# **Lurline Chamber Orchestra and Rising Stars for The Galston Concerts**

Sunday 17 September finds the Lurline Chamber Orchestra and Rising Stars pianists playing for The Galston Concerts.

Joshua Zhi, also 10, a prizewinner in Belgium, Italy and a special Jury Prize at the St Petersburg competition, will perform the Concerto in D by Josef Haydn as soloist with the Lurliners.

The Lurline Orchestra unites leading Sydney string players whose past years in such groups as the Vienna Chamber Orchestra, Sydney Symphony and Australian Chamber Orchestra have been set aside for their preferred careers as freelance musicians

As reported by residents at the Community Meeting on Friday 25th August, the trucks have been arriving at a rate of 20 truck and dogs per day since then. One resident reported that when they spoke to the foreman at the site, he said he thought works would continue until July 2019, although this has yet to be substantiated. Ray Hadley from 2GB took up the residents concerns after they had continual problems trying to get Hornsby Council to review the situation. Ray spoke on air to Matt Kean, Julian Leeser and Mayor Steve Russell. Julian Leeser attended the residents meeting together with Deputy Mayor Michael Hutchense, a representative from Matt Kean's office and two Council Officers.

Many issues were raised at the Community Meeting, the main points were:

- 1. Trucks and dogs travelling too fast and 'running people off the road'.
- 2. Truck and dogs lining up along Blacks and Arcadia Road (outside Arcadia Public School). Sometimes up to 6 trucks & dogs waiting, causing problems at school drop off and pick up time
- 3. Damage to the local roads, particularly Geelans Road which

is clearly not designed for these types of heavy trucks, 20 per day for over 12 months and potentially longer.

- 4. Works being undertaken appear to be way outside what was proposed on the DAs submitted.
- 5. Probable removal of more trees than the DA suggested (Council will now review)
- 6. The vegetation management/sediment controls were not being adhered to
- 7. Far more fill appears to being delivered to site than the DA suggested
- 8. Some of the fill was reported as being dirty fill, ie had builders rubble in it. Pictures of dirty fill were made available to Ray Hadley and State/Council Officers.
- 9. Rock breaking noise from 7am to late in the day being heard as far away as Galston.
- 10. Dust generated from the site blowing around, which is not
  - good for neighbours health nor the fact they are all using water tanks.

11. DA says there has been continuous dog boarding on the site, but there was no kennels noted on the site in 2011 (as shown in picture of the site in 2011). Comparison of the site from 2011 to 2017 also shows the extent of the earthworks.

This is not an exhaustive list of the points raised, but some of the main items.

The residents asked the Council to stop the work on the site, given all the evidence and pictures that had been provided. The Council refused to do this immediately. They advised they would have to arrange a survey to see if the amount of fill that had been delivered was in excess of that described in the DA (this raised laughter from all residents present given the height and scale of the soil on the property). Council further advised they would ask the EPA to sample more of the soil on site.

Residents were shocked that the Council didn't have the power to stop the work immediately. How can this be, given the DA suggested 10-12 weeks and it had now been going on for over 12 months, and looking at the size and scale of the earthworks compared to the DA.

The Hornsby Police also attended the meeting and agreed to provide additional police patrols to ensure the trucks and dogs abide by road rules. (In the last week following the meeting, several trucks were seen to be booked for various offences).

# **News from Glenorie Progress Association**

The Association wants you all to be privy to all the developments as they happen and, to that end, we have been active in apprising all 'stakeholders' of the application for a full liquor licence by the Glenorie Bakery. Submissions closed on 26 August.

A great initiative also of the Hornsby Council Waste Division has been to remove the clothing bins opposite the Glenorie Village Shops and make the area free from the possibility of further illegal dumping. With Michael Hutchence, Deputy Mayor of Hornsby Council, the GPA has circulated drawings for community consultation on the beautification of the Glenorie bus bay area. You may have seen those plans on the local noticeboards (see also page 27) and we are happy to announce that, after input from many locals, Council will proceed with the beautification project. Trees may be trimmed or removed, the planting will not inhibit sight lines from Cairnes Road, and the logs will be termite treated. As you read this it may already have happened!

