Unexploded Bomb found in Galston Gorge

The work to upgrade and improve the Galston Gorge road access between Hornsby and Galston suffered a slight hiccup last week as road contracting crews uncovered something completely unexpected.

An unexploded WWII ordinance was uncovered during excavations near the Galston Road bridge at the bottom of the gorge, approximately 100 metres west of the roadway. The "25 pounder" (approximately 12 kg) artillery round may have been lying in place for up to 70 years. A spokesperson from Hornsby Police said the projectile was quickly identified and exclusion zone established. Army rescue and recovery teams were called and took possession of the round for disposal. The road crews found the ordinance at around 12.30am on the morning of Thursday 23rd June with Galston Road being closed for about three hours overnight.

By first light, the road had been reopened and all exclusion zones had been lifted.

All designs must seek to retain the heritage look of the building. It would be ideal if the design concepts can be phased as the Hall Committee will be applying for grants, donations and public funds to complete the project.

The concept plans should address the following:

- 1) Existing toilets are outside.
- **2)** Building is not very well insulated
- 3) Building does not have a commercial kitchen



History Making Month

16 fire calls in the month made May Glenorie Brigade's busiest month on record! June is becoming just as busy. Calls have included kitchen fires, bush fires, trees down, car alight, shed fires, storm damage, assistance with flood evacuation and illegal pile burns. This combined with regular training, community engagement commitments and assistance with district Fuel Management burns has meant members have been in their yellows most days! All brigade members are volunteers and give generously of their time and talents for the benefit of our community.

PILE BURNS - Just a reminder: Although you no longer require a permit for bile burns the regulations vary between shires so please contact your local Rural Fire District Office; The Hills 9654 1244 or Hornsby 9883 2000. **Failure to comply with regulations can incur a fine.**

A couple of basics:

- No fires can be lit on unoccupied land.
- Pile burns must be to standards and not be used for the purpose of land clearing.
- Your district office and all neighbours must be notified 24hrs in advance.





Dural and District Historical Society Johnny Allen's Story

This is an edited story written by Malcolm Johnston several years ago about someone who had a great influence on our district. Over the years John Allen employed many local people in all areas of his business, training around 25 apprentices in his mechanics workshop.

He is remembered with much affection.

John Eric Allen was one of seven children born to Silas and Joanna Allen. He was born in 1917 and attended Castle Hill Public School till he turned thirteen. When he left school, he worked for a fruit carrier, Henry Barry. Later he worked for about eighteen months on a ten acre property in Highs Road, clearing land and cutting wood for bakeries. John purchased his first truck when he was seventeen, and carried fruit, firwwood for a not an arthing

firewood, fence posts and anything else that came his way. In 1935 John married Thelma Maud Viney, of Vineys Lane. She was always known as Betty. They had three children, Shirley, Barry and Ken, when John enlisted in the Army in 1941. He was a prisoner in Changi Prison and was put to work on the notorious Thai-Burma Railway for three and a half years, before being liberated by American forces.

After the war John started a general carrying business, taking fruit to market. He was soon running a fleet of trucks to keep up the transport demand. In 1949, when John was on the Sydney to Young run he was involved in a serious accident, which laid him up for months and left him with a disabling limp for the rest of his life.

Around 1953-54 John opened a Mobil Oil Service Station on Old Northern Road, Dural. About the same time, he was approached by the NRMA to have the franchise for the road service in the area, and Nuffield offered him the franchise to sell new Austin and Morris cars. In his large workshop, John employed many locals and ran a truck body building business for every type of truck from furniture vans to refrigeration vans. His proudest time was in 1987 when he was asked to build a special semi-trailer to transport a Satellite Earth station across the Nullabour to Perth to beam the America's Cup images around the world.

John retired in 1989 and moved to live at Round Corner, where he died in early 2012, aged 95. Dural Business Centre and a Caltex service station are now on the site of his workshop and garage.

A large photo of John and his staff, taken in 1963 is on display at History Cottage, which is open on Wednesdays, 1-4pm and Sundays 10-4pm. Most of the 45 staff in the photo are named.

At the next meeting of the Dural Historical Society on **Saturday 9th July at 2pm**, the guest speaker will be Ron Ray from the Maritime Museum. He will talk about the Endeavour Replica and will include a virtual tour of the Vessel. All Welcome



Real Tea By Mary at Heritage Haven

Almost five thousand years ago, legend has it, some leaves from a native shrub, Camellia sinensis drifted into the Chinese Emperor's kettle of boiling

water. The emperor savoured the fragrance and delicate flavor of the infusion with delight. Confidently believing it must possess medicinal qualities, the emperor called this happy discovery tea and made it an essential part of every day.



