\$48 MILLION WASTEWATER PROJECT BEGINS AT GALSTON AND GLENORIE

Minister for Natural Resources, Lands and Water, Kevin Humphries and Member for Hornsby, Matt Kean recently marked the start of Sydney Water's \$47.8 million Galston and Glenorie Wastewater Scheme.

The project will allow around 625 households in Galston and Glenorie to be connected to the new wastewater system by mid-2015 after the scheme was fast-tracked when the Coalition came into government in 2011. Mr Humphries commented "The new scheme will provide enormous benefits to the local community by reducing risks to public health, improving public amenity and protecting the environment. This announcement is a huge win for the residents of Galston and Glenorie and is the result of the tireless advocacy of the Member for Hornsby Matt Kean."

Mr Kean said that once connected, residents will no longer have to rely on septic tanks and pump-out services. "By connecting to the wastewater system local residents could save hundreds of dollars, help reduce odours and eliminate dampness and seepage on their properties," Mr Kean said.

The new wastewater service is a pressure sewerage system that works by collecting wastewater in a small tank installed on each property. Wastewater from both Galston and Glenorie will be transferred to the West Hornsby wastewater system for treatment.





Farewell

Computer Pals for Seniors, Galston & District Inc.

It all began with a public meeting on 17th May 1999 when an enthusiastic group of seniors decided to form a branch of Computer Pals for Seniors for the Upper Hills district with the aim of introducing seniors to the computer age in a fun, non-threatening manner. Tuition was to be on a one to one basis, no classrooms, no pressure, each to learn at his/her own pace.

A committee was formed and office bearers elected, and the inaugural meeting was held on 21st June 1999. The first president was Alan Oxenham, the secretary Wal Aldwinckle and the treasurer Dulcie Fowler-Smith. "Computer Pals for Seniors, Galston and District" was in business.


First there had to be somewhere for it to all happen, and very generously Dural Historical Society offered use of their premises and computer at the History Cottage, in Galston, and the management at Rowland Retirement Village offered use of a comfortable recreation room there.

A generous grant from Hornsby Council and kind offers of 'pre-loved' computers and we were ready to begin.

Our club became affiliated with Australian Seniors Computer Clubs Association (ASCCA) and was incorporated with the Department of Fair Trading on 10th September 1999.

The aim was simple, one-to-one teaching of the basics of using personal computers to the "over fifty-fives" right from the beginning. Learning at their own speed with just friendly support and encouragement. A generous band of volunteer tutors gave freely of their time. Tutors also travelled to pupils' homes to be able to teach them on their own personal computers. With the development of computers over the years, so the skills and special interests increased.



Early Works Begin On Glenhaven Intersection

Council contractors will begin early works from Monday on the intersection of Glenhaven Road and Old Northern Road in preparation for the installation of traffic lights.

Hills Shire Mayor Clr Andrew Jefferies visited the



Mayor Jefferies said that the intersection had long been a source of frustration for motorists and that Council was working with RMS to get the intersection upgraded as soon as possible.


"With Glenhaven Road under Council control and Old Northern Road under the NSW Government's control, both authorities have had to work together to get this upgrade happening," Mayor Jefferies said.

"Council has been working with RMS on the design of this intersection and we are close to agreement. In the meantime, our contractors will begin the early works to ensure that the upgrade of this intersection is completed as soon as possible."

Mayor Jefferies said that the intersection upgrade would go some way to alleviate traffic congestion.

"Residents who regularly use this intersection will no doubt be sick and tired of the long queues to turn out of Glenhaven Rd onto Old Northern Rd. This upgrade will go some way to reducing those long queues."

19 accidents have been recorded at the intersection between January 2008 and June 2013.

Getting the trucks ready for the 2014/15 season.

What do you need to do to prepare your family and property for bush fire?

- Make a bush fire survival plan Have an alternate plan for changed conditions
- Keep lawns short and gardens well maintained
- · Cut back trees and shrubs overhanging buildings
- Clear gutters and clean up fallen leaves, twigs and debris around the property
- Have a hose long enough to reach around your house
- If you have a pool, tank or dam put a Static Water Supply(SWS) sign at your property entrance - install a fire pump and practice using it
- Check your insurance is adequate and up to date
- Stay alert and be ready to action your plan if bush fire threatens





Hornsby Rural Area Rezoning

Hornsby Council voted unanimously to continue planning for this restructure at the last General Meetingon November 12th.