Last month, we told you about exciting happenings at the Glenorie Hall with regard to the Environment Centre. We plan to run a Fire Awareness Day in early October for all residents of the Glenorie, Hillside, Maroota, South Maroota and Arcadia RFS areas. Our major focus will be on educating new residents on preparing for bushfires, including those residents in cluster developments, however, all are welcome. # **Time to Top Dress lawns**

#### Spring is here.

Now is the perfect time to start preparing your lawns for the Spring & Summer months ahead. Only top dress your lawns when the weather is warm enough for growth. Otherwise the lawn will die under the soil.

These days we top dress to correct poor nutrition, fill in low spots and correct uneven areas in the lawn and give your lawns that lush green look.

On new lawns, top dressing is generally not required, but can be done to fill in any gaps or holes. However, we recommend that you leave it for a few months, and most of those issues will take care of themselves. Occasionally, after a settling period, some areas of a new lawn may need a slight correction to desired levels. Fertilize a few weeks prior to top dressing to ensure maximum growth at the time. Using a top dressing soil mix.

For established lawns that need top dressing, prior to doing so, mow lawn low and try and to use a catcher. Spread the mix evenly over the desired area, then rake, level lawn or broom it into the lawn profile. Never top dress more than 1cm in a single application, making sure the grass tips are still exposed. And at all times keep the soil moist until there is no soil visible on top of the lawn.

# **Nati Roses a Brief History**

Nati Roses had it's origins in 1944, when Giuseppe (Joe) Nati purchased 5 acres of land in North Ryde. Here he grew top quality flowers and quickly established himself as one of Sydney's leading suppliers of fresh cut flowers to the local flower industry.

In 1964, Joe and his wife, Antoinette decided that they needed a larger area to grow their flowers so they purchased a 20 acre property at Middle Dural. They were now joined by their sons, Sam and Pat and the decision was made to concentrate solely on growing roses for the ever increasing demand for high quality blooms required for weddings and other social occasions. In 1972, Joseph decided to join the family business and he took over the marketing role.

In 1990 an expansion plan was put into place to ensure consistency of supply. This was achieved by the construction of greenhouses, which provided a controlled environment through





heating, making possible year round production.

It was about this time that the family decided to open it's doors to the public, providing an onsite shop where customers could purchase fresh flowers.

Nati Roses has always been involved in helping local charities and community projects. In 2009, Pat was awarded the' Order of Australia' for his services to charities, in particular the Special Olympics of Australia where he was the Chairman of the Fundraising Committee. In 2006 he was also awarded the title of ' Community Father of the Year'. Through positive radio and press coverage this involvement has helped raise the profile of Nati Roses.

Nati Roses is a member of the Hawkesbury Harvest Trail, an organisation which encourages tourists to visit farms in the Sydney basin and experience the local production in the area.

## Hornsby Rural Area – Where To From Here?

Chairman Tony Jones, Hornsby Rural Areas Association

Well over 50 years ago the current zonings were established, villages were recognised, working farms existed and a lovely, beautiful area evolved.

50 years on and nothing has changed regarding zonings, whilst everything else has changed dramatically. There are now virtually no working farms or orchards in existence; the residents of the village areas have been allowed to subdivide their land (sometimes with one block becoming three); multiple SEPP 5 aged care/residential facilities have been approved on the village boundaries; all with no thought to our roadways which are already clogged badly.

For 15 years now the warning bells have been sounding – medium density housing encroaching on our fringes – South Dural – developers won't stop – and the State Government is pushing hard to satisfy a relentless demand for more housing in Sydney.

Three years ago Hornsby Council surveyed its' rural area asking if the residents wanted change – change in a good way that allowed growth, gave population to schools, local businesses and facilities, but vitally preserved the rural ambience for at least another one or two generations. Reducing village surrounds from 5 acre lots to 1 acre, extending the 5 acre zoning into what is now 25 acre areas and allowing the potential for the creation of new Villages – all designed to make SEPP5 much more difficult to achieve adjoining the village areas, whilst promoting affordability and growth and allowing the current owners of this land to retain as is if they so want.

This survey response resoundingly supported change in the rural area – it empowered Council to act on these results.

Three years on and Council has only acted on part of the responses. We now face another Council election (having gone

through an almost farcical amalgamation process). Our State Government's actions have impacted the financial viability of our Council – less area, less rates - NO Compensation! And to top it off – now no amalgamation. Who will have to foot the bill? Us, obviously.