Since the emperor's discovery so long ago, these days it would not be considered revolutionary to flirt with the original recipe. The Chinese have improved fine green tea with the addition of jasmine flowers, and the Moroccans with fresh tips of spearmint. Some tea-drinkers love to add a hint of ginger or orange zest to their favourite brew. For me, there is lemon verbena, sage, peppermint, rosemary and thyme ... gentle companions that wait in my herb garden, ready to blend delicately with my green tea and making the custom of taking tea an even more pleasurable and uplifting experience.

The Camellia sinensis is an attractive plant with shiny evergreen leaves and sweetly scented white flowers. Although a tall grower in warm, tropical climates, in temperate zoned gardens this *real tea* bush grows well as a container plant, in hedges, or as part of a border. I like to keep mine neatly pruned at shoulder height by giving it a slight trim each Spring. To enjoy a cup of the Emperor's own brew, I have no hesitation in plucking a couple of tender leaves from top or side shoots at any time of the year and infusing the leaves in a cup of hot water for five minutes.

Berowra Pre-Selection & The South Dural Development

The Dural Business Branch of the NSW Liberal Party was founded well over a decade ago. Its purpose was to attract new members of the Dural, and surrounding districts, business community to the Party.

It was designed, as with most other branches in all major political parties, to represent the needs and aspirations of that community. Allowing for direct access to elected Liberal politicians and providing an influence on policy in the local area, it is not unlike any other branch of any major political party.

However, the Liberal Party preselection panel for the Federal seat of Berowra, obtained by the Monthly Chronicle newspaper, reveals the votes cast by the Dural Business Branch are directly linked to one of the largest residential subdivision proposals in the region, the South Dural Planning Proposal.

With an estimated 3000 to 4000 new residential lots up for rezoning, the proposal, in its entirety, is worth billions of dollars. Even though the proposal has been in the works for close to a decade, it has yet to be formally approved.

One of the sticking points that will need to be addressed is the contribution to local infrastructure the combined development will have to make. One of the biggest components will be towards the upgrade of the local road network. Namely, New Line Road.

Eric Cooper is president of the Dural Business Branch and a former Hornsby State Electoral Conference convenor for the Liberal Party. He is also on the committee of the South Dural Residents and Ratepayers Group (SDRRG) which is a representative body for the landholders and property owners for the rezoning of rural lands around Dural.

Additionally, he is a landholder in the subdivision of the South Dural Planning Proposal.

His vote in the recent Berowra pre-selection was one of three from that branch. Two of those votes, Cooper's being one, went to the now Liberal candidate for Berowra, Julian Leeser.

Cooper says his involvement with the Liberal Party, and the Dural Business Branch, is to make sure we get the best politicians for our community.

"I've never asked one politician for any favour in reference to this [South Dural Planning Proposal]. All I have ever asked for is honest politicians that represent our community," he said.

"When I go out on to New Line Road, I take my life in my hands. The upgrades to the roads in the area are needed because of all of the congestion coming in from and passing through from other suburbs. That is why it [New Line Road] needs widening." 22

The NSW Government position on the infrastructure costs for this development is it can proceed but as long as there is "no additional cost to Government." Upgrades to the local road network are estimated to be anywhere between \$150 and \$200 million or more. Julian Leeser, the newly minted Liberal candidate for Berowra, ultimately won the preselection with 97 votes of the 114 available on the day. With his campaign for the July 2 poll well and truly underway, one of his key platforms is for an upgrade and widening to New Line Road.

He identifies the bumper to bumper congestion, the increased commuter time and the sheer volume of local residents that have mentioned the congestion problems to him as to why he is campaigning on this NSW State issue.

"I am campaigning for New Line Road because thousands of people have literally talked about New Line Road and what a terrible road it is. How it reduces their quality of life, they have to get up earlier to get to work in the morning. I am campaigning for it because I know from my own experience that our infrastructure has not kept up with population growth. That is the only reason why I am campaigning for New Line Road, no other reason," he said.

"I am trying to work with my council and state colleagues to try and see what we can do to fasttrack New Line Road and draw some attention to it."

Beyond the selection panel for the recent internal Liberal Party vote, there are other members of the Dural Business Branch (and Liberal Party pre-selectors in the past) that also have a commercial interest in the South Dural Planning Proposal. One of those is Joe Saliba, who also has other development applications in place on New Line Road.

He categorically denies there is any conflict between having a commercial interest in the local area and being a member and

pre-selector within the local Liberal Party.

"The Dural Business Branch is a small branch; it has very little influence. I've been a pre-selector for over 30 years and a Liberal supporter for 45 years. All well before I was ever involved in any commercial interests in this area," he said.

"I've lived all my life in the area, the upgrade and widening to New Line Road is needed now to cope with all of the congestion and traffic that has a negative influence on my business now, not in the future but now."

Hornsby Aquatic Centre's Cafe Capers

The Hornsby Aquatic and Leisure centre was officially opened by the then Prime Minister, Tony Abbott. The centre was the pride and joy of the Shire with all the facilities, including the new cafe serving a public that had waited two years for it to open.

