

### **Proudly Supporting Australian Red Cross**

Pedal for Humanity is a fund raising initiative created by Johl Storey from Galston. Pedal For Humanity is dedicated to supporting Australian Red Cross by raising much needed money for the numerous programs offered to assist vulnerable people within our community.

The first event, which is taking place between 25th September – 4<sup>th</sup> October this year is a 10-day solo bicycle ride around Tasmania. To complete this challenge Johl must ride 140-170kms per day over some of the highest peaks in the country, outside of the Australian Alps. On completion of the ride Johl would have ridden over

The journey begins in Tasmania's North West, in a little town called Marrawah before heading over the Tasmanian Mountains through Hobart and onto the Huon Valley. The adventure then heads north via Port Arthur, Bicheno, Scottsdale and onto the finish line at Devonport.

The drive to complete such a challenge comes from his family. Two and a half years ago Johl nearly lost his wife during childbirth due to a rare complication called Placenta Percreta, resulting in massive haemorrhaging. With the assistance of amazing medical teams and the blood kindly donated through Australian Red Cross his wife made a full recovery. Since that day Johl vowed do something to return the favour, and help others.

It is hoped by completing this challenge that Johl is able to raise much needed funds to assistance vulnerable people across Australia. Australian Red Cross runs numerous programs to assist vulnerable people in our community including blood donation services, Good Start Breakfast Clubs, Save-A-Mate (SAM) Program, and Emergency services in Australia to name a



### Vale Larry Jacka 10 July 2014

It is with sadness that we report the passing recently of Larry Jacka. His funeral service was held on 10<sup>th</sup> July, 2014 at the Pine Grove Memorial Park Minchinbury, The Northern Chapel.

Rotarian's from the Rotary Club of West Pennant Hills and Cherrybrook Club formed a Guard of Honour at the chapel entry.

Larry was a well respected and long term member of the Club, he became a Rotarian just after its Charter in May 1987, he served well and loyally for 23 years.

The idea of Rotary as a conservative group of more elderly gentlemen as the mainstay of Rotary was forever changed by Larry and a few of his cohorts in the club at that time. His idea was that the club had to get things done in the community, but the members had to have fun doing them.

His deep sense of humour and mischief was always there and came through at every meeting, sometimes to the despair of the President or meeting Chairman. Larry was Rotary to his bootstraps but he would never be compliant to the specific 'Rotary way' of doing things. Larry had his own way of getting the job done.

After holding the position of the 4th President of the Club, Larry stood for District Governor in 1999 / 2000. Larry was never of the normal 'District Governor' mould, but delighted that he had the opportunity to take on the role and be a leader in an organisation that meant so much to him.

Larry went on his first Rotary International trip to Onamuga in the eastern highlands of Papua New Guinea in 1989. On that particular trip he and 4 others from the club help construct a 1st Aid station in an area where medical help was almost non-existent.

Following this contact with the villagers in Onamuga, the Club were informed that the young son of one of the team helpers had fallen into a fire and was badly burned. Mainly through Larry's efforts and the Rotary Club of West Pennant Hills and Cherrybrook, and those of the Salvation Army who were working in that area, Wesley Koni has been able to have numerous operations and lead a relatively normal life.

Later Larry was the instigator of the Rotary Club of West Pennant Hills and Cherrybrook setting up the Wesley Koni Trust to provide assistance for Wesley until he was 18 to help with his education, training and ongoing medical care in Australia. Larry maintained his ongoing involvement with RAWCS, with both he and his wife Miriam concentrating mainly on the Vanuatu area.

In this work teams of Rotarians carry out such works as repairing and painting dormitories at local schools and Larry's humour and sense of fun was always evident.

When not involved in his many ongoing duties with Rotary, Larry was also involved with Little Athletics and as a high level judge for athletic competition generally. He travelled Australia wide in this capacity.

Even though Larry was unwell he managed to make it to his club changeover of officers in late June and officiated with the response to the toast to Rotary International as a District Officer.

Larry's last act in Rotary was to present a Paul Harris Fellowship to the wife of a previous member. He did this personally out of his own accumulated donations to the Rotary Foundation.

Larry is survived by his wife Miriam and two children Nathan and Ashley.

Larry, your family miss you, your mates miss you, Rotary misses you.





### **Galston Sewer Scheme Information**

by Fox Plumbing

Getting connected to the new "Sewer Scheme" should be a relatively simple process, but only when managed properly by a competent and experienced plumber. There are critical steps that all plumbers must follow during the connection process, as required by Sydney Water and the Department of Fair Trading. The final commissioning of your sewer connection cannot be completed until all these critical steps have been finalised.

