

NorthConnex - Tiny Tunnellers Program

Local school children had the opportunity to learn first-hand what it would be like to work as a NorthConnex engineer on one of Australia's largest infrastructure projects.



The "Tiny Tunnellers" program as it is known is a fun educational session for students to learn from interactive displays and test real-life equipment to see how the NorthConnex engineers and planners are building the longest tunnel in the southern hemisphere.

Up to 50 school kids from 20 local schools had the opportunity to dress up in tunnel safety gear, test out noise real noise testing equipment used on the project, have a close up look at the kinds of rocks coming out of the ground and have a go at constructing their very own model tunnel.

Hornsby MP Matt Kean dropped into join the school holiday program class and speak with the children about their thoughts and ideas on the NothConnex project.

"The school kids were very enthusiastic and asked lots of questions during the presentation session," Mr Kean said.

"Hopefully this program helps to inspire the next generation of tunnellers and encourage them to take part in science, technology, engineering and mathematics subjects at school."

The project team is now also investigating opportunities to develop education resources for secondary schools around STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) education and environment as part of the geography curriculum.



Last month the Galston Rural Fire Brigade celebrated 75 years of service to the community with a magnificent anniversary dinner at the Galston Community Centre.

It was a wonderful evening for old mates to reconnect, honour our Life Members, award long service medals, and reflect back on the brigade's long and impressive history.

We would like to thank everyone who attended and helped make the night a roaring success, including our MC Tim Webster, NSWRFS Commissioner Shane Fitzsimmons, Hornsby Mayor Steve Russell, Local MP Matt Kean, and all our Life Members and former Captains.

Midweek structure fire

This week the brigade was paged to a house fire on Galston Road, near Middle Dural Road. On arrival the Galston crew faced near zero visibility across Galston Road with a thick column of smoke under heavy winds. This was immediately made worse by a running $100 \times 100 \, \mathrm{m}$ grass fire also on the property.

The brigade managed to turnout both our brigade appliances and 11 brigade officers and members to this incident and provided substantial breathing apparatus (BA) manpower while also holding a number of incident command positions.

Due to the asbestos environment of the structure our BA operators needed to be decontaminated and all their gear taken away for thorough cleaning.

Amazing turn out by our firies - especially for a midweek call!





H Rose In Bloom

Throughout temperate parts of the world, roses are esteemed for their fragrance and beauty. Long considered a symbol for love, the modern hybrid roses hold pride of place in floral arrangements. For the herb gardener though, the old fashioned rose is the ultimate herb,

favoured for its deep fragrance, flavor in foods, medicinal properties and usefulness in cosmetics.

The flowering of old shrub roses is lavish and spread over a season. The many-petalled roses are coloured white and pink, through to magenta and deep purple: they are rounder and more flat than modern roses, yet, profuse with thin to mediumthin petals. Most roses that are not picked will bloom again in autumn with scarlet rose hips, tangy but full of vitamin C.






To discover the exuberance of fragrant old roses, seek out those classified as Damasks, Bourbons, Centifolias, Gallicas and Rugosas. Plant them in moderately rich soil, then water and mulch to encourage deep root growth and to conserve moisture. Old-fashioned roses are remarkably resistant to disease and if not sprayed with insecticides can be enjoyed herbally in potpourri and for cosmetics, or culinary purposes.

Since ancient Roman times, rose petals have been pounded into conserves, steeped in honey and wine, or made into fine syrups and cordials. Candied with egg white and a sprinkling of sugar, rose petals become a delicate nibble to end a meal. Enjoy the clear distilled essence of Rose water, to flavor thin butter biscuits or Turkish delight. Stir fragrant rose petals through a compote of summer fruits or sprinkle them beneath a white cake batter before baking.

If the thought of rose potpourris or floral craft fails to enthuse, go out and "smell the roses" for the mere fragrance of roses is supposed to make you feel "well-balanced".

South Dural's 3,000 new homes - have your say

Residents across north western Sydney are being asked to comment on plans to build nearly 3,000 homes in the South Dural development.