On top of this, the Liberal Party has seen fit to dump Steve Russell as Mayor (the man who has stood up fiercely for the rights of our shire and embarrassed the Government about the inequity of the non-amalgamation debacle – rightly so) and "replaced" him with the candidate they wouldn't pre-select again after 43 years for his Federal Government seat.

The Liberal Party are playing a power and control game that ignores the wishes of the residents and will, in all probability, result in a lack lustre Council, which will be indecisive and unfocussed. We desperately need strength, focus and determination to structure this shire, and our rural area in particular, in a way that will protect it for future generations whilst accommodating reasonable growth and ensuring its financial viability.

We have reviewed the Candidates for the Hornsby Shire Council Mayoral Role (the guiding force of the Council) and the Councillors and it is our strong feeling that , for the first time, we need to seriously consider voting below the line rather than just accepting what any particular party encompasses with its' above the line grouping.

We hope you agree and vote carefully to ensure the best outcome for the residents of Hornsby Shire. Select those candidates that you know will do the best for our area.

This is the only way to get responsible people with focus, energy and integrity onto our Council to carry us forward for the next term.

## **Telstra/NBN Meeting at Dural Country Club**

Following continual complaints by Arcadian, Glenorie and Galston residents about the quality (or lack of) our Telstra phone and internet services, Julian Leeser MP organised a Community Forum at Dural Country Club on 23rd August. This gave residents the opportunity to tell Telstra of their problems and also to learn how this area will be serviced by NBN Co.

Telstra were bombarded with complaints, and appeared to be quite surprised by the number and depth of the complaints. (you would think that they would have done a bit of homework first before attending..), but they tried to answer all the questions and further agreed to another community meeting in late September to address more concerns. At the meeting they noted each residents ongoing problems and agreed to provide an answer by the September meeting.

NBN Co outlined the services which will be provided to our local areas. The villages of Glenorie, Galston and Round Corner will be served by Fibre to the Curb (FTTC) (American spelling!) An optic fibre line will be run to the street front of your premises. Existing copper technology will then be used to make the final part of the NBN broadband access network connection. The acreage areas are planned to receive NBN Fixed Wireless Technology. In this circumstance data travels from a transmission tower located as much as 14kms from a premises to a rooftop antenna that has been fitted by an approved nbn<sup>™</sup> Installer. This means most of the acreage properties will loose their fixed landlines (changeover is forced 18 months after NBN Wireless becomes available).

Appeals were made by NBN that if anyone was interested in

having a tower on their property, they should contact NBN Co as locations were still being sought. Questions were raised regarding quality of service given we are in the 'Hills' district. NBN Co confirmed that 'line of sight' to the towers was needed to obtain good signal. When questioned about properties surrounded by trees, they suggested the trees be trimmed (!!). Audience gasps were heard!

It was also noted that as landlines would be discontinued, there would be no internet during a blackout as the home NBN boxes required power. NBN Co said they would be working with providers of back to base alarms systems, medical alarms and other devices using landlines so an alternative solution is found.

Rollout of the NBN is planned to be completed by 2020.

If there is a fire in your area you will find its alert level on the NSW RFS website and in the 'Fires Near Me' app. You need to keep track of the alert level so you know what you should do.

#### Step 4: Keep all the bush fire information numbers, websites and the smartphone app

In a bush fire, it's important that you stay up to date on conditions in your area.

# The Galston Uniting Church A Little Bit More of Our Story: Part 2

In the last instalment, we learned about the beginnings of the Dural Uniting parish under the Methodist-Wesleyan church banner. This instalment looks at some of the activities that took place as part of the life of the church community.

Anniversaries were a particularly special occasion. The 1889 Anniversary at Dural Church was held on a very wet day on The Queen's Birthday weekend, the Queen at that time being Victoria. It was attended by about 150 people who did not have the air conditioned, water tight motor cars of today. A very generous lunch was served and everyone enjoyed themselves in spite of the heavy rain.

Another great occasion was the first ever Harvest Festival held in Dural Church on 23rd October, 1918, when the first world war was still in progress. This district was particularly favoured having two citrus fruit harvests and one of summer fruits and many high quality eggs.

The annual Sunday School Picnic was held in Parramatta Park in 1923. Everyone just piled onto the backs of two trucks, and all hands helped with the catering, sandwiches, cakes, raspberry syrup, fresh local fruit in season. Running races, egg and spoon, sack races were organised.

