

Cherrybrook Shopping Village set for \$36m upgrade

irvac, the owners of Cherrybrook Shopping Village, have put in a DA to Hornsby Council to upgrade and expand the existing shopping centre. The development will increase the size by 6,599 sqm of commercial floor space and expand the existing car park into multi-storey. The current floor space is 9,636 sqm so it's quite a significant increase in size. The proposed retail extension provides new retail shops (including Woolworths and Aldi), a medical centre, gym and centre management offices. The shopping village also has a 48 place childcare centre.

Two entrances are proposed, one in Shepherds Drive opposite Macquarie Drive and the other Shepherds Drive opposite Kenburn Avenue (the existing access) to accommodate the increase in traffic. This increased traffic could access the shopping village via Shepherds Drive, but also Purchase Road/Beechwood Parade, as this route would lead to the new access opposite Macquarie Drive.











to Anglicare through St Jude's Anglican Church, Dural to help those in difficult circumstances, particularly approaching the Christmas season.





Outcome of Conciliation Conference - Glenorie Shopping Village

The Hills Shire Council received 76 submissions from residents regarding the Shop Top Housing development at Glenorie Shopping Village.

At the conciliation conference arranged by Hills Shire Council approximately 40 residents attended plus 4 attendees from the Applicant including Mr Tassie Pirina, his Architect and Planning Consultant.

There were approximately 6 speakers on behalf of the residents and they raised a number of issues. These included::

- **1.** The proposal does not enhance or integrate the village
- 2. Units are not in keeping with the character of the area
- **3.** Concerns over the loading dock being close to residents
- **4.** Removal of waste considering the number of residential apartments and retail spaces.
- **5.** Impact on traffic flows along Post Office Road, in conjunction with Woolworths and Glenorie RSL Club
- **6.** Overshadowing and privacy impacts on local residents.

The applicant's Architect responded to most the questions raised, and took a few questions for further investigation. He stated that the development would comply with all council regulations and Australian Standards.

Council confirmed that they will consider the issues raised during the Conference and this would help inform their decision.

Dural and Districts Historical Society

History under the Lino

It is amazing what you can find under the lino! The son of one of the members of our Historical Society was renovating an old house and when he took up the old Linoleum he found lots of old newspapers in quite good condition. They dated from about May,1955.

In 1955 the "Cold War" was at its hottest and there were was lots of talk about what would happen if an atom bomb was dropped on Sydney. Maps appeared in newspapers Illustrating how far out you would have to be to not be affected if the worst happened. Dural was just beyond the outer radius.

The headlines in the Sydney Morning Herald for 18th May, 1955 ... "Government to build Ammunition Filling Factory at St. Mary's.....Fears that a single factory could be easily pinpointed and wiped out in an atomic attack". Just at this time a certain young couple with great plans to build a home, decided to buy an old citrus orchard . covered with blackberries, for one hundred pounds an acre, at Dural. They too, had noticed the atomic attack warning.

The other big announcement was "State Cabinet (Mr. Cahill was Premier) has decided that the Sydney Opera house will be built on the site of Fort Macquarie tram depot at Benelong Point (sic)" There had been 20 other sites suggested. They decided to have a competition to determine the design. It was to have 2 Halls, one to hold 3,500, the other 1,200 and parking for 200 cars. The public would be invited to subscribe towards the cost. In this article they seemed to be more concerned about shifting the trams than anything else. As it was the last trams ran in Sydney in February 1961

In this same paper there is a photo of a cage of Cynomolgus monkeys that had been imported for the manufacture of Salk Polio Vaccine.




Dural Country Club, Men's Lawn Bowls Club



Bush Bashing

Cluster Subdivision Explained.

Kirsten Cowley, Glenorie-Maroota Bioregional Forum.

