Changed Traffic Conditions for Essential Bridge Maintenance on Mid Dural Road at Galston

Motorists are advised of changed traffic conditions on Mid-Dural Road at Galston in late November/December for bridge maintenance.

The NSW Government is funding this essential maintenance work under its \$1.5 billion program to maintain and improve the 18,028 kilometre state road and bridge network.

Every effort will be made to reduce the impact of noise from this work on the surrounding community.





A big thanks to the people of Castle Hill and surrounding areas

As you may already know Days for Girls is a non-profit project run by grass roots teams of women worldwide to provide feminine hygiene products to girls to allow them to stay at school all the school year.

The Castle Hill team has already completed its first year (Oct 2016 - Oct 2017) of contributing to this worthwhile program. They have worked hard both in workshops each month and at home creating the items used in the packs that are sent.

They have achieved:

- 15 packs to Sri Lanka
- 60 packs to Solomon Islands
- 500 packs to Cambodia
- 50 packs to East Timor
- · 55 packs to India.



A total of 680 packs.

None of this would be possible without grants from many local service clubs such as Lions, Rotary and View Clubs and many individuals and businesses.

We are a dedicated team of 106 women (and some men) from many surrounding suburbs meet on a regular basis to pack, sew and overlock items to go in a pretty cotton bag to send to girls in various developing countries. People within and outside of this team contribute also by donating money, fabric, thread, underwear, soap and washers. Each item included in the bag requires several processes to complete it. Some volunteers can sew or




overlock, but many are required to do the ironing, cutting, finishing and packing processes. Quality control is a vital part of the overall process to make sure the kit is robust enough to last 2-3 years.

Is Your Pool Safe for Summer?

With the onset of summer, backyards with pools will again be the focus of family activity. If you have a pool or spa, is it registered, safe and certified? Swimming pool safety legislation has been enacted to increase the safety and security of children under 5 years of age in and around private pools.

Safety measures cover pool and boundary fencing, gate operation, access through doors and windows that can provide direct entry





to a pool, safety and CPR signage. It is the responsibility of the pool owner to ensure that the pool is at all times surrounded by a complying child resistant safety barrier restricting access to the pool. Private swimming pools can be located in all manner of places. Rural acreage, waterfront, suburban, indoors, rental properties, strata properties. All are subject to an Australian Standard, Act and Regulation. To ensure the safety of private pools, all owners should be aware of their responsibilities in maintaining safety barriers in good operating order and condition.

Not all pool accidents are fatal. Unfortunately many result in severe mental, physical and health issues as a result of near drownings, causing extreme hardship and distress to families so affected.

To ensure that your pool barrier and surrounds meets all necessary safety requirements it should be inspected by a qualified pool safety Certifier. The inspection process covers all aspects of pool barriers and safety issues, with photographic evidence of all areas inspected accompanying the report. If the pool complies, then a Certificate of Compliance will be issued. If the pool does not comply, a Certificate of Non-Compliance will be issued with a complete and comprehensive report of all non-compliant areas with photographic evidence and recommendations on action required to rectify these issues. A follow up inspection will be required to gain a Compliance Certificate when non-compliant issues have been rectified.

It should also be noted that if you are selling a residential property with a pool or spa it must have a Certificate of compliance or non-compliance, or if leasing a residential property with a pool or spa a Certificate of Compliance is required.

Community News

Report of Glenorie Progress Association Meeting on 14 November 2017

Major points arising from the November meeting of the GPA were as follows:

- Boral will be providing a written response to the residents' concerns relating to the intended upgrade of the concrete batching plant near the corner of Schwebel Lane and Old Northern Rd.
- 2. Street speed limits: a number of letters had been received calling for the imposition of appropriate speed restrictions on our unmarked suburban roads and more were expected - all letters will be forwarded to the authorities with copies to our local members.
- **3.** The Chair provided a summary of his assessment of the implications for Glenorie of the latest Greater Sydney Commission report and noted that the issue will be addressed by the Planning Subcommittee at its meeting on 28 November.
- **4.** It was agreed that the most important decision yet to be made was for residents of and around Glenorie to decide what it was they wanted for our community.

