





Local P Plate Driver Faces Court

A P-plate driver will face court next month on drink driving and dangerous driving charges after an incident in Galston. Just before 1am on Saturday 13 May 2017, emergency services were called to The Galston Club, Arcadia Road, Galston, following reports a man had become trapped under a car. Initial inquiries suggest a 26-year-old man jumped onto the bonnet of the car, which was being driven by a 23-year-old man, before sliding off and becoming stuck under the vehicle. The 26-year-old man was treated at for a broken leg at the scene, before being taken to Westmead Hospital in a stable condition.

Officers attached to Kuring Gai Local Area Command, spoke to the p-plate driver of the car. He was subjected to a breath analysis, which returned a positive reading. A subsequent breath analysis returned an alleged reading of 0.152 The 23-year-old man was arrested and taken to Hornsby Police Station where he was charged with aggravated dangerous driving occasioning grievous bodily harm, driving with a high range PCA and dangerous driving occasioning grievous bodily whilst under the influence.

1 He was granted conditional bail to appear at Hornsby Local Court on 8 June 2017. Crash Investigation Unit is continuing to investigate the circumstances surrounding the incident, and further charges are expected to be laid.





Australia farewells cucumber pioneer

On Sunday 7th May William Elazzi of Glenorie, NSW passed away at home. William was one of the first growers of Lebanese cucumbers in Australia and can be called the father of the Lebanese cucumber industry.



William was a man of many "firsts"; the first to switch to hydroponics; the first to grow

beefsteak tomatoes and, when he reduced his growing activities in Glenorie, the first to set up hydroponic lettuce production in Lebanon allowing him to enjoy two summers per year.

William was not just an innovator, but someone who will be remembered mostly for being a community leader who was always willing to share his knowledge and contacts with others so that they too could prosper. With the influx of migrants from strife torn Lebanon in the eighties, the developing Sydney greenhouse industry played an important role in providing income opportunities for the thousands of migrants. It also provided a lasting legacy on Australian dinner plates.

William's and his wife Amal's hospitality was legendary and their house was open to people from all nationalities and walks of life.

(1) William's friends in the growing industry farewelled him at Our Lady of Lebanon church, Parramatta remembering his contribution to the industry and the friendship that endured the decades.



About The Budget

A brief comment about proposals of the 2017 Federal Government Budget.

The focus is on Home owners and investors in property.

First Home Buyers

First Home Buyers will be able to salary sacrifice \$15,000 per year from July 1st 2017 up to a maximum of \$30,000, to deposit into their Super Fund as savings toward

a deposit for their first home. These pre-tax deposits, as well as deemed earnings on the deposits will be taxed at 15%.

Withdrawals can be made from 1st July 2018 and will be taxed at marginal tax rates, less a 30% offset. The overall benefit could be as high as a 30% increase in savings.

First Home Buyers still need a plan to save outside this arrangement and I am more than happy to help point you in the right direction.

Negative Gearing

From 1 July 2017 deductions for plant and equipment items such as washing machines etc. will only be allowed if the investor purchased them independently from the property purchase. Existing investments will be treated under the existing rules.

From 1st July 2017 investors will not be able to claim tax deductions for travel expenses "related to inspecting, maintaining or collecting rent for a residential rental property".

Negative Gearing implies you are planning to lose money on your investment. Check with Sandra before buying a negatively geared property whatever your income.

Empty Houses

From 7.30pm on budget night 2017, foreign owners will be charged an annual vacancy charge for properties not occupied for six months each year.

Retirees

From 1st July 2018 people aged 65 and older will be able to make a non-taxed contribution of up to $\$300,\!000$ to their Superannuation after selling their home.

There are other options for the retiree to obtain cash out of their home equity without selling. This cash can be used for expenses, health costs, travel and lifestyle, with **no repayments made** until last owner passes or moves into full time care. Please

Affordable Housing

The Capital Gains Tax discount will increase from 50 per cent to 60 per cent for qualifying affordable housing with rent charged below the private rental market rate, and managed through a registered community housing provider. The investment must be held for a minimum period of three years.

