#### **GLENORIE GETS NEW FIRE TRUCK**









## The much-loved Glenorie Bakery opened in 1994 has recently undergone a transformation bringing a slice of baking and local history to Glenorie.

Rob Pirina and his team over the past seven months have been hard at work creating a home for the country's largest collection of bakery antiques with a centerpiece being the resurrection of a slab hut that has been part of the community landscape since the late 1880's.

The slab hut which is now standing tall within the bakery was once the home of the Newland's family who have family relations tracing back to the Waddell family, an early pioneering family of the district. Though ownership of the land has changed many times over the years the slab hut remained on the property. Over the years however nature and time had taken its toll on the hut, it eventually collapsed some years ago during a violent storm. In recent times the property came under the ownership of the

Floriano family who discovered the fallen remains and kindly donated the hut to the bakery museum.

When asked why was it important to preserve the hut Mr Pirina commented "I strongly believe in the preservation of our local community history and sharing it with generations to come".

Recently Rob and team proudly unveiled their latest addition the Glenorie Bakery. Inspired by the traditional German cuckoo clocks and Rob's love of baking. Bobby Bakehouse as he is affectionately known as is the little baker who can make everyone smile when they meet him with his daily appearances at 10am, 12pm and 2pm.

In addition to the recent renovations, the launch of a new made to order café menu has added a new level of flavour to compliment the famous pies, pastries, breads and sweets.

With all the recent changes at the Glenorie Bakery there's even more reasons to come rediscover this much loved local institution.

With spring upon us the risk to our pets from Tick Paralysis increases. Unfortunately the Galston area is one of the high risk areas for the Paralysis tick. Bandicoots are the natural host and they can spread ticks into new areas. Dogs and cats are primarily affected but other animals can be susceptible.



the oesophagus. Symptoms can include lethargy, difficulty or inability to walk, breathing difficulty and regurgitation. If no symptoms are present when you find a tick on your pet remove the tick immediately and keep them quiet and confined for the next 24 hours. Once symptoms are present prompt veterinary treatment is necessary to avoid complications developing.

- There are two new tablets treatments available for dogs. Both of these are very effective in killing ticks and also are effective against fleas. One of these tablets gives four months excellent control of ticks.



This Blak market provides the opportunity to be part of the learning with a traditional smoking ceremony and Aboriginal dance performances along with spearmaking, catch n cook and plant and artefact workshops.

The Blak markets is a showcase of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island culture with products from La Perouse to the Torres Strait. Learn how to throw a boomerang from the grandson of the great Joe Timbery who threw his boomerangs around the Eiffel Tower or buy some beautiful gumnut jewellery.

The beauty of the Blak markets is it is a social enterprise and simply by paying to do a workshop and learn about Aboriginal culture, you will be enabling a young Aboriginal person to be learning essential things about their own culture to increase their life resilience.



There's plenty of bush tucker food as well as plant and artefact talks with tastings where you can find out how native plants were used traditionally and then taste them.

Entry price onto Bare Island, which is usually only open for tours, is \$2.50 per person with children under 5 free.

Open from 9:30am until 4pm the Blak markets take place within the Kamay-Botany Bay National Park with the support of the NSW Parks and Wildlife Service

## Dural and District Historical Society How trees formed our District

If there was one word that described the history of our district it would be **TREES**.

Way back in the very early 1800's, explorers and surveyors who came to this area reported an "inexhaustible supply of timber" and for that reason Governor King proclaimed 34,000 acres, stretching North from about the newly established Government Farm at Castle Hill to about Maroota, as Crown Land.

In 1819 some of this area was released and the first grants were made to settlers who got busy clearing their land, selling timber, cutting shingles and building their homes. By 1850's citrus orchards were being established on the higher areas were there was good soil (Wianamatta Shale), and water from springs. By the turn of the century this became the biggest citrus growing area in Australia, until the M.I.A.(Murrumbidgee Irrigation Area) was established in the early 1950's Their production costs were lower than the Hills district, and soon the old orchards were pulled out. The orchardists wondered what to do with their land, and decided to subdivide into 5 acre lots. This brought many new comers into the district. They wanted 'privacy' and planted many exotic trees to shut themselves off from their neighbours. New Line Road was upgraded from a dusty track to take the newcomers to their jobs in the city.

In 1955, if you stood on high ground, such as Uralla Rd, you could see for miles and miles. The only trees visible were the few pine trees planted as 'boundary markers'. So nearly all the trees around Dural are less than 60 years old. Now this area is the 'Lungs' of Sydney, absorbing the Co2 and producing life giving Oxygen.


There are still some old 'historic' trees about the district. The Hoop Pine and a Morton Bay Fig at Arcadia school were planted on 14th August 1897, which was Arbor Day. The Principal, Mr Knight, had arranged the delivery of these trees from the Botanic Gardens in Sydney. The Hoop Pine has been used by the RAAF as a landmark when approaching Richmond from the east. From its top you can see the CBD in Sydney and all the surrounding countryside. There was a famous old Angophora at Bus Stables Corner until it was removed several years ago to make way for the roundabout. It was used like a notice board for every organisation to advertise meetings, special functions and anything for sale

The large Camphor Laurel trees around the district may have a special origin when we realize that such trees were planted to commemorate First World War servicemen. If anyone has a large old Camphor Laurel on their property they might like to do a little research at History Cottage and the Galston Cenotaph to see if there is a connection.

