Lucky to be Alive!

On Thursday 23rd August, the community was shocked to hear of yet another tree falling on a car. The incident was only 400 metres from where Heidi Edwards was hit by a similar falling tree in May 2010. The female driver was lucky to survive with only a few broken bones when the tree landed on the bonnet near the windscreen. She was trapped for over an hour then air-lifted to hospital.

Mario, a truck driver from Schofields, was first on the scene, followed by Robert from Condor Glass. Both men stayed and comforted the driver until paramedics, police and the RFS arrived.

As can be seen from the pictures, the tree is quite clearly decayed and rotting at the base where it has sheared off in the strong winds. It was noted that other trees in the same vicinity, are exhibiting the same sort of decay, and

therefore could pose future threats to unsuspecting drivers.

How many more lives will be devastated or lost by falling dead trees? Why are these trees not inspected and removed when they are situated so close to a major road? We will be contacting local authorities to get a report on responsibilities for publication next month. As a community we need to work together to prevent further catastrophes.




Rumour has it that a person very involved in the Glenorie Memorial Hall and the Glenorie Community also turns 80! So maybe it could be a double celebration!

Local Swimmers Medal at School Sport Australia Championships

Caitlin Walsh and Emily Steer represented New South Wales recently at the School Sport Australia Swimming and Diving Championships.

The Swimming Championships is the largest of all school sports events in Australia based on participation. This year more than 740 athletes participated in this event at Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre from 28 July to 3 August 2012.

Caitlin, aged 10, is a resident of Glenorie. Caitlin achieved two Silver medals during the week long meet – Under 11 50m



Breaststroke and Under $11\,4x50m$ Freestyle relay. Caitlin was also a finalist for the Under $11\,50m$ Freestyle event.

Emily, aged 14, resides in Castle Hill. Emily secured three Bronze medals; 15-16 200m Backstroke, 15-16 50m Backstroke and 15-16 Medley relay.

The girls' journey to the Championships began at their local school carnivals.

Caitlin is a Year 5 student at Dural Public School and Emily is a Year 9 student at Northholm Grammar School.

Each of the girls swam successfully through a series of qualifying carnivals which allowed them the opportunity to be chosen to represent New South Wales. Being members of the New South Wales team, the girls would then compete against other state teams in a National school competition.

Both Caitlin and Emily are members of squads that train at Galston Aquatic Centre under Head Coach Eric Lobbes.

Dural & District Historical Society

John Orr, the tractor man

John Orr, who passed away in June this year, was a well known local identity, who came to Galston in 1937 when he was a seven year old.

So he could remember all the developments in the district from that time $% \left\{ 1,2,\ldots ,n\right\}$

He was an only child and the family lived on a farm in Bayfield Rd, where John worked and lived until he moved into Rowland village about 8 years ago. With his tractor he worked on many of the farms in the area, and used the tractor as a way of transport to the shops and meetings, as he never owned a car. His great interest was classical music, learned entirely from listening to the ABC.

In the taped interview, Ruth Chiswell asked him about the migrants who came to the district after the war;

"They were mostly Italian, followed by the Dutch, particularly around Galston. Joe and Dorothy Rutland, who worked on a poultry farm in Crosslands Rd, before building up their own poultry business, had layers before making a broiler factory. They worked their hearts off to get the farm going! I worked for the Rutlands for about 35 years" Many other Dutch families followed them. The Italians mostly bought land out towards Arcadia and Glenorie and developed market gardens. "The old established Australian families were the ones who had the big citrus and stone fruit orchards, which are all gone now. There was a time, in the 50's, when poultry was combined with the citrus orchards. Now the urban sprawl has taken over and, and food production is completely worthless. There were several Russian families and some Chinese here too."

Ruth asked John about the shops that made up the Galston village before the war;

"There was a general store, a bakery, a Post Office and a Motor garage on the corner of Galston Road and Mid-Dural road (where the roundabout is now). Then, where Rosie's restaurant is was a confectionery store and milk bar. Mr.Baxter had a fruit and vegetable run as well as the shop. Then on the corner of Glen St, the Jones family had a small store, that sold a bit of confectionery. It was sometimes open and sometimes shut. There was a pharmacy in with the general store, where the newsagency is now, and where the other shop is next to the now Deli, was a liquor store. Mr Butler bought all that building and then Warren Griffiths built all those new shops (In 1973), and had his pharmacy there. Then the Allen family built the shops along Galston Rd., and had a butchery there. Before that, we got our meat from Round Corner. Along Arcadia Rd, where the Galston Club is now, was a Methodist Church Hall. The Hayes family ran the Post Office and mail delivery for several generations."





