Is Dural about to become the next Cherrybrook?

2016 is turning out to be the year developers make their move for residential sub-division in and around Dural. Reports on pages 30-33 show the local council's and the NSW State Government, are being lobbied by property developers to change the zoning on large parcels of land. Once rezoned, the developers can then build a range of low, medium and high density houses and apartments.

By far the biggest rezoning is the South Dural precinct (the area bounded by Old Northern Road, Hastings Road and New Line Road). This represents 240 hectares of land, and will consist of approximately 3000 dwellings.

The next largest rezoning application relates to the properties along Old Northern Road towards Galston. These are noted with a suffix (1) in the list below.

This rezoning application leaves around eight rural properties in the middle of the development, separating the "northern site" from the "southern site" See map on page 30.

Reports on pages 30-33 give a brief description of what is proposed for each of the applications.

Residents need to decide if this type of residential sub-division is what you want for Dural. If it is, then that's OK, but if its not, then you need to decide what to do to fight the developments.

This is a strong Liberal seat. Liberals hold the balance of power in Hills and Hornsby Councils, State and Federal Governments. We have an election looming. What better time to write to your State and

Madge Roughley ANZAC

Madge Roughley commemorates ANZAC Day each year, and has done since she was a young girl, growing up in Arcadia. This year Madge, who lives in Northbridge, visited the Galston Cenotaph a week before the Galston Commemoration event, to remember her father, Eric Carlson and her uncle, Herman Carlson, and take another look at their names on the Cenotaph list.

Her father, Eric, enlisted as J Carlson - the 'J' stood for John, and didn't sound so 'German', he thought. His younger brother Herman is listed on the cenotaph above Eric, as 'W H Carlson'.

Eric Waldemar Carlson was born on the 10th May 1887 at Windsor, New South Wales, Eric was the second son of Axel Wilhelm and Eliza (Woods) Carlson. Axel had been a Swedish seaman who 'jumped ship' in Sydney and became officially naturalised on 14th March 1883. Eric had an older



brother, Manfred Ferdinand Carlson, a younger brother, Wilhelm Herman Carlson, and two younger sisters, Eliza Leonora Carlson, and Ann Jane Carlson. The family later lived for some years on a dairy farm at Moore Park, then moved to Redfern, Birralee and Castle Hill.

Eric (John) and Herman signed up to join the fighting forces in World War 1 on 14th January 1916. Eric's regimental number was Private 4663, and he served in the 53rd Battalion. He saw active service at Villers Bretonneux and Ypres. He contracted severe bronchitis in the trenches, and spent some time in Reading, England, recuperating. He returned to Sydney in 1919.

On 26th March 1923 he married Elizabeth Sydney Waddell Norquay. Elizabeth was the granddaughter of the Waddell's of Galston. Eric and Elizabeth built a new home on his property on Wylds Road Arcadia and started farming. He later purchased another home on Arcadia Road Arcadia. Eric and Elizabeth had two daughters, Madge who was born on 26th May 1925 and Shirley who was born four years later in 1929.

When times were difficult on the farm, Eric worked for the Galston Co-Op, and travelled to northern New South Wales, promoting the sale of Arcadia and Galston's citrus fruit. After Madge and Shirley married and left home — Madge married Colin Lesley Roughley of Galston's Fagan family, and Shirley married Tom Kildea from Berowra Waters — he worked for the Post Master General's Department (PMG) on the electricity lines. He lost his left eye when a piece of steel flew into his eye. Eric's



wife Elizabeth died after a road accident in Blacks Road Arcadia on 31st December 1953. He lived for a further 10 years with his two daughters and their families in Galston and Hornsby. Eric died on 1st May 1963 in Madge and Colin's home in Galston.

Madge, now 91 years of age, attended the 2016 Galston Anzac Commemoration and proudly wore her father's medals. She looks forward to returning for the 2017 event next year.

Dural and District Historical Society The Trethowan Family

By Caryl Turnidge (nee Trethowan)

Alfred Trethowan was born in 1855 in Falmouth, Cornwall, England. His sister, Augusta, was born in 1856. Both brother and sister married in 1877 and the two young couples set sail for Sydney, Australia, in October of that year.