#### Ross Grieve's Story

Ross Grieve, who has lived all his life in the district tells this story. His father bought



Foster approached the Governor and was granted land that had a 2 and a half mile frontage to the east side of Old Northern Rd. in what we now know as Middle Dural. He cleared the land and planted about 300 pine trees all along his frontage and the long drive to his house, which was a 'Mansion'. This house was later used as a T.B. convalescent home for patients from Sydney, run by Mr. Stintson. John Foster eventually lost everything because of a gambling debt, and died a pauper in a slab hut on the other side of the road. The original pine trees were dead or dying when my dad bought the land, and he got a local saw miller (Black Jack Saunders) from Glenorie to fell the trees and take them away.

Ross can remember living in the mansion as a small child, but the white ants and dry rot eventually destroyed the house and Mr Grieve built a new house on his property for his family

Whilst out driving in the car, my wife and I were reminiscing recently, about fashion.

We have an 18 year old boy (rather I should say young man) at home, who is very fashion conscious, and we started to discuss how we were in our teens.

Fashion deals with not only clothing but also other parts of one's personal appearance such as hairstyle, cosmetics and not forgetting the music of the day, which has also greatly influenced how we dressed.

Can you recall the Beatniks? Generally they were viewed as intellectuals who wore berets, skivvies and frequented coffee shops where they would recite poetry or sing folk or protest songs.

Also in Australia we had the bodgies and widgies (in the UK they were generally referred to as Rockers- Australia had a rocker culture also which came a little later). The early bodgies who were males (widgies were the female equivalent) would dress similar to the late James Dean. Satin shirts, slicked back hair etc. The slicked back hair saw products such as Brylcreem, Spruso and Atkinson's California Poppy sales climb astronomically. I can still remember the old Brylcreem song which was aired on radio and TV in commercials of the day.

"Brylcreem a little dab would do you Brylcreem, you'll look so debonair Brylcreem, the girls would pursue you Simply rub a little in your hair."

Now back in the 1960s, whilst I was working as a DJ at a teenage dance on weekends and as a guy of 16+ during that period naturally I was fashion conscious also. When the Beatles hit the pop scene I just had to have a Beatle jacket. I didn't go for those plastic Beatle wigs though. During the surf music craze (remember The Atlantics, The Rebels, Jan & Dean and not forgetting the Beach Boys) blonde hair was all the rage amongst many, particularly using peroxide to lighten the hair,

Mind you, it wasn't only the guys who were fashion conscious, the girls were also. Can you remember the beehive hair styles that many wore back in the day? Or what about the styles made popular by Dinah Lee or that 'blonde headed stompy wompy real gone surfer girl' Little Pattie.

Guys who previously would have considered wearing after shave as being girly, started applying "Old Spice" so that they would appeal to the girls. Although recently a number of women have said to me that they hated the smell of "Old Spice". So did it actually achieve what the guys wanted, I wonder?

During the 60s also came the Paisley fashion. I had paisley shirts I would wear to the teenage dance where I DJ'd and on other occasions. Floral and paisley styles became very popular with the Hippie generation or Flower people. There were also the bell-bottomed trousers . What of the girls in their Go-Go outfits or wearing muu-muu's. My wife wore Hipster shorts and dresses at the time and, talking about shorts, can you remember the Culottes and the Hot Pants? Who can forget the ruckus caused when Jean Shrimpton (aka The Shrimp) wore a mini to the 1965 Derby Day races at Flemington, Victoria? Much of the older generation were outraged, whilst the younger generation thought it was so liberating. Talking about liberating clothes, topless dresses were also introduced during the late 60s or early 70s but they just didn't take off.

In the seventies, a popular fashion amongst men of the day was the Safari Suit. I had one that I wore out and also to work. You could also get a safari suit with shorts rather than long trousers.

Other fashions that I recall during my younger days include the rope petticoats that my sisters wore, bobby-sox, pony skirts and gingham dresses. I recall guys wearing floral shirts, cowboy string ties and when cuffless trousers became more popular than those with cuffs.







#### **Lorien Novalis School**

### Local Community and Lorien Novalis School working together to bring native wildlife into schools

Lorien Novalis submitted to the Bird of Schools a yearlong program to develop an action plan to build awareness between people and birds. In 2014 Lorien Novalis was one of only 20 schools fortunate enough to participate in this rich, informative



programme, and was allotted a funding grant which helps with two key planting/landscaping projects within the school.

This month, students were busy planting Australian Native gardens to support bird diversity on the school grounds. The final planting day was a culmination of a year's learning with students in the school, which involved observing, collecting data and gaining knowledge and know-how towards improving, creating and caring for our increasingly fragile bird habitat. Upper primary students participated in a citizen-science-based environmental studies project offered through Birds Australia and its school outreach educational programme, Birds in Schools. The school was determined that they could improve Lorien Novalis's Birdlife through the planting of additional native gardens which invited and sustained a greater diversity of birds, particularly small bird varieties.