ATTENTION ALL RESIDENTS

Go online and read what the GSC says about Glenorie. The GPA thinks it can be boiled down to this:

- **1.** Residential development in and around Glenorie is not to be encouraged.
- **2.** Agricultural operations are to be encouraged and protected from "urban sprawl".

3. The opportunities for further expansion of the Glenorie Village and subdivision of existing acreages are therefore limited.

If you agree with this approach, that is good. If you disagree, write to the GPA explaining why. The GPA cannot represent the residents' concerns if the residents don't tell the GPA about their concerns.

Laughtondale Gully Road Reopened



Laughtondale Gully Road is now open, following major repairs to make it safe for vehicles once more.

This is great news for local residents, who have been inconvenienced by the closure of the road. For a while it was uncertain if the road could be made safe but Council's engineers worked extremely hard to find workable solutions.

The main part of the work involved the stabilisation of a number of sections of road that were at risk of collapsing, as well as the sealing of one of the particularly hazardous hairpin bends.

Seven new cross drains were also installed, while the existing cross drains were cleared and new guide posts put in place.

"I would like to sincerely thank the local residents for their patience throughout this process," Mayor Ruddock said.

"Safety is always Council's absolute top priority when managing roads and convenience, unfortunately, must finish a very distant second".

The \$300,000 in road works were paid for by Hornsby Shire Council.



Fred Catterson Park, Castle Hill: All Abilities Mtb and Bmx

Hills Council has provided excellent bike lanes along Gilbert, Tuckwell and Ridgecorp Roads and a brand new cycle path along Showground Road to access Fred Catty and the new Showground Rail transit hub by bike, from all surrounding suburbs!

This Festive
Season, off-road
bicycling delights
await discovery in
this green sports
lung bordered by the
suburbs of Glenhaven,
Castle Hill and
Showground Road.

First, there is the BMX track, which has been upgraded to international race standards. Lower your saddle and practise bike-handling skills on it anytime there is not an event, using

your MTB or a BMX. Then there are all the choice technical single tracks in surrounding forests and parallel to the creeks...

Park at Knightsbridge Shopping Centre. Turn left onto Ridgecrop Drive, right down Linksley and in the dip, turn left onto Timber Grove and look for the trail head on the left near the bridge over the creek. You will love this rock and rolling, scenic ride parallel to the verdant fern-lined Castle Hill Creek. Singletrack

opens out onto a firetrail /neglected Hills Council Cyclepath in Fullers' Road Reserve, hugging the bottom of sheer rocks at the hem of suburbia. The cyclepath then opens out onto a short stint on tar, and you are now riding parallel to Cattai Creek and straight for the Waterworks. Turn left onto the single track at the waterworks fence. The track loosely follows the perimeter of the waterworks. It is very technical, and only elite mountain bikers will be able to ride the whole thing. Keep your weight far back off the saddle if rolling down the rock steps. Turn left over the footbridge to the BMX track. From here, there are plenty of short, winding single track circuits in bushland around most sport fields to explore and call your own. None of them are ever groomed, but surprisingly for Sydney, many of them are actually marked! They are all rocky, rutted and intersected by tree roots- the most excellent stuff to make mountain bicycling here, amongst the best Hills District currently has to offer.



You will love this rock and rolling, scenic ride parallel to the verdant fern-lined Castle Hill Creek.





Difficulty: Technical singletrack trails for Intermediate to elite mtb riders. Flat, hardpack firetrails and some paved paths for kids and novice cyclists.

Notes: Lower your saddle before attempting to ride the BMX track on a mtb! Ride early, or on weekdays, to avoid having to give way to lots of dog walkers. Keep to the existing trails, and give way to bushwalkers. Roads inside the reserve service RC Cars, Soccer, Tennis, Cricket, Basketball and BMX, so beware of vehicular traffic.

Leave the Car at Home: Hills Council has provided excellent bike lanes along Gilbert, Tuckwell and Ridgecrop Roads and a brand new cycle path along Showground Road to access Fred Caterson and the new Showground Rail transit hub by bike, from all surrounding suburbs. At the end of Tuckwell Road, there is a subway under Gilbert Road to access the park safely from Castle Hill CBD.