The Survey results for the area were overwhelmingly in favour of change - in some instances 80% of the rural respondents were in favour, the lowest margin being 58% in

As one speaker put it - Council now has a mandate for change.

What does this mean for all of us?

There were multiple considerations in the Survey, all of them insightful, indicative of a firm vision for how the area may change for the better, whilst preserving the Rural character that makes the area so wonderful.

We have formed a new Community Group – **The Hornsby Rural Areas Association (HRAA),** stemming from the Committee of Concerned Residents (authors of "Your Area – Your Say") – the objective of the group is to be very conscious of what the rural community wants to happen and liaise with Council, during what will be a lengthy planning stage, to make sure that what does happen with our area is what we all would like to happen.

We want the change to occur progressively, allow for infrastructure development, give some certainty to the rural landholders and promote affordable growth. We do not want small lot subdivision, in fact we want to plan in such a way as to make that option very hard for any developer to achieve.



Your committee will have a number of discussions with council planners and management over the period that it will take to put all this into place. It will take many months.



At an early age I always wanted to be a nurse, so on leaving school I went to the East End of London. This was a poor area and had its fair share of characters and criminals. I did my training in Bow, which is not far from Poplar, where the BBC show 'Call the Midwife" was set.

I worked in Concord hospital for 2 months and then saw this wonderful country for a month before returning to UK. I completed my training and qualified and went to work at RNSH and the old 'Mater Public Hospital" and subsequently "Bowral Hospital".

Whilst at the Mater I met Dr David Richardson and his wife Kerrie and we decided to open a fledgling practice in Galston in April 1980. We were told this was designated as a 'Cottage Industry' and we would surely fail!! As they say the rest is history and the practice is still going strong.

I would like to sincerely thank the valued staff and my wonderful colleagues, Dr. Graham Campbell, Dr. Bronwyn Edwards, Dr. Joyce Beardsell and Dr. Anju Pandey for their support, humour and care over the years. But most of all thank you to all my valued patients you have given me a wonderful journey through my life as a GP and I thank you all from the bottom off my heart.



Welcome Christmas with fresh herbs from the garden. Here at Heritage Haven Herb Farm, we start with Rosemary Christmas Trees ... for remembrance. A pine-fragranced

rosemary plant is positioned beside the front door, and on the sideboard another is decorated with small spice cookies and posies of baby's breath, tied with red ribbons.



Mountain pine wreaths deck the walls, and bowls of lavender flowers await restless fingers. Fragrant bunches of rosemary, lavender and thyme, join sachets filled with dried rosescented geranium leaves and crushed cinnamon sticks ...

they hang in the bedrooms or looped over door handles. To entice Sugarplum Fairies, dream pillows have evolved: they hold leaves of sweet marjoram, lemon verbena and mint.

Move to the kitchen, the heart of the house, and here herbs enhance every recipe. There is magic in the air when basil marries with Spanish onions, firm, red tomatoes and balsamic vinegar ... or allow fresh coriander leaves to join lime juice. Try crisp, flashfried Sage leaves spooned over asparagus and lemony-minted seafood. Add a dash of masala and fresh rosemary tips to a batch of glaced cherry madeleines.

To enhance the spirit of Christmas further, hang an organza heart fragranced with lemon myrtle leaves, cardamon seeds and bay leaves to sweetly invigorate the kitchen further. Herbs make a difference!

Create a host of pomanders by studding lemons, oranges and, perhaps, petite cumquats, with cloves, and rolling them in ground cinnamon and allspice. Finally, gather fragrant herbs like thyme, sage and Artemisia and scatter them over a basket filled with pine cones.

This Christmas fill the whole house with herbal traditions to touch both heart and home.



Dural and District Historical Society. Our Daily Bread

When setting up a new settlement, one of the first problems that has to be solved is how to feed the population. The early years of Sydney were difficult, and explorers were sent out to find suitable land to grow wheat and corn in particular. Parramatta and the Hawkesbury district were ideal, until some disastrous floods at Windsor made crop growing difficult. In 1802 Governor King chose some higher ground and declared about 34,000

acres of land at Castle Hill and to the north, as Crown Land. He established the Government farm at Castle Hill, mainly to grow wheat for the growing population

Ben Singleton set up his mill to grind the wheat on the narrowest part of the Hawkesbury River, so that the tides coming in and out could turn his mill stone.