A Young People's Club was commenced in 1940 with a major activity being Amateur Acting. The first presentation was in November 1940 in Dural Memorial Hall, and their productions continued for a number of years. In 1950, a tennis club was formed. Many keen volunteer workers built a tennis court at the rear of the Dural property, and tennis became an important youth activity on Saturday afternoons.

The Young People's Club became the Methodist Youth Fellowship and did much of its own organisation, continuing into the 1960s.

Another part of the church's life involved the maintenance of the cemetery. The old Methodist-Wesleyan Cemetery, now Galston Uniting Church Cemetery, began in 1865. The cemetery is located in Derriwong Lane at Dural and can just be seen from Old Northern Road, Dural since the clearing of the land near the Dural Memorial Hall. There was a laneway belonging to the church which ran from Old Northern Road down to Derriwong Lane, and it was used by undertakers with their horses to take a shorter route to the cemetery with the coffins.

This quiet little spot is backed with bushland to the west. The earliest grave is that of William Hunt in 1865, the second oldest being the 1867 grave of Harriett Warner nee Kentwell (formerly widow of James Roughley).

John Charles Hunt, the first President of Hornsby Shire Council (formed in 1906), is probably the most distinguished person buried in that cemetery. Mr. Hunt died in 1930. The family of Samuel Fagan also rests there. Samuel died in 1948 and his wife Emma in 1956. Their only surviving son Bruce who gifted Fagan Park to this community died in 1984.

## Dural and District Historical Society Berowra Floods, 1942

From R. Fishburn's Story in Galston News Sept. 1975

It was during World War 2, when an invasion of the Australian mainland by the Japanese seemed imminent, that Berowra Waters figured in an almost disastrous incident. It was March, 1942.

The Naval Control Board set up a plan to combat any possible Japanese amphibious attack on the eastern waterways by keeping all small craft out of enemy hands. The plan was the assembly of all small craft at a central control point, where, in the event of an invasion, all vessels could be quickly destroyed. Every type of craft---row boats, motor boats, luxury cruisers and house boats headed for cover at the dispersal point, Berowra Waters. After being individually marked and registered for future identification, all craft were towed to the final destination, Crosslands Flats. By April, 1700 craft were catered for at this point and another 300 were moored at Berowra Waters awaiting their final move to safety.

Work progressed well up to this stage, but then the rain commenced, and soon boats became flooded and the task of the horses hauling the boats had to cease, because of mud.

The river had been rising for two days and, on the third day, began to break its banks. After checking that all craft were securely tied, all workmen, except two, headed back as usual to Berowra Waters. The two who remained lived in a house overlooking the river flats and cared for the horses.

That night the two men were startled by a terrific roar, made by a raging river. Later it was confirmed that logs had jammed behind Galston Gorge Bridge, forming a dam and when pressure



had released them the wall of water rushed down Berowra Creek, picking up boats and whatever was in its way.

The two workmen rescued two elderly ladies who lived in a cottage which was 25 feet above the normal river level. These men, as well as their workmates at Berowra Waters Ferry, stood by helpless, watching craft go crashing down stream. Owing to the irregular course of the river and its rocky foreshores, it seemed that every vessel would be smashed to pieces, but the majority of boats were salvaged

Another war time measure to confuse the expected Japanese invaders was to take down every street sign and road notice. Nothing was wasted, and one home in Blacks road had its veranda lined with the street signs that had been taken down! It was years after the war finished before the street signs were replaced.

Those of us who lived through the war years, would remember the severe rationing of petrol, butter, sugar, meat, and clothes. We did not waste a thing then and perhaps we should be less wasteful of our precious resources now.

At the next meeting of the Dural Historical Society at the History Cottage, next to the Cenotaph, on Saturday, 9th September, the guest speaker will be Garry Smith who will speak about "Promise of better husbands to come" All welcome. The A.G.M. will be held in October.

Paul, a professor in aquatic ecology at Victoria University in Melbourne, realised that there are no single definitive accounts of the Hawkesbury, the longest coastal river in NSW with a long Aboriginal history, that adequately describes the ecology of the river and how it has informed human use and their patterns of settlement, and in turn, how the river has been affected by those settlements and their people.

Please join us as we listen to Paul speak about his recently published book 'The Hawkesbury River: A Social and Natural History'. In his talk, Paul will discuss the geography, geology, hydrology and ecology of the river through to its use by Aboriginal and European people and its role in transport, defence and culture.

