









The Bachelor Moves to Glenorie



Council Donates \$10,000 to Womens Shelter

Hornsby Shire Council has donated \$10,000 to the Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Women's Shelter, in recognition of the valuable work it continues to do.

"When I suggested this donation there was no hesitation among the councillors, who voted unanimously for it," Hornsby Shire Mayor Steve Russell said.

"Domestic violence is a scourge we do not tolerate and it's been heartening to watch the community come together in an effort to eliminate it."

The shelter board director Sallianne McClelland collected the cheque from Mayor Russell and is highly grateful.

"It's a huge relief and contributes significantly, meaning we don't have to worry as much about the next rent cheque," Mrs McClelland said.

"We receive no government funding at all, so each year we need \$400,000 in fundraising to continue operating.

"This donation helps us a lot."

The shelter has now been operating for more than a year and its 10 beds are always full, with an average of 20 women having to be turned away each week.

"It's obvious there is a real need for this shelter in our community and Council is proud to be able to assist," Mayor Russell said.

Galston Concerts go Mostly Mozart

The Galston Concerts close their 2015-16 series with a Mozart & Vienna mini-festival of two programs, Saturday and Sunday 7 & 8 May, in Galston Uniting Church.





A 3pm start on the Saturday sees Mozart, Duos & Dances with duo pianists Brachi Tilles and Jenni Flemming, Jenni being the founder and Director of the Australian Piano Duo Festival at the Queensland Conservatorium.

Founder violinist and Leader of Ensemble I, Spiros Rantos, and cellist Gwyn Roberts will join their pianist partners in stringpiano contrasts.

The 3pm Sunday start sees Mozart & the 'Trout' with a first half of Mozart's 'Marriage of Figaro', a Piano Concerto and a Quartet. Mothers Day Mozart!

The second half features one of the greatest and most beloved of all the Classics, Schubert's Trout Quintet, with a rumour of Mozart's Eine Kleine Nachtmusik to close the festival.

Ensemble I takes its name from the Chinese philosophy of the I Ching concept of change, hence the varied combinations and sounds through the group's concerts.

Their multi-national origins - Greek, Israeli, Canadian, Hungarian, Taswegian and Queenslander - are matched by their successes in well over forty countries and on high seas concerts cruises.

The festival will also see the launch of Young Artists performance awards for 2017, a major goal of Galston Concerts to encourage the next generation of young musicians.

Some Disabilites Can Be Invisible

With a valid disability permit, Susan Hughes parked in a disabled spot opposite Hornsby train station. Waiting to pick up her 87 year old aunt, she got out of her car, walked a short distance to check the timetable, and walked back and waited in her car for the train to arrive.

A man watching from afar then approached the car, walked around looking at the car and then proceeded to bang on the window and voice his opinion. "How dare you park here! You haven't got a disability." He said while swearing and cursing as he stormed off.

It's not the first time Hughes has experienced this type of thing. Her disability, rheumatoid arthritis, is a chronic progressive disease causing inflammation in the joints and resulting in painful deformity and immobility, especially in the fingers, wrists, feet, and ankles.

Hughes is one of around 400,000 people in Australia that suffer from the disease. The nature of the disease means that sufferers often don't need walking frames, crutches or any other visible aids. To an observer, the disease is often invisible. For the sufferer, common daily tasks are often excruciating.

"Do we all have to resort to faking a limp, when we are in really excruciating pain in our skeleton and our muscles, just so people don't think we are there illegally," she said.

Recently, Hughes has become a member of a new organisation called Dragon Claw. Established in 2014, its aim is to provide a community for sufferers that will help them navigate the health system to help them find services and support.

Its founder, Michael Gill, acknowledges there is a lot of discrimination in the community when it comes to these types of invisible disability. He also believes it extends into the workplace as well, compounding the effect of the disease. He believes the organisation is important, mostly for the support it provides to sufferers.

"The typical symptoms are extreme fatigue. They get very tired, very quickly: stiffness and continuous or cyclical pain. On a bad day you can be staggering out of your disabled car park to go to do some shopping. On a good day you can walk normally. But then again on a bad day you might be able to walk fine but you can't carry anything very far. So a shopping bag becomes too heavy," he said.

