

What a Headache... What can Chiropractic care do for headache sufferers?

What Causes a Headache?

Even though headaches can feel like the brain itself is hurting, the brain does not have the ability to sense pain. It is actually a cling film-like tissue that wraps around the brain and spinal cord called the "dura" which perceives pain. The dura contains a large amount of blood vessels, and the most common cause of headaches is a change in blood flow to the brain and dura.

What causes pressure on the blood vessel?

There are numerous things that can induce a change in blood flow to the brain such as blood pressure issues, hormone changes (especially spikes in oestrogen) or physical pressure put on the blood vessels directly where they travel through the dura. The most common cause of physical pressure on blood vessels as they travel through the dura surrounding the brain and spinal cord arise from distortions in the position and motion of the bones that make up your skull, called cranial bones. The skull is made up of 8 cranial bones which are interlocked together by fibrous extensions of the bones to form a suture. The cranial bones, although interlocked together still need to have some small degree of motion to pivot and flex, much like the plates of the earth. Sometimes the cranial bones can become jammed through things such as the birthing process, a bump to the head or jaw problems. When the cranial bones cannot flex and move normally, pressure is placed on the underlying dura that attaches to the cranial bones inside the skull. This in turn pulls on the blood vessels that travel through the dura altering blood flow to the brain, creating a headache.

What can I do about my headaches?

Chiropractic treatment can help relieve, monitor and effectively manage most of the causes of headaches mentioned above through hormone profiling, spinal adjustments to maintain good posture and subtle cranial adjustments for long term resolution of headaches and their associated symptoms.



Be Ecowise when building your rural property

When buying property, with a view to building in a rural area with townwater, many buyers are unaware that they will need a wastewater management plan, along with a wastewater treatment system, to process household wastewater, as townwater means that there is no connection to the Sydney Water metropolitan sewerage system.

Aerated Wastewater Systems are very effective in moving and processing the wastewater throughout the various chambers within the treatment system.

From solid waste matter it becomes clear odourless water by the end of the process for disbursement onto your lawn or non edible shrubs, making it an effective irrigation system and eco-friendly at the same time.

The positioning of irrigation sprinklers is critical, as its preferable not to let the wastewater enter natural waterways or dams, as it may upset the aquaculture.

Correct and regular servicing of your wastewater treatment

system is very important to its functionality, and technicians should not be taking short cuts with your servicing.

Quarterly servicing is a local council requirement, with field service reports required to be submitted to council on a quarterly basis, correct servicing requires specialised equipment, not just an empty spring water bottle and some chlorine tablets.

Servicing correctly also requires analysing, checking and recording of chemical, oxygen and ph levels.

Checking of irrigation pumps, aerator, control panel (including alarm), cleaning and checking also of baffles, outlet filter and aerator should also be performed.

Choosing a reputable and qualified wastewater service technician is also critical, as correct and regular servicing and monitoring of your system should prevent most breakdowns, as these can be costly and involve downtime waiting for parts and a technician to come out.



Galston Honour Roll

There are 60 names engraved on the marble fixed to the imposing sandstone Cenotaph in Galston Recreation Reserve, a neat 15 on each side. The names represent men from the district whom voluntarily enlisted in the Australian Imperial Forces during the period 1914-1918. There were two referendums attempting to force national conscription but both were narrowly defeated. As the war progressed much effort had to be made to encourage enlistment as the number of casualties threatened to, and did exceed, the rate of recruitment. The 19 names of the local men who were killed in action, or died of wounds or disease, are identified on the Honour Roll by an asterisk.

At the end of the war the Government was strictly committed to returning all the survivors to Australia as soon as possible in comfortable accommodation on the available ships and the men agreed those who had enlisted earliest had priority. One man remained in France to run a grocery business. Many did not come home until late 1919. The majority were Australian born and the rest were from the U.K. Their ages ranged from a very young 16 to a mature 48 but most were about 24. A few men did not see military action, particularly those who enlisted in 1918 as the war ended in November.

A notable five men received awards for outstanding bravery. The recipients included , A G Newland (Military Medal and Distinguished Conduct Medal), L W Chadwick (MM and Military Cross), S J Calderwood(MC), and R Estell and H Fagan received the MM. The men who served in Gallipoli earned the 1914-15 Star medal, and the British Empire Medal if their service was deemed meritorious. The Anzacs who managed to survive to 1967 were awarded the Anzac Commemorative Medallion and they thought it was worth the 52 years wait. The rest had received the British War medal and the Victory Medal.