The Trethowan family had had a ship building yard in Falmouth for over two centuries, but the world was changing and there was not going to be a future in building wooden sailing ships

The Trethowan boys had to make a new and different life. Alf had completed his apprenticeship as a shipwright before marrying Anna Maria Ham. When they arrived in Sydney they lived in the area now known as The Rocks, where their son Alfred Ham Trethowan was born on 12th January, 1879. Alf and Anna Maria established a Ham and Beef Shop

(a deli today), which they sold at a profit. This process was repeated at Burwood and Glanville before Alf had enough deposit to buy a forty acre property on the corner of Smalls and Blacks Roads, Arcadia in November 1885. Here they established the family farm, growing citrus and poultry. Their young family of Alf, Ern, Daisy, and Bill grew up happily although they had the tragic death of little brother Sidney, aged 4.

The Trethowans and other local families were keen to have a Church of England place of worship at Arcadia. A site was chosen alongside the School and fundraising commenced. Alf senior as a shipwright was able to prepare the building plans for the little wooden church and with his three sons was among the volunteers who built St, Columbs, Arcadia which was opened in 1907.

Anna Maria and Alfred died in 1909 and 1913, and most of the family married and moved away, leaving Alf II and his wife, Ruby and their only son, Dick on the original farm. Dick married Dorothy Davidson of Galston in 1934, and they had Michael, Terry, and Caryl (me !) over the next nine years. The whole family moved

from Arcadia to Galston in 1953, and the last of the original Trethowan property was sold.

The first motor truck in Galston was an International, (pictured above) owned by my grandfather, Alf. It was used to take produce to market bring supplies home an on occasions, with the addition of seats and a roof, to carry passengers.

Alf died in 1960 and Dick (most untimely) in 1962. Orchards and egg production had become much less profitable with the M.I.A. producing fruit and the cage system coming in for laying hens. Death duties were crippling for all families especially those with farms. Michael and Terry established a farm machinery business known as Hills District Farm Equipment. Michael and his three sons still run the business at Dural after the untimely death of Terry in 1992.

At the next meeting of the Dural Historical Society on Saturday, 11th June at 2pm, the guest speaker will be Ron Ray from the Maritime Museum who will talk about the Endeavour Replica and will include a virtual tour of the vessel. All Welcome

Pool fencing laws as at 29th April 2016

To sell a property with a swimming pool or spa pool, you must attach to the sales contract a valid copy of one of the following documents issued in the last 3 years:

- certificate of compliance
- relevant occupation certificate (together with evidence that the pool is registered), or
- certificate of non-compliance.

If this is not done, the buyer may rescind the contract within 14 days of exchange, unless settlement has already occurred.

Be aware that a certificate of non-compliance transfers to the buyer the seller's obligation to obtain a certificate of compliance. The buyer has 90 days from the date of settlement to rectify defects listed in the certificate and obtain a certificate of compliance.

The requirements for child-resistant barriers vary depending on when the pool was built and where the pool is located.

Pools built before 1 August 1990

Access to the pool from the house must be restricted at all times. Windows and doors may form part of the barrier, but they must be compliant.

Pools built after 1 August 1990 but before 1 July 2010

The pool must be surrounded by a fence that separates the pool from the house. Some exemptions apply if the pool is part of:

- a very small property (less than 230 square metres)
- a large property (2 hectares or over)
- a waterfront property.

Pools built from 1 July 2010

All new pools must be surrounded by a fence that separates the pool from the house.

How do I register my swimming pool?

Pool owners are required to register their pools online on the NSW Government's Swimming Pool Register.

Once registered, a certificate of registration will be issued to the pool owner. To check that your pool has been registered, go to the NSW Government's Swimming Pool Registerwebsite at www.swimmingpoolregister.nsw.gov.au

How can I organise an inspection and obtain a certificate of compliance?

Local councils, and accredited certifiers registered with the Building Professionals Board, can carry out a swimming pool barrier inspection. They can then issue a certificate of compliance if the swimming pool or spa pool meets all the safety requirements.

Pool owners should contact their local council or a private certifier early to organise a compliance inspection.

A swimming pool certificate of compliance is valid for 3 years from its date of issue. To check if a certificate of compliance has been issued, go to the NSW Government's Swimming Pool Register.