"I think there is a reasonable amount of discrimination also in the sense that people can't hold jobs down. Either because of the effects of the illness or because the employer doesn't like to carry someone with a chronic disease," he said.





It has been a long, breathless summer from which I have often sought respite on the shady southern side of our old farm house. Tonight, as I paused for a cup of tea, I leant my forehead

against the kitchen wall, only to find myself exchanging silent salutations with a small garden dweller. Separated merely by the cool glass of the kitchen window, a garden frog sprawled

motionless, save for the silent, shadowed thumping of his heart against the glass. He is no stranger here ... some nights he even appears with a couple of mates, but tonight he is alone, and wordlessly I rest my finger tips gently against his white pulsating belly and admire his



athletic presence. How many insects will he consume tonight? Will he leave a dent in my backyard's insect population?



Common frogs enjoy a diet of flies. moths and slugs, and my wee visitor obviously anticipates being treated hospitably ... especially if it includes enjoying supper on my kitchen's window sill and even more preferred if mosquitos are on the menu.

Outside below my window sill, an old copper bath has become a resident home for travelling frogs, tadpoles and snails. Dragonflies

are always welcome visitors, while birds will frequently pause for refreshments or a quick dip in passing. Here also damp mud and gravel encourages plants like pennyroyal and soapwort to thrive.

Hornsby Art Goes to Gosford

A significant collection of over \$500,000 of art, collected in Hornsby, has been donated to Gosford Regional Gallery. The size of the collection is so significant it has more than doubled the value of the existing collection in Gosford.

Gosford City Mayor, Lawrie McKinna said the entire Gosford City community is set to benefit from this generous donation.

"My fellow councillors and I are extremely grateful for this amazing act of generosity. What an amazing gift for Gosford and our wider community," he said.

Hornsby Arts Council Incorporated (HACI) has been collecting the donated works of art from local and regional artists for about 15 years. The works have either been hung or displayed in various Council and public buildings around Hornsby Shire or stored at HACI's expense.

HACI has been trying to find a permanent place to display the collection for some time. In late 2014, it became apparent that Hornsby Council was not going to provide a place for the artworks in a dedicated gallery. As fantastic as the Wallarobba arts centre is, it is not a regional gallery and does not have the space to accommodate a collection of this magnitude.

Michael Bell is the acting chair of HACI, while he and the arts council are pleased to find a dedicated space for the collection in Gosford, hs says it is disappointing the works had to leave the Hornsby Shire.

"The works were collected for the people of Hornsby. It is regrettable that Hornsby residents will not have the accessibility and close daily contact they would have had if the collections formed part of a Hornsby regional gallery," he said.

"Unfortunately Council chose to spend its money in other areas and missed opportunities when they were there. In particular we recall the sale of the Cinema, the equestrian centre and the swimming pool upgrade. "Wallarobba" is an excellent facility supporting artists but it is not a visual and performing arts centre."

In response, a spokesperson for Hornsby Shire Council noted the conditions required to not only display but to store a collection of this size was something that could not be met.

"Hornsby Council has communicated with Hornsby Arts Council about the Bestowed Art Collection over a number of years. The Hornsby Arts Council imposed a number of conditions on the transfer of the collection that unfortunately Council was unable to meet," said a Hornsby Council spokesperson.

"The Bestowed Art Collection is a private collection that was held by the Hornsby Arts Council and it is their decision where to house the works. We are pleased that the public will now be able to view them.

Hornsby Shire Council is proud of its contributions to the arts, including the opening of the Wallarobba Arts and Cultural Centre in 2011."

Dural and District Historical Society The Roughley Family



The family name, "Roughley" comes up in many aspects of our local history. The first Roughley members to come here were father and son, Joseph and James, who lived in Lancashire. They had been found guilty of stealing several pieces of cloth to the value of five pence (!) and were sentenced to transportation for seven years. They arrived in Sydney

in October 1818, and were sent to Parramatta for distribution. In 1824 they were given "Freedom from servitude" and James married Harriot Kentwell of Castle Hill in September, 1825.

They moved to Dural in about 1830 when they tenanted 50 acres from William Mobbs. This land was situated on the western side of Old Northern Rd. opposite where St Judes Church is now. The Roughley family had given 2 acres of land for the building of a small house which was used for church services and a denominational school. Later, in about 1846 the present St. Judes was built, but it was not until 1865 that the land, including the school, was officially conveyed to the Bishop of Sydney.