Within this last year they have been excavating on the Castle Hill Park site for the North West Railway. The huge pile of soil they were digging up was beautiful rich dark brown, ideal for agriculture. Yes, Governor King picked an ideal spot! In later years, in the 1890's the Hills district supported the largest citrus growing area in the state

A bakery is an essential part of the community, and was always one of the first businesses to be established in any area. One necessity for baking bread is fire wood for the ovens.

Many successful business men (such as Johnny Allan) have started out by carting the wood to the local bakery. The bakery at Galston was situated just west of the present Newsagent where the present road is. Down this road there is a patch which keeps subsiding. It is probably the site of an old well at the back of the bakery, or maybe a "long-drop dunny"!

Galston still has it's own bakery. David Goode started his Bakery in June 2001, in the rear of the Garage, where the Aldi shop is now. He moved to the present site in January

2007. Round Corner has had a Bakery for many years. In the 1960's the Waldhaus family had a bakery towards the back of the shops, about where the delivery station for Woolworths is now. They delivered bread to households 6 days a week to a large area of Dural. Remember when the baker, the milkman, the grocer and the butcher home delivered? The Waldhaus family built the block of shops where Mode Property and Subway are now. There was residential accommodation on the first floor.

The baker at Glenorie, Rob Pirina, has plans for setting up a Bakery Museum as he has acquired much old bakers equipment and hopes to be able to display it

Well another year has flown by! History Cottage will be closed from 4pm on Wednesday

December 10th to Wednesday January 14th at 1pm. Remember that there is much local history to be explored at the cottage, and you will always be welcome to come and explore. We need more people to come and tell their stories, particularly we would like to record the names of the local bakers and to share stories of this fascinating district.







Intersection Improvement Work Continues on New Line Road at Dural

Major intersection improvement work is progressing at the intersection of New Line Road and Sebastian Drive at Dural.

Hornsby State Liberal MP Matt Kean said the NSW Government is continuing work on the \$3 million project which aims to improve road safety and access for all road users.

"The first stage of work completed included removing vegetation, relocating utilities and building road crossings where new traffic lights will be installed," Mr Kean said.

"We will now carry out work to install the traffic lights and widen the road to provide an additional northbound through lane. The southbound left turn lane will be removed to allow for two southbound through lanes at the intersection.

"Road widening and major work is scheduled to be completed by late December and will be carried out between 7am and 6pm on weekdays and Saturday, weather permitting.

Some night work will also be carried out between 9pm and 5am for worker safety and to minimise traffic disruptions.

Mr Kean said work will be suspended during Christmas and New Year and finishing work and final landscaping will resume early next year.

"Every effort will be made to minimise any impact associated with this work and thanks motorists for their patience while this important work is carried out," Mr Kean said.



Learn About a Forgotten Piece of War-Time History

Archaeologist Dr Michael Bendon made the discovery of a lifetime when he stumbled upon a mysterious shipwreck and you can hear his exciting story when he visits Hornsby Library.

Michael chronicled his experiences in the book *The Forgotten Flotilla: The Craft of Heroes. Greece, Crete and North Africa* – 1941.

We are now well and truly into the fire season and the seasonal weather outlook is not favourable in terms of the potential threat of bushfire.

As a community we urge everyone to be vigilant and to report all fires, no matter the size by calling 000.

The brigade was called out on Saturday 1st November to the report of a tree alight in Peebles Road Fiddletown following a thunderstorm at the end of a Total Fire Ban day. Upon arrival we found a tree, situated 30m from the road in heavy bushland that had been struck by lightning and was well alight. During our conversation with the local resident who reported it, he expressed concern that maybe he had overreacted in calling 000. If left unreported situations such as this can quickly escalate and the resident was informed that he had done exactly the right thing.

In addition to this we would ask all residents to be aware that during the official fire season there are to be no fires without both Hornsby Shire Councils environmental approval to burn and a Rural Fire Service fire safety permit. These permits can be obtained by calling 9847 6853 or 9883 2000 respectively.

OPEN LETTER No. 3



To the residents of Galston, Glenorie, Dural, Middle Dural, Arcadia, Canoelands, Forest Glen, Berrilee, Fiddletown.

NO SUBDIVISION

You may have recently received a letterbox mailer from a group calling itself The Hornsby Rural Areas Assoc.

It appears that this pro subdivision group, the same group which bombarded parts of the rural community with false and misleading statements under the banner of "Your Area, Your Say" is the same mob that first started out this time around as an anonymous group not wishing to show who they were or who they represented. In one of our previous Open Letters we had referred to them as the Nameless, Faceless and Shameless. It was only through our enquiries that we discovered they had now become the Committee for Rezoning Galston.

