

Pool Inspections to Keep Children Safe

Hornsby Council has emailed all registered pool owners in the Shire, informing them their pool will be inspected in line with NSW Government legislation.

Pool owners can have their pool inspected by a private company or Council will do it for the Government-imposed fee of \$150 – a significant discount on the actual cost of performing the service.

"There has been some concern expressed that this is a money-making venture, but that could not be further from the truth," Hornsby Shire Mayor Steve Russell said.

"The annual income from the inspections is \$145,000 while the annual cost is \$297,000, leaving the Shire's ratepayers significantly out of pocket.

"However, it is a price that's well worth paying if it helps to keep our children safe from drowning in backyard pools.

"When preparing this legislation the NSW Government found that up to 80 percent of backyard pools are not adequately fenced, placing young lives at risk.

"The Government has made councils across the state responsible for reducing that risk and Hornsby Shire Council takes the responsibility seriously."

Hoon Driver Forced to Pay for Damage

A vandal who drove their vehicle on Dural Park and Hayes Oval in March has been ordered to pay the \$3,000 it cost Council to repair the damage.

They were also given a 12-month good behaviour bond when the judge handed down his sentence yesterday.

"This is a very good result, meaning the Shire's ratepayers do not have to pay for the criminal foolishness of one individual," Hornsby Shire Mayor Steve Russell said.

"It also sets a good example, proving that Council will not tolerate this kind of behaviour and will do everything possible to bring offenders to justice."

The worst damage occurred at Dural Park, which the offender accessed by cutting the chain on a locked gate.

The ground had to be closed, with cricket games and rugby training cancelled for a number of weeks.

Letter to the Editor

September $9^{\mbox{\tiny th}}$, the ninth day of the ninth month, is World FASD Day.

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) is an irreversible and lifelong disorder resulting from exposure to alcohol in the womb. **FASD is the largest cause of non-genetic, at-birth brain damage in Australia. It is a completely preventable condition but there is no cure.**

- It can result in learning difficulties, a reduced capacity to remember tasks from day to day, anger management and behaviour issues, impaired speech and muscle coordination, and physical abnormalities in the heart, lung and other organs. The effects can range from mild impairment to serious disability. It is primarily the result of impairment of the brain's 'executive functions', so affected children might be regarded as being wilful or undisciplined when in fact they have little control over their behaviour.
- There is no safe level or safe time during pregnancy for women to drink. Consequently, the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) recommends that pregnant and breast-feeding women should avoid alcohol.
- Despite recommendations that FASD warnings should be on all alcoholic drinks, only 38% of products carry the warning and, in a recent survey, less than 5% of those who are planning a pregnancy, pregnant, or mothers of infants, recalled seeing a warning.
- Surveys show that between 50% and 80% of women continue to drink during their pregnancy, thus putting their baby at risk of being born with some symptoms of FASD.

A House of Representatives Standing Committee Report, November 2012, "FASD: The Hidden Harm",

recommended that labels consisting of text and a symbol warning that women who are planning a pregnancy or are pregnant should not to drink alcohol, be **mandated on all alcoholic beverages** and should be accompanied by a vigorous education campaign.

This was to have been implemented by January 2014 but it has not happened and ineffective labelling has remained in the hands of the alcohol industry.

We therefore call for the Federal Health Minister, Hon. Peter Dutton, to immediately implement the recommendations of this 2012 report in order to prevent more babies being born with this lifelong disorder.

Glenorie Rural Fire Brigade News

RFS Blessing Service

Members from Middle Dural and Glenorie brigades joined with Galston, Arcadia and Hornsby Support at Galston Uniting Church on Sunday 10 August, for the annual Blessing Service. Steve Mansfield from Galston brigade gave a great summary of "why we do what we do" and the Hornsby District RFS Chaplain, Christopher Pears, shared an encouraging word. Thank you to the congregations of Galston Uniting and Hills Life Church for hosting the event and putting on a great feed for us all.

Prescribed Fuel Management Burns (Controlled Bush

Fire Hazard Reduction)

What is a prescribed fuel management burn?

A prescribed burn is a low to medium intensity burn aimed to provide reduced fuels across an area to slow the spread of a larger wildfire. The burn should provide strategic advantage to nearby properties and other assets for a few years if done well and to a prescription.