The Dural & District Historical Society has been unable to positively link service records with the Honor Roll names J Wilson and T Ward, and seeks community input to resolve the matter. (There are 3069 Wilson service records and many have the same regimental number). The Society has determined there are additional men from the district who enlisted but are not remembered on the Honour Roll. Detailed records have been compiled using all the various sources to document where the men served and the particular actions where they were killed or wounded. These records are available to interested family descendants. Lest we forget.

Sewage Pumping Issues at Glenorie and Galston

During the recent rain events, residents at Galston and Glenorie were awoken at 4am in the morning, but a number of pump alarms. Residents continued to experience pump alarm problems for several hours. Sydney Water were called and attended to site to try and resolve the issues. We also understand that some residents did experience 'back flow' issues with water rising from their toilets.

We contacted Sydney Water for an explanation of the issues residents faced. This was their response:

A Sydney Water spokesperson said:

"Due to the excessive rainfall in the early part of March, it is likely that a large amount of stormwater entered the Galston and Glenorie wastewater system. The extra stormwater flows in our system and the pressure sewerage equipment on each customer's property, caused the alarms to activate."

"When this occurs, customers are encouraged to call Sydney Water on our 24-hour emergency number, 13 20 90, so that we can send out a technician to investigate the issue."

"Sydney Water is undertaking further investigations to determine how stormwater is impacting our wastewater system and to implement measures to reduce the amount of rain water entering the system."

Background:

• Sydney Water provides wastewater services to about 630 properties in Galston and Glenorie. The villages are serviced by a pressure sewerage system, which collects wastewater in a small tank on each property connected to the system and pumps into Sydney Water's network.

- The equipment on each property includes an alarm to alert customers if there is an issue with the system. Alarms are used for all Sydney Water owned pressure sewerage system equipment across greater Sydney.
- Eligible properties that are connected to our pressure sewerage system were provided with a home owner's manual as part of their connection kit. The manual outlines how the pressure sewerage system works, how to use it safely and what to do in an emergency if the alarm activates.
- Stormwater is getting into Sydney Water's wastewater pipes in Galston and Glenorie during heavy rainfall. The information Sydney Water gathers from further investigations will help to improve the operation of the pressure sewerage system and reduce wastewater overflows on properties due to wet weather.
- The Galston and Glenorie Wastewater Scheme was designed to include the 24 strata units that will be connecting in Glenorie. The design also includes a *nominal allowance* for future development within each village. Any new development application for properties within the serviced area must be assessed through Sydney Water's E-Developer process.

State-of-the-Art Hospital for Sydney's North

The northern Sydney community today gets its first look at the new design for the \$200 million Stage 2 redevelopment of Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Hospital featuring integrated, co-located health services.



Minister for Health, Brad Hazzard and Minister for Innovation and Better Regulation and Member for Hornsby, Matt Kean, released the designs to the public before touring the new hospital site with Northern Sydney Local Health District Acting Chief Executive Lee Gregory and local clinicians.

"The new facility will include a refurbished and expanded Emergency Department and a new multi-storey Clinical Services Building. We're investing in communities and their health, not just now but well into the future," Mr Kean said. The Clinical Services Building will accommodate a Medical Assessment Unit, combined Intensive Care and High Dependency Unit, combined Coronary Care and Cardiac Investigations Unit, Ambulatory Care Centre, Transit Lounge, Inpatient Units and combined education space with the University of Sydney and retail space.


The project complements the \$121 million Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Hospital Redevelopment Stage 1, which saw the construction of the STAR building. The STAR building (Surgery, Theatres, Anaesthetics and Recovery) includes eight new operating theatres, a central sterilising service, surgical in-patient units, pathology services, kitchens and improved health information services.

Also planned for the site is a multi-storey carpark.







Days for Girls project: Castle Hill Team

Days for Girls is a non-profit project run by grass roots teams of women worldwide to provide feminine hygiene products to girls to allow them to stay at school all the school year. It has been initiated to create a more dignified, free and educated world through access to lasting feminine hygiene solutions. It survives by donation and volunteer help.