What Can YOU do Around the Home to Protect You and Your Family From Bush Fire?

As the weather begins to warm up it is a gentle reminder that the bush fire danger season is fast approaching and regardless of your decision to Leave Early or Stay and Defend your home, you still need to prepare your property against the threat of a bush fire or ember attack.



If your plan to leave early fails you may need to take refuge in your home. A property which has been properly prepared stands a far better chance of surviving a bush fire than one that hasn't.

If you haven't already done so consider undertaking the following:

- Cut back any branches on trees or shrubs that overhang your roof, garage, sheds or other structures around your home and dispose of cuttings appropriately.
- Clean leaves from the roof, gutters and downpipes and consider fitting quality metal leaf guards.
- Provide unrestricted access/egress to your property for fire fighting personnel and evacuating residents.
- Keep lawns short (less than 10cm) and prune and maintain garden beds as islands away from your house.
- Avoid brushwood and other combustible fences leading up to your house. If unavoidable they should be kept wet during a bush fire.
- In areas of bush fire risk provide an additional static water supply (eg. water tank, swimming pool, dam) with a petrol or diesel powered pump and fire hose long enough to reach all sides of your house. Also practise connecting and starting the pump before a high fire danger day.
- Check the condition of your roof and replace any damaged or missing tiles.
- Check the condition of external walls and cladding and seal any gaps.
- Enclose underfloor areas and keep space under buildings/decks clear of vegetation and/or combustible materials.
- Install metal flywire or solid screens to the outside windows and doors.
- Have a non-combustible door mat.
- Remove and store any flammable items away from your house.
- Make sure the pressure release valves on LPG cylinders face outwards (so if they ignite the flame is not directed toward your house).





Savouring Spring

Spring arrived early this year with a mass of golden freesias blooming beside the front gate and violets emerging from garden crevices. As the violets' roots stirred in the

earth, their purple flowers proffered fragrance above clusters of heart-shaped leaves. In France, young violet leaves are enjoyed traditionally in salads as a tasty spring tonic, or the sweet flowers delicately candied and passed around at the close of a meal. I was tempted to gather a handful of these harbingers of spring to scatter over a scoop of sorbet, but settled on a minute vase of fragrant violets on my work table ... pure delight!

Native poppies have self-sown beside the garden pathway and lizards have emerged to bask on nearby sandstone slabs where the sun can warm their sleek skins. Unobtrusively spring glides through the herb gardens. Chives, winter tarragon, parsley and sweet marjoram are filling their allotted garden spaces with patchwork shades of green. Severely clipped fronds of lemongrass and oniony chives still display browned crew-cuts from their autumn trims, but these are now interwoven with cheerful spikes of lime green fronds arrowing into the sunshine. Sturdy dandelions have emerged, sporting fuzzy, yellow flower heads that are eagerly nuzzled by the bees. I enjoy grazing on a dandelion leaf now and then, savouring its sharp taste and imagining all the vitamins streaming from it into my system.

This morning I surprised a Wanderer butterfly tentatively unfurling his large black-veined wings like a stained-glass window. Wanderers are immobilized by cold temperatures but perhaps fear was giving him wings! As I gently moved him from a spray of rosemary into the sunshine, he swept upwards into a cloudless blue sky ... hopefully to a supply of fresh water and a smorgasbord of flowers and nectar plants. Spring is definitely here!

Crimes of the Month

Kuring-gai LAC

Steal from Unit Complex

Hornsby police have noticed an increase in the number of unit complexes being targets of Break & Enter offences. The thieves are targeting the secure caged areas in the underground carpark. The security of the cages and padlocks on inspection is usually weak.

STEALING

The items being taken are usually high end pushbikes some valued over \$1,000. Expensive sporting equipment, power tools and motor bikes are stolen plus GPS units and remote controls left in cars.

How they get in

The thieves usually 'tailgate' a resident in either by the driveway or the foyer and then target the cage areas usually unseen. Sometimes a fire door or utilities door is forced open to gain access.

DON'T GIVE OPPORTUNISTIC THIEVES A CHANCE If you have expensive items in the caged area think about relocating these to inside your apartments/units.

