

Intersection Improvement Work Continues on New Line Road at Dural

Major intersection improvement work is progressing at the intersection of New Line Road and Sebastian Drive at Dural.

Hornsby State Liberal MP Matt Kean said the NSW Government is continuing work on the \$3 million project which aims to improve road safety and access for all road users.

"The first stage of work completed included removing vegetation, relocating utilities and building road crossings where new traffic lights will be installed," Mr Kean said.

"We will now carry out work to install the traffic lights and widen the road to provide an additional northbound through lane. The southbound left turn lane will be removed to allow for two southbound through lanes at the intersection.

"Road widening and major work is scheduled to be completed by late December and will be carried out between 7am and 6pm on weekdays and Saturday, weather permitting.

Some night work will also be carried out between 9pm and 5am for worker safety and to minimise traffic disruptions.

Mr Kean said work will be suspended during Christmas and New Year and finishing work and final landscaping will resume early next year.

"Every effort will be made to minimise any impact associated with this work and thanks motorists for their patience while this important work is carried out," Mr Kean said.

Make a Bush Fire Survival Plan

Does your family have a Bush Fire Survival Plan? If not, now is the time. There is great information to help you on the Rural Fire Service website www.rfs.nsw.gov.au. You can also download the myfireplan App to help with the process.



Having a plan allows you to consider your decisions with the luxury of time. In the heat of a fire, you may not make the most sensible decisions about when to leave or how to manage your animals. Many people die in fires when they leave their decision making until the last minute.

How do you know if you need a Bush Fire Survival Plan? If you answer 'yes' to any of the following questions, then you need to make a plan:

- Do you live within a few streets of the bush?
- Does your area have a history of bush fires?
- Do you have many trees or shrubs around your home?
- If you need to leave your home, would you need to travel through bushland?
- Is your Bush Fire Survival Plan more than one year old?

Once you've made your plan, make sure that every member of your family knows what to do if a fire occurs.

Hazard Reduction Burns

Hazard Reduction burning is one way of preparing for bush fires by reducing the amount of fire fuel on the ground. They do not, however, remove the threat of fire, nor do they remove the need for you and your family to prepare your home and property.

There is a list detailing all planned Hazard Reduction burns on the Rural Fire Service website (www.rfs.nsw.gov.au). Please note that this list is subject to amendment at any time, depending on weather conditions at the time. If you happen to see a fire and cannot confirm that it is a controlled Hazard Reduction burn, please phone 000 and report the incident.



Cancer the Dragon and You

Living with cancer as a chronic disease is possible if the cancer growth rate is slowed down or halted. We often hear that people die with cancer but not of cancer.



The question is what drives mutated cancerous cells to accelerate their growth rate and become highly invasive with time? How do we put the brakes on the cancer growth rate?

The pioneer Oncologist Professor Lucas Salus has developed a list of measures as a guide to putting the brakes on cancer growth. Working with patients it is possible to formulate a personalised approach. Current traditional cancer therapies may have time limitations due to serious side effects.

A chronic disease approach typically requires long term daily treatment.

This necessitates a mix of low toxicity regimes.

The search for the ultimate cancer "cure" is difficult as there is no single cancer but a mixture of mutated cell types with uncontrolled growth rates. We treat some medical conditions as chronic if there is no clear cure. A chronic treatment approach for cancer would appear to be more achievable but requires supervision and patient adherence.

The American Cancer Society agrees

"it is important to know that even those who are not cured of cancer may go on living for months or years, even though there may be changes in their lives. And though it can be hard to do, many families adjust to this kind of treatment schedule. For people with controllable cancer, it can be something like diabetes or heart disease – a chronic illness that is mostly controlled with treatment."

But unlike Professor Lucas Salus they do not go far enough and suggest only continuation of current therapies which are limited by their toxicities.

When we moved to the farm thirty years ago, a sprawling excuse for a hibiscus emerged beside the old well. We cleared around the old well, covered it with a gazebo, and graciously allowed our old hibiscus to remain and continue to produce its annual display of crumpled-white, wilderness flowers each spring. As years rambled by, my herb gardens spread and the little hibiscus meekly sheltered passing birds or hid the occasional spotted pardalote who loved to nestle in the hibiscus's subterranean, dome-shaped chamber, snug amongst the hibiscus roots. Then, audaciously, other birds in transit from visiting the borage that sprawled on the hill, took a rest, and left "unsolicited calling cards", by sowing a miniature forest of borage beside the old hibiscus.