Behind the scenes a battle was erupting that has eventually led to where we are today, an aquatic centre with no cafe operator.

Hornsby Shire Council first went to tender looking for the new operator in early 2014, with the first round unable to find suitable tenants for the kiosk. A second round of tenders were sent out and, as time was drawing near to the opening of the complex, a successful tenderer was found.



Sorrento Trading Pty Ltd successfully won the rights to hold the licence for the operation of the kiosk. Its directors, Alfredo Gualterio and Michael Franks impressed selectors during the evaluation period of the tender process.

Pandoras. Tender documents obtained under NSW GIPA show that during the evaluation phase of the process Gualterio even brought across an executive chef and other staff from Pandoras to explain menus and describe their proposed operation.

Pandoras, as Hornsby Council described it in the tender documents, won the tender process convincingly over the two other tenderers.

There was only one problem. The real owners of Pandoras restaurant had no idea their business and staff were being put forward during the tendering process with Hornsby Council.

Gualterio had catering, hospitality and restaurant experience behind him. Council believed he owned a restaurant business in Rouse Hill called

Glen and Tracey Henwood have owned Pandoras restaurant for a number of years and categorically deny at any time was Gualterio a director or had any ownership rights to the company at all.

"He was just a manager," said Tracey Henwood. "And no, he didn't leave on happy terms. He was asked to leave."

At around the same time, his partner Michael Franks was starting to get suspicious. At this point Franks too believed Gualterio was the owner of Pandoras. That was until the Henwoods got in touch with him and let the cat out of the bag.

> The relationship between Gualterio and Franks then soured with the pair splitting and Gualterio signing over his directorship to Franks.

Hornsby Council was aware this problem had occurred within weeks of the new kiosk opening and decided to continue with Franks as sole operator until recently.

The licence was terminated in March this year. Council has written off \$26,447 in bad debts.

A spokesperson for Hornsby Council said a new set of tender documents are being drawn up to find a new operator for the kiosk.



Glenorie Community Church

The Glenorie Community Church is celebrating its **90th Anniversary on Sunday 24th July at 10am**. All residents and former worshippers are invited to come along.

The church started off as a Methodist Church and then Uniting Church, and in 1995 it was sold to Glenorie Community Church. The services were held in Glenorie School of Arts, then in the Mission Church every fortnight from early in the century. In 1926, during the time of the Reverend SA Pill, the Methodist Church was established. A block of land was bought from Mr Stan Black for the amount of \$20. A complete weatherboard building in good condition, although already 30 years old, was available from Beecroft Methodist Church. It was decided to buy the small weatherboard building for \$60 plus removal expenses.

The church was purchased and dismantled in sections and transported to its new site and reassembled, all within the space of 3 months. Milton tendered for the work for a reasonable price of \$50. This was for financing the work and moving the building. Contributions included substantial donations, fencing materials and a very welcome organ.

The District Chairman led the first service on the last Sunday of July 1926, and dedication of the church was conducted by the President of the Methodist Conference.

In 1933 a vestry was added which became the Sunday School hall, and further extensions have been added over the years.

Mountain Bike Trail Realignment Begins

Hornsby Shire Council has begun work to realign Hornsby Mountain Bike Trail, which will allow it to remain open while Hornsby Quarry is rehabilitated.

On Monday 24th June, the trail will close for a few months while the work is carried out, making this the last weekend it can be ridden until later in the year.

"There was talk among the staff of closing the trail this week, but we've decided to keep it open to give the riders one last weekend of fun," Hornsby Shire Mayor Steve Russell said. "If the weather remains fine it should be a great weekend for all the local mountain bikers."

The trail is being realigned to give vehicles access to Hornsby Quarry, which will be partially filled with dirt and rocks from the NorthConnex tunnel that is currently being constructed.

"One of the conditions Council placed on the project was that the mountain bike trail remain open. That is being managed through the construction of two bridges, one that will take the bikers under the road that is being built and another that will take them over the conveyor belt carrying the fill to the quarry."

The trail has been redesigned by Synergy Trails and will remain the same length, while a new trailhead will be opened in Hornsby Park.

The "trail closed" signs will go up Monday morning and riders are urged to respect them. "This is not like closing the trail when it is wet, at which point some of the less considerate riders ignore the signs," Mayor Russell said.

"The trail will become a construction site and entering it would be very dangerous for both the riders and the workmen."

It's difficult to say exactly when the trail will reopen, as there are a lot of factors at play, but it is expected to be by November.

Nature Notes

Owls of Sydney

The easiest way of discovering a Boobook Owl is by keeping your eyes open - and by chance.