In Castle Hill a dedicated team of women (and some men) from many surrounding suburbs meet on a regular basis to pack, sew and overlock items to go in a pretty cotton bag to send to girls in various developing countries. People outside of this team contribute also by donating money, fabric, thread, underwear, soap and washers. Each item included in the bag requires several processes to complete it. Some volunteers are able to sew or overlock, but many

are required to do the cutting, finishing and packing processes. Quality control is a vital part of the overall process to make sure the kit is robust enough to last 2-3 years.

The kits made by Australian women go to many Pacific Island and South East Asian developing countries. Castle Hill team has sent a delivery to Sri Lanka and is working on a large delivery to go shortly to the Solomon Islands and then another to Cambodia. Educated women who are Days for Girls Ambassadors accompany the kits. Each kit is calculated to cost approximately \$15.00 with volunteer help to make and pack them.



- Footpath clean ups you must stack all steel items separately from other items.
- · Village shops Please observe all timed parking signs and disabled marked areas.
- · Do drive slowly within the shop areas, drive one way in past newsagent and exit past post office. This is safer and helps the flow of traffic. The shops on Galston Road, require 15min parking and reverse out and use roundabout at Arcadia Road to head West.
- 50 kph speed limit should be introduced on Galston Road between roundabouts. This is used in many other shopping village areas to help slow traffic.
- Remember, put your RED Otto bin first in line BEFORE the YELLOW bin. This helps the driver.

Domestic Violence Inspires Hazel's Hornsby to Manly 'Run For Shelter'

From feeling helpless to empowered, Mt Colah local runner Hazel O'Halloran will run from **Hornsby to Manly on Sunday 23 April** to raise funds to support community women's shelters in both suburbs and highlight the desperate need for North Shore women's crisis care.

"Domestic violence affected people close to me and every day news reports feature terrible stories of violence against women," said Hazel. "Inspired by a good friend, I decided to make a difference. My idea was to do a run between two of the North Shore's key women's shelters at Hornsby and Manly to highlight the plight of women affected by domestic violence and the lack of local crisis accommodation."

"My 'Run to Shelter' fundraiser has been planned for well over a year and I am relishing the goal of running the challenging



Hornsby to Manly 35km course. The last 10 kms from The Spit to Manly is really tough, especially given I'm recovering from injuries."

The Hornsby Ku-ringgai and Manly Women's Shelters are community funded and run – without any government assistance. Close to a million dollars is needed each year to keep their doors open. While each shelter provides a 24/7 caseworker, food and accommodation, a team of shelter volunteers work tirelessly without taking a cent to provide everything else needed to keep the shelters running.

"We aim to empower women in crisis to create a better future for themselves," comments Sallianne McClelland, President of the Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Women's Shelter. "After staying with us, 85% of our clients are able to turn their lives around but it's heartbreaking we need to turn away on average 5 women a week due to our limited resources."





The brigade mobilised both heavy appliances and the PC, and consumed 16 bags of absorbent material to render the oil spill safe.

The area was handed to the NSW Police Force who were awaiting the arrival of the RMS for traffic signs.

Thank-you to the attending crews, they performed a great job in a tough work environment - especially at night .

eat anything they wanted. It sounds like the kind of freedom some of us want to-day – freedom to do anything we want to do.



Who loves a thunderstorm? Claps of thunder, streaks of lightning, torrential rain.

Now I love a good storm, but only from the safety of home. It's one thing to enjoy watching a storm, completely another to be caught in one.

Having travelled to the Phillipines numerous times, I witnessed a few storms that are much more precarious than just a lightning show. These are storms where you can sense, even in the safety of home, the danger, unease; an awareness of the ferocity of the event.

Similarly in life, we all get hit with storms, some that threaten to topple our very being. They are unavoidable, it could be financial, relationship, health issues, or work related. The reality is we all face seasons of joy and of sadness.

In Matthew 7:24-27 is the story of the wise and foolish builders, both have built a house, one on sand, one on rock. Both houses have to weather a storm, one house falls, one stands - albeit weather beaten, but still strong.

With so many builders in our area, it is no secret that foundations need to be strong. That the base needs to be sturdy to support that built atop.

Jesus teaches, "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, yet it did not fall". (Matthew 7:24-25)

Whatever season you are facing, you can stand strong if your foundations are secure. Jesus offers a rock on which any storm can be weathered, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

Chanticleer Gardens Open Garden and Gallery Event on Easter Weekend

Many Sydney-siders use the Easter long weekend to take a lovely drive through the North-Western Hills district, and meander through the back roads of Arcadia, down to Berowra Waters. On the way there is Fagan Park, a delightful picnicing area to call into for lunch or fish and chips down at the Waters. There are many cafes open in the area for that flat white or latte or maybe a nice glass of wine as well.