Hornsby Council is looking into significant re-zoning of 250 hectares of rural land bound by New Line, Old Northern and Hastings Roads to allow for residential subdivision, and wants public opinion about the re-zoning.

Developers Lyon Group Australia and Folkestone Ltd have in their sights building units, townhouses and houses in a staggered development, starting in 2019. The new-look suburb is dependent on Council's re-zoning rural land for urban use, amending lot sizes and buildings heights, the creating of five precincts to be the subject of future detailed urban layout plans and allowing around 113 hectares of infill residential development. The plans include using existing roads as well as building a new collector road, plus providing a sports field and local parks, while 62ha of threatened and endangered native forest along the Georges River will be left untouched.

Residents' Infrastructure and Planning Alliance spokesperson Andrew Harrington said: "The piece of land known as South Dural is equivalent to 129 Sydney Cricket Grounds and is intended to deliver 2,900 homes including apartments up to six storeys high, and house up to 9,000 people. This will place extra pressure on schools, roads, transport services, and shopping facilities.

"The proposal doesn't include any plans for the development of the road infrastructure surrounding it. These roads are already at capacity so it's unthinkable how they'll cope when there are an extra 9,000 people using them."

But Lyon Group spokesman Mike Milliken said that "there's no question the roads around South Dural are failing; our proposal seeks to be the catalyst to not only fix this but to upgrade roads as new housing comes on line."

Schools are another concern, says Andrew Harrington. "Take Cherrybrook Technology High School - already one of the largest in the state with over 2,000 students. With no school facilities included as part of the South Dural development, there will simply be nowhere for high school age children to go. The end result is that they will have to be shoehorned into Cherrybrook Tech and surrounding schools."

Government and developers on notice with new residents' alliance

With the surge in infrastructure developments like NorthConnex and Metrolink North-West right on their doorstep, concerned Hornsby residents wanting to keep a track of their progress have banded together to form the Residents' Infrastructure and Planning Alliance (RIPA).

"It started because a number of community groups were concerned about the growing number of developments in Hornsby Shire," said spokesperson Jacqui Goddard, a former architect with a background in historic buildings.

"Each group was fighting individual spot fires, and inappropriate development was continuing unchecked. Road

congestion, safety, school overcrowding, pressure on amenities and loss of rural lands came up repeatedly."

She said that while planning for future communities is to be applauded, "it cannot be achieved by listening only to developers and failing to consult the present community. Ignoring communities is unacceptable."

RIPA cites the example of government assurances that initiatives like Metrolink North-West and NorthConnex, designed to alleviate congestion, whilst also announcing urban consolidation measures to increase population densities, as the sort of issues the Alliance will tackle.

Goddard said: "Any benefit to traffic that a Metro may offer to areas such as Cherrybrook will be quickly negated by increased population particularly along arteries such as Castle Hill and New Line Roads. NorthConnex will have little effect on these roads and for areas like Beecroft and Cheltenham the metro offers no benefit."

RIPA plans to have its sizeable voice heard - nine groups representing around 5,500 people - by setting up meetings with politicians and government departments on specific issues, as well as submission writing and Q and A forums. 
His wife Joanna Davidson, a barrister specialising in constitutional law, has her own reasons for working as a volunteer counsellor at Lifeline since 2010.

Glenorie Rural Fire Brigade News

The brigade enjoyed hosting the Glenorie Public School years K,1,2 and 5 for the annual Firewise for Kids day on Friday October 21.

As each year group arrives at the station they learn about what it is to volunteer, the importance of protective clothing and the role of a firefighter. They practice Stop, Drop, Cover and Roll, should their clothing catch alight. One member (Chris Compton) dressed in full CABA (Compressed Air Breathing Apparatus) gear to help overcome children's natural fear of the mask.

The students then break into three groups and rotate around specialist stations. Learning through fun games, discussion and hands on experience, the value of preparation, water in fighting fires, personal protection, family home evacuation and a safe meeting place. They each get a turn on

the '000' simulation phones and get to talk to a real person!

