


FIRE DEVASTATION

Businesses lost at Dural Business Park

In the early hours of Thursday morning, the owner of Dural Tyrepower was alerted to a problem at his premises from his alarm system. Initially he assumed a break-in but when he arrived on site, he discovered the RFS and police already present dealing with a significant fire. Reports indicate the fire started within the pet shop, although this has not been confirmed. It spread quickly engulfing many of the neighbouring units. Once it spread to the Tyrepower unit the ensuing heat and toxic black smoke made fighting the fire even more difficult for the RFS. Neighbouring residential properties were evacuated at around 2.30 am.

By early light the devastation caused by the fire could be seen. All the units along the left side appeared to be very badly damaged. The steel frame buckled and black.

The right side of the building also saw considerable fire damage, but three units appear to have been saved by the efforts of over 100 firefighters and police.

Over 20 fire units responded to the fire and considerable effort was made by all firefighters in stopping it spreading to the Caltex Petrol Station.

Present at the scene also, were the shocked and stunned owners of the businesses. Locals were turning up for work, only to be told to go home and the owners would call them as soon as they could. With an estimated 60 people working at the Dural Business Park, this fire will have an affect on all of them. The owners now face the task of finding new/temporary premises, then fitting it out and trying to rebuild their businesses. For some, this will take months. Whilst insurance will help with some costs, many may be faced with interim costs to cover themselves. Without Business Interruption Insurance, many will have no income for a significant time. Some casual workers may even have lost their jobs.

All of this will affect their families and our community as a whole.

Congratulations to our local man, Jim, for winning the Badge Draw at The Galston Club. Well deserved - I wish it had been me! Oh well, I'll keep trying.


Congratulations to Christopher Saliba - he was the winner of the Easter Bunny Rabbit at Goodies Bakery, Galston.







National Alpaca Week Back in 2012.

National Alpaca Week (NAW) returns due to popular demand! Those who visited an alpaca farm in 2011 enjoyed themselves so much that it is being done all over again! The alpaca industry recognises that one of its strengths is the endearing nature of its animals, and their public appeal has seen them taking pride of place at many shows. While traditional livestock numbers have spent the past 10 years in decline, alpacas now are major show attractions.

As part of NAW, alpaca farms across the country will open their doors at various dates in May. In 2011 over 400 individual studs Australia-wide participated and welcomed people onto their properties. Australian Alpaca Association Board member, Esme Graham, said "Over the past few years NAW has been a great success. People come along for many reasons, some for a day out with the family, and others who are thinking of owning their own alpacas". The latter are divided into two groups, those looking for pets and/or lawnmowers or stockguards, and those who have a serious interest in the future of alpaca farming. For these people, more detailed information can be supplied with regard to the commercial aspects of the industry, and a chat with a number of breeders, many of whom have been involved in the industry for 15-20 years, is very beneficial.

Alpacas are recognised as the all-round environmentally

acceptable livestock. With their soft-padded feet, they are very kind to our fragile Australian soils as well as being hardy and adaptable to most conditions. Alpacas are easy to manage and in addition to producing a softhandling fleece in a range of colours, they are also extremely appealing animals to own. Most people who start out with a couple of alpacas, even as grass-eaters, are soon on the lookout for a few more to complement their herd. The fibre is in high demand overseas and is



also very popular with hand spinners. The great range of natural colours means that dying is unnecessary, leaving the fibre with its original silky handle.

In our local Galston/Glenorie region, four studs will be opening their doors and welcoming visitors - see the nearby advertisement for details of Open Days, which do vary between studs. Our region, with its smaller acreages, is eminently suited to the farming of alpacas - why not do a "stud crawl" in May and investigate these fascinating creatures?







M EMORIES OF KENTHURST SCHOOL.

I first attended Kenthurst Public School in 1952. My family lived on Porters Road at the time, and my first trip to school was in the sidecar of my father's motor bike.