Facilities: Lovely playground for the kids with water bubbler between Cedar Grove Road and Field 6. Coffee and toilets at Local Bean Café, Knightsbridge Shopping Centre. Nearest bicycle shop is 99 Bikes, Victoria Road. CHBMX is a very active club, welcoming new members of all abilities to their school holiday skills sessions and weekend race events.

Ride Map: Follow the author, Susanna Mills, on Strava or research the route on Google Maps...or why not cycle there this weekend and discover your own circuits?



Galston Netball - Active Kids Program

Keeping Kids Active

From 31 January 2018, parents will be able to claim up to \$100 per school child, per calendar year, as a voucher to reduce the cost of sport registration or membership fees for after-school, weekend and structured fitness or physical activity. Netball is an eligible sport, the Active Kids Rebate can significantly reduce the financial burden for parents when registering children for sports.

Who is eligble to receive the rebate?

The Active Kids Program provides an incentive to children enrolled in school (K-12) to get involved in sport by providing an annual \$100 voucher (limit of one per child per year only), which can only be used when joining an approved activity, such as when registering your child to play netball.

How will the \$100 rebate be applied?

Although details are yet to be confirmed, it is expected that from 31 January 2018, parents will be able to create a NSW Government MyService Account to register their child to participate in the Active Kids Rebate program. Parents will then receive a 16 digit voucher code to be used for an approved sport activity. Parents will be required to enter this voucher code at the time of completing the MyNetball online registration form.

Important: Voucher codes can not be applied retrospectively. We are advising parents to complete the online registration process only AFTER they have received their voucher code.

Is Galston Netball an approved provider under the Active Kids Rebate program?

Yes! We are an Affiliated Club of Netball NSW, a State Sporting Organisation under the Active Kids Rebate program. All activities offered by our Club are approved activities and accept use of the \$100 rebate voucher.

Registration for the coming season's netball commences in January and concludes in February in order for parents to claim their \$100 rebate.

Carpark at Hornsby Hospital

I recently spent some time with the wonderful kids at Arcadia Public School. The school had received \$8,000 from my office under the Community Building Partnership program to fix the access and drainage to the oval. That work is now complete and I hope it ensures the oval is in the best shape possible for the kids to play every day. I am very proud to have a school like Arcadia in my electorate and the wonderful teachers and Principal Sharon O'Brien are an asset to the community.

I am also pleased to announce construction of the multi-storey carpark at Hornsby Hospital has begun. This major project will create 520 spaces and ensure visitors and patients have plenty of parking while visiting the hospital and local residents will get their streets back.

The project is expected to cost \$19.8 million and will be completed by late 2018. The community has been calling out for this for years, and I am proud to deliver another commitment for our community.

Constructions for the \$200 million Stage 2 redevelopment of Hornsby Hospital should also start next year. This will include a new emergency department and five-store Clinical Services Building, a one-stop shop for a range of medical services. This investment in our Hospital will see it become a state-of-the-art medical facility which will service the Hornsby community not just now but into the future.

I wish everyone a Merry Christmas and I am looking forward to continuing to work for the Hornsby community in 2018.

Grants Open for Life Saving Defibrillators

Local sports clubs in Hornsby are being urged to apply for cofunding for a defibrillator under the NSW Government's new Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program.

Member for Hornsby Matt Kean MP said more than 2,500 Automatic External Defibrillators (AED's) will be rolled out across the state over the next four years.

"We encourage local sporting clubs to take this opportunity to apply for a grant to help fund an AED - which can be the difference between life and death," Mr Kean said.

"The program will fund up to 50 per cent of the defibrillator cost, along with training and maintenance support."

Minister for Sport, Stuart Ayres said the \$4 million program will make sporting fields safer for thousands of players and spectators.

"More than 33,000 Australians experience cardiac arrest every year, and the first eight minutes are critical to improving the likelihood of survival," Mr Ayres said

"Early access to CPR and defibrillation can influence survival rates by up to 75 percent".

The scheme is targeting community sports clubs, but applications from licensed sporting clubs and sports organisations associated with schools, churches universities, and councils will also be considered.