# Galston Equestrian Club Jumping, dressage and important safety training!

Sunday 13th August saw the return of popular instructor Tana Subotic running a showjumping clinic. "Get on the phone, don't come alone" was a fun concept to grab a friend and share a showjump lesson at the height of your choice. Fourteen riders participated with heights ranging from cross rails to 90cm, with their ages ranging from the midteens to early fifties. Everyone had a fun day and learnt so much, and it was great to see the participants improving in their lessons and their confidence building. It shows that everyone can have a go at jumping if you are given the encouragement and correct coaching. Thanks to everyone who helped on the day.

In Australia alone, there has been an average of 10 hospitalisations per day over a recent 3 year period due to horse riding activity, and from 2000 to 2012, there were 98 fatalities of which 74% (6 per year) were a result from a fall from a horse. Scary statistics! GEC organised for Lindsay Nylund, the founder of Horse Rider Fall Safety Training to run a clinic at our grounds for interested riders on 22nd July. The clinic was fully booked with most riders requesting more advanced training. Lindsay is a former Olympic gymnast and coach, and highly qualified to develop the fall safety training program in consultation doctors, scientists and industry professionals. This program has now been recognised internationally as a world-best in rider safety. We learnt the basics of the brace position, "tuck and roll", tried simulations of a quick response to a



fall using safety mats and foam shapes, and even rode "Naughty Ed", the mechanical horse trying to unseat us! Lindsay is a fabulous coach and made the learning such fun, while giving us the tools to potentially reduce serious injury or save our lives. It was such valuable instruction for

anyone riding, regardless of ability, and I would suggest mandatory for all young riders as they start a long association with horses. Lindsay can be contacted at : horseriderfallsafety.com.au

How is it that the extraordinary became ordinary? That the supernatural became just natural?

Last month we looked at the life of Jesus, he healed the sick, the blind, the lame, he rose people from the dead! He changed water to wine, he withered a fig tree through a word. Extraordinary!

Yet, history hasn't been kind to Jesus. What Jesus did and how the Holy Spirit moved 2000 years has seemingly been diluted so that now church appears more about rules, routines, and rituals ... and the miraculous has morphed into religion.

Last month we spoke of the revelation that comes when you truly understand that Jesus lived. A knowledge that Jesus cares for us, for the broken and the lost, the sick and lame, not the religious and pious.

Jesus lived and He was fun. Sinners and tax collectors gathered around him, they ate with him, drank with him, enjoyed time with him.

Jesus was fun! Fun to be with, fun to hang around, He was loving, joyous and made you feel comfortable and accepted. He lived to reach the lost, He died to save us all.

If only Christians truly understood that Jesus died for them. Not just read about it in their bible, or attended church on Good Friday.

# A Blessing in Disguise

In a bygone era, cotton was king in the Deep South of the United States. A typical example of the region's agricultural economy was the district surrounding the town of Enterprise in the state of Alabama. All the farmers in this locality pinned their hopes and entire livelihoods on cotton; they invested their savings and set aside most of their farms to the production of this crop.

But they had reckoned without a pest called the boll weevil. Over a number of years, this insect wreaked havoc and virtually devastated the cotton crop. Local farmers were facing economic ruin. If only it was truly revealed.

It would transform our thinking, our way of life.

Jesus foretold His death, even welcomed it ... for what it represented. He died so that we could have grace. He died so that our sins were washed away.

In a sense, Jesus is the ultimate tag team wrestler! Just as it seems we have no hope, He dives in for us and takes our burden and even leads us to victory.

"Come to me all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest". (Matthew 11:28).

Jesus died so that we could be forgiven. We all sin, we will all continue to sin, yet when we take Jesus as our saviour we are freed from the bondage of sin.

This is possibly the greatest revelation missing from most Christians ... we are FREE from sin. We are saved by grace.

You say "Oh, I know that". Well do you suffer from guilt? Regret? The "if only" syndrome, if only I hadn't done that, or if only I had.

We are freed from this burden, we are freed from this battle that seems constant in our minds.

There is freedom available to us all, a life without regret and guilt: a life full of love, joy, peace.

If you are burdened by guilt, shame, or regret, you no longer need to be. That battle that thrives in your mind can be replaced by a spiritual peace, that shame replaced by joy, and the guilt replaced by love.

Jesus is fun, and offers a life of joy not rules or burdens! Pray to Jesus and seek His cleansing to release those areas of your life that have weighed you down.