On my first day I remember climbing the steps at the end of the brick building to enter the cloak room which had hooks on the wall to hang coats, hats and school bags. At the other end was the verandah.



and the school bell stood nearby. All the timber sections of the building were painted with a standard government mustard colour. The building was divided into two classrooms by a timber petition. In the playground there were two pit toilets. They had weatherboard walls, and a large box like seat which was constructed over a deep hole in the ground. There was also a weather shed in which we sat to eat our lunch during wet weather. It had an inner wall which separated the girls from the boys. At each end of the weather shed was a row of bubblers and taps, which were set above a long trough.

My first teacher was Mrs. Minnie Stranger. She lived in Volunteer Road, which at that time was only a gravel track. Mrs. Stranger was very strict and broke many rulers over pupils hands During morning tea and lunch time she sat on the verandah and while reading the newspaper was able to keep a watchful eye over all the students.

During the 1950's most local children owned a push bike as public transport did not exist. Most roads were gravel and they were usually dusty; muddy, pot holed or corrugated, The ride to school was done daily, rain hail or shine.

Mr. Aubrey Duffy was our Headmaster. He was an environmentalist and was responsible for the planting of many native trees within the school grounds. He was a keen gardener and with the help of the boys, won the Baulkham Hills Shire Garden Competition. Mr. Duffy taught us basic carpentry skills when we constructed wooden seats around some of the established trees in the playground. A large vegetable garden was created and managed and the produce was protected from rabbits by a well constructed fence, and sold to local families Mr. Duffy was a popular person. Kenthurst School dominated the district athletic carnivals for many years under his guidance.

In the 1950's school students were supplied with a free bottle of milk every day. I remember the specially constructed cooler which housed the milk. It stood near the front gate facing Kenthurst road, and was about 3 feet high, with a tray to hold a block of ice over the small bottles of milk, and draped with hessian. On hot days the ice melted very quickly.

I have fond memories of my early school years at Kenthurst Public School, where students learned reading, writing and arithmetic, participated in sport, learned the history of our country, and the wonders of mother nature.

Helping kids get a head start in saving by Roger Wheelahan, Wheelahan Investments

Parents and grandparents often wish to set aside savings for their children or grandchildren. It's a great idea but there are traps for the unwary.

When the children are older they can use the money for travel, higher education or first home deposit on a first home.

Not only must you decide where to invest for the best returns but whose name to invest in. Grandparents often choose not to invest in their own name for fear of losing their age pension entitlements. The pension will not be affected if you hold investments in trust for a child and the money is clearly earmarked for their use. But be aware of the tax rules in place regarding the gifting of assets or cash. If you dip into the funds for any reason the Australian Taxation Office may assume that you are the owner and tax you accordingly.

Investing in a child's name may avoid confusion, but there are tough taxing decisions to make.

The child will need their own tax file number and any investment income may be subject to punitive tax rates.

Children under 18 years of age (minors) are taxed at penalty rates of up to 66 cents in the dollar on unearned income above the tax-free threshold of \$416. Unearned income refers to income from savings and investments.

From 1 July 2011, minors are no longer able to access the LI-TO to reduce tax payable on their unearned income such as dividends, interest, rent, royalties and other income from property.

Insurance bonds are a popular investment vehicle for people saving for children.

Investment earnings are taxed at 30 per cent inside the bond, although dividend imputation can reduce this rate. This makes them attractive for children who would otherwise pay penalty rates. Generally no additional tax on income or capital gains is payable if you hold the bond for 10 years or more.

Not only do they sidestep many of the tax traps, but insurance bonds offer reasonable investment choice and flexibility. This is why these bonds are often considered the most tax effective savings vehicle outside superannuation. Source: Charter Financial Planning.