Middle Dural Rural Fire Brigade is one of the oldest in the district, having been formed in 1945. Although our station is in Mid Dural Road, in Hornsby Shire, we are part of the Hills District, mainly caring for the community on the western side of Old Northern Road. You will see us at a wide variety of bush fires, building fires, hazard reductions, motor vehicle accidents and various community events.

We are always happy to welcome new members, or local residents who are curious about what we do and what it's like inside a working fire station. You may have considered becoming a volunteer fire fighter - please - come and visit, see if you might like to join us (no pressure!). For new people, there is plenty of friendly help and mentoring. You will learn many new skills, including how to look after yourself, your property and animals in a bushfire. You will probably have seen that both men and women are firefighters and hold officer rank in our Brigade

Our formal training is carried out at the Hills District Rural Fire Office in Annangrove Road. There are two Basic Training courses each year in which new volunteers learn the ropes before they get to 'put the wet stuff on the hot stuff'. Some firefighters are content to stay at basic fire fighter level, however, most do further training to achieve their Advanced Fire Fighting accreditation, leading to Crew Leader accreditation. All this happens in a friendly and supportive environment where your fellow volunteers are keen to make friends, offer encouragement and welcome you to the team. There's trust and mateship, together with getting to know your community.

When you're not at the brigade's Santa run, what do you do for a living?





Fire Season Started 1st October

Fire season kicked off in the Greater Sydney region on the 1st of October, and will end 31st of March.

Preparing your property is an essential part of getting ready for Summer and while we support and encourage the reduction of hazards from around your home, it is a timely reminder to make sure that you have received the correct fire permits. During fire season, residents of the Hornsby/Ku-Ring-Gai district must

have two permits, a current council permit, and a fire safety permit from NSW Rural Fire Service. It is a simple process and all you need to do is call and they will be sent to you, see the phone numbers at the end of this article. Unfortunately, we have been called to a number of pile burns and bonfires in recent weeks that have not had the required permits. As the weather continues to warm up, our opportunity to complete Hazard Reductions through burning is coming to a close, however, when conditions are right we will commence the program again. These Hazard Reductions also play an important role in regenerating our native bushland. However, Hazard Reductions can continue in the form of mowing lawns, removing materials that can burn away from your homes, and garden maintenance.

Part of our great working relationship with our colleagues at Fire Rescue NSW, Castle Hill FRNSW invited the Arcadia to train with them recently. Castle Hill's "A" Platoon discussed with us how



we can assist them at different incidents. These training sessions continue improve the coherency between the stations during incidents that we attend together. During this training session, we looked at the various equipment they carry on the truck, some similar to what is on our trucks. We also discussed rescue situations and utilising the stokes litter, which is an important and versatile tool used to transport patients out of different environments such as rugged terrain to suburban homes. To top the night off, the

brigade was given a tour of their station, seeing all aspects of their


Arcadia was invited to discuss with 100 year 5 students from Waverley College who were at Vision Valley during November, about the difference between hazard reductions and back burning, the weather and geographical characteristics that influence the behaviour of fires and how we prepare for bush fires. Afterwards we showed them the equipment on our truck, and how it would be utilised during a bush fire. It was great to see the level of enthusiasm these students had towards our role in the community, and the understanding they demonstrated regarding bush fires.





Dural and District Historical Society Horse Troughs

It is hard for us, in this day and age, to realise the importance of horses for hundreds and hundreds of years before the invention of

motorised and mechanical transport.

When you think of the wars that were fought on horseback, the recent enactment of the last great horse attack at Beersheba a hundred years ago, comes to mind. Horses were essential for carrying Mail and all messages, (no mobile phones or radio then!) and pulling carriages, and carting produce to market. We still use the term "Horse Power" (h.p.) to describe the amount of power needed to do a certain job, such as running a car.

About a hundred years ago, a couple, Annis and George Bills, had made a fortune out of making Inner-spring mattresses. They had no children, but were great lovers of animals, horses in particular. They were also involved in the beginning of the R.S.P.C.A. They set up a Foundation to make sturdy concrete water troughs that were set up beside roads for all horses that were passing

to drink at. Hundreds were made and each one is inscribed "Annis and George Bills, Australia" Many are still to be found all over Australia, and are treasured relics of a time gone by.