But farmers are resilient and resourceful people, and these Alabama farmers displayed such qualities in their reaction to this crisis. They decided to diversify their crops with an emphasis on the planting of peanuts. And what happened? They earned more money through mixed farming and peanut production than they ever did through growing cotton. That region of Alabama became prosperous. What had looked to be a disaster became the forerunner of prosperity. The coming of the boll weevil proved to be a blessing in disguise.

A decade later, the farmers in that area decided to erect a monument in honour of the boll weevil, and if you ever visit the town of Enterprise in Alabama you will find this unusual

monument to a pest. Its inscription contains the following words: "In profound appreciation to the boll weevil and what it has done as the herald of prosperity."

Has your life been attacked by a 'boll weevil' recently? Have you been jolted out of a comfortable and happy routine? Has a loved one died, or has a friend moved away, or is your social circle changing? Have you experienced financial setbacks or a loss of health or position? Perhaps you are wondering where God is in your current situation.

In such circumstances we need to remember that where God leads, He prepares and provides. Perhaps in your current situation you are learning lessons and gaining experiences that will equip you for future challenges. Whatever difficulty you are enduring may be your 'boll weevil', the doorway to a deeper experience of God and a closer walk with Jesus.

# **Glenorie Mission Church**

What is your biggest difficulty as a Christian? Is it hardest to simply live for Christ day by day? Is your biggest problem witnessing for Christ? Are you living a defeated life instead of knowing victory in Christ?

Do you realise that God the Father has given you the Holy Spirit to live in your heart to solve these problems for you?

It is the Holy Spirit alone who can enable us to live the Christian life day by day. He takes the full and complete salvation Christ purchased for us and applies it to our daily experience. In other words, the Holy Spirit was sent to make real to us all that Christ made possible for us on the Cross.

#### Who is the indwelling Spirit and what is He like?

We need to be clear first of all regarding the Person of the Holy Spirit as well as his work.

The Bible tells us about both.

The various names given to the Holy Spirit in the Bible reveal something of His personality and character. For example He is called the 'eternal Spirit' (Hebrews 9:14) and is often referred to as the 'Spirit of God' (Romans 8:9).

Perhaps His most familiar title, 'the Holy Spirit', tells us more than any other. 'Holy Spirit' immediately suggests holiness, purity, cleansing, sanctifying, and other similar thoughts.

The Hebrew word for 'Spirit' is often translated 'breath' in other places in the Bible. It reminds us that He is the Unseen One, the presence of God within us who does not draw attention to Himself but to Jesus Christ.

The Bible clearly tells us that the Holy Spirit indwells every believer. He enters when Christ enters. No one needs to plead with Him to come in John 14:16 and 17 states : 'I will ask the Father and he will give you another counsellor to be with you for ever... he lives with you and shall be in you'.

You cannot divide the Trinity, that is God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. If you receive One you receive the Others also. Do not allow anyone to take that truth from you or cast doubts on it. Read and believe these verses: 1 Corinthians 3:16 and 6:19, John 4:13-15; Romans 8:9b. Notice the strong words of the last reference: If anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ he does not belong to Christ.

This indwelling makes all the other work of the Holy Spirit possible and is part of the birthright of every child of God. (by Rev E.C.Long) to be continued.

# Starting "Right" with Bees

A lot of people are taking renewed interest in the possibility of keeping a hive of bees. There is a great deal of awareness of the fact that bees in different parts of the world are suffering setbacks from pesticides and disease problems, and also that there is a new way of keeping bees in which the honey can be collected with a tap. In fact, the full story in both cases involves more than meets the eye.

Its certainly true that the widespread use of pesticides/insecticides called Neonicinitoids, (also known as Neo-nics) is having a calamitous effect, and its confusing that they are sold under various names. One of these chemicals is "imacloroprid" which is the active ingredient of sprays such as Confidor, and some very effective cockroach baits. Being systemic, imacloroprid can have a long lasting effect on the soil that transmits to the sap of plants, and the nectar that bees forage on. A gardener asked me why there were fewer bees around his passionfruit, and I soon found out that our largest retailer for the home handyman was still selling this product in their garden section.

So, we concluded that having sprayed his plants, he now has to wait many years until the residual effect dissipates. A similar chemical which was sold as "Gaucho" was banned in France after vast areas were affected, but you still buy Confidor and similar sprays, right here near Round Corner....bad sprays are just the beginning.

