





Well done to Elena Duggan, the Head Teacher of Creative and Performing Arts at Galston High School, for her wonderful achievement in winning Masterchef 2016







Dural and District Historical Society

Great North Road

From a story in the archives of our Historical Society

Land grants were first given in our district of Dural, Galston, Glenorie, Arcadia by Governor Macquarie in 1819, and the land was being opened up for cultivation. Settlers in the Hunter Valley were petitioning the Governor for a better and shorter road to their properties.



A very young surveyor called

Heneage Finch arrived in the colony with a new university degree and a young wife in 1825 and the Governor put him to work surveying a line of road from the 19 mile peg on the Windsor Road (where the Bull and Bush inn is now) up to the head of the Wollombi Brook in the Hunter Valley. He collected horses, tools supplies and convict gangs and completed the work in good time, often following Aboriginal tracks along the ridges



In 1826 under orders from the new Governor Darling, work began on the road from Castle Hill northwards, under the supervision of Lieut., Jonathon Warner. The convict gangs of 50-60 men, some of whom were in irons, felled and burned trees, and the Aboriginal word for burning logs or trees with smoke coming out that stuck to one particular

area—"Dooral- Dooral" The road took 10 years to build. The part we know as Old Northern Road runs from Baulkham hills to Wisemans Ferry. The part north of the Ferry is not trafficable but displays engineering excellence in the massive stone retaining walls, some of them up to 12 metres high, supported by massive stone buttresses every twenty metres.

The road fell into disuse over the following decades because other routes became available. There was no water for stock, as the road flowered the ridges and it was isolated. The section from Glenorie to Maroota fell into disrepair for many years. Now the north section is Heritage listed and is called the Convict Trail.



Several years ago a small box of old "bits" was left at the back door of History Cottage with an anonymous note saying they were found about 30 years ago on the site of the convict camp on the south side of Wisemans ferry. They are very interesting and tell a story of the 1830"s

Prof. Dr Ian Jack has been researching the writings of someone who called themselves "XYZ", and wrote about the Convict Trail. Who was this XYZ? and what do we learn from his writings. This year Ian Jack is coming to deliver the June Roughley Memorial Lecture at the Arcadia Community Hall on Saturday, 20th August at 2pm. Free entry. All welcome to come and find out about "XYZ"! ### Local Cyclist Wayne Grech to Cycle Again for Charity

Local Hornsby Shire resident, Wayne Grech, is set to once again take part in the annual Big Red Ride charity bike ride, cycling 150km from Bondi Beach to Katoomba and climbing over 2500 metres to raise money and awareness for Muscular Dystrophy NSW (MDNSW) on Sunday 6 November 2016.

One hundred per cent of funds raised will go to the MDNSW Kids For Life Program, which provides critical life-changing support and assistance to children living with Muscular Dystrophy to help them live longer and more fulfilled lives. Four hundred thousand dollars has been raised over the last four years to support children and their families living with Muscular Dystrophy.

Cyclists will depart from Bondi Beach at 6.30am. The riders will then head north on the Pacific Highway towards Hornsby, descending into Galston Gorge before the grueling climb out. Cyclists will continue on to Dural, then Richmond via Annangrove and Windsor Road for the lunch stop were they get a chance to mix with some of the kids with Muscular Dystrophy. With the ride departing Richmond and with 90km under their belt at this point, they will continue uphill to the finish line in

Katoomba.





In August, the Dharug and Lower Hawkesbury Historical Society Inc will be leading an excursion to the two 'road encampments', formerly referred to as the 'stockades', situated above Wisemans Ferry. These encampments were used from 1827 until 1832 to house the convicts working on the construction of the Great North Road down into Wisemans Ferry. There are two groups of stone structures, one with some 13 ruined fireplaces and the other, 200 metres to the north, with some 5 fireplaces and the ruins of a stone room. We will also visit Court House Rock overlooking Wisemans Ferry which has a magnificent view down to the Hawkesbury River.

We will meet at 10.00am at Hawkins Lookout (about 1 km out from Wisemans Ferry) on Old Northern Road for morning tea prior to proceeding to the road encampments. We will park at the Goliath's plumbing sign and proceed to walk into both sites.

After the walk we will then proceed down into Wisemans Ferry and have lunch at Cobham Hall (Wismans Ferry Hotel). The owner of the hotel has a collection of memorabilia from the 19th century housed upstairs which we will visit after lunch.

**Fire Season.** If you would like a property check or you have a Static Water Supply (dam, pool, large tank) you think may be useful for fire-fighting in your area, please talk to one of the team and they will arrange to come to visit at a time that works for you.

### Glenorie Public School Fair

The brigade will be at the school fair Sunday 18 September, and once again would love to chat to you about the upcoming fire season and the best way you can prepare your family, home and property.

#### **Brigade Training**

To ensure all members are ready for the coming fire season the brigade continues to train regularly with a major training excises each month. July training was pumps and pumping. Getting water onto a fire is always very high in our priorities, second only to safety to the public and members. Regular training ensures all members work together avoiding unnecessary delays.

If you have a fire pump on your property but are unsure how to use it efficiently, please chat to a member and we can organise a demonstration for you. Knowing how to use your equipment minimises delays and could potentially save your life or that of your loved ones.

**Pile Burns** - Before the Bush Fire season begins is the ideal time to do pile burns on properties, however, pile burn regulations vary between shires so please contact your local Rural Fire District Office: The Hills 9654 1244 or Hornsby 9883 2000. **Failure to comply with regulations can incur a fine.** 

A couple of basics:

- No fires can be lit on unoccupied land.
- Pile burns must be to standards and not be used for the purpose of land clearing.
- Your district office and all neighbours must be notified 24hrs in advance.
















# DO I HAVE TO NOTIFY THE AUSTRALIAN TAXATION OFFICE WHEN I SELL MY PROPERTY?

# YES, BUT ONLY IF THE SALE PRICE IS \$2,000,000 OR MORE. THIS APPLIES TO ALL SALES FROM JULY 1ST 2016

- Australian residents selling real estate with a market value of \$2 million or more will need to apply for a clearance certificate from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) to ensure amounts are not withheld from the sale proceeds.
- Where a valid clearance certificate is not provided by settlement, the purchaser is required to withhold 10% of the purchase price and pay this to the ATO.
- Only a vendor who is an Australian resident can be granted a clearance certificate by the ATO.
- If the vendor fails to provide the clearance certificate by settlement, the purchaser is required to withhold 10% of the purchase price and pay this to the ATO.

- To obtain a clearance certificate, a vendor who is an Australian resident (or their representative) must complete an online 'Clearance certificate application for Australian residents' form. This form will be available on ato.gov.au/FRCGW
- An Australian resident vendor may apply to the ATO for a clearance certificate at any time when considering the disposal of real property. This can be before the property is listed for sale.


Hornsby State Liberal MP Matt Kean joined Hornsby Council mayor Steve Russell to announce the sports funding upgrade and meet several of the club members.



A word that is plaguing my thoughts at the moment is platforms. Each of us has a platform; a position of influence within our circle of friends and acquaintances.

The question that I keep considering is how are we using our own platform?

A platform is something you step up to, a raised area that offers the opportunity to influence others around you, to share or express your opinions. Again I emphasise, WE ALL HAVE A PLATFORM.

"I'm a bit sceptical....

When people tell me they have heard God, or God has told them this or that, I am always a little sceptical. 
While our love of gardening brings us together each month, our social secretary is busy organising functions for members to attend. Our Christmas in June started with a tour of