It's no accident. we've been around for so long

We were so lucky to grow up in the house that Dad built. The house with the little love hearts marked in sandstone. It's a house that sprawls out over the

landscape. He extended it as he saw fit to accommodate his growing family and his grand vision, stone by stone, to create the little kingdom we know as Talai Estate. David came up with the name 'Talai' after a small fish in New Guinea because he said that's how he and his wife Eleanor felt coming back to Australia, like small fish in a big pond. Through hard work and sheer grit, they forged lives worth living.

David was the epitome of a jack-of-all-trades. He knew how to make anything and if he didn't, he gave it a crack anyway. He has five children, but was a father figure and mentor to countless others. He had seemingly endless patience and energy and persisted with people, particularly if they had lost their way in life.

He enjoyed hard, physical work and he could never sit still. He really set high expectations for us because we saw buildings go up, walls come down and whole landscapes change in such short time frames that we assumed that's how everyone did it. After receiving a voucher for a joy flight from Eleanor for his 40th birthday. David ended up attaining his private pilot's licence and became Director of Schofields Flying Club for a time. He was a compassionate and generous man. He enjoyed helping people through his volunteer work with Eleanor at St Vincent De Paul

It was David's vision to create the massive cellar, buried underground and encroaching into solid sandstone, is remarkable. In its construction, a huge slab of sandstone was removed, cracked down the fault line and was left in the paddock behind the winery.

Driving his tractor, with the sun low in the sky, Dad noticed long shadows cast along the rock. He saw what no one else had, the indentations were fossilised footprints. The Australian Museum identified them as footprints from the Triassic Period, set in the sandstone over 200 million years ago. The name of the ancient creature? Coincidentally, Paracyclotosaurus Davidi.

His vineyard and cellar door became one of his biggest achievements. He

loved nothing more than welcoming friends and strangers onto the property and he astounded people with his generosity and hospitality. He swung open the cellar door and did what he did best, mingling with and entertaining locals and travellers at his monthly Pizza and Pub nights.

He put up a brave fight and a long fight. Many people would have given up after suffering so many blows, but he dusted himself off each time and got on with business after seven major cancer surgeries over seven years.

He wanted us to remember him when he was well. So we will remember him for his generosity and kindness, his intelligence, wit and love of life. We will remember him for the way he loved Eleanor fiercely. We will remember him as Patriarch of the Moss family, local icon and immovable pillar of his community. We will hang on to the image of him happy and contented, dressed in his old clothes, looking out over his day's work, glass of red in hand and setting sun on his face. David has left an indelible mark on all of our hearts. While we mourn his loss, we celebrate his life. We look around this house that Dad built and revel in how lucky we have been to know and love him.

Changing people's lives - one pair of shoes at a time

Viv Kartsounis may have thousands of shoes at her Waitara home - but she'll never wear them - and she has nowhere to put them.

Viv is the woman behind the remarkable local charity Shoes for Planet Earth. It has put sports shoes on the feet of over 51,000 disadvantaged and homeless kids and adults in 20 countries around the world from Rwanda and Papua New Guinea to right here in Sydney.

But her home looks more like a shoe shop with all the donations she receives - and she's calling on the local community to find her a place to store the thousands of pre-loved donated runners that clog every inch of her home.

"I need free storage anywhere between Hornsby and Turramurra," said the mother of two and engineering draughtsperson, for whom the Shoes for Planet Earth is her real passion. "Then I can have my house back."

First steps

It was while Viv was running for Australia in the 100km World Cup competitions in a running career spanning 30 years, that she first matched sports shoes with people in need.

"The Shoes for Planet Earth idea started in 2009 after a visit to South Africa to run the Comrades Marathon, a 92km race between two cities. My partner Nick and I both completed the event and it

was en route that we noticed the poverty. So many people are barefoot - I've seen people wearing plastic bags tied to their feet as they couldn't afford shoes.

"Back in Australia I decided that one way I could make a difference was to send running shoes to these people.

"As a South African by birth, I have the contacts to distribute the shoes and as a runner, I have access to many pairs of shoes from running contacts and friends. Running has been so good to me, and it seemed a natural connection.