- Firstly ensure you are happy with the location of the collection tank and alarm unit, and that restoration of the surrounding area meets your satisfaction. If concrete or pavers need to be reinstated, you can request your plumber to do a "partial connection" and get enough sewer pipe installed so the restoration works won't have to be dug up again when it is time to connect. These partial works will of course need to be inspected by the Department of Fair Trading, as will the final connection.
- Check that your plumber has a valid trade licence (www. licence.nsw.gov.au/LicenceCheck), and has had experience with this type of connection. Whilst working with residents in the recently connected suburb of Cowan, I have heard horror stories of poorly managed connections, leaving people without a sewer service for days on end.
- Make sure your plumber has checked that ALL your plumbing gets connected - I have seen houses where the laundry, handbasins, and kitchens are not connected to the septic tank, and could easily be missed if you assume the existing sewer pipe connecting to the septic tank collects all your waste water.
- Do you have a grease trap? This will also need to be disconnected.
- Council needs to be contacted about the decommissioning and cleaning of your septic tank, and provided with proof of a desludge and pumpout from a suitably qualified contractor. Only then can the septic tank be filled and the lid demolished.

· Along with inspection fees being paid before the start of the job, make sure you receive a "Certificate of Compliance" from your plumber at the completion of the connection.

Read your quotes carefully, being sure there are no "hidden extras", and that the full scope of work is clearly outlined in the quote.

Items such as septic pump-out costs, rubbish removal, septic tank demolition, possible electrical disconnections for Aerated Water Treatment Systems (such as Envirocycle or Bioseptic), and restoration of turf or paths, etc, can be a costly addition to a quote that you first thought to be "cheap"...





"This is very exciting, a huge amount of work has brought us to this point and we're delighted to see it all paying off," Hornsby Mayor Steve Russell said.

"We would also like to thank the community for their patience throughout this process, as we've moved carefully to make sure we deliver a facility that will serve the Shire for generations to come."

The construction of the centre is now in the final stages, with the current tasks including the painting of the building's outside, landscaping in the forecourt and installation of the Wi-Fi connection.

"The end is now tantalisingly close and we can't wait to get there," Mayor Russell said.

Those who are in the Learn To Swim program will be able to have an earlier dip, with children going to the centre a week before the general opening for their assessments.

### **Asbestos Dumping Earns \$2000 Fine**

A property owner in Mount Colah has been fined \$2,000 for dumping material containing asbestos and for lying to Council about it.

"Any illegal dumping is a serious matter, but when asbestos is involved it is particularly concerning," Hornsby Mayor Steve Russell said.

"By now everybody knows the dangers of asbestos and there is absolutely no excuse for this type of behaviour."

The person was fined \$1,500 for dumping the waste and a further \$500 for lying about it to the Council officer who investigated the matter.

"If you've been caught doing the wrong thing it's always best to be honest, or else it will cost you even more in the long run," Mayor Russell said.

"It's also worth noting that the waste was dumped outside Hornsby Shire, which proves there are no limits to our ability to catch those who do the wrong thing."

The property owner was served with a clean-up notice, which meant they had to hire an occupational hygienist to inspect the site and clean up any asbestos residue.





### **Dural and District Historical Society** Early Settlers at Marra Marra

Sarah Wallace, the daughter of a member of the family of the aboriginal, Bungaree (who travelled around Australia with Matthew Flinders) and an English seaman, settled on the lower reaches of Marra Marra Creek with her lifelong partner, a convict lime burner known at first as Lewis Ferdinand.

Ferdinand is known to have been a Hanoverian German who fought with the British forces in the Peninsular War. He was sentenced to life in NSW for desertion. By the

1830's he was working with lime burners, John Grace and John Hunter on the

Lime for making mortar to hold bricks together was in short supply in the early Colony, until deposits of limestone rock were discovered. Prior to that, the settlers recovered lime by burning the contents of Aboriginal middens of shellfish found along the Hawkesbury shores.

What the Aboriginal folk felt about this treatment of their middens is not known, but it supplied a practical living for people like Grace, Hunter and Ferndinand, and their families.



In the 1830's, after surveyors had been through the Marra Marra Creek area, the limeburners were able to buy title to the land areas they had been long settled on, at the mouth of the Creek near Bar Island. Since Ferdinand was still a convict, his wife Sarah obtained the title in her name.

Sometime later the couple dropped the use of the German surname Ferdinand and called themselves Sarah and John Lewis instead. This wiped out all memory of a convict past, as well as any German associations.

Their family became closely identified with the Anglican Church on Bar Island (now a ruin), and Sarah's memory, particularly, lived on in local popular tradition as "Granny Lewis".

If you want to find out more about Bar island and its history, Tom Richmond will be speaking about it at the June Roughley







#### **Looking Up**

You may recall a few months back I wrote a story and with it was printed a photo of an owl I took in my front yard; the article ended by offering local galleries or gift shops to contact me regarding my nature photography. I was delighted to receive a phone call inviting me to provide my images to a new gallery opening on the grounds of



Greenshades Café in Galston. The gallery owners, Ruth and Helen were of like mind and we all wanted to promote the uniqueness of our area and the hidden creative talent that lies within. We decided to start with a series of bird photos, so I unplugged myself from feeling 'too busy' (this surprisingly required considerable effort). I spent many hours over the past few months scouting our local area with eyes and ears open. Did you know we have a Buddhist meditation retreat, a lovely candle making shop and a large free range chicken farm, including some very cute friendly goats, in Arcadia?