What nicer way to spend the day, either before lunch or after lunch than to pop into Chanticleer Gardens and stroll around this delightful 3 acre English style cottage garden.

In Spring or Autumn this garden is a display of mass plantings of perennials, dahlias, sedums and roses, all planted within a formally structured garden. Entry through crafted wrought iron gates leads you up an avenue of plane trees, where an Australian colonial home sits on the crest of the rise. As you walk through a small parterre, the rear of the garden unfolds before you with a vista of colour. This is a garden of seasons and the autumn perennial season is one of loud bright colours, yellows, mauves blues and reds. It never fails to delight.

It's unusual to be able to grow cherry trees and the myriad of perennials and deciduous trees that Peter and Grada have planted within the temperate Sydney climate. This is possible because Arcadia is situated on the 2nd highest point above sea level for Sydney and this creates the cold climate garden needed to grow many of the plants found here. Winter temperatures will drop below zero.

Although the garden is only fifteen years old it looks more mature than that. Plans to create a large garden where made soon the purchase of the property. Also a decision was made to engage landscape architect, Melinda Bargwanna to design their garden.

Within three months of having purchased the property, Grada and Peter were planting out as many advanced trees as could be

found with the help of an old kubota tractor. The garden has been a work of love created by the owners and maintained with very little outside help.

The row of chanticleer pear trees, Pyrus "Glens Form" planted in the formal courtyard have given the property its name.

At different times of the season people have commented that the garden is very similar to Monet's Garden.

ABC Gardening Australia ran a feature on the garden on May 7th 2016. It was titled "A Work Of Art" and shows the garden in late spring, with Grada painting one of her 'works of art'. abc.net.au/ gardening/stories/s4457261.htm#ABC%20 Gardening

A character feature is the avenue of Golden Elms leading to the French provincial style barn were Grada displays her work. Most of the paintings, either acrylic or silk are of the garden.

Poppies are painted in beautiful colours on silk, with larger acrylics painted on canvas using a palette knife to give an impressionist style to her work. She sells her works in various art shows around Sydney and also does commissions.

If you are a visitor to Sydney this is definitely a nice way to spend a day out of town without going too far..

Orphaned Possum Release

Two juvenile Brushtail Possums came into my care in early December, but their rescue story began in late July. Both were orphaned in separate car accidents, they weight 80 and 90 grams, their eyes were still closed and they had no fur. At that weight they had a reasonable survival chance, if cared for by an

experienced wildlife carer, kept warm and fed special milk formula 4 times a day, toileted and closely monitored.

After 5 month of caring and teaching them how to survive in the wild, they came to our bush property. I kept them inside a large aviary. I avoided all contact with them, and daily gave them a wide range of fresh greenery from native trees and shrubs that were good to eat for possums. Safe in their aviary, they also learned about the local powerful owl and other dangers that came to visit.

After 3 weeks, they were released together into a nesting box. To keep them in good condition I supplied additional food in containers hung in the tree close to their box. That worked very well and it was a delight to see the two climbing in the trees near their new home. One night I woke up and found one of them trying to force entry into our upstairs bedroom window. We put him back into his tree. Within the next month they both ventured further and further afield and found themselves a roomier place to stay: the shed. A trail of destruction, things falling out of shelves and other tell tale signs always led me to their new sleeping place in the shed. After a week or so they slowly made their way into the wild of the Still Creek Catchment. Being two male possums, they have now gone separate ways, now and again I see them one at one time in the vicinity of our yard and hope they are both still about and have found a good home in the valley.

Organisations like Wires and Sydney Wildlife are voluntary organisations licensed by National Parks and Wildlife Service NSW to rescue, foster and



rehabilitate native animals in the Sydney metropolitan area. In most instances, these organisations work to save wildlife that come into contact with our communities.

The main impact on wildlife in Sydney is from developing our natural landscapes. Native animals are affected by traffic, our domesticated cats and dogs, barb wire, fencing, and netting. All these changes are alien and dangerous to Native Fauna and cause injury or death to countless native species.

You can help native wildlife by locking cats and dogs in at night, add a bell to your cat's collars, plant locally native trees, shrubs and groundcovers and preserve natural habitat in your area and drive carefully.
