for classes.
- The name Arcadia was adopted in 1895 by the local residents under the recommendation of Mr John B Shearston, following the establishment of the local school.
- The parcel of land which Arcadia Public School is located was purchased on 13th March 1896 from the sisters Henrietta Best and Eveline May Wells for £44.0.0 plus £6.0.11 interest.

Many of you have your own memories of Arcadia Public School and we ask you to share them on the school's Facebook Page or direct with the Committee (email: lori@lorickmanagement.com.au) so that they may archive them for future generations to enjoy. The committee's 120th Celebration Book will be compiled and printed before the Celebration Picnic in May and available for purchase from the school. They hope to see many past students and parents at their celebrations commemorating what really was the start of the Arcadia Community!

Well, today I was lucky enough to have my mum with me who was able to push the trolley while I pushed the stroller with the twins in it and my oldest son sitting on the front. I asked them to settle down as I am aware that not everyone likes to hear the sound of children playing. I was not prepared for what would happen next.

While standing ordering some meat at the deli in Woolworths, Glenorie, a large, imposing "gentleman" stood over my children in their stroller and yelled at them at the top of his voice: "WILL YOU SHUT UP - I DON'T WANT TO HEAR ANOTHER WORD FROM YOU - SHUT UP". It was loud enough for people to hear at the front of the store. If anyone had a problem, I would have expected them to come and talk to me - not stand over my children and intimidate my children as only a bully knows how. If this "gentleman" is reading this - yes, sir - you are a bully.

I would like to end this on a positive note and thank the kind staff at Woolworths Glenorie for their support and kind words - from the Branch Manager, the Deli Manager to the girls at the front checkouts - I really appreciated you all caring enough to ask me if I was ok, and to talk to the "gentleman" about his behaviour. A big thank you to the other mums in the store that also offered their support to me. Without knowing it, you all made the situation so much better than it could have otherwise been.

For those that are wondering, the "gentleman" did not apologise... but bullies probably never do!

"Mum, can I go to the shark cull protest?"

Not a question I thought I'd encounter when I planned to have children. However, I am partly, well mostly to blame, along with my husband. From our children's infancy we have inculcated in them a love of nature. From taking them camping when they were

From this point on my twelve year old, Aleesha was fueled with a desire to learn more about sharks and she voluntarily spent many hours during the school holidays looking up shark facts and pictures with the intermittent "Mum, come and look at this" to which I was shown yet another spectacular image of a White Pointer midair above the water or bearing its' teeth near a cage diver. These dramatic images would often be juxtaposed with one that showed someone engaging peacefully with a large shark, sometimes even serenely holding onto the dorsal fin. She is very shy by nature, but when she gets going about sharks the passion bubbles forth.

Her research found; **A shark is killed every three seconds.** Two-three people are killed by sharks annually in Australia while in the same time 12-18 children are run over by four wheel drives.

The recent fatalities in Western Australia have been distressing and as a mother I find myself fearing sharks and wonder if a cull

would help keep my children safe when they go snorkelling. Yet, on the other hand, I feel passion for this creature which deserves immense respect. The ocean is their domain, which we temporarily inhabit when we enter the water. If we were to go into the outback and see a brown snake or hear of someone dying from a snake bite, would we promote going out of our way to find and kill snakes? We are entering their world; we know we need to respect the wildlife there, as it can be dangerous.

Being an ocean lover, I feel passionately about the plight of whales and after swimming with Humpbacks myself, I would certainly attend a protest against whaling. How can I say I would support the anti-whaling movement but she cannot support the anti-shark cull movement? I am torn between wanting my children to be safe in the ocean (which a cull doesn't guarantee) and wanting magnificent sharks protected. I cannot say I am for or against the cull.

My daughter, on the other hand, has a very strong opinion. She has developed such a love, awe and respect for sharks, that when the West Australian cull was announced, she was very upset, so when an Anti-Shark Cull protest was announced for Manly, she was almost bouncing when she asked if she could go. How could I say no? How could I stand in the way of a youth full of passion about protecting the ocean? I helped make her what she is, someone who appreciates and respects our vast planet and is willing to stand up and say so.

Then a second question swam my way from my child "Can I have a sheet?"

So what do you do when your twelve year old asks to attend the Anti-Shark Cull protest and to have a sheet to make into a "STOP THE CULL. SAVE THE SHARK" banner? You say "Of course".

So how do I feel to have my child ask to go to the Anti-Shark Cull protest?

I have never been so proud.

Dural and District Historical Society Fagan Park, Galston

Fagan Park was established on 55 hectares of rich land that was once part of the original land grant of 600 acres to George Hall in 1819.

The Park can trace its origins back to an Irish immigrant from Londonderry known as William Fagan (1823-1896) He arrived in Australia as a free settler in the late 1840's and worked for

a short time in

Sydney. He married Ann Waddell, daughter of James Waddell. They bought 70 acres of land at Arcadia, (Fagan Road) which they cleared and established a citrus orchard. Eventually they had four daughters and three sons.