"I collected, washed and mailed the

first box of 13 pairs only to realise that we couldn't afford to send shoes internationally on a regular basis. I tried washing them in a cement mixer to save my washing machine, but that didn't work, so now we always ask that people only send clean ones so I'm not washing thousands of shoes."

So Viv decided to look locally - only to realise that there's also a huge need all over Australia for trainers. Now she's known in running circles as the 'Shoe Fairy', with donations flooding in from shoes stores, gyms, podiatrists and clubs, as well as company and school

Stories of the differences the shoes have made are many, with the links with shoes and fitness finely interwoven.

"A contact in the Northern Territory told me it was the happiest day in the lives of the indigenous kids who received the runners we'd



sent them. They'd never had shoes - now they get up early before school and put on these shoes and go for a run, so excited!

"In Africa a man will spend his whole month's salary on a pair of shoes as it's a status symbol. When you have no shoes people think you're poor. People will walk nine kilometres in the freezing cold early morning to work, in thongs or shoes fashioned from old tyres. We sent a container to a church in South Africa and we heard how it changed lives, because it enabled people to get out and get jobs."

Closer to home

Back in Sydney Viv runs a weekly walking group for the inner city homeless, turning up at a food truck weekly, armed with sack loads of runners, encouraging the homeless eating there to come for a walk in the new shoes. "One guy got so involved he lost 19 kilograms.

"Then it went a step further and we trained some of these homeless guys living in shelters to enter the Santa Fun Run and the City to Surf. They won medals for taking part, but then didn't have a wall to hang their medals on.

"A number of these people are still my friends and when I see them in the city I get the biggest, and warmest hug."

Other recipients close to home include include Dress for Success helping women return to the workplace, and flood victims in Moree and Queensland. Dozens of The Big Issue vendors wear Viv's runners, also using them to play soccer when not selling the magazine.

Want to help? Here's how it works

There are 90 permanent collection points around Australia - see the website for where they are. "So you drop your used or nearly new trainers at one of these points like sports shoes shops and podiatrists, and when we have enough pairs, I call a local agency. It might be for the homeless, a women's shelter, a drug and alcohol

rehab place, an indigenous organisation, refugee group or Heart Foundation walking group - and they come and collect them.

"That way we keep it local and sustainable so the shoes aren't clocking up air miles. Sometimes it's like moving chess pieces on a board, matching shoes with local groups and moving them about."

Started with a cash grant and stack of free air miles from Jetstar, today the charity - a modest affair with just two volunteer staff and advisory board of three - runs out of Viv's home quite literally, on a shoestring.


"We get very few financial donations and to help fund the charity we built a cabin in the bush between Lithgow and Mudgee, in the Capertee Valley, the widest canyon in the world. It's on Airbnb and the rent pays for the running the charity."

When they're needed internationally, a worldwide network of roving friends, and even air hostesses do their bit: "I have an air hostess who flies to the Philippines who's a member of a sports club there. When she flies, she distributes our shoes amongst other hostesses and they all put them in their luggage and take them back."

Viv also needs volunteers once she has the free storage, to help her sort the mountain of brightly coloured trainers of all shapes and sizes piling up in her hallway, kitchen, living room and back verandah.

"The storage needs to be close to my house in Waitara so I can meet donors or couriers there or get there soon after, so I can lock them away. Anywhere from Hornsby to Turramurra, preferably in an industrial estate with good access for delivery trucks."

Perhaps the last word should go to another recipient, Andrew Bagnall, a teacher in the Northern Territory, who says in a heartfelt thank-you email to Viv: "I'm lucky enough to see the impact it has on children every day, and when I was walking down the street this morning, I could see children in their shoes, lifting their feet up to show me!"

Wild Walks

Mt Ku-ring-gai to Cowan, via Berowra Waters

17.2 km, 8 hour hard walk

This bushwalk explores some of the most spectacular scenery in the Hornsby area, featuring big views with big hills, so it's really for the regular walker and reasonably fit. Start with a coffee at Mt Ku-ring-gai, then explore the sandstone caves and waterfalls as you wander down Lyrebird Gully to the lovely open salt marsh near Calna Creek Bridge.