As for keeping bees in a box that requires no more than turning a tap to drain out the honey, people don't realise what they are missing!

For me, beekeeping was a window onto sheer magic, when I was only about 11 years old. An elderly Englishman in Forbes encouraged my disbelief in what I was seeing, and in no time he gave me a box with which to get started. Next, he supplied a swarm that had come from one of these two amazing colonies he had in his back yard. Perhaps there was extra drama when we were to transfer the swarm to the box, and like most people, I had no idea how this could be done. Its actually remarkably easy, when you are not too hesitant.

The first key to success with bees is to be prepared to learn from the bees themselves, and to seek guidance from a knowledgeable beekeeper. Unfortunately, there is a lot of misunderstanding and complexity disseminated through beekeeping clubs, but I can't do much about that. Often the first mistake people make is to go and buy the big white bee suit, and some heavy gloves. Its as if they are saying, "now you will do as I demand and you can't object".

Now, when they try to handle the bees, they are so hot and clumsy, its not surprising that the bees react. Far better to observe them carefully, and approach them calmly with a fair amount of smoke ( when they are sitting on honey), to see what they will do. Their first instinct will probably be to run into the hive, and cluster together until everyone makes up their mind what to do. You need to have a gentle plan. Maybe, the first thing to do is to lift up a frame and check their brood. See if there are small black beetles running around. These are called Small Hive Beetles, surprisingly enough, and they are a major nuisance. Their proper name is sp. athena Tumida, and they can infect the honey with a yeast that turns it putrid in no time. The bees simply leave in a hurry. Its a good reason for eliminating any feral bees that nest in the wall of your house, because the damage done is awful.

Arcadia is a great place to keep bees. So is just about everywhere else. You don't need a lot of space, just an area where the bees will not respond to fluorescent lights at night, or the proximity of vibrations from mowers. Its fairly easy to recover the cost of setting up within the first year, all going well. I suggest that you need about \$450 to

If you are keen to create a tropical garden effect or searching for something suitable to under-plant in shade where nothing grows, then bromeliads are perfect.

They are, very easy to grow, easy care, inexpensive and reward the grower with spectacular, long lasting blooms and ornamental foliage in a variety of brilliant colours. They require very little watering and come in a wide range of sizes from tiny miniatures to the incredible giants.



There are over 3000 known varieties of Bromeliaceous and the first recorded bromeliad was 500 years ago.

Within the last hundred years, bromeliads have become more widely used as ornamental plants. Originally only found in royal botanical gardens or the private collections. Their popularity has grown such that today bromeliads are more available to the home gardener and the bromeliad enthusiast.

Once again, a generous donor has enabled Landcare to offer free local native plants to landowners who live in Hornsby Council's rural area, or Hills Shire along Old Northern Road. We want the plants to go to people who are clearing privet or lantana or other weeds and who wish to revegetate with native plants. Also those who want to revegetate their roadside nature strip, or create a wildlife corridor or a similar activity.

If that sounds like you, contact Barry Lees on 9653 3691. I will help you work out what plants would suit your property from those available at either of 2 Nurseries. I will then advise the Nursery to expect a call from you to pick up your plants. For Hornsby Shire residents, the plants will come from the Community Nursery at Pennant Hills. For Hills Shire residents, the plants will come from the Community Nursery at Baulkham Hills. The minimum number of plants will be 1 tray of 40 tubes. Plants can include trees, shrubs or groundcovers. Trays and tubes are to be returned to the Nurseries or to me when you have finished with them.

You cannot buy local native plants from retail nurseries, so this is a special opportunity. The plants are top quality. I look forward to hearing from you.

start out with two colonies, so you can compare the progress of one with the other. You really need to understand that a feral swarm must be given a NEW QUEEN, so these bees will be naturally gentle to work with. Sometimes you can be lucky, but how do you know you have avoided disease? Many good queens come from Queensland, but I get most of mine through the post from Blaney. Careful genetic selection results in queens that are a pleasure to work with, and her genetics will affect all the bees in the hive after about 8 weeks when the old bees die off. A queen usually costs about \$30.

There is so much to tell you about starting right with bees. You could read my articles online, in WIKIHOW, which are popular. You might even ask the editors of this magazine if we could have another article next month, or perhaps a local beekeeping day.