Now borage is a plant known since ancient times, where its flowers were recommended in drinks to instill good cheer and courage. In the garden, borage's star-shaped flowers will appear, clear azure blue in colour,

contrasting in clusters against its huge gray-green bristly leaves. The flowers of borage are invaluable as a garnish, although there is a special delight to gather those first sky-blue flowers to enhance a cucumber-flavoured salad, or to preserve their delicate shape in ice. In ages past, borage-flavoured wine was heartily dispersed amongst men going into battle to increase courage, or to help drive away melancholy. I love to press borage's starry, silken flowers between the pages of my garden diary, but this year, the mild, cucumber-flavoured floral stars have been preserved frozen in ice cubes to create an uplifting garden drink.

Nothing is All One Thing

I have been writing short stories that have appeared in this paper for the past three years. You may have noticed that for about twelve months, I disappeared. I have a little secret...I have been writing a book. It has actually been three years in the making and is almost complete, thus I have popped my head up again, to say hello to you all, with my recent round of stories, which I hope you have enjoyed. If you are a regular reader, you will have noticed my themes tend to be uplifting and feel good that put a spring in your step. Well, let me show you my other side. I have been tackling very heavy issues in my book and want to give you a little taste of what I have been working on, in silence for many, many months. This is not a direct excerpt, but is one of the topics I cover; that of bullying.

Society has recently acknowledged bullying among school students and has put strict policies in place to protect youths from bullying and to give them a lifeline if they are targeted by bullies. (Another major issue that comes hand in hand with bullying is isolation - which can also be immensely harmful).

When we hear about bullying, we often think it only happens to adolescents. But what about when we enter adulthood and we are faced with bullying in pretty much the same manner as youths dish out? Sometimes it's more subtle; women ostracising other women or more aggressive, like the time a man screamed into my face when I confronted him about the bucket of home grown mandarins he was about to abscond with.

As adults, how do we handle bullying? Are we expected to "Suck it up, toughen up" or "Get over it" because we are now mature? There is a major flaw in this argument; if people are gentle and sensitive when they are young, they will likely be gentle and sensitive adults. Ok, I will put it out there; I am one. I am mature, intelligent, can talk the leg off chair, will cook for an entire community for free, (if they would just let me) but I am an inherently sensitive person. I actually have immense admiration for tough people, but I was born this way; being sensitive is not a choice.

One unexpected issue with being kind and sensitive is that aggressive people can spot sensitivity a mile away and they may interpret this quality as weakness, and it can actually trigger aggressive people to target you for bullying (or ostracism) - you see, a bully likes a soft target - someone they know they can beat in a fight.

One day when I entered into a club, I walked by a woman and smiled and said "Thanks" as I skirted past her, through a gap between the tables to reach the counter. The woman was furious at my kind manner and tried to start a fight with me, she seemed even more furious when I refused to raise my fists. A close relative of mine is a kind man and became a fireman in Newcastle. He was targeted because he was not arrogant or aggressive (two qualities which are inherent in bullies) and was harassed by his colleagues; the more he put up with it, the more intense the bullying became. Once they confirm you are a soft target, they go on an all-out attack, knowing that a victory is certain and that this will make them look strong in front of their peers.

To be fair and I do like to be fair; there are always two sides to a story. Just as a genuinely kind person can at times snap and be unkind, so to, a bully will be capable of kindness. Hitler was a vegetarian. He was the facilitator of genocide, but he sure treated his dog well. I know many people who were bullied or are 'anti-bullying' but they themselves end up engaging in bullying behaviour and often the motive is a genuine one; "If I expose them to poor treatment, they will toughen up, and it'll be good for them". (A study of psychology and the social pecking order explains this phenomenon and also how this approach can lead to trauma rather than resilience).

I have been interviewing bully victims from around Sydney, for my book. Bullies, in general, are presented as being strong and uncaring. They are powerful (and have major control issues), but what I now believe, is they're actually very sensitive and they are afraid...they are afraid of losing something; losing money, losing power, losing control, losing their social stature, losing their dignity or losing the freedom to do whatever the hell they want. The lady in the club wanted to beat me up for my rainbows and unicorns demeanor, she had puffed herself up like she was ready for a round in the ring. How on earth had she felt threatened by me??? If you take one step back, it becomes very clear the only reason why people would be so reactive, is because they are highly sensitive and afraid. Perhaps the woman was afraid of losing her dignity. Bullies don't want you to know they are afraid, so they project their fear outward, in the form of intense aggression and intimidation.