Wander alongside Berowra Creek before climbing the infamous Sam's Creek Hill, before enjoying the spectacular views from Naa Badu Lookout. Continue along the Great North Walk enjoying the cliff and



water views before a good, solid lunch at Berowra Waters.

After refuelling there's another hill - I did warn you about the hills! But it's worth it as at the top, you reclaim the picturesque views of Berowra Waters. Continue through the remote area, crossing



a few lovely creeks and finishing the walk at Cowan Station.

It's a stunning day out for those who are fit and up for an adventure, especially if you enjoy a cafe lunch. You can make this walk a bit easier by skipping Lyrebird Gully and starting from Berowra Station. A great way to enjoy the truly wild parts of Sydney on public transport, or by car.

If using public transport: start the walk by catching the train to Mt Kuring-gai Station. Once you leave the platform, turn right at the bottom of the station stairs to follow the Great North Walk sign over the highway, past the shops to the signposted track head at Glenview Rd. There is also free on-street parking in Glenview Rd. The walk finishes at Cowan Station where you can catch the train back home or back to the start of the walk.





Dural and Districts Historical Society

The Government Experimental Farm

Way back in 1907, when our district was the most important area for the growing of Citrus and many other varieties of fruit, the Department of Agriculture purchased 40 acres of an old run down orchard in Galston Road, Dural, to be used as an experimental property for research into fruit disease and good orchard practice. The farm was situated where Uralla Road is now, with the main headquarters house about half way down that road. Mr Archer was the Manager. At the Galston Road entrance there were sandstone columns on either side. When Uralla Rd was declared a Public road in the 1950's, the stone was used at the entrance to one of the properties in the road.

The Experimental Farm was used as a training scheme for boys selected in Great Britain needing agriculture experience. They were called the Dreadnaught Boys, because they were financed by money originally raised in England for the purchase of a Dreadnaught Battleship in 1909. 21 boys were selected and sent out to Dural for training. When W.W.1 was declared some of them were old enough to enlist. One of these was George Rook. Several years ago his daughter, Mrs. Patricia de Groot, gave some photos, which had been taken by George in 1914, to our Historical Society.

There was also an advertised scheme for the training of young woman in suitable agricultural interests "suited to the physique and temperament of women", such as beekeeping, dairying, pig raising, and poultry farming, but it is not known if anybody applied.

An interesting point is that the old pioneers knew where to find underground water. There are several wells, with water only 2 or 3 $\,$ metres below the surface, along the top of the hill in Uralla Rd and in San Remo Pl., but most of them have been filled in. Connection to the main water supply happened after about 1937 when the Water tower in Galston Road was built. It was the last project to be completed under the Depression Relief Scheme.

I was pleased to see the final roadheader Dahlia has been delivered to the NorthConnex project. Named after the Tunnel Manager Ian Webb's daughter this makes 19 roadheaders working on the \$3 billion project.

It is a tradition that the last roadheader is named after the tunnel manager's wife or daughter. While other roadheaders Petra and Meehan Demon have been named by local schools.

The NorthConnex tunnel will connect the Hills M2 Motorway at Pennant Hills with the M1 Pacific Motorway at Wahroonga. Once completed it will save motorists $15\,\mathrm{minutes}$ of travel time and $21\,\mathrm{minutes}$ sets of traffic lights. If you have ever been stuck on Pennant Hills Road during peak hour, you will know how much we need this piece of infrastructure.

The NorthConnex tunnel will be one of the deepest roads reaching up to 90 metres below the ground. The tunneling is currently being carried out by the roadheader machines which can cut thought 5 metres of rock per day, which is incredible. More than 3kms has already been dug and I look forward to watching this project progress.

In more good news for motorists changes have been made to Peats Ferry Road. New 'no-parking' zones will mean there will be two lanes in peak directions between Bridge and Galston roads. The east side will be in operation between 6am and 10am while the west side will be between 3pm and 7pm.

This will ease congestion for motorists travelling to work and home along this road.