Glenorie, Hillside and Middle Dural brigades continue to complete as many of these planned burns as weather and resourcing allow. The mid August rain gave brigades a weekend off burning, however if weather permits more burns will be completed before this goes to print.

Reminder: Burns are good *but* the best form of defence is still a well maintained and prepared property.

Training





Dural and District Historical Society

Our oldest Member, Nancy Smith, 102.

Nancy Smith has been a member of our Society for many years, and now she is a resident of Mark Donaldson V.C. House, within the Rowland Village.

<u>Val Newin</u>, who also lives at Mark Donaldson V.C.House, has written up the story of Nancy's life in the Village Newsletter, so we asked her permission to re tell it here.

"We are very proud of Nancy, our centenarian, who was born in Mosman on 10th March, 1912, and is such a sweet, gentle lady.

Nancy was born into good circumstances, her father being the Managing Director of Cumberland Paper Mills. Nancy and her two sisters were sent to "Wenona" private school in

North Sydney as boarders, but they had to leave when the Great Depression came and circumstances changed.

Nancy told me her mother had the desire and ability to become a doctor, but her father wouldn't have any of it. When her mother was 21 she announced she intended to study nursing at Sydney hospital and her father did give her some support. Her mother's training enabled her to establish a private hospital at Pennant Hills, with the help of two doctors. (*The building is still in use as a private residence, on the corner of Beecroft and Pennant Hills Rd, opposite Observatory Park*)

Nancy had to leave school in only her second year at high



school and so then she helped her mother in the hospital .She can remember standing on a box and holding a 100 watt globe over a patient for a doctor to operate.

Nancy's aunt had a dairy farm at Dapto, down the South Coast and needed help, so Nancy offered to go. There she met her

> husband, Len, and they eventually had there own dairy farm at Dapto.It was hard and constant work, particularly when the War came, and with very little labour available, because all the young men went off to enlist in the Services.

Nancy and Len had 4 children, 3 boys and 1 girl. When they decided to retire all the children were married, so they made their home at Wolli, on the coast near Grafton, and later on at Bateau Bay. When Len passed away Nancy came down to Sydney and chose

a unit at The Court at Rowland Village, where she lived for many years before coming to Mark Donaldson V.C. House."



Spring Promises

By Mary at Heritage Haven

Myrtle waits at the gate, her damp, black nose quivering with anticipation. I am wearing my garden shoes ... ones that smell of dirt and the great outdoors. I pat my leg and Myrtle bounds through the open gateway, heading for the herb garden, where there is the joyful sound of birds and rustles of life in the undergrowth.

Leafy scents of lavender, artemesia and rosemary are significant in the winter garden. Rosemary plants have retained their flowers and it is delightful to savour the flavor of a delicate blossom or two in passing ; they are reputed to improve memory ... an option never to be passed by. Calendulas are massed alongside the verandah, turning to follow the sun and also welcoming the return of the blue wrens for spring nesting.

A viburnum burkwoodii stands leafless, on the cusp of bursting into bud, near the front verandah. Will the English blackbirds return to build another nest within its twiggy wilderness this year? Nearby, autumn's compost heap lies secreted beneath a sparkling blanket of furred borage leaves; a seedy present deposited by passing birds last summer. How exciting to discover this grey-leafed mound sparkling beneath the morning's dew. In a few weeks it will erupt to reveal a plethora of blue, or, perhaps white, starry borage flowers ... much loved by visiting bees and birds.

Clumps of creamy freesias and self-pollinating sweet violets have emerged in crevices near the archway. I should remove the plethora of weeds and frost-bitten, tangled remnants of winter, but instead, I gather Spring between my fingers by plucking several small, sweet violets (V. odorata) loosely encircling them with a ring of heart-shaped leaves and binding them with a weedy wisp of grass. I love the scent and taste of violets. Blossoms and also leaves contain vitamin A and are very high in vitamin C ... much higher than any other green vegetable used in my kitchen. Perhaps this is the year that I will plant a skirt of violets at the base of the archway of lemon backhousia roses. Violets grow well in sun or shade, and have been my favourite flower for as long as I can remember. Perhaps this will be the year to celebrate Spring with the French custom of candied violets.