This group in essence consists of the same people who in 2003 were the Farmers Group, more recently they have gone from Anonymous to Committee for Rezoning Galston, then Committee of Concerned residents. Now that the Council survey has been completed and the 'results' announced this group now seeks legitimacy by naming itself Hornsby Rural Area Assoc. and seeking members.

But most galling of all is their claim in the opening paragraph – Our Purpose "To represent the Rural Community in any discussion and/or negotiation to progress the views and wishes of that Community in order to achieve its desired aims".

This is just more of their misleading and unsupportable claims. They don't and can't possibly represent the wishes of the rural community. All they can do is represent their members, not anybody else. It is an obvious quest to form the basis of a lobby group.

They also state – OUR IMMEDIATE TASK – "Replanning of the Hornsby Shire Rural Areas – What arrogance! Just who on earth do these people think they are?

Further, in their membership form they again continue to be totally patronising of Council with comments concerning the survey such as Visionary concepts. Visionary in whose opinion?

The survey itself will be shown in time to be a sham. Already there is a great amount of commentary along the lines of people withdrawing their support because they believe they have been misled or misinformed. This is particularly true apparently of people who are not in the immediate vicinity of Galston. We will have a lot more to say regarding this survey soon. There are many serious questions that need to be asked of Council. We have had numerous offers of support in our research of this issue.

Surely, for starters, it raises serious questions when on a matter of such critical importance to people who live on acreage the survey only managed to achieve a response rate of 20% <u>one in five</u> and from this it is supposed to provide guidance to Council on planning issues for our rural lands.

This HRAA mob would like you to pay \$25.00 each year to access provision of their services. We wonder what their 'services' would entail?



THE TRUST (SARAPLT)

In 2003 a group of local residents formed the Sydney Agricultural Rural and Public Lands Trust. At this time its prime role was to fight against the subdivision of 2000 acres around the Galston Village, a development concept yet again championed by Councillor (as he was then) Russell. The Trust led the fight to stop this and over the ten years has fought a number of battles against inappropriate development, fortunately (at least twice) with a great deal of success.

BACKGROUND

It only requires one inappropriate re-zoning or use of agricultural, rural or public zoned land to spell the beginning of the end for Sydney's rural amenity.

OUR PHILOSOPHY

We may as individuals be the owners of rural land, however we are only custodians of the rural amenity.

This amenity belongs to the people of Sydney and its future generations.

OUR CHARTER

To vigorously promote by all possible means the protection, preservation and enhancement of Sydney's rural amenity and with equal vigour, oppose the re-zoning, subdivision and otherwise inappropriate development of Sydney's agricultural, rural and public lands.

OUR OBJECTIVES (not all inclusive nor in any order of importance)

- To promote greater transparency and accountability in the decisions of Local Government.
- To seek to have all Councillors, individually, both current and future candidate(s) declare for the public record their stance, policy and/or philosophy on the protection of the rural amenity during their term of office.
- To seek to obtain security of tenure for those agricultural landowners who wish to continue the farming of their land.



We Have it All

8am and I'm racing along Old Northern Road in my tight gym pants, peddling frantically on my daughter's pink bike.... ok, so how did this come about? Let's go back to yesterday.



I have the gardening bug.



Next is a stop at Glenorie Post Office and chat with the friendly lady who feels like my sister, a quick stop into Woolies where Heather is always a pleasure, then a skirt around to Linga Longa Nursery where I buy some blueberry bushes and indeed 'linger longer' while I chat to the lovely lady and she agrees to let me come back and photograph her flowers; pop across the road to buy chicken food, the helpful man loads it into the car boot while I pat his dog and he agrees to let me return and photograph his geese. Race back and forward to Cattai Ridge Road a few times to buy fifteen bags of horse manure to fill my new awesome above ground garden bed that a great neighbour made for me from old fence logs, then a trip to Craig, my favourite Poted Herb man and almost clean him out of cherry tomatoes, marigolds and petunias. Back home, I mow, trim, tidy, dig, plant and generally revamp the yard. Just need to let all of the kale I bought from Craig in winter go to seed, then I can clear that bed and plant whatever will be due for the next season (requiring a conversation with Craig or a Google search, I'd prefer a chat with Craig).