Just a reminder, teach your children to answer a couple of basic questions:

- · What state are you in?
- What is the town or suburb?
- What is the nearest cross street or landmark?

The senior students discussed the value of a household fire plan and answered 3 very important questions. Where will we go in the event of a bush fire threatening our home? How will we get there? What will we take?





It was good to see how much thought they put into their answers.

150 students accompanied by their teachers to attend the station with 14 Rural Fire Service members from several brigades coming together to create an exciting and educational experience, which we all hope will translate into safer homes throughout our district.



Dural and Districts Historical Society

Memories of St Joseph's Church, Dural

In 1960 Father Joe Walsh, the parish priest of St Bernadette's church and school in Castle Hill, bought nine acres of land at the corner of Old Northern Rd and New Line Rd., for six thousand pounds, with the intention of eventually building a church and school. There was a small fibro cottage on the land. The interior walls were removed and the house was converted into a little church, seating about 130 people. The Altar was donated from the old St. Monica's, Northmead, and parishioners provided seating, vestments and furnishings. From about 1973, the little Harmonium organ was played by Shirley Pronk. It was previously in the original St. Bernadette's Church.

Officially Castle Hill, Dural and Kenthurst were in the Parish of St Michael's, Baulkham Hills, which had been established back in the 1850's. In May 1970 Castle Hill became a separate parish responsible for Dural and Kenthurst. The little sandstone Church of St Madeleines at Kenthurst had been built by the parishioners back in about 1915, and a priest came from St Michaels then to say Mass there once a month.

Father Walsh said the first Mass at Dural at 8am on December 4th 1960 and Greg Smith was the altar boy. Of course the Mass was in Latin, the altar against the back wall, and all the ladies wore hats and gloves! And you wouldn't speak a word in the church. Ted and I had 3 small children then, and Paul was the youngest, at six months. In later years we added another 5! There was a great sense of community

in our little group. Some of those who were present at that first Mass were Mr and Mrs Gloster, Mrs Ruby Leslie, Mrs Iris Newman, Mr and Mrs Larkins, Bid and Bill Garretty, The headmaster of Dural School, Mr Jack O'Brien and Peter and Dorothy Brown.

We gathered for Mass every Sunday morning at 8am, and usually one of the monks from the Benedictine Monastery came to say Mass. Father Mark was a great favourite and our little congregation grew until the church was just too small. The little church at Kenthurst, where they had Mass at 9am, was also bursting at the seams.

About this time St. Joseph's was the object of several serious vandalism attacks which made the church unusable. The decision was made to sell both churches and to join with Kenthurst and buy a block of land for a Church/School. So 20 acres were bought in Annangrove Rd where the present St. Madeleines Church/ School is now.

The St. Joseph church was repaired and in Novenber1986 it was sold to the Salvation Army, who have developed the site with a new Church and improved the whole block into a great amenity for the general community.

Galston Parkrun

Parkrun is a collection of free, timed, weekly 5km running events that are held every Saturday morning at various locations around the world. The concept began in the UK in October 2004, with a weekly 5km time trial organised around Bushy Park, London. In the following years, more of these time trials started up around London and the rest of the UK, and in 2010 became known as "parkrun". Founder Paul Sinton-Hewitt continued to facilitate the establishment of new events not just in the UK, but also around the world, and parkrun now operates weekly 5km runs in 14 different countries! The first event in Australia took place at Main Beach, Gold Coast in April 2011, and since then nearly 200 new events have launched in Australia. Galston parkrun launched on 8th October 2016, with an attendance of 250 runners including visitors from all parts of Sydney as well as Newcastle.

Each parkrun event is run completely by volunteers. In order to remain free for all participants, parkrun also relies on support from local and national sponsors. Medibank, Suncorp and Stockland are national sponsors in Australia, and Health Space Hornsby is a local supporter of Galston parkrun.