The Love Tree

In the 18th century, Spanish explorers discovered the South American herb, lemon verbena. Maria Luisa, wife of Charles IV of Spain, encouraged its aromatic use in cosmetics and introduced the practice of infusing its leaves in hot water to create herbal tisanes (teas). In her honour, Spanish botanists in

1785, named the herb Aloysia, the Latin word

for Louisa. By Victorian times, lemon verbena had

received the florigraphic meaning of Herb of Enchantment, and it became fashionable to grow this fragrant, ornamental plant in English gardens. Early settlers in Australia referred to it affectionately as the Love Tree, and grew it close to hand, so its fragrant leaves could be brushed in passing.

My lemon verbenas grow well planted directly in the ground by the front gate and potted demurely in the Tea Garden. The verbena's twiggy growth has developed into hardy shrubs, well-covered with lance-shaped, chartreuse leaves ... strongly scented with lemon, wonderful in tea, especially memorable in sugar. Winter has not touched the garden yet, and the thin branches of my lemon verbenas bear delicate sprays of summer's tiny white flowers tinged with lilac. Yesterday, I tidied the bushes, gathering trimmings of flowers and leaves for my garden basket. I scattered a handful of tiny, Cecile Brunner rose buds over the leaves. Such a delightful treasure from my garden ... such a delicious welcome to autumn!

Earlier this year, I boarded the Young Endeavour for the first time, and left land for the last time for the next 11 days (minus some sneaky trips to beaches). After some shy first meetings and attempts to make jokes to ease the tension and awkward silences, we weighed anchor and settled in for a night

out in Watsons Bay. And when I say settled, I mean we climbed up the 33m tall mast in the dark and windy night. And when I say climbed, I mean the others climbed and I clung on for dear life, with my eyes bolted tightly.

The next day it was time to learn a few sailing basics, practise around the harbour and then finally sail out into the big blue! My crew got the first watch (which was the best watch) and it was from 2000-2400 hours, and allowed us to have an uninterrupted sleep of about 7 hours (well that was the theory behind it anyway). However, for the first 5 days I was unable to complete any of my watch duties as I was pre-occupied coming to terms with what felt like my own long and painful death on the leeward side of the back of the deck. My watch crew soon got the nickname as the 'fully SICK' team which seemed to sum us up pretty well.

By day 6 we were choosing our own captain, watch officers, navigator and even chefs! I chose to be part of the watch crew team because as I had spent a considerable amount of time with my head over the railing, no doubt enjoying refreshing sea spray, I felt I couldn't trust my stomach enough to lead this crew into Eden. That night I ate a proper meal for the first time in a week

The last few days in Eden were spent going ashore having picnics, visiting the old whale museum, having raves on the deck at night, and of course my favourite, 'Sods Opera' (skit night!!!). One morning we had 38 guests on board, the majority of whom were associated with 'Workability Personnel'.

And as all good things eventually come to an end, this ship finally sailed into the wharf at Eden, with the entire youth crew aloft and up the mast (note; this time I was quite comfortable up there, I even had my eyes open!) and all of our eagerly awaiting friends and family in awe of our climbing abilities.

This was by far the best experience I have ever had, and probably will ever have. It had taught me many things about life and the people in it. And if I can take one very useful tip from the voyage, it would be that chocolate mousse is the best possible thing to have if you're feeling sick and in need of a pick-me-up!





Miniature Pigs

Miniature pigs make fantastic, intelligent pets for someone who is looking for a pet that is a little different from the norm! There are miniature pig breeders around New South Wales. Pigs are available in a variety of colours, usually black, pink or a combination of both. It is important to use a registered breeder of miniature pigs.

Both male and female pigs are suitable as pets. A mini pig will grow roughly 25-30kg – about the size of a kelpie and a bit rounder. They are a bit big to travel in your handbag! While they don't bark, they do make some characteristic snorting and squealing noises.

When you adopt them, they are usually already desexed and vaccinated. Pig vaccinations are done through piggery vets, who keep the vaccinations in stock. Desexing can be done at Galston Vet, all our vets have experience with desexing miniature pigs.