DERRIWONG ROAD/OLD NORTHERN ROAD, DURAL

The Planning Proposal is asking for approximately 21 hectares of land along Old Northern Road to be re-zoned as **R2 Low Density Residential**, plus some RE1/RE2 public/ private recreation space. The applicant claims this proposal provides the justification to The Hills Shire Council to commence the process of transforming rural land into urban land for the purposes of delivering additional residential dwellings, seniors housing (to include aged care), health services facility and recreation space (public and/or private).

The properties included in this application are from **584 Old Northern Road to 606 Old Northern Road** (584 is next to the Timber Yard mentioned on page 33 - 606 is the property which has been recently cleared next to Dural Memorial Hall), **plus 4 properties in Derriwong Road (7, 11, 21 and 27)**. The Planning Proposal has been split into two sections detailed in the plan opposite as the applicant has either not secured the purchase of eight properties in the middle of this development (or they do not wish to have their properties rezoned). Those properties are 608, 610, 612, 614 and 616 Old Northern Road and 9, 17 and 19 Derriwong Road.





The proposal for development is as follows:

Northern Site: 98 low density residential lots, plus an Aquatic Centre. The residential lots will typically be 700m². The Aquatic Centre will be a 25m lap pool plus a children's play and splash area.

Southern Site: 48 low density residential lots (700m²), a day surgery/ medical centre, an aged care-nursing home, seniors housing (independent living units). Both the heath care facility and aged care facility fronting Old Northern Road are proposed to be three storeys high.

There is a heritage cottage (600 Old Northern Road) within the Southern site , this will be adapted for re-use. It can incorporate an independent cafe/restaurant with landscaped garden within the curtilage for patients, visitors and the general population.



SOUTH DURAL (land bordered by Old Northern Rd, New Line Rd and Hastings Rd)

The initial preliminary concept plan submitted to Council indicates a mix of residential and potential educational uses. The applicant identifies an indicative yield of 2,500 – 3,000 dwellings in the following mix:

- low rise (3-5 storey) residential flat buildings at 40-50 dwellings per hectare;
- townhouses and terrace housing on small lots at 25 dwellings per hectare;
- detached dwellings on average 450 600sqm lots at 10 15 dwellings per hectare; and
- large lot housing along creeks and where there are remnant areas of vegetation at 2 dwellings per hectare.

Council referred the proposal to NSW Planning (called the Gateway Process). The Gateway Determination for South Dural was issued on 7 March 2014 and provided a two year period to finalise the Planning Proposal. At its meeting on 9 December 2015, Council resolved to write to the DP&E to request an extension of the Gateway Determination for a further 24 months. Council has received an alteration of the Gateway Determination from the DP&E permitting a 24 month extension. The timeframe for completing the Local Environmental Plan is 14 March 2018.

488-494 OLD NORTHERN RD DURAI

Skyline Dural - The first floor of the development will have six commercial tenancies, above a ground-floor supermarket and seven shops.



The basement levels include loading docks and three levels of parking with more than 300 spaces.

The application also includes widening Old Northern Rd to two lanes and construction of a signalised intersection

at Old Northern Rd and Franlee Rd. A public piazza and a bus interchange are included as part of the development.

The commercial/ retail building is the first stage of the three-stage development. Stage two is

Stage two is construction of a residential

building with up to 80 units, subject to a future development application.

Round Corner.)

Stage three is for 21 townhouses at the rear of the development.

268-274 NEW LINE ROAD, DURAL

This application relates to the existing site of Martins Sand and Soil and the land where Dural Irrigation is situated - plus Dural Business Park next door a total of 6.6 hectares. This application is for a change of use and rezoning from IN2 Light Industrial to B2 Local Centre.

The proposal is to develop a 4,200sqm full line supermarket, specialty shops, bulky goods (potentially a hardware superstore), a medical centre, possibly gym/child care centre or commerical offices, self storage facility, bus parking and service, plus 834 car

parking spaces.

Hornsby Council has endorsed this proposal and a "Gateway" determination has been issued. This means that NSW State Planning Gateway must review and approve the planning proposals to rezone this land. This was proposal was passed by Hornsby Council despite considerable opposition from the Dural Chamber of Commerce as they considered, amongst other things, that adding another large supermarket in between Round Corner and Galston would significantly affect those existing centres.