Parkrun is inclusive of all abilities - participants are free to run, jog or walk at their own pace. Galston parkrun is pramfriendly. Dogs are also allowed (but must be kept on a short lead), and children of all ages are welcome (those under 11 must be accompanied by an adult). Parkrun has proved to be extremely effective in encouraging people to start a regular pattern of exercise, as well as developing strong, close-knit communities.

Each week, a number of volunteer roles need to be filled in order to conduct the event. These include run director, course setup, timekeeper, handing out finish tokens, barcode scanner, marshal, photographer, and tail runner. Everyone is encouraged to volunteer a few times a year. The roles are very straightforward and volunteers are given full instructions on what they need to do.

To register for parkrun, go to www.parkrun.com.au/ register. It is completely free, and you only need to register once. After registering, you receive a personalised barcode which you need to print off and bring along to each run. This barcode is required in order for your time to be recorded.

"Women, collectively, are getting better at supporting each other in the industry, but I think more has to be done to foster this.


"Events such as these are valuable for providing a platform to hear from strong, successful women who have been through challenging circumstances and for them to pass on their knowledge and experiences."

Are You Ready For This Fire Season?




Few people are ever fully prepared for an emergency like a bush fire outbreak and the speed at which the fire front can travel. Consequently, they often allow little time to implement an effective fire defence.

Davey has a list of recommendations for effective management and maintenance for consumers, ahead of the fire season.

- 1. Know the machine: All members of the household need to be proficient in the location, operation and fitting of attachments like inlet and outlet hoses to the fire pump.
- **2. Practice:** A well-rehearsed and documented fire plan is critical to personal survival.







- 3. Fuel Petrol: Many people fail to recognise that petrol has a limited life, losing its volatility and effectively becoming 'stale'. A simple and recommended solution is to change the fuel every two months either by running the pump or draining it of fuel.
- **4. Fuel Diesel:** Has a longer shelf life but it generally needs to be stored at low ambient temperatures to extend the storage time. Major fuel companies expect diesel fuel to have a 12 months or longer life at an ambient temperature of 20 degrees C or six months at an ambient temperature of 30 degrees C.
- **5. Engine oils:** Engine manufacturers offer their own specially branded engine oils to best suit their engines. Synthetic multi-grade engine oil is not a suitable alternative.




- **6. Running the engine regularly:** This will ensure that oil is well distributed around the moving parts to provide best lubrication and a longer working life.
- 7. Air cleaners: The air cleaner or filter needs to be checked and replaced as per the recommendation of the engine manufacturer.

Up the creek

The development angering residents of Calabash Bay

High up in Berowra Creek, Hornsby Council is considering a Development Application for a local landowner to move three landlocked lots held up on a ridge above Calabash Bay, down to the foreshore for homes to be built.

It's a scheme that has angered locals including the seven houses currently at Calabash Bay who say the delicate ecobalance of the area including designated wetlands under Environmental Protections, will be decimated. Local councillor Nathan Tilbury has dubbed it as "inappropriate" and "overdevelopment".

Calabash is a pristine area of the Hawkesbury River so remote it takes 25 minutes in a boat to get there from Berowra. The Bay is a regular spot for canoeists and campers wanting to escape city bustle. The waterway which also features precious mangroves and fisheries, is divided by a sandbank and the only access route for residents and bay users.

Adjacent to the sandbank sits the parcel of land on which the controversial DA has been lodged - to place the lots side by side in four parcels of land which are double existing frontage sizes, along the river frontage in a "boundary readjustment".

"These are contrary to the Council's Plan of Management for Berowra Waters which states there will be not further subdivision less than 40 hectares," said Lee Kemp, Chair of the Association for Berowra Creek.

"To build homes on these lots it's proposed two pontoons and jetties would be built halfway into the bay because the water is so shallow where tinnies carrying building materials could moor, as there are no roads to transport materials in.