The Dural trough was originally in Galston Road, just near St Jude's. Up until about 1970, Galston road just vied off Old Northern Road opposite the shops. Galston travellers considered they had right of way, and Glenorie travellers thought they did too! Which


> caused many "Confrontations". The Roads department offered to buy the "V" part of land from St. Jude's and made a distinct Right Hand turn, which entered Galston road just where the Horse Trough was. The remnants of the old road are still visible outside the Dural Medical centre. The Dural trough was carefully moved to Galston High School and can be seen just inside the fence in front of Waddell Cottage. Hornsby also has one of these troughs. In more recent times the trough at Dural was a place of initiation. Some readers may wish to share their experiences of this.

Do we really want a concrete batching plant in the middle of Glenorie Village? It's time to consider this proposal before it's too late.

I have seen the community consultation letters from Boral to the residents of Glenorie via the GPA. Boral are to be commended on their approach. I thought little of the impact on our community till recently I was riding past the Boral concrete batching plant at Mount Kuring-gai and I was struck by the impact that such a facility would have on Glenorie. It will totally change the view and perception of Glenorie. It would decrease land values and the aesthetic ambience, even the "feel" of Glenorie. I would encourage anyone driving on the Pacific Hwy through Mount Kuring-gai to look up at the towering Silos. You will see just how enormous and un-avoidable the visual impact is. The Silos proposed for Glenorie are 21m high. The ground level may be lower on that site, than that of Old Northern road, but not that much, and it doesn't matter what colour you paint them, they will dominate the skyline. There are other considerations such as the increased truck traffic, turning in and out of Schwebel Lane where children are crossing. It doesn't matter how careful the majority of drivers are, it just takes one driver, not concentrating, under time pressure to cause an accident. The corner in question has a lot of parents and children crossing at drop off and pick up times.

The more I considered what I saw in reality at Mount Kuringgai, these towering silos and super imposed that image across the village of Glenorie, the more I am convinced that this DA should not proceed. The location of the current plant is a hang-

over from an era of no planning. The village has grown and a concrete plant simply does not belong directly next to amenities like the RSL and the School. Glenorie deserves a master plan, and the community, council and Boral should negotiate another, more appropriate location for the plant. I can fully appreciate how hard it is for Boral to find sites where there is no resident opposition, however I would suggest that Dural industrial area would be a good place to start. If The Hills Shire Council can work a deal that re-zones the land high density residential or retail, Boral will be able to sell the land for a high value and purchase a more appropriate site, in and industrial zone, closer to the action they wish to service.

Concrete feedback needed on proposal

Comment on a proposal for more regular use of the concrete batching plant in Schwebel Lane, Glenorie is being sought from residents living in and around the village centre.

The facility, operated since the 1980s, was last year taken on by leading building and construction materials firm, Boral, after the company reached a leasing agreement with local owners, the Webb family.

During the past year, the plant has only been operated occasionally as a 'campaign' site.

Boral is now, however, preparing a development application (DA) to seek approval for an increase in production output.

The DA, to be submitted to The Hills Shire Council, will request an annual production limit of 52000 tonnes for the site, with various operating hours across seven days.

The proposal will also include the building of a third storage silo to hold materials, and the establishment of a new 'slumping' stand (where water is added to cement and aggregates to make the concrete).

Since June, Boral has been engaging with several local groups to introduce the proposal and gather initial feedback in an effort

to shape the application. This included a presentation at the October meeting of the Glenorie Progress Association (GPA).

Boral's Stakeholder Relations Manager, Paul Jackson, said comments given on the proposal so far had greatly assisted the company's understanding of several potential issues. Despite this, he said more views were needed.

"A clear picture on what we need to focus upon through writing the DA has emerged, but we're conscious

there will be other opinions that need consideration as well," Mr Jackson said.

"Our approach is to discern the broadest range of views before the actual planning process begins so that right from the outset, what we propose is as aligned to community expectation as possible."