"Netherby" Fagan Park, Arcadia Road, Galston

William Fagan 11 (b.1860) teamed up with his younger brother Sam (1862-1948) to create what was reputed to be the largest citrus orcharding operation in the Southern Hemisphere, with orchards in Dural (corner of Galston Rd. and Carters Rd), Arcadia and Galston.



Sam built Netherby Homestead in the early 1900's with bricks that were fired on site. The bricks for the Galston School of Arts (now the Galston community centre) were also made in this kiln. The homestead

"Fagan Park" Arcadia Road, Galston - May 2007. Single Furrow Plough

stands today as a beautiful example of fine craftsmanship of the time, lovingly restored by volunteers in association with Council.

When Sam died in 1948, his youngest son Bruce Fagan decided to increase the family's Jersey dairy cattle herd as the big orchard operation began to wind down, following the development of the Murrumbidgee Irrigation Area. Bruce, who never married, and his sister Ida, lived in the Netherby homestead, and they were committed to seeing the past retained for future generations, for historical, educational, recreational and agricultural purposes. In the late 1970's they decided to donate the property to the State Government, under Hornsby Shire Council's care.

Hornsby Council decided to make the development of the property a Bicentennial project, and it was opened by the N.S.W. Premier, Mr. Nick Greiner, on Saturday, November 5th 1988.

Cancer the Dragon and You

Last month there was published in the British Medical Journal a Canadian Breast Cancer Study over 25 years involving 90,000 women aged 45 to 59 which concluded that Mammography made no difference to breast cancer deaths compared with a physical examination. This supported an earlier report based on a study in Denmark. Australia experts were quick to defend their existing recommendations for regular Mammograms.

We have a similar situation in

Australia with PSA testing for prostate cancer, where routine testing is recommended as opposed to the USA where it is not.

The benefits of both these early detection methods are outweighed by the added risk factors including up to 25% overdiagnosis.

All cancer over-diagnosis results in unnecessary surgery, unnecessary chemotherapy, unnecessary radiotherapy and unnecessary hormonal therapy."

"To change current practices is not an easy task, because governments, research funders, scientists, and medical practitioners may have vested interests in continuing activities that are well-established," one editorial concluded.

There is general agreement that high risk groups such as those with a family history of aggressive cancer diseases can benefit from more regular testing.

Once again we see the lack of co operation and rationale debate holding back progress in cancer treatments at the expense of patient welfare and survival.

Better education of patients will also go a long way towards reducing the fear provoked by the word "Cancer" and reduce the risks of overtreatment.

David Rosenberg from the Department of Fair Trading addressed the Probus Club of Round Corner Dural recently on "Travelling Con Men".

David Rosenberg said, "Con men are at work in all areas of NSW including the Hills District. They are usually itinerant workers who travel from town to town offering home building work such as bitumen driveways, roof restoration and driveway line marking. They often target the elderly, people with dementia or an intellectual disability to scam them into giving money for building work that is

invarialbly not to tradesman standards. Most are not licensed to do the work they charge for, and are often not able to be contacted by consumers if the work is defective.

"These men offer cheap deals 'for today only' and ask for cash up front. They even offer to take you to the bank. They make you feel pressured to take the offer and usually disappear and leave the job unfinished or of poor standard."

David advised to not be tempted by unexpected cheap deals. "If it sounds too good to be true, it usually is. It is important to shop around and use licensed tradespeople who provide written quotes."

Graham Ascough, Club President said "A lively discussion followed as some Probus members had had some experience with these con men. Members were informed about what to do if approached by one of these operators. "Say no, record as much information about them such as their name and vehicle registration and report them the Travelling Conmen hotline on 1300 133 408."

A Mint to Remember

Summer has not yet passed. In my herb garden the lemon verbena sprawls across the garden gate, its leaves fragrant with the scent of lemon, and delicate sprays of its tiny, white flowers are receiving attentions from the bees. Nearby, perennial basil raises its flowering head to tempt the bees as they meander past. A nibble of basil's sweet, spicy leaves would surely capture the taste of summer on my tongue.

Beyond the garlic chives with their white-starred flowers, stands a collection of potted rosemaries, whose rugged growth is covered in tiny, blue flowers and tufts of pungent green needles. I cannot resist placing a couple of delicate rosemary blossoms on my tongue and inhaling their delicate fragrance ...perhaps my memory has improved a little too.

Few references exist to the history of the next herb in my garden. It is a perennial of the mint family, named Anise hyssop. It looks like a miniature tree with aromatic, oval, mid-green toothed leaves.

Common in North American herb gardens, it is valued for its long spikes of startling purplish-blue flowers and its fruity scent. Its foliage is favoured by bees and butterflies, but its tender, maroontinged leaf tips taste of mint and anise. Such vibrant flavour makes the leaves a natural partner for summer fruits and salads.