Solar Panels for Hornsby and Epping Libraries

Hornsby Shire Council will install solar panels at Hornsby and Epping libraries, using a \$250,000 grant from the NSW Government.

"This is a significant step forward that limits Council's impact on the environment and reduces the cost to ratepayers of providing these services," Hornsby Shire Mayor Steve Russell said.

"These are our biggest libraries, operating every day of the week, and it will make a big difference if they are less reliant on power from the grid."

The grant was provided under the NSW Government's Waste and Sustainability Improvement Program.

A 79.75kW photovoltaic system will be installed at Hornsby Library, where there are already some solar panels in place, while a 20 kW photovoltaic system will be installed at Epping Library.

The panels are expected to save almost \$30,000 each year on Council's electricity bill.

The project is now fully funded, with the Government promising to give Council up to two thirds of the estimated \$7 million the project will cost.

"This is a huge win for the local community and we're very grateful to the Government for the assistance they have provided," Hornsby Shire Mayor Steve Russell said.

"We're particularly grateful to Hornsby MP Matt Kean, who has been a strong advocate for the new bridge.

"This bridge does not simply provide access to Hornsby Station, it connects the two sides of Hornsby and is used by around 15,000 people every day.

"Whenever we consult with the community, a new footbridge appears at the top of the list of priorities and we're thrilled that it is now moving forward."

The new bridge will be significantly wider and will include two lifts to provide access for those with mobility issues.

The project will also include significant improvements to the Florence Street Mall.

Construction is expected to begin in the middle of next year and take around 12 months.

Throughout construction the existing bridge will remain open, providing ongoing access to pedestrians.

"The Mayor and I worked closely together to deliver this much-needed outcome for our community," Mr Kean said.

"The new bridge will vastly improve transport access and also improve the amenity of our area."

Warning Bells

10 signs a senior needs help

1. Unpaid bills piling up - Seniors can feel overwhelmed by the simple task of opening and responding to daily mail, particularly if their eye sight is deteriorating or if this was once the responsibility of a now deceased spouse. This can result in overdue bills, bounced cheques and potential utility disconnection due to lack of payment and other creditor issues.

2. Reluctance to leave the house - Rather than ask for help, seniors who are having trouble, e.g. walking, remembering directions, seeing or hearing, will slowly pull away from their community and friends and isolate themselves. If left unresolved, this isolation can lead to loneliness and depression, as well as malnutrition and other health issues.

3. Losing interest in preparing or eating meals - Seniors who suddenly find themselves alone, who have become lonely over time or are easily overwhelmed by cooking, tend not to eat properly. Signs that poor eating habits are forming include: improper selection of food in the house (not well-balanced), expired or rotten food in the refrigerator or signs of excessive weight loss (clothes much looser). An ageing person may eat enough calories to get by, but may suffer nutritionally, including increased cholesterol and low vitamin intake.

4. Declining personal hygiene - Changes in appearance are the most obvious sign that some assistance is needed. These signs can range from unkempt hair and body odour, to unshaven faces, wearing clothes that are dirty, unchanged for days or inappropriate for the weather. These changes may occur because doing the laundry or getting in an out of the shower has become too physically challenging. Many who live alone also fear slipping and falling in a shower or bath with no one to help him or her get up.


5. Declining driving skills - Look for evidence of parking or speeding tickets, dents and scratches on the senior's car - these may be signs of deteriorating driving skills. Decreased ability to see, poor sense of direction, inability to merge in traffic, driving way under the speed limit and very slow reaction times may indicate help is needed.

6. Signs of burnt pots and pans - This may be a sign of short-term memory loss or even the onset of Alzheimer's disease, as pots used in cooking are forgotten on the stove and burn. Besides the danger of falls, fire is probably one of the greatest safety concerns families of older relatives face.

7. Symptoms of depression - Depression causes marked changes in behaviour and one's daily routine over time. Many seniors feel isolated, or like prisoners in their own home, particularly if a health condition or the deaths of friends or family members keeps them from going to the places they once enjoyed. Feelings of hopelessness or despair, increased listlessness, and not wanting to get dressed can call be indications of a problem. Other signs include decreased visits with family members and friends, change in sleeping patterns (sleeping for long periods or not sleeping at all) and lack of interest in usual hobbies and activities.