Ok, so shower, throw on oversized, vibrant hippy dress, race daughter to drama lessons, (plan is to hide in car so no one will see me looking scruffy and my dress is see through, definitely for the house or beach). Don't need wallet, grab mobile phone. Read a book while drama lessons are on, daughter skips to car happy as Larry, turn the key, engine makes weird clicking noise and won't start. I turn the key again, more weird clicking noises, twenty more turns, so much clicking noise I think the car is about to fall apart. Call husband with mobile, (so glad I grabbed phone and not wallet), "Car won't start please look up mechanic on Old Northern Road who rescued me a year ago when same clicking noise happened". Husband gives me phone numbers but none of them are the same person and although they are very nice, they can't come until tomorrow. That's a problem as I have to show a client their photos at Wiseman's Ferry at midday and they want the photos for Xmas so I don't have time to cancel and re-book down the track. Call husband again and ask him to look up more mechanics. He gives me two numbers of people in Glenorie. Tony answers, what a nice guy! Once I tell him I am stranded by the road in Galston he offers to come straight over even though it's 5:30pm. He shows up and I decide not to mention my shabby attire or bring attention to my see through dress and just make sure I stand in the shade and hope he doesn't notice. Does a jump start and I pick up husband who has just finished work at Galston, drop him and dancing child home, grab wallet (don't turn ignition off!) and drive to meet Tony at his workshop next to the fire station on Old Northern Road. I'd never been there before, just a vague memory of a mechanic's sign. He brings out a 'do-dad' and finds that I have a dodgy battery although it's only one year old and suggests I go back to where I originally bought it, as it should be covered by warranty. Good looking mechanic from shed next door drops by with his own 'do-dad' and does a quick check for other mechanical problems (ok, now regretting oversized hippy dress, lack of lipstick and wild out of control hair). He also thinks it is just the battery, but the problem is how do I get my battery replaced at Middle Dural, where I originally bought it? It's now after 6pm and I have to be at

Wiseman's Ferry by midday tomorrow. Here's the plan; Tony will drop me home tonight and take my car back to his workshop. I will ride my daughter's pink bike back up to his workshop tomorrow at 8am. After he jumpstarts the car, I will drive to Middle Dural and hope I can persuade the other mechanic to replace my battery.

There is a side to this story I haven't mentioned, it's actually all been quite fun. I am not stressed or freaked out, nor do I feel abandoned. I feel completely looked after. From my husband to Tony to the other guy with the other 'do-dad' and the mechanic at Middle Dural who uses his own 'do-dad' and yes, does replace my battery. So, back to pick up husband from home (car now has sexy new battery), drop him at mechanic, he now rides daughter's pink bike home (gets same sideways glances), while I race home and get ready for Wiseman's Ferry, this time loose, smart black pants and top. My client loves their photos and I love my client. Back to Glenorie; oh, Craig has put a whole new tray of multi-coloured petunias out. I can't resist, so stop to buy half a dozen. Craig happens to be walking down the driveway and gives me his effervescent smile. I give him my \$6 and put six flowers in a cardboard box, he continues to fill my box with more orange marigolds and I shiver with delight at how my back yard is going to look when I plant them.

I arrive home and almost float in the door with my client's order and box of flowers in hand as my husband pours the last of the homemade wine that my Italian neighbour gave me last week.

Sometimes life can throw us a challenge but it doesn't have to be a negative experience. Actually, that's what resilience is; the ability to fail and face challenges and get back up again.

I can certainly say that I am so glad my battery failed in this local area. Actually, I enjoyed my early morning bike ride so much that I think I might go grab my daughter's pink bike now. I have no doubt that if the chain comes off, I will not be left stranded.



Sara Mills

Sara Mills certainly is the 'girl who never gave up.' The 17yo Galston High School student has taken the Australian MTB scene by storm proving that hard work, consistency and a passion to triumph will take you to the top! At the age if 17, Sara has collected over 6 Australian medals



in MTB, 2 of which are gold! She no longer enters the 'junior girls' category more and instead enters the elite/open field.

"I grew up in a family where cycling was a way of life! Both parents were very competitive, encouraging and passionate and I think that rubbed off on me. I guess I could ride before I could walk, my mum use to take us every where on bikes. Moving from South Africa to Australia was a massive transition for me and I struggled a lot. But riding my bike brought me a sense of comfort and security from the stresses of a new home. It also have me a sense of identity- I was called the bike girl and I loved it!"