Today my delightful plant will be cut back by half its height to encourage a second, later season's blooming and a re-flowering before winter. With luck and a steady hand, this trim will result in a lovely multiplication of Anise Hyssops.

News from Galston Rural Fire Brigade

Like us!

Galston Rural Fire Brigade has launched its facebook page with an aim of communicating events and other interesting activities our members are engaged with. Some of the topics will include local hazard reductions, community safety



activities, training, incidents attended as well as sharing images of over 70 years of community service.

For up to date bushfire information it is always best to view the NSW Rural Fire Service website, twitter or facebook sites.

Hazard Reductions

Several hazard reductions are ready to be conducted in the local area once weather conditions stabilise. The aim of a hazard reduction is to remove the fine ground fuels which generate much of the heat and the speed which a fire will spread in the burnt area in the coming years.

Hazard reductions are very weather dependant with detailed plans specifying ranges of temperature, humidity and winds acceptable to delivering results whilst minimising environment and possible property damage. As a result false starts and delays are a common occurrence because of weather.

To find out what hazard reduction burns are planned in the coming week for your local area and where you may be travelling, the NSW RFS website has a section which registers all planned hazard reductions.

There are many ways to reduce your local fuel load which don't include burning off and your local brigade provide advice and managing fuel loads, burning off and safety equipment.

We Need More Static Water Supplies

Static Water Supplies (SWS) are reliable sources of water which we can access during bushfires and other incidents. They are commonly pools, dams and large tanks which can be access by equipment from portable pumps to helicopters.

The brigade undertakes a site survey to confirm access and suitability before placing a small SWS sign near the roadside so incoming fire appliance are aware the presence of a SWS.

During bushfires water supplies are placed under great strain as many appliances try to access water at once and SWS relieve some of the pressure.

Australia Day is past and gone and soon Easter will be here with us again. 2014 seems to be going full steam ahead. I arrived at Galston during the latter part of 2013 as a Uniting Church in Australia minister in training assigned to Galston Uniting Church from the United Theological College at North Parramatta. My first impression was the serenity and beauty of the small community compared to the hustle and bustle of the greater northern western suburbs bordering the two Windsor Roads.

Coming from a non white background I was wondering how it will be like learning from a predominantly white community and of course too in the congregation I had been assigned to.

My first meeting with Geoff Smith, the minister, and Elizabeth, the secretary, was indescribable to say the least. It seemed like I had been part of their congregation and they had known me for a fairly long time. In short I felt at home and chastised myself for all the questions and fears I had in my heart and mind. What a welcome for me and my family, my wife and three children, at my commissioning service . It was both moving and very special beyond words. Did I weep? Yes I did. I felt at home and thought wow, what an amazing representative for the whole of Galston and the surrounding communities.

I have not had the opportunity to meet many of the general community members but I guess the contacts I have had have been great and off good report. Firstly, I have been to the news agency a couple of times and was assured that there were no difference to the welcome I had in church to what I received there. The couple of staff at the newsagency did not just sell, they were an absolute pleasure and delight to talk to. And what about the strawberry man opposite the shops? It was pleasant to have bought his sweet and ever fresh fruit.

My children arrived home after the commissioning service content and peaceful in their hearts that dad had been given the opportunity to study and learn from Galston Uniting Church. They asked me; "Dad will this be your home church now?" Alas no, I have to move on though reluctantly, I replied. Enjoying Microbats on your property.

Recently I was fortunate enough to participate in a Microbat information evening led by Microbat expert Dr Brad Law (NSW DPI) and Mark Chidel (The Hills Shire Council) and hosted by the Greater Sydney Local Land Service and Hawkesbury City Council.

It was a fabulous evening, and we learned that Microbats are a protected species and that it is a real bonus to have them roosting in tree hollows on your property or even in your roof.

Microbats play a vital role in the health of ecosystems. They eat a wide range of insects, including mosquitoes, moths, beetles and bugs, helping to keep

their numbers in check. Good foraging areas for Microbats include over water or around trees-especially big trees. You can often see Microbats at dusk, patrolling along tree lined corridors like roads or tracks like a silent flash.

More importantly we also learned simple ways how we can create ideal habitat for these gorgeous little creatures on our own land. Most Microbats rely on shelter like tree hollows in large, old trees, dead trees and dead limbs on live trees. The number of hollow- bearing trees is declining as more and more large old live and dead trees are being removed. As the number of roost sites decreases, bat populations will decline. Without adequate numbers of roost sites for shelter, bats are vulnerable to predators and less able to successfully rear their young.

If you want to enjoy Micobats in your neighbourhood, retain large trees as it takes decades to create suitable nesting hollows. Rather than felling a tree, ask an arborist for advice on safe pruning. If you want to provide sites for Microbats, consider mounting nesting boxes and plant locally native tree species.