All mini pigs have a ring through their nose. Pigs have powerful snouts for "rooting" which means digging up your garden and making a huge mess – the ring prevents this behaviour.

Mostly pigs will graze on your lawn but need to be in an enclosed backyard or supervised. They can be fed a wide variety of grains, fruit and vegetables. All pigs in New South Wales MUST be fed a vegetarian diet for disease prevention.

Pigs are friendly and lovable. They can live inside with you and are easily toilet trained and lead trained. Our Galston Vet puppy school has had the first mini pig graduate recently and we hope to have more!

May Gardening

Autumn Colour

Deciduous plants drop their leaves when conditions are unfavourable. And the largest group of deciduous plants are those that lose their leaves for winter. This is a survival mechanism that helps get the plant through the tough, cold part of the year.

Before the leaves fall, the chlorophyll, the greening substance in the plant, withdraws from the leaf and allows the other colours to show through. This is why autumn leaves can be red, orange, yellow, brown, pink and all those other related



shades. The intensity of autumn colour will be even deeper if the plant is under some stress. Cool, dry weather produces the best autumn colour.

If you want to have more autumn colour in your garden, take a walk around the neighbourhood in autumn and see which trees put on the best show. Japanese maples and crepe myrtles are suitable and reliable in smaller gardens. Ash trees, ginkgo, liquidambar and tupelo (Nyssa sylvatica), which all need a bit more space, will also produce a beautiful display.

Here are some autumn-colouring favourites:

- Ornamental pears There are many cultivars that range from round-headed shade trees to upright-growing statement makers.
 Pears are tolerant to varying conditions and mostly produce a spring show of blossom that rivals the autumn display.
- Chinese pistachio is related to the well known nut tree. Its divided leaflets are glossy green during summer and change to satisfying shades of red in autumn.
- Crabapples are usually grown for their spring flowers, but their ability to produce autumn colour shouldn't be overlooked. The leaves of the popular Bechtel crabapple, Malus ioensis 'Plena', turn shades of red and orange in autumn.
- Golden ash is a good-sized shade tree with yellow autumn foliage and fascinating yellow bark that is studded with dark buds in winter. Once established, this tree has reasonable drought tolerance.
- Cercis 'Forest Pansy' is a fashionable favourite with heart shaped leaves that stay a rich purple for most of the growing season, then turn orange and yellow as winter approaches.

And if you don't have room for a tree, there's still the opportunity to grow an autumn colouring shrub or climber.

Native Grasses and Sedges for your Garden and Farm



by Jutta Hamilton

Native grasses and Sedges can add interesting textures, shapes and colours to any garden. Perennial grasses are the ideal plant to give stability to the soil surface and suppress unwanted weeds. Most grasses look best in mass plantings.



Where to find them? Your

local Council Nursery is a great resource for local native plants.

To get you started, try looking for these....

Kangeroo Grass (Themeda australis) is a graceful upright grass to 1m with brown, purplish flowers. It is a tough species that can grow easily in clay or sandy soils. See photo.

Barbed -Wire grass (Cymbopogon reflectus) has unusual twisted flower spikes and grows in most soils and even rocky

Tufted Hedgehog Grass (Echinopogon caespitasus) is a smaller growing grass with dense bristly flower heads.

Weeping Meadow grass (Microleana stipoides) is another smaller grass. It prefers damp and shady positions and has an attractive weeping habit.

Stout Bamboo Grass (Stipa ramosissima) immediately attracts attention. It grows up to 2m height in cane like clumps.

The Common Rush (Juncus usitatus) is great in wet areas and near ponds.

Mat Rush (Lomandra longifolia) is a versatile and popular near pool and pond and effective on retaining walls and banks.

Native pastures offer a variety of benefits. They can be habitat for endangered flora and fauna, they are well adapted to the variable Australian climate, they have low maintenance requirements and provide a good source of drought feed. They may be the "healthy" alternative to your horse's diet.