Most of the descendants of the original Roughleys had large families. Some were of 10 or 11 children. James 11,who married Lydia Hunt, built "The Pines" in 1856 and the house was occupied by several generations of Roughleys, the last being Clive, who will be remembered as the "Honey and Egg Man" by some of our older residents. Clive had no descendants and in about 2001 gave the house and land to Baulkham Hills Shire Council (now the Hills

Shire), who now maintain it as a tourist attraction. There are regular guided tours of the house, and it is well worth a visit to be reminded of the old days and ways.

Miss June Simeon was appointed as the teacher at Annangrove School in 1948, and met and married Bert Roughley. She was an outstanding teacher, and was instrumental in researching the history of Kenthurst and Annangrove, for the publication of a book, by Catherine Charlton in

1981. June Roughley also published the story of the Roughley Family, "A Loftier Race", which has detailed family trees and is available for sale at the cottage. June was on the committee of the Kenthurst Literary Institute in 1961, when the decision was made to build the swimming pool which was entirely financed and built by the local community. At that time it was the only pool in the district, where children could be taught to swim.

The formation of the Dural Historical Society in 1984 was June's idea, and we are eternally grateful to her for the tireless work she put into setting up an organization to record and preserve the history of our district. Finding a home for the Society took several years, until the cottage near the Cenotaph became available. It had been built for the caretaker in about 1946. The members of the Society worked hard in renovating, altering and decorating the building and had it all ready for the opening on 29thAugust,1998, by Hon. Kevin Rozolli. "History Cottage" is open for enquiries on Wednesdays 1pm-4pm, and on Sundays from 10am to 4pm. All welcome

"The sad tales of the convicts and the suffering they endured is lightened by that 'good old Aussie humour' to take audiences on a journey back in time.

"We have seen audiences members with tears in their eyes as the 'convicts' tell their stories of hardship and despair, but soon the mood is lifted as these same convicts rebel against the Government officials and red coat soldiers.

"The script has been carefully researched and follows historical fact closely, but we encourage the actors to improvise in their interaction with each other and audience members so you never really know what might happen," said Mr Retford.

Restoring Carrs Bush

An unpleasant surprise awaits those who remove a mature privet tree - a thousand privet seedlings spring up to replace it! This is happening in our restoration area in Carrs

Bush. A lush carpet of seedlings about 5cm high has appeared, powered by sunlight that was not there previously. We don't like spraying because it kills new natives hiding among the privet, so hand weeding is used. Among other things, bushcare teaches you patience!

You may remember that in August last year, we advised that

our Landcare group had obtained a \$40000 grant over 3 years to restore a section of Carrs Bush, part of Fagan Park in Galston. The work is being done near the electricity tower at the corner of Bayfield and Carrs Roads. Since then, contractors and Landcare members have cleared privet, blackberries, honeysuckle and Ochna near the tower and on Carrs Road. You can now walk through some sections that were almost impenetrable.

Having received a sizable grant, some would expect to see bobcats and trucks removing trees, moving soil, reshaping the ground, planting new trees and laying turf, like most landscaping sites. For our work, you would be very wrong! Bush regeneration is about people crawling around in the undergrowth using small hand tools and a lot of knowledge. Experienced bush regenerators know the name of every plant, whether it is a native to the area or introduced, and how to efficiently remove the 'baddies' and encourage the 'goodies'. We get great satisfaction seeing an area change its character over time. We rejoice when natives reappear after being crowded out by weeds for years. We are governed by the speed at which the bush regenerates, not to a faster human timescale. Many workfaces are open at once, all being independently managed to avoid overclearing.

A small amount of replanting will be needed in badly degraded areas, using plants grown from local seed. However most plants will be supplied by the bush itself, from seed that has been dormant in the ground or spread from adjacent good bush. Once again, patience is the key.

Most of Carrs Bush is absolutely glorious. If you would like to help us restore the remainder, you would be welcome at occasional Landcare working bees, or you could join the Bushcare group. Call Barry Lees on 9653 3691, or go to www.stillcreeklandcare.com.au or Facebook.