Bullying is very common; most people I know have had an encounter with bullying in some form. It is terrifying to be targeted by a bully, so how do we as adults handle being bullied and/or ostracised? From my observation - not very well. Depression, breakdowns and anti-depressants seem to be how the stories proceed, while the intimidating bully often gets away with it...but not always...You see; we have a choice. We might not be able to choose our emotional responses, but we can choose our actions. It can be very hard to stand up to bullies, especially if you are in your yard with a male psychopath screaming into your face, and it can be equally as hard if you have to work with a horde of men (or women) who gang up against you or if you are a woman selected for social isolation by the local lassies...

So what can a victim do and what can the average person do if they witness bullying?



In my opinion, we have four choices:

1. We can try to be resilient and just get on with our life, in spite of the bully.

2. We can stand up to the bully, in which case, if we do it alone, we are often chewed up and spat out as they are inherently more aggressive than we.

3. We can gather support to confront the aggressor and say "This isn't on" (but being aware that this act can lead into reciprocal bullying, where you actually turn into a bully. You want the bullying to stop; you do not want to escalate it into war).

4. We can perform the immensely powerful act of 'walking away'. For some people and in some situations, this can protect us and empower us, more than any other action. We might be sensitive and shake if we have to stand up for ourselves and we might view walking away as a hostile act and we pride ourselves on avoiding hostility; we might have to dig deep and find our courage to turn our back toward the bully and walk away. It may be our last resort and you can be sure they will 'tut' and call you weak as they scoff at you, one last time. But walking away is powerful and clearly says "I am not going to take it anymore". And to me, it shows that sensitive people have immense inner strength, because they are facing their fears. Isn't that the real indicator of true inner strength?

We do have a choice. We do not have to stand there and take it. We do not have to turn the other cheek to a bully. There is the tradeoff of course. There is always a tradeoff. The bully might well intensify their bullying against you as you have directly challenged their power and they might even rally their friends to turn against you. Also, the bully might have something you want and you no longer have access to it. But what you will have - is your pride and your dignity.

The fireman I mentioned was emotionally broken by the bullies, but he went to his superior and the powers-that-be intervened.

Interestingly, one year after my shaky encounter at the club, I took my children there for the Australia Day celebrations. I was at the same counter, about to order the same drink when a woman in the queue started chatting to me. When I went to pay for my drinks; she stopped me and insisted she pay. A complete stranger shouted me and my kids our lemonades. A part of me wonders if it was actually the same lady from the previous year, I do not know. But it made me realize that no community or individual is all bad or even all good. Nothing is all one thing and we all have a choice.



Cracking Down on Recklessness During Total Fire Bans

Hornsby State Liberal MP Matt Kean has welcomed tough new penalties which will empower the New South Wales Police Force and the NSW Rural Fires Service (RFS) to bring those who deliberately and recklessly disrespect Total Fire Ban warnings before the courts after NSW Parliament passed the *Rural Fires Amendment Bill 2014*.

Under these strong new measures, offenders can be prosecuted under a new offence and face a fine of up to \$132,000 and/or seven years jail time if they deliberately light or allow a fire to escape their property on a Total Fire Ban day.

In what is predicted to be a difficult bushfire season ahead, Mr Kean said the NSW Liberals & Nationals Government has responded by targeting those who blatantly ignore the Total Fire Bans and the safety of others.

A jury can still find someone guilty of the existing offence which carries serious penalties of up to \$110,000 and up to five years jail time, if they think the person did not have enough warning that a Total Fire Ban was in place.

Other changes allow NSW Police and RFS to penalise less serious offenders with fines up to \$2,200 effectively covering off on penalties for would-be firebugs as we move into bushfire season.

Other amendments to the *Rural Fires Act 1997* will streamline fire permit requirements and ensure those who throw lit cigarettes, matches or other "fire objects" from a vehicle will be held accountable, not just the registered owner.

"Those idiots who throw lit cigarettes or matches from cars during a Total Fire Ban can already be hit with double the penalty, but will now be unable to blame it on someone else," Mr Kean said.

"These tough changes aim to not only deter, but put an end to such reckless behaviour."

MARKET APPRAISALS

WHAT IS A MARKET APPRAISAL?

A market appraisal is designed to tell you what your property is worth in today's market and are used as an estimate of price. These appraisals are carried out utilizing knowledge of the local area and recent sale prices and take into account many different factors about the property, some of these being:

- Location/aspect
- Home: size, condition, age, degree of modernization and presentation.
- Special features of the home.

A formal valuation can only be conducted by a qualified valuer who is registered as a valuer by virtue of training to attain these qualifications. That's the question the Brigade Kids, by way of an "action song", asked at the Glenorie Public School end-of-term assembly. The message was reinforced along with other fire safety activities at the "Firewise for Kids" program at Glenorie and Hillside Fire stations when the respective schools visited last week of 3rd term.