This month Lorien Novalis moved forward with two unique gardens, a 50 metre bird friendly hedge near the upper primary classrooms, and a small bird sanctuary situated closer to the native bushland. On planting day everyone had a part. High School students helped dig and weed, and younger children planted and watered. It was a great day enjoyed by all. The new gardens are already attracting many birds.

As a final perfect note...on planting day one Birds in Schools volunteer, Mark Fuller, discovered a pair of Spotted Pardalotes. He responded to their calls, which resulted in them coming to perch in a nearby tree.

You can visit the Small Bird Sanctuary during the 'Lorien Novalis Fair' on the 5th September. Wander down toward the Performance Hall and look for the white-tipped twigs that form a temporary boundary for the new plants. Enjoy the birds and know that their presence is the single most important indicator of a healthy, sustainable habitat.

Lorien Novalis is grateful to Birds in Schools and Birds Australia for their contributions and support, and also to Malcolm Johnson, of Boongala Native Gardens on Pitt Town Road, Kenthurst, for his valuable consultation with our planning, and also for the provision of a large portion of the native plants.

#### Crofton Weed is About to Shed its Seed Again

By Chris Noon

Crofton is a highly invasive weed: each plant can produce up to 100,000 seeds. It's in this area and has been declared a noxious weed by councils. It can grow up to 1 to 2 metres, see our website for photos and the brochure.



Horses suffer respiratory disease if they eat it, sometimes with fatal results.

#### What can we do?

Buds begin to form in august and September, so now is the time to act. We can stop the spread by clipping the flower heads and bagging them. Better than this is to remove the whole plant by the roots by hand or wel.

Herbicide can be used but usually needs a respray after three months.

#### What is science doing to help?



The CSIRO has developed and released this year a new Crofton Weed Rust Fungus which infects young leaves and stems. It won't eradicate the weed but is expected to help control growth. They have used up supplies this year and will be releasing more in 2016. Let us know if you wish to participate next year. See their website: http://www.csiro.au/en/Research/







#### New Bridge Reconnects Iconic Bushland Track in Berowra Valley National Park

sections of the Great North Walk.

The new bridge in the Berowra Valley National Park exceeds the former bridge in weight limits, aesthetics and accessibility. It replaces the demolished former bridge which was removed after collapsing in 2013.

Mr Kean said that an estimated 40,000 people utilise the popular Great North Walk each year, and the installation of this bridge replaces the alternate creek crossing that had been in use since the collapse of the old bridge more than two years ago.

"The installation of a the bridge will mean bushwalkers, Duke of Edinburgh participants and school groups can now again enjoy the historic Great North Walk without having to walk across the creek and get wet," Mr Kean said.

"The construction of this bridge will help lots of people get out here and enjoy this amazing place whilst also protecting a nearby endangered ecosystem."

"Berowra Valley National Park is one of the most spectacular natural places in Sydney. There are not many places in the world where you can get off a train and walk along natural waterways, through deep gorges and through native forests like this. It's a place that every Sydneysider should visit for themselves."

Minister Speakman agreed saying the Berowra Valley National Park is part of a vital ecological corridor linking extensive and rugged bushland to the north and the urban fringed bushland corridors to the south.

"The park is one of those special places within Sydney that is well known and well-loved for its incredible natural beauty, cultural heritage importance and recreational opportunities.

"The new Calna Creek Bridge is a significant connection, providing a safe creek crossing on one of NSW's most iconic bushwalks. I encourage the community to visit Berowra Valley National Park, and the Great North Walk, including the new creek crossing."

Approximately 21-kilometres of the 250-kilometre walk from Sydney to Newcastle are located within Berowra Valley National Park.

A significant planning design process was behind the construction of the new Calna Creek Bridge to ensure that works caused as little impact as possible on the surrounding park.

Construction of the new Calna Creek crossing cost \$270,000, with every care taken to preserve the intricate local ecosystem, despite issues with access to the remote site.

#### **Wahroonga Waterways Landcare**

#### Time to go bushwalking



With summer well on the way, now is a great time to go bushwalking before the weather becomes too hot. Wahroonga Waterways Landcare looks after a 34ha E2 Environmental Conservation Zone in Wahroonga between Pennant Hills Road and the Comenarra Parkway, following Coups

Creek. This secret valley is full of character, containing some excellent examples of remnant Sydney Turpentine Ironbark Forest and Blue Gum High Forest, as well as riparian Coachwood habitat. Walking trails crisscross the valley, taking walkers past ephemeral native orchids, swathes of Grass Trigger Plant, and under flocks of rainbow lorikeets, king parrots, crimson rosellas and the occasional watchful eyes of tawny frogmouths and powerful owls. Coups Creek itself is busy with the calls of frogs and the chak-chak of a Satin Bowerbird who holds court at the north-eastern end. Although the land is privately owned, members of public are welcome to walk along tracks, provided they do not disturb the natural habitat and take all rubbish with them. Guided tours and maps are available.