An early start with preparing ponies and riders and to make the hour long drive to Terry Hills meant a sleep in wasn't an option.



Galston Equestrian Club – Lots of lovely dressage!





Newly Renovated Playgroup Opening

Arcadia Playgroup recently welcomed local federal MP, Julian Leeser, to officially open their newly renovated Playgroup Shed. Playgroup Coordinators, Dale Carn, Farah Miles and Jo Dawson, welcomed Julian, alongside Arcadia School Principal, Sharon O'Brien, and Arcadia P&C President, Pete Jones, who also participated in the proceedings.

The crowd of onlookers heard about the history of Arcadia Playgroup from its inception in 2013 and the previous challenges faced with regard to inadequate storage space and facilities. Arcadia Playgroup took the opportunity to thank the generous funders of the recent renovation project – the Arcadia Public School P&C Association and the Australian Government's Volunteer Grant Scheme. After failing to secure a local funding source, the Arcadia P&C Association generously covered the vast majority of costs for the project.

Work was completed in January 2017 by a number of local trade businesses including Empire Bathrooms, Dawson Electrical, Arcadia Painting and Abood Excavators. The

Playgroup Coordinators then arranged the internal fitout in April.

Prior to the renovation, the playgroup shed was little more than a dirty tin shed with no internal walls, constant water damage, cracks and holes leaving toys open to the elements and a range of creepy crawlies and no power. It has now been beautifully transformed into a functional storage and play space. Features include freshly painted gyprock walls, modern stencilled concrete floor, a new front patio, storage racks and tubs for all playgroup toys and craft supplies, power, including downlights and power points, guttering, drainage work and repair work to the external structure, blackboard paint on the front door and tea/coffee making facilities. A new chair for breastfeeding mums has also been purchased as well as other

essentials such as a First Aid kit. The federal MP has even offered to personally donate a heater for the Winter months!

Local Arcadian parents, and their babies and toddlers, now have somewhere very special to come together, to enjoy each other's company, to give and receive support when needed and to provide opportunities for their pre-schoolers to socialise with other local kids. The Arcadia Playgroup setting has always been very special, with fabulous outdoor spaces to explore, but now the group has the facilities and shelter needed to grow from strength to strength.

Together for Humanity



Gardening

Some weeds have nice flowers, but.....

I spend a lot of time pulling out weeds on my own property, at Bushcare, Landcare working bees, in National parks and other bush areas. It is surprising

how the same weeds pop up in all these places. I got to thinking – if the people who have these plants could stop them spreading into the bush, how good would that be! I would rather we did not grow these plants at all, but if we want to, here is what needs to be done to stop them spreading:

Cassia (Senna pendula). The seed pods look like beans. When they turn brown, they split and release up to 50 seeds with a long life. To stop spread, remove all the seed pods. If you can't reach them, prune the plant until you can.

Ochna (Mickey Mouse plant) has yellow flowers, then red with black seeds. We have an ongoing battle with these plants in Carrs Bush. Remove all the seeds before they go black.

 $\label{passion} \textbf{Passionfruit} \ seedlings \ grow \ in \ bushland \ everywhere. \ Don't \ let$ seeds be spread by people, animals or birds.

Seaside daisy spreads quickly and needs multiple visits to remove it. Seeds are spread by wind. Cut all dead flowers off before they go to seed.

Japanese honeysuckle is a real nuisance. Remove the black seeds before birds can spread them. Prune the plant so you can reach them all.

Formosan lily. Cut the flowers off as soon as they are finished to prevent the seed capsules growing.

Agapanthus. This popular plant is becoming weedy and is forecast to be a major problem. Cut the flower heads off as soon as they are finished to prevent many black seeds forming.

There are many other introduced plants that invade the bush, like Jacaranda, Camphor laurel, Lantana, Privet, Crofton weed, Whisky grass, Mothvine, Arum lily, Mother of millions, Fishbone fern, Trad, Bridal creeper, Fireweed, Blackberry, Farmers friend. If we all controlled these plants on our own properties and nature strips,

far fewer of them would end up in the bush. I realise this is a big ask, but it would help enormously.