Bush Fire Season from Oct 1.

Oct 1 marked the beginning of bush fire season and 14 years since the fires of December 2002 blazed through Glenorie into Arcadia and Berowra. The yearly rainfall to date is the driest in many years. Many very experienced fire fighters are saying it is not a question of "if" but more "when" fire will once again impact our district.

Are you and your family prepared? Do you have a **Bush Fire Survival Plan?** Have you got a "plan B", if for some reason you cannot implement you first plan eg: the car is in for a service that day?

Bush fires are a part of living in these bushland shires. However, they needn't be devastating. A well-prepared property can survive and a well-organised family can get out with more than the clothes on their backs. If you haven't done so already, please take time to prepare your home and family now before it is too late to do so.

Reminder:

- You need a **PERMIT** to burn on your property. Contact your local brigade.
- The FIRE DANGER INDICATOR (FDI) SIGN becomes active. It is there for your benefit. Checking the sign regularly helps you become more aware of the current bush fire risk. When the needle reaches "Very High" you should be ready to implement your Bush Fire Survival Plan should there be fire in your area.

- In a TOTAL FIRE BAN
 - o No fires can be lit in the open
 - o All permits are suspended
 - o No general purpose welding, grinding, soldering or gas cutting can be done in the open.

Heavy fines can apply, if you don't comply.

Bush Fire ALERTS

- **ADVICE** A fire has started no immediate danger stay up to date
- WATCH and ACT Heightened level of threat Conditions are changing – you need to start taking action now.
- **EMERGENCY WARNING** Highest level of Bush Fire Alert – You may be in danger and need to take action immediately.

The **FIRES NEAR ME App** is a great tool to assist you to keep up to date with the current fire situation.



Top Honours Awarded to Avid Child Protection Campaigner

TIRELESS child protection campaigner and Bravehearts volunteer Karen Lindley has been recognised for her outstanding contribution to the community, after taking out top honours at the 2014 Sydney City/East Volunteer of the Year Awards.

The Arcadia local has been an invaluable supporter and volunteer of Bravehearts for more than seven years, advocating on behalf of adult survivors of child sexual assault in NSW and is on the Bravehearts' NSW Committee.



Overwhelmed by the acknowledgment, she says it's a 'win for survivors of child sexual assault'.

"I did not expect this at all, but it gives me a great feeling of satisfaction. I accept this on behalf of the entire Bravehearts team. I just open doors for people," she said.

Bravehearts Founder and CEO Hetty Johnston AM noted Ms Lindley's selfless dedication and commitment to child protection.

"Karen is one of the most caring, selfless, compassionate people I know, often putting her clients needs before her own – all at her own expense, all on her own time, often at nights and weekends available to them whenever needed. Her determination and strength makes her so successful in helping clients navigate their way through challenges and obstacles," she said.

"For so long, many of the adult survivors of child sexual assault in NSW had no one to fight for them, but due to the amazing determination and volunteering of her time and personal resources, Karen has provided this specialised help within the community over the last seven years."

"Her acts of service going above and beyond to ensure that survivors receive the best possible care, support and have a strong voice in all systems and processes are testament to her character. She has tirelessly assisted them during reporting processes to authorities, court support and emotional and practical support."

The accolades poured in with The Hon Anthony Roberts MP, Minister for Resources and Energy, also singing her praises.

"As a proud supporter of the work performed by Bravehearts, and as a foundation member of the Bravehearts New South Wales Advisory Board, I am a strong advocate for the protection of children from child sexual assault. As such, I appreciate the valuable role that volunteers play in supporting victims through this traumatic time in their lives," he said.

"Ms Lindley has volunteered hundreds of hours of her time for more than a decade assisting the victims of child sexual assault. It takes a remarkable person to dedicate their time to assist those who have been sexually assaulted – Ms Lindley is such a person."

"Bravehearts' vision is to make Australia the safest place in the world to raise a child by 2020. It is without a doubt the work of compassionate volunteers, such as Karen Lindley, who have gone a large way to ensuring that this vision will be realised."

The volunteers representing Potts Point and Sydney CBD received top honours were announced at The Woollahra Golf Club.

Chief executive at The Centre for Volunteering Gemma Rygate, says the annual awards were the State's way of recognising the outstanding work of volunteers in our community.

"Volunteers make a huge contribution to our community without seeking anything in return," she said.

"These awards highlight some of the 2.4 million volunteers in NSW and the selfless work they do. Volunteers fill the gaps in communities - they see a local need and generously step in to help others."