Do an audit of the security of your cage, have someone trained to assist if needed.

Reduce the chances of 'tailgating' by waiting until the doors close BEFORE moving away.

Be neighbour aware know who should be there and who should not, if in doubt seek assistance or advice from others.

Raise the issue at your next body corporate meeting to review the complex's security measures and how best to target these incidents. An audit tool is on the police website.





It's Tomato Planting Time!

Modern tomatoes are distant descendants of the wild plants that grew in the Andes Mountains in South America. The Aztecs in Mexico were the first to domesticate and begin breeding better varieties of tomatoes. It was after the Spanish conquest that tomatoes were first taken to Europe. Here they grew so well in the warm Mediterranean countries that tomatoes became an integral part of Italian and Spanish cuisine.

To matoes are the world's most popular vegetables and Wikipedia claims that close to 150 million tonnes of tomatoes were grown worldwide in 2010.

With their tropical origins it's easy to appreciate why tomatoes are grown in the warmer months. They can't stand cold so are usually planted in spring to grow through summer.

Grow tomatoes in soil that's been enriched with plenty of organic compost or manure and some fertiliser. Organic Life/ Dynamic Lifter Plus is ideal because it combines composted manure with added nutrients. Choose a sunny spot that hasn't been used to grow tomatoes or tomato relatives (capsicum, eggplant, potatoes) in recent years. The Rotary Club of Dural

"Serving the Community" through The RALLY Youth Program

The Rotary Club of Dural has just completed the third school Mental Health forum this year in the district. Marian College, Annangrove on Monday 13th August saw 180 students plus teachers listening to clinicians from The Hills Clinic, Peter Casbolt and Leanne Hall, presenting strategies to assist students from Year 10 cope with stress and anxiety and maintaining a healthy mind and body. They also heard first hand from a young lady sharing her own journey of recovery from episodes of depression that have affected her for the past 10 years.

Our guest presenter, Matt Kean, State Member for Hornsby, opened the forum and gave a stirring introduction relating his experience with a close colleague who succumbed to mental health issues. His delivery was crisp and factual gaining a quite respect from his younger attentive audience!

Peter Casbolt encouraged students to identify the causes of stress - family, peers, school, study, jobs - and spoke about acceptable levels of stress and the pre-occupation of stress and anxiety that may dis-empower students to enjoy life with friends and family and result in a negative outlook to each day. This is when courage is required to share your feelings with someone you trust. It is not bad to have some stress, he said! But if it continues regularly then help needs to be found.

Colina is a 26 year old who shared her personal journey of events that led to bouts of depression and her subsequent recovery. Young people relate well to hearing real life experiences, especially when that person is merely 10 years older and giving such a positive message about seeking help from someone you trust. Colina is a fine example of hope to her young peers.

Leanne Hall is a psychologist with The Hills Clinic at Kellyville whose specialty is healthy lifestyle, healthy mind and how to go about it. Her light-hearted delivery kept students relaxed as she encouraged students to look at the Headspace website and try some of their questions and programs - but not to replace a visit to the school counsellor or GP, if they felt something was not quite right.

The overall message to students was to take control of yourself and your mind, learn how to help yourself, and to be aware of your actions as you don't know how they affect others

whether it's on Facebook, email or in school peer groups. Be strong enough to speak up when you are feeling numb and empty.

At the conclusion of the 90 minute forum, students spent time completing the Australian Rotary Health feedback sheet, discussing with their neighbour and engaging in good conversation about what they had just heard. Students then had time to browse the table of handouts from Youthbeyondblue and SANE Australia.

Our Chairman, Rotarian Allan Forno, thanked Kelly Grlyak, the Marian College School Counsellor, Matt Kean and our three expert speakers from The Hills Clinic for giving Rotary the opportunity of raising awareness of good mental health with young people in our neighbourhood. The Hills Clinic has been at the forefront of these presentations to local high schools in the district. Their continuing support of these forums is paramount to their success and also of Colina for her courage to tell her story so that others may learn.

Friend of Dural Rotary, Sue Coleman, and Rotarian Paul Wolf have been rewarded for their desire to hold these initial forums this year. The three schools, Cherrybrook Tech High, Galston High and Marian College have all confirmed the continuance of these forums each year as a major initiative in spreading the word that mental health issues need to be discussed in the community, are preventable and curable, if treated.