Subdivision of the rural areas of the Hills Shire has been a long running and contentious issue for well over ten years. In 2012, Hills Shire Council adopted new planning controls that allow for increased housing density on land of 10 hectares or greater, that has been mapped as being of high biodiversity value. The objectives of these planning controls are to "ensure land is developed, managed and conserved in a holistic and sensitive manner to achieve an environmental outcome that ensures the protection of the landscape, biodiversity and rural setting of the land" (Hills Shire Council DCP 2012). In the minimum allowable area of 10 hectares, at least 60% must be a community block and 6 housing blocks are allowed. In a larger area there can be more housing blocks.

Despite the rather lofty environmental sentiments portrayed in the zoning objectives, there are a number of concerns that we have identified that the Hills Community should be aware of.

Many approved cluster subdivisions are unlikely to fulfil the required biodiversity outcomes

There have been a number of cluster subdivisions that have required some level of vegetation clearing for the building lots. This loss of vegetation including trees (mature trees in some cases) on the building lots reduces bird and marsupial habitat. Vegetation clearing also increases erosion which can severely impact our creeks and waterways. On-site wastewater systems can lead to nutrient rich water flowing through to the community lot, which means weed plumes and poor water quality of streams, wetlands and creeks.

Bushfire

With population increases comes a significant risk of bushfire and greater risk of property damage and death during a fire. The risk to our Rural Fire Service volunteers who are fighting these fires also increases. Many of these cluster subdivisions are in areas which have no town water supply, reducing firefighting abilities by land owners and greatly increasing the risks.







Biodiversity management - a costly responsibility

There are significant costs associated with managing the community lots. The vegetation management plans (VMP) which must be developed for the community lots, with controls such as bush regeneration, weed control, fencing and water management. There might be prohibitions on pet ownership. These controls are enforceable and the payment of a bond is required to ensure the VMP is followed. Management of the community lots is similar to strata title within apartment blocks. While this process will be positive for owners who share a common goal of environmental protection, there will be many who find this responsibility too difficult. Which means more risk to the environment.

Disputes between neighbours

Similar to body corporates within strata title there will be the likelihood of disputes over how the community lot is managed. Disputes are relatively common within apartment living and can lead to court action. It's possible that VMPs may not be implemented due to these disputes which will again lower environmental outcomes.

Traffic

With more people there will be more traffic. *Unlike other developments, cluster subdivision developers do not have to contribute to funding road upgrades*. The existing community will therefore have to contend with more traffic as well as degrading roads. With no viable public transport options, adding a cluster subdivision population to the proposed developments along New Line and Old Northern Roads will mean severe traffic stress for those of us who work outside the district.

Conclusion

While there are a few positive outcomes for these cluster subdivision developments including benefits to local business, increases in school populations and better biodiversity management in some cluster subdivisions, there are quite a number of negative outcomes that will impact not only on our unique environment but also on the community at large. We need to be asking Council whether this new type of development is actually meeting its objectives and whether the negative outcomes that result from them are actually worth it.

Save Calabash Bay

A number of residents at Berowra Waters have expressed concern regarding a new proposed development at Calabash Bay. They have set up a public facebook page - Save Calabash Bay.

Here is a summary from their facebook page: "West of the large sandbank of Calabash Bay is zoned Environmental Protection A 'Wetlands'. Where the Wetlands meet the River Settlement - 3 additional blocks of land have been proposed on very steep land. (In addition to the one block that already exists)

DA 1009 and this subdivision was recommended for approval at the last Council Meeting and was deferred only because of a legal challenge.

This Development Application is being assessed under the Local Environmental Plan 1994 because it was originally lodged several weeks before the LEP 2013 was gazetted. DA 1009 has been kept active through several major reincarnations, the latest of which involves picking up 3 huge blocks on the ridge and moving them to the river frontage.

Many residents of Calabash Bay believe the additional development on this wetlands boundary will result in unmanageable environmental stress on the wetlands and river system and unnecessarily introduce buildings into a pristine and uniquely beautiful place that should belong to future generations.

This is a complicated issue with environmental issues at every turn with quite a few 'clever' planning precidents being trail blazed for good measure.