Hills Homes Eligible For Free Loose-Fill Asbestos Check Up

Hills residents living in homes built prior to 1980 are now eligible for a free safety check-up from a qualified licensed asbestos assessor if they suspect their home may contain loosefill asbestos.

The Heads of Asbestos Coordination Authorities' (HACA) independent investigation into homes affected by loose-fill asbestos has identified records for asbestos ceiling insulation from the early 1980s for a house located at Carlingford. It has since been removed.

Loose-fill asbestos is insulation made from raw asbestos that was crushed into a fine state and sold as ceiling insulation throughout the 1960s and 1970s.

Hills Shire Mayor Clr Andrew Jefferies has encouraged residents to enquire about the free inspection.

"Like many Hills residents, I live in a home that was built prior to 1980, and as we know there are materials that were used back then that are now considered unsafe," Mayor Jefferies said.

"It's always better to be safe than sorry and I encourage residents to safeguard the health of themselves and their family by getting their home checked."

Council's Group Manager of Environment and Planning Cameron McKenzie said that Council was working with HACA to ensure that suspected homes are identified and checked.

"HACA are co-ordinating this investigation across the state and we are working with them to make sure that Hills residents are living in a safe environment," Mr McKenzie said.



Dural and District Historical Society Hawkers and Caravaners

Reprint of story written by Rev .Ken Roughley in about 1997

Among a variety of enamelled notices available from hardware shopsand stores, were two widely used in bygone days. They said BEWARE OF THE DOG and HAWKERS AND CARAVANERS NEED NOT CALL. Numbers of residents attached one or other of these notices to their front gate to ward off unwanted callers.

Quite often occupants of houses displaying BEWARE OF THE DOG never had the job of separating unwanted callers from a ferocious dog, simply because they didn't have a ferocious dog! The notice was a bluff that usually had the desired effect and, apart from anything else, it was much cheaper than having to feed a watch dog.

A high percentage of Hawkers and Caravaners were charlatans. They travelled widely throughout the country, thus avoiding second encounters with deceived and irate customers. One such Hawker specialised in exclusive dress materials. An unsuspecting woman would purchase a dress length on the assurance that it was 'the only one of its kind', only to see a neighbour, dressed in the same material sitting in front of her at church a week or so later

Perhaps the best known Caravan of the 1920's was operated by Dural residents, Mr and Mrs. Bishop. Their home was the first house from Viney's Lane (as it was called in those days), on the right hand side of Old Northern Road.

The Bishop's drab, battle-ship grey vehicle was in striking contrast to the great assortment of colourful articles which were revealed when the sides and tail-board of the van were lowered to form the equivalent of shop counters. The interior of the van was fitted with display racks from which hung various articles of clothing; cabinets of drawers containing ribbons, elastic, tape of various widths, buttons for dresses, trousers and ladies shoe buttons, shoe laces, shoe horns, hair pins and pins and sewing needles. In fact any item needed by their patrons on their regular visits. It was fascinating to watch Mr. Bishop turn a dingy van into an attractive haberdashery shop in a few minutes

Oh What a Wonderful Feeling...

Planting trees gives me a great feeling of satisfaction, and a secret smile for a week after.



It seems this feeling was shared by volunteers who turned up in September to plant trees and shrubs on a property in Blacks Road Arcadia.

Landcare contractors had cleared 3 acres of dense privet, as part of a strategy to reduce bellbird numbers. This clearing let the sunshine in, and thousands of privets and other weeds sprang from the ground. We cleared many of these with more to go. Some natives also came up, each one welcomed with a smile. Meanwhile the volunteers at Hornsby Council Community Nursery were growing hundreds of native trees and shrubs for us.



We planned two planting days. Holes were dug and materials laid out. The call went out for volunteers to help and on 21st September an amazing 48 people arrived, aged 5 to 75. After explanations of why and how, we planted 565 shrubs and trees, complete with mats, plastic sleeves and water, and that's before morning tea! As the organiser, I was very happy! We finished off with fresh scones, jam, cream and other delights. Many promised to return the following week for more punishment.

On September 28th, 33 people returned to plant 200 grasses and sedges in quick time. At the back of the property we turned around, picked up buckets and watered everything planted the previous week, arriving at the front fence with time remaining. So we turned around and headed back pulling out hundreds of privet seedlings before the morning tea bell rang out. Yes, you guessed it, more delicious scones, jam and cream.

The place is now a sea of plastic sleeves among the big trees. The landowner's task is to keep them alive through summer, then they can fend for themselves. Of course, the weeds are still coming.....

I want to thank the landowner and his family, Landcare members, the various contractors involved, the Community Nursery and most of all, the volunteers who arrived not quite knowing what they were in for. You've all done very well!