The Dural Rotary Club will continue serving the community through our RALLY Youth Program in our schools, reaching young people at a vulnerable time of their lives and providing opportunities for leadership training to school students and after school to young adults.

Borrowing within an SMSF to purchase property by Roger Wheelahan, Wheelahan Investments

Using an SMSF can overcome common problems associated with building a direct property portfolio. In fact, subject to the trust deed and investment strategy of the SMSF, there are no restrictions on which asset class the funds can be invested in. It can also borrow to leverage the investment, provided the loan is a limited recourse loan for investment purposes, through a separate trust.

How does borrowing to purchase property in your SMSF actually work?

The favoured trust for a limited recourse loan is an Bare trust. It allows the SMSF to purchase a property, repaying the limited recourse loan by instalment, while the asset is held in the Bare trust which is separate from the SMSF for the life of the loan. If the SMSF defaults on the loan, then the lender's rights are limited to the property in the Bare trust only. While the fund's loss is limited to the equity in the property and all instalment payments made prior to the default.

What types of property can your SMSF purchase? Residential

SMSFs are able to purchase any residential property at public auction or a private sale, provided it is not purchased from a related party. It cannot be transferred in specie into an SMSF from related-party ownership. The purchase of direct property must be for investment purposes only and you cannot receive any other benefit from it.

Business real property

However, unlike residential property, business real properties such as commercial properties and farms can be transferred in specie into an SMSF by related parties at market value. It can be bought at auction or private sale. Business owners are also able to buy their commercial premises, and pay arm's length rental to their SMSF.

There are taxation benefits from owning business real property within an SMSF, particularly if that property was initially owned outside of superannuation, and/or you are a business owner.

Appropriate diversification

Depending on the total funds available within your SMSF your ability to diversify with direct property may be limited. Lack of diversification can increase the risk to your retirement plans if your property investment does not perform in line with expectations. It is important to remember even 'blue chip' property prices can reduce in value.

Is it right for you now, or in the future?

While members of an SMSF are working to accumulate funds, assets that produce little income for the SMSF may not present any immediate problems. However, in retirement, income (and therefore liquidity), is of paramount importance when specified withdrawal amounts of income are required by law. For example, an 80-year-old member must withdraw 7 per cent of their SMSF capital each year, rising to 9 per cent from age 85.

A significant concern with residential property is that it often produces less than 5 per cent net rental yield (after expenses) and consequently insufficient retirement income. Because property is not divisible and cannot be sold off 'bit by bit', unlike units in a managed fund, accessing liquid funds often results in a forced sale.










Winter Sports for Tiny Tots to Teens

What a wonderful and diverse group of people are the member's of our Rural Fire Service! It's wonderful when you get a group of people together who are liked minded.


The Rural Fire Service was what brought everyone together at Galston Uniting Church on Sunday 12th August. There were representations from Galston. Middle Dural, Arcadia and



Still Creek Landcare Fireweed is here NOW!

by Nick Chartorisky



If there is ever a time to pull Fireweed. IT IS NOW.

The reason to remove it is because IT IS TOXIC! Fireweed is responsible for many cases of poisoning in livestock as it contains pyrrolizidine alkaloids. These chemicals in the body result in a characteristic type of liver damage, damage that cannot be reversed. The



damage to the liver is accumulative and can ultimately lead to death.

All parts of the plant throughout its lifecycle are toxic. Hay or silage contaminated with Fireweed can be toxic as it is easily caught up in its dried up form in the feed. The same way it started it's foothold in our district only recently.

The fields and lawns of the district might be brightened by their Yellow flowers, but don't be deceived. Up to 30,000 seeds can come from a single plant, which is why it has become so wide spread in the Hills over the last 5 years.

It's so easy to control without weedicide. On your garden property, it's just a matter of keeping it cut in lawns so as not to let it flower and spread. In paddocks it is easily pulled by hand. Just remember to dispose of it thoughtfully

It is possible to stop the spread of this weed and help out our primary producers, stock owners and equestrian's. A little work now really pays off in the next season; I have personally applied this and witnessed the results. One good afternoon of work pulling the flowering plants and mowing the rest paid off with a 90% decrease the following time they bloomed. I now find myself pulling Fireweed only around my boundaries with the infested areas.

We have chosen to live in a rural environment and even if we do not own grazing stock, as good neighbours we owe the people that make this district rural to keep their stock healthy.