582 OLD NORTHERN ROAD, DURAL (TIMBER YARD)

This is the site of the existing Sydney Timber Supplies yard at the McDonalds roundabout. The site is just under 2 hectares. The application is to rezone the land to R3 medium density housing. The dwelling mix will be a range of attached and detached houses as follows:

6 x two bedroom townhouses, 47 x three bedroom townhouses and 4 x four bedroom townhouses, giving a total of 57 houses. There are approximately 21 visitor parking spaces, plus just over 2,000m2 of common open space.

The site is subject to a critically endangered tree species known as the Shale Sandstone Transition Forest.

The applicant is looking for a minimum lot size of 700sqm.

Two further floors of residential apartments will be above the retail area. Vehicle access to the site is from Old Northern Road.

The child care centre will accommodate 57 children and there will be parking for 40 vehicles.

It should be noted that the Cascades development next door also contains a child care centre.



616 OLD NORTHERN ROAD, DURAL

Proposed: Alterations and additions to an existing building and change of use to a restaurant, café and ancillary retail shop and parking for 63 vehicles. **Council Status** – Information required

Total building capacity of 200 persons (188 seats/12 staff).



This expanded restaurant and café will be located next door the proposed rezoning mentioned on page 30. This will affect the views from the rear verandah of the proposed restaurant.

636 Old Northern Road, Dural

The Cascades development (artists impression pictured below) is for a mixed use development including residential apartments, restaurants, a child care centre, retail shops and 191 parking spaces for visitors and residents.

We understand 17 residential apartments are approved, 10 x three bedroom and 6 x two bedroom an 1 x four bedroom.

There will be 4 small retail shops. The child care centre will be a long day care centre and cater for a maximum of 72 children and 12 staff, with hours of operation from 7am to 6.30pm.

This development has been approved and construction has commenced and is expected to be completed mid to late 2018.

It should be noted that the proposed property development next door at 634 Old Northern Road, also has plans for a child care centre.

Donald Horne, somewhat ironically, coined the term 'the lucky country' in his book of the same name. It is a description that many Australians have taken to heart: Australians like to believe they live in "the lucky country".

There is no doubt that on a world scale Australia is a prosperous country. Most Australians have access to more food than they could ever need – too much, in some cases – and with recent revelations that Australian households are responsible for \$8 billion worth of food wasted per year, it seems that many of us have more food than we know what to do with.

Stick Insects

There are about 200 species of stick insects or phasmids

found in Australia and more are discovered on a regular basis. They usually live high up in gum trees but after a stormy day you can find them trying to look inconspicuous in unlikely places. People have found stick insects hanging off their laundry drying in the sun, clinging to windows or on plants in your garden and more unfortunate ones, drowned in swimming pools. Stick insects have truly amazing camouflage and can be easily overlooked as they often stay unmoving for long periods. Australian stick insects range in size from a few centimeters to the longest species; the Titan Stick Insect, *Acrophylla titan*, which can grow up to 30cm from head to tail.



Once a phasmid believes that it has been seen there are a few tactics that they employ to avoid being eaten. Males can fly away when stressed, but females can't escape predators so easily and will attempt to try to blend into the background of twigs and leaves, It will often, sway in a regular motion to help it blend in with its surroundings.

All phasmids begin life as an egg which is dropped from the end of the female's abdomen and falls to the ground at the base of the tree or shrub. Thousands of eggs are laid during the females' life. The Spiny Leaf Insect, *Extatosoma tiaratum* eggs have a knob, called a capitulum,

which is attractive to ants. Ants will carry the eggs back to their underground nests, eat only the knob, and leave the rest of the egg safe in their nest, protected from other animals that might eat it. To avoid being detected after they hatch, the young spiny leaf phasmids (also known as nymphs) resemble, smell and behave like red-headed black ants. They emerge from the ant nest and climb rapidly upwards, looking for soft green leaves.

Many female phasmids do not need to mate in order to produce fertile egg, but the eggs produced will hatch into females. If the females do mate with a male before producing eggs, the nymphs (babies) may be male or female . Most females live for about 18 months, while the males are only short-lived, surviving for around 6-8 months. They are just one of the fascinating creatures that make up the wildlife in our local bush land. If you see any, take a photo and share it with us on our facebook page.