At the age of 15 Sara decided she wanted to start riding more, then at 16 she wanted to start competing. Spurred on by the encouragement of a local cyclist who described her as a 'hill climber', Sara was accepted into the Western Sydney Academy of Sport for road cycling for 2013 and 2014. Claiming 2 NSW State titles and gold medals on the road, Sara made a name for herself and surprised many when she came of no where.

"My real passion is on the dirt though, I love being out in the early morning smashing the trails. I get to see things that no one else my age does, and for me the sunrise and a good coffee is the reward for your efforts. I compete in 'Cross Country Mountain Biking', I like the marathon style events which cover distances from 50-200km. I'd like to give stage MTB racing a shot one day."

Sara currently rides for Jet Black MTB and hopes to ride for the JBRacing Team. She says her idols in the cycling world are Australian cyclists Jo Hodson, Imogen Smith and Cadel Evans, and European cyclists Jenny Rissveds and Niño Schuter.

My biggest inspiration and fan is of course my mum. She's my best friend and has really nurtured and encouraged me to pursue my dreams. She was a former elite MTB racer is South Africa and I think she and I experience the same rush and same emotion when we ride. Without my mum I wouldn't be here today and the I wouldn't be the cyclist I am.

An average day for the 17yo starts at 5am. There's always some form of activity in Sara's morning whether it's a good 80km with the 'boys' from Dream Loop, or a slow easy active recovery which finishes at the coffee shop. Then she heads off for school, study sessions or another training session in the gym.

"I'm very big into the holistic approach to my sport and as a result I've started my own health initiative, blog and business with my good friend and incredibly talented NSWIS track cyclist, Hollee Simons. We constantly update our Facebook and Instagram page with this message. We're known as 'Health Hax' and this really encourages me to approach my sport with positivity, love and a burning desire to succeed. My goals though, besides racing professionally, are to finish my schooling years and receive my ATAR to go to university. I really want to study Business and Nutrition."

She's decided to split her HSC over 2 years to cope with year 12 and the stress from the hard training she does.

"I still have a heck of a long way to go! I am no where near where I want to be fitness wise. But I'm training to try and represent Australia, that's my goal for 2015. I have 5 weeks until the National MTB series starts again and I'm really giving it my 100%! I have had the most incredible coaches! Larri Wallbridge

was my mums friend and MTB rival in South Africa, she formed the foundations for me and built my confidence- she is amazing! I'm currently coached by the talented "Coach Chops" James Lamb. He like my 'bug-brother' and makes sure I'm balanced on my journey and training, but also makes me work hard!- without him I don't think I'd be achieving the results I'm obtaining now.

Sara has a big year ahead of her-being signed as a guest rider for a new women's NRS team, Delphi, sees her competing in the 2015 Santos Women's Cup (part of the Tour Down Under). She also hopes to win the U19 category in the MTB national championships in Bright to be selected for the Australian National team to compete in the World Cup over in Europe.

Although passionate about school, cooking, coffee and her family, if you asked Sara what she was going to do tomorrow morning, the answer would be simple: "I'm going riding." LIVE. LOVE. RIDE.

Planting Guide for Native Plants

By Barry Lees and Jutta Hamilton

Choose a plant suitable for your soil and climate. Small plants grown in forestry tubes establish fast and are easy to plant.

Materials - available commercially.

- Slow release fertiliser for natives (low phosphorus)
- Jute mat(or similar) 368mm square with slots for the plant and
- Plastic sleeves with 3 stakes (or similar)
- · Plastic or wire mesh cage
- · Wetting agent

Method

- Dig hole at least 50 mm wider and deeper than the tube or pot holding your plant.
- If soil is poor put 1 teaspoon of slow release fertiliser for natives in the bottom of the hole with some soil.
- Remove plant from the tube or pot and carefully place it in the hole, planting it at the same or slightly below the original soil level.
- · Backfill with dug out soil or native planting mix and create a Saucer like depression for easier watering.
- Add at least 1L of water to wash the backfill soil against the plants roots.
- A jute mat on the ground around the plant will reduce weed growth.
- A plastic sleeve will retain a moist environment, preventing wind, frost and rabbit damage.
- If wallabies can access the plant, it must be protected. A wire or plastic mesh cage about 1 metre high has proven
- If there is no rain, deep water the plant about once a fortnight for the first 3 months. After that, little or no water is required other than natural rainfall.
- Wetting agent or granules may be of benefit if the soil does not absorb the water.
- The plant might benefit from a small application of native fertiliser twice a year. No other fertilisers are needed, in fact they may harm the plant.