"Yet because it's tidal and the water drops to 300mm at low tides throughout the day, this makes development appear unfeasible as you won't get boats across." Another resident Sharon Howarth added: "There's seagrass there that's meant to be a protected marine environment and tinnys going across it would destroy this, though council has denied its existence. This increased water activity would also obstruct the flow of fish up the river and impede other users."

A vote by Hornsby Council in September was stopped due to a last minute legal challenge which Council is currently considering.

In the latest twist in this four year saga, in early October Hornsby councillors and officers travelled up the Hawkesbury River in boats to 'discuss the impacts of the proposed subdivision on the environment and character of the river settlement' said a council spokesman.

While the development contravenes current planning laws, Calabash resident and architect Jill Gleave said on the resident's 'Save Calabash Bay' Facebook page that 'the DA is being assessed under the Local Environmental Plan 1994 because it was lodged just 17 days before the LEP 2013 was gazetted.

'Many residents believe the additional development on this wetlands boundary will result in unmanageable environmental stress on the wetlands and river system and unnecessarily introduce buildings into a pristine and uniquely beautiful area,' she said.

Cllr Nathan Tilbury added that he and fellow councillors were obliged to consider the application under the LEP at the time of initial lodgement. But he added that "the impact on the community is too big and the infrastructure - waste, parking and water is already at capacity so to put four more houses in is going to have a negative impact and result in overdevelopment."

Stephen Berry who represents the landowners and is the DA applicant, said there would be no harm to

seagrass through dredging as hydrographic surveys "showed access compliance 99% of the time." He added that at least one of the dwellings would be a low-slung eco-friendly home that won't need connecting to the grid or water and that there was an absence of seagrass adjoining the sites in question.

He said: "What we have here is a case of nimbyism. The owners have sought to address the concerns of the RMS, fire services and council all along, and the environmental concerns are ill-founded."

The DA was due to go before a Council vote once more, on December 14.

Another district is North District which includes the council areas of Hornsby, Hunters Hill, Kuring-gai, Lane Cove, Northern Beaches, Mosman, North Sydney, Ryde and Willoughby.

These *district plans will directly inform local council planning* and influence the decisions of state agencies.

The District Plan will help Sydney to plan sensibly as we grow. It will underpin our planning for a resilient future that balances new housing, workplaces, infrastructure and services with innovative ways to protect the district's networks of regional parks, waterways and rural beauty – areas that provide much of Sydney's local produce – while offering great spaces for outdoor and adventure activities and an exceptional backdrop for the district's unique mix of communities.

Following consultations with stakeholders (ie councils etc), District Plans will go on exhibition in late **November 2016**, then they move into **Community Consultation**. This is where locals can get involved to help shape what our villages will look like.

Coming in from the cold

The low key weekly get-together with computers having remarkable results with teenagers

Anyone who's ever known someone with autism, Asperger's, ADHD or any of the other autism spectrum disorders will know of the social and mental isolation, the bullying and teasing, the ostracising and the day to day pain people with these conditions endure through no fault of their own.

Until the world is fully educated in treating people who are "different" with the respect and kindness they deserve, they will have to rely on the caring of an educated few - people like Mark

Mentor Max Meltzer, organiser Mark Buckle and participants Josh Biziuk, Brendan Connolly and Tom Dickinson

Buckle, a health professional who runs The Lab at Hornsby RSL.

What's the Lab? Mark explains: "The Lab is a safe place where teenagers who are socially isolated, who don't make friends easily, who sit at home alone on their computers, can come and interact with others and play on computers at the same time."

The Lab takes place every Saturday morning in two 90-minute sessions and is staffed by a team of volunteers with specialist IT skills who get it - they get the needs of these kids and how hanging out with others who are similar, works for everyone.

Kids from nine to 16 - mostly boys - sit at small desks and play on computers. It's a simple concept - but the benefits and outcomes are almost immeasurable.

The extroverts like to be heard as they play; meanwhile the quiet ones who occasionally get distressed by the noise, usually those with Asperger's, don headphones to shut out the noise. There's the occasional altercation, averted with a quite intervention from one of the volunteer mentors in the room.