With my newly opened ears, I have a new awareness of birds constantly singing and with eyes open; I am now addicted to 'looking up' and am absolutely staggered by the quantity and variety of birds in our area. I now regularly see wrens, finches, mynas, hawks, crows, pee wees, magpies, king parrots, lorikeets, rosellas, ibises, ducks, cockies, plovers, galahs, wattle birds, kookaburras, storks, pigeons, sparrows, eagles, robins, bulbuls, wagtails, starlings, egrets, silvereyes, black birds, hummingbirds and have been treated with some rare sightings of bowerbirds, lyrebirds and huge black parrots.

The song of the belle and whipbird confirms I am out of the city, yet no matter how often I hear them, they remain elusive to me. They are in stark contrast to the family of noisy plovers who made their home in the gutter near the busy intersection in Glenorie, where Whites Road crosses Post Office Road. Plovers are known for nesting in ridiculous places, even atop poles in the water so when the chicks hatch they step out of the nest and immediately fall in the water! Plovers are also known for being fiercely protective parents who screech and swoop anyone that goes near their nest. I was hoping to get a photo of the adorable chicks I saw from my car. Donning my hooded jacket for protection; I took my camera for a walk and smiled, both in delight and concern when I saw the chicks were still where I had spotted them, but it was the darndest thing, when I got close, the chicks completely disappeared while the parents started swooping me. I kept walking and when I was far up the road, I turned around and the invisible chicks reappeared. I headed back down the street, but was given a bizarre repeat performance, the chicks vanished again and the adults swooped me a second time. Then again, when I was far away, the chicks reappeared. I decided to leave them alone but worried they would be run over. A few days later, I noticed they had moved, so I may have inadvertently encouraged them to relocate to a safer place. A friend soon informed me that plovers have a sharp hook on their wings and can slice open an animal. Checking the photos I took of the swooping plovers, there they were - a sharp hook on each wing. So watch out if there is a plover about!

After much work by all involved, Greenhouse Gallery is now open - Thursday and Friday 10 - 3, Saturday and Sunday 9.30 -3.30. I am just one of many artists supplying a wonderful variety of custom made products. My local bird images can be purchased in the form of greeting cards for as little as a few dollars or as large canvases for the wall; a few canvases are on display or you can personally order your canvas to be made with your favourite bird photo from the selection provided.

We live in an amazing part of the world, if we can always make the time to look up, we won't be disappointed.



The children were shown on a large map of Australia showing where her ancestors were from. The children were shown how the Aboriginal people communicate using sign language in the bush while hunting. A picture of an emu was shown to the children, explaining that in their language an emu is called a "gulliah" and that a goanna is called "bubin maroo".

The children learnt about foot prints and how Aboriginal people can use footprints to track animals for hunting.

We looked at a painting that a family member had painted using traditional dot painting. It was of a goanna. In the painting you could see the tracks of a goanna's footprints and a line in-between where the tail dragged. We also talked about snake tracks and what they would look like. The beautiful painting is now hanging in the Pre-school classroom.

We looked at the Aboriginal flag and were explained the meaning behind it:

**Black** – is for the Aboriginal people of Australia

#### **Beware those Nice Yellow Flowers!**

Have you noticed the yellow flowers along roadsides and in paddocks recently? They may look nice, but they have a dark side. They belong to a toxic plant called Fireweed and it is invading our area. In other places, it totally dominates roadsides and paddocks. Fortunately in our area, with some effort, we can still



control it. It grows all year, but best in August and September.

We urge all residents to pull them out at every opportunity. When you walk the dog, take a shopping bag and pull it out as you go. If you walk without a dog, do



likewise. Save on gym fees - pull fireweed instead! If you have it in your paddocks, collect at least a shopping bag full each day. Bribe the kids to do it, especially if they ride the horse that's in the paddock. Take it home and put it in the green bin. Try to stop the seeds escaping.

Fireweed is toxic to horses, cattle and native animals. It has an accumulative poison that damages the liver and can lead to loss of energy, retarded growth and even death. It has a bitter taste so animals will graze around it, but if food is scarce, or there are too many small fireweed plants, there is increased chance they will eat it. The plants grow to about 60cm tall and each plant can have up to 30,000 seeds. Seed is blown large distances by wind, and is spread along roadsides by movement of vehicles. Flowers left on the ground can still produce seed - that's why all plants removed should be bagged and disposed of. It is easy to pull out. Slashing or mowing before flowering is another way to control it.

So together, let's get rid of this nasty weed. There is some in my back paddock, so I will take my own advice - now where is that old shopping bag?