I was sitting in a tea shop recently when I spotted a Boobook roosting on the metal arm of the sun awning, less than two metres away. The bird showed no sign of moving. I also happened on one in a small tree when I was bushwalking. The white splashes (droppings) on the path alerted me to the owl's presence. It's always worth

looking up into the trees when you come across this indicator. Nine times out of ten there will be nothing. But on the tenth...

Once again the bird remained motionless, allowing me good views. Most owls are nocturnal creatures and do their best not to move during the hours of daylight; you wouldn't get within a mile of one after dark when they come to life.

I recently discovered another Boobook when its roosting place was betrayed by a group of squawking Noisy Miners. These birds' behaviour often leads to the finding of a predator which they are trying to move on.

Of the owls in our area, Powerful Owls, the largest species in Australia, roost regularly in Pennant Hills Park and Cumberland State Forest.

Barn Owls (often called Screech Owls - especially in Europe where the species is also found) can occasionally be seen flying over the turf farms around Windsor. But the hardest to see are the Sooty Owls. They live in the Royal National Park but as they roost in tree hollows during the day are seldom seen.

You are more likely to hear, than to see, owls. The Boobook is well known for its monotonous 'boo boo' (or 'more pork') call which is a common feature of the Sydney night.

If you hear what sounds like a descending, screaming bomb don't be alarmed - it's only the call of a Sooty Owl!

St Madeleine

All things French

St Madeleine's celebrated the feast day of their Patron Saint on Friday 27th May in a day filled with everything French. St Madeleine Sophie founded the Society of the Sacred Heart whose purpose was to make known the love of God revealed in the Heart of Christ, and take part in the restoration of Christian life in France through the education of young women of the rich and the poor classes. By the time of her death in 1865, Sophie Barat guided an international community of 3,359 women, inspired by a deeply held spiritual ideal and offering a service of education to women in Europe, North Africa, North and South America. Madeleine Sophie Barat was canonized a saint of the Roman Catholic Church on May 25, 1925.

To celebrate her life, St Madeleine's students added a touch of France to their school uniforms, a moustache, beret or a scarf. Recess saw them enjoy croissants and 'frog in the pond' jelly. After lunch, we were entertained by a French mime artist.

Saint Madeleine had many wonderful quotes but none as lovely as: "Give only good example to the children; never correct them when out of humour or impatient. We must win them by an appeal to their piety and to their hearts. Soften your reprimands with kind words; encourage and reward them. That is, in short, our way of educating."

News from Uniting Care Galston Early Learning Centre

On Wednesday the 4th of May, Galston Early Learning Centre was lucky enough to have Mic Conway visit us to perform the show "Reduce, Re-use, Recycle". This performance provided the educators with an opportunity to further develop the children's understanding and awareness of the impact we have on our environment. After the visit from Mic Conway, we researched different ways to limit our waste at



the centre. We hope to share these ideas with the families and the outer community so that they implement similar practises at home.

Only a few weeks after our performance, we had a student that joined us from Crows Nest Tafe, who wanted to conduct a sustainability project that showed the children how to recycle and re-use coffee pods. This was a perfect opportunity to re-use a material that does not break down very easily, to create less waste for our environment. After a discussion at a staff meeting, our student and the preschool educators sent out a letter to the outer community and families to ask if they could collect their used coffee pods for the children, so that they could re-use them at the centre.



After an incredible response from the Galston community, the children started to work very hard on the pods. They scraped out all the coffee grains and cleaned out each and every pod that we received before pouring the grains on to our vegetable garden and into our

compost bin. We then cleaned out the pod containers and used them to plant some seedlings to grow for our vegetable garden. Below is an image of only one tenth of the coffee pods and one third of the grains that we were able to re-use and recycle. We would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to everyone who supported this project. It has been a very successful learning experience for the children and we couldn't have implemented this without your ongoing support.

John 4 captures the story of the woman at the well. Not just any woman but a Samaritan woman!

As she draws water from the well Jesus asks her for a drink. Quite obviously surprised a discussion starts around two types of water - that which is present in the well, and that which is unseen.

Jesus uses the opportunity to talk to her about hope and faith, and ultimately, fulfilment.

While the analogy used is water in the well, it could be substituted today with any number of items.

In our district there is no shortage of possessions, things to entertain, to consume, to engage our attention; yet none of them bring any long term happiness.

Like water in the well, they meet a thirst or craving, but cannot quench our need. We continually upgrade cars, renovate houses, buy the latest home theatre systems, yet none of this generates any more happiness than before.

Jesus offers a joy that surpasses possessions, quenching an inner need that no purchase could ever achieve.

We all are seeking living water - an inner desire that constantly seeks happiness, fulfilment, joy and many seek this in the world. Yet new cars become old, houses deteriorate, products become old and outdated.

As Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." John 4:13-14



It's our prayer that this positive outlook on Scripture in our schools would continue for the good of the young people of Galston High School.