8. Missed doctors' appointments and social engagements - While this can be a symptom of increased forgetfulness, it is often simply a result of not having transportation and not knowing how to access transportation options on their own.

9. Untidy house - Changes in housekeeping may occur simply because it is too difficult or tiring. This is especially troubling if a parent used to keep the house neat and orderly or if a now-deceased spouse was responsible for these duties. From dirty laundry to dirty dishes, these everday tasks

New "10/50 Code" takes effect...but what does it mean?

The 10/50 Vegetation Clearing Code of Practice for NSW (10/50 Code) permits the owners of land within the "10/50 vegetation clearing entitlement area" to carry out the following vegetation clearing:

- the removal, destruction (by means other than fire) or pruning of any vegetation (including trees) within 10 metres; and
- the removal, destruction (by means other than fire) or pruning of any vegetation (except for trees) within 50 metres of an external wall of a building with habitable rooms that comprise or is part of residential accommodation (or a high risk facility).

The "10/50 vegetation clearing entitlement area" has been determined by the Commissioner of the NSW RFS. A map is available on the RFS website, best accessed via a desktop browser.



Some important points to note:

- Only the land owner can permit clearing. If you lease/rent the property, you MUST get permission from the owner before conducting any clearing.
- This code **does not** apply to outbuildings e.g. sheds, detached garages or non-habitable structures.
- This code **does not** apply to structures for which Development Consent has not been obtained.
- You cannot use fire to clear your vegetation, nor as a means to dispose of your cuttings/cleared waste.
- You cannot disturb the soil in the clearing process (no ploughing, grading or dozing).
- If your property is subject to protection from another planning instrument (e.g. Prescribed Stream, Aboriginal Heritage, etc) you cannot apply the 10/50 Code. If in doubt, check with the appropriate Authorities.

Tree removal is a specialist exercise. Please ensure that you utilise the services of a suitably qualified contractor for the safe removal of any trees.

This information is offered as a general summary. Before you undertake any vegetation clearing, please visit www.rfs.nsw.gov. au to confirm that your property lies within the determined area. You should also download and read a full copy of the *10/50 Code* of Practice to ensure that you fully understand the definitions, guidelines and your obligations. Hard copies are available from the local NSW RFS District Office.

combined training competition each year as preparation for the Zone One Day Event (ODE), which is a very popular Zone event both within our Club and our neighboring Clubs in the Sydney area" says Leanne Davies, Senior Instructor, Arcadia Pony Club.

"As our pony club grounds don't have a permanent cross country course, we use the showjumping phase of the combined training discipline to create more of a Derby course with some of the same technical challenges you could be faced with out on the cross country course.

This means adding in our portable x-country fences and spooky fences such as walls, straw bales, water trays, gates, tyres, barrels and pipes to the show jumping. Our riders then need to continued on page 34




training to help prepare the kids for the Glenorie Pony Club One Day Event the following week.

What is Landcare?

As a Minister for Conservation in 1985, Joan Kirner came to learn quickly that there was a pressing need to develop a program that would reverse the degradation of farmland, public land and our waterways.

Landcare groups have formed all across the state, around Australia and in over 20 countries around the world. The keystones of Landcare are that it is community owned and driven.

Landcare is a grassroots movement that harnesses individuals and groups to protect, restore and sustainable manage Australia's natural environment and its productivity. It had its genesis in initiatives to

improve agricultural productivity through sustainable land management.

With over 6000 Landcare and Coastcare groups nationwide there is likely to be a group near you, possibly working on a project right under your nose. Volunteers range from kids to retirees, surfers to farmers and CEO's to students.

The success of the Landcare model is due in part to its bottom up philosophy. A Landcare group usually starts when community members with common objectives connect over their observations of a local environmental issue. Groups may apply for funding from a variety of different sources to support their work including local, state, federal government and Landcare Australia.

Generally, small group committees oversee operations, apply for project funding and organise communal activities like community workshops or tree planting.

The success of the Landcare bottom up model can be attributed to the inspiring contributions made by the passionate individuals who make up Australia's Landcare movement. Their sense of stewardship, enduring commitment and deep appreciation for our natural environment is why Landcare exists today. Its people are its greatest asset.