"The kids have told me that the computers are icebreakers," says Mark who also runs Just Better Care Hornsby. "It provides them with a reason to leave the house. They can come and still sit on their own and not talk - or they can just sit and watch as others play games or watch videos. They're not judged and they can be themselves.

"Parents are delighted they have an avenue to direct their energies into, and somewhere to go to. They can talk to other parents at the coffee shop downstairs, sharing their experiences and concerns. They report their kids wake up excited on a Saturday morning as they have somewhere to go to."

He recounts the moving story of the 13 year-old boy with severe autism who'd been coming to the Lab for a while. He'd never eaten in public before, but one day when it was someone's

birthday and there was a birthday cake on the table, his mother reported excitedly to Mark how he had eaten a huge piece of cake. "To most this is a small thing but to this mother, it spoke volumes about her son's feeling he could trust where he was and relax enough to eat. Apparently he even came back for seconds."

The Lab has been running for four years and has seen around 50 kids come through its doors in Hornsby RSL. Turnover is low - most come and love the non-demanding

space and just stay. They come from a range of backgrounds from all over north western Sydney, attending mainstream and specialised schools during the week. Five laptops were donated, though most kids bring their own.

They're tutored in whatever skill the kids want to have a go at, by mentors skilled at tutoring in design, contouring, programming and games - Minecraft and Roadblocks are popular.

Unexpected newfound skills - aside from upping the communication between other teens - include using the phone for the first time so kids can arrange to meet up between Lab sessions. This in turn has propelled new friendships and outings like bushwalks,camps and picnics. Then there was the birthday invitations - no big deal to most - but to the 12 year-old who received one for the first time in his life, it represented a huge step forward in social acceptance.

And there are successes, though that's never the intention: "One of the boys took to programming like a duck to water and won a Department of Education prize for it and is now programming his own video games."

"And the first of the teenagers to turn 18 has just left the Lab and is now going to TAFE to study welding - something he could never have achieved without the socialisation skills he learnt at the Lab. Two others have left the sessions

because they've landed part-time Saturday jobs.

"It's tapping into the natural abilities and pushing them in a positive direction."


Old School Shed Sets a New Standard



Small Native Trees for Your Garden



By Jutta Hamilton

In selecting suitable small species for smaller gardens there are several factors which need to be considered. Firstly, you need to decide what you mean by "small". For the purpose of this article I have adopted a maximum height of about 10 metres (30 feet) or smaller. Then you need to consider the local growing conditions in comparison to the conditions of the natural habitat of the various species.

Some trees may only grow to shrub size, with a naturally branched habit, but can be trained into a single trunk tree.

The first tree that springs to my mind is Tristaniopsis laurina (Water Gum). It is a small spreading tree with handsome leaves and beautiful pale bare sheen to the bark and dense clusters of yellow flowers around Christmas. Although its natural habitat in this area is along rocky creeks in sandstone gullies, it is quite adaptable to various soils and conditions.

Acmena smithii (Lillypilly) is a small tree with dense dark glossy foliage that grows quite tall in rainforest gullies, but is much shorter in the open garden situation.

Backhousia myrtifolia (Grey Myrtle) is usually found along banks of streams, but can grows on drier hillsides. It has dull dark green foliage and the young branches are covered in fine grey hair. It has cream coloured flowers in summer.

Many of the Bottlebrushes are large shrubs and can form tree- like trunks. Callistemon salignus (Willow Bottlebrush) has a corky bark and creamy flowers, while Callistemon citrinus (Crimson Bottlebrush) has bright red flowers.



Melaleuca linariifolia (Snow- in-summer) is an adaptable small tree with papery bark. It puts on an extraordinary display of white flowers in summer.

Other local native favourites of mine are: Elaeocarpus reticulates (Blueberry Ash), with its fringed flowers and pretty blue berries, Trema tomentose (Native Peach), and Ceratopetalum gummiferum (NSW Christmas Bush).


So why not try one of the above selection when looking for a small tree or large shrub for your garden.