Any advice or suggestions are greatly welcome. A legal challenge may be our only hope. "

A more recent facebook posts suggested that dredging of $3500 \, \text{m}^3$ maybe be required in order for the RFS to safely access the new development.



The tale of the beautiful Peacock Spider

This magnificent little spider - at 4mm he's no bigger than

a match head - is resident in St Ives, and in particular the St Ives Wildflower Garden, known in spider circles as a Peacock Spider hotspot. In fact the Peacock spider is very well connected to the St Ives, Hornsby



and Ku ring gai areas - the species was first discovered locally in 1887 and noted in its use of microscopic abdominal flaps in an elaborate mating display to attract females.

More recently St Ives resident Dr Jurgen Otto, a scientist that specializes in mites, noticed the peacock spiders' display on a walk in St Ives and filmed the amazing display. His videos



have been viewed millions of times on the internet and he has made the spider well-known around the globe, even helping Sir David Attenborough find some for a recent documentary. Dr Otto has said in interviews that he wouldn't live anywhere else, due to these little spiders.

And the name? The Maratus Volans has a set of extendable flaps at the sides of the abdomen which he extends like a peacock's tail when he sees a female spider. The species name—volans—means "flying" in Latin, because in his description of them O.P-Cambridge indicated that the person who sent him the specimens from New South Wales had told him that he had seen the spiders "actually using [the flaps] as wings or supporters to sustain the length of their leaps."[3] This belief has been debunked by the Australasian Arachnological Society.[7][8] Nevertheless, the designation "volans" remains.



That's it for this month's bulletin, we hope you all enjoy your long-awaited holidays!







Last year in November we took our Class 10 over to the Island State of Vanuatu. Our sixteen students got involved in two community service projects, one on the small island of Pele where we helped to put a roof onto their community hall/cyclone evacuation centre, and the second project in Vila where the students built two 3500

litre water storage tanks from woven plastic tubing material.

In June this year another Class 10 travelled to those same two communities in Vanuatu and offered their services. We had 21 students accompanied by six adults: three teachers and three professional past-student volunteers (two who were carpenters, and a tree lopper).

These trips happen in school term time and are scheduled activities where the

students make deep connections with the local people and their culture. They contribute to overcome infrastructure issues of a developing country like Vanuatu, and students also have a hands-on climate change experience by being involved in coral reef rehabilitation and the planting of coral branches in shallow waters. In this way, the world becomes their classroom.

Are we grateful for the blessings and the many gifts we have been given? It might be as simple as being thankful for our health, or our resource, maybe it's thankful for our family, our


All too often it's not until we lose something that we are appreciative of the many blessings we've received.

Wildlife Nest Boxes

Many of our native wildlife need tree hollows for shelter and nesting. It can take 100 years for a tree to develop a suitable hollow and in urban areas there simply aren't enough old trees around. Where natural hollows are limited, the more abundant species like Brush tail Possum and Cockatoos may push out smaller and rarer wildlife making it even harder for their survival. So a good start to keep wildlife abundant is to maintain old trees and their hollows for the habitat they provide.

You can help your local wildlife by building and installing nesting boxes for the more at risk species like Sugar Gliders, Pygmy Possum, Red-rumped Parrots, Micro bats, Pardalotes and cute Ringtail possums.

Each of these species has different requirements and one needs the correct design and dimensions of the box to attract the right animal.

A publication from the Greater Sydney Local Land Services, Build your own Wildlife Nest Box: A guide for Western Sydney is freely available on the internet. The guide gives detailed plans for nest boxes to house various native animals along with instructions for selecting material, installation, cleaning, and monitoring:

Nesting Boxes can be as simple as a hollow log hung in an appropriate location to provide great insulation against cold and heat and last for many years. But make sure you are not stealing

one animal's home to make another. Hollow logs on the ground are important to provide shelter to ground living native animals. They should not be removed to build a nesting box in the tree.

If you're building a box, a warm and strong material like 15 mm hardwood is best to make the nesting box effective and long lived. So why not hang one in sight of where you live and enjoy watching the native animals set up home around your home