🚺 Information about Boral's proposal released to the community so far has been placed on the GPA's website at www.glenorieprogress.org.au. The company is working toward lodging the DA before Christmas and will issue further community information ahead of the DA lodgement.




Term 4 will conclude with a joyous Christmas Carol evening to be held in the school hall. This evening is to celebrate the wonderful community spirit of Galston Public School.

The Wonder of Immanuel

James IV, one of Scotland's greatest kings in the Middle Ages, employed a curious method in the government of his people. He would often disappear from the palace in disguise and walk unrecognised amongst his subjects in their everyday surroundings. Sometimes he was absent for weeks at a time, and even his closest advisers were unaware of his whereabouts. Fears arose for the king's safety, but when James was asked to halt this unusual practice, he responded, "I cannot rule my people unless I know how they live."

In his desire to rule his subjects fairly, James IV of Scotland tried to identify with them. He came down to their level for a while, but always he returned to the luxury and majesty of the royal palace.

It is a remarkable story, but James' actions only faintly reflect the tremendous humility of Jesus in stepping down into our world. In leaving heaven to come to earth, Jesus completely identified with us. He did not disguise himself as a human; he became truly human. As the apostle Paul put it in one of his letters, Jesus took 'the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness' (Philippians 2:7). That is the wonder of the Christmas story, which is expressed in one of the names given to Jesus: Immanuel, which means 'God with us' (Matthew 1:23).


Jesus is the only person who has ever lived who could have chosen his birthplace and everything associated with it, but consider what he did. He was born in a crude stable and brought up in a peasant home amongst a despised people. Jesus tasted the

full range of human emotions and experience. He came down to our level. He understands what it is like to be human.

And because Jesus has identified with us, we can trust him with our fears, doubts and needs in the knowledge that He understands and cares. He is Immanuel not just for Christmas, but for every day of our lives. Because of what Jesus did on that first Christmas, these words of comfort and encouragement are true, 'For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathise with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are - yet was without sin. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need'. (Hebrews 4:15-16)

May God bless each one of you as you celebrate the wonder and gift of Immanuel this Christmas season, and may you experience the reality of 'God with us' throughout the year ahead.



"We girls never give up" ladies who brought a champagne picnic and were determined that it would go ahead even though it was raining.

The garden beds were mulched, the plants pruned, paths were swept and all was ready for the Open Gardens Weekend and the much prayed for rain came.....the first day of the Open Gardens and did it rain! As we contemplated whether people would even turn up, the rain became heavier, but turn up they did, rugged up in their boots, raincoats and with umbrellas, gardeners are a hardy bunch. A little rain was not going to stop them exploring the 8 lovely gardens. There was a sense of comraderie, a shared experience and no-one was going to complain about the much needed rain. This spirit was embodied by three lovely ladies who turned up at "Elegans" determined to have their champagne picnic lunch that they had brought. A couple of tables put together in the undercover morning and afternoon tea area and they were set, complete with their tablecloth, champers, their bowls of food, in raincoats and with a merry attitude of "We girls never give up!" Thankfully the rain held off for the rest of the weekend and there is nothing like a good soaking of rain for the gardens to come alive.

Our Open Gardens weekend was again very successful with garden owners and Galston Garden Club members going that extra mile to make the visits enjoyable for all who attended. A huge



thanks goes to the Open Gardens committee and to the garden owners who not only open their gardens but who work very hard to present them so beautifully and then are so willing to pass on their knowledge, experiences and to talk about their gardens. This year over \$40,000 was raised and will be distributed to the various charities selected by the garden owners and the Open Gardens Committee.

Our last meeting for the year has been held with the hall almost at capacity. The new Executive has been nominated and will be formally elected at the AGM in February 2018. Our guest speaker was Robyn Bible a Geranium and Pelargonium Specialist who kindly stepped in at the last minute due to our booked speaker being ill. Robyn is passionate on educating people about the care and how to best display geraniums in the garden, her own garden is an enormous collection of geraniums of every type. So what is the difference between a Geranium and a Pelargonium? Leaf? Flower? Shape? Size? It is by the shape of the seed pod - who knew? There was so much we realised we didn't know about this plant, like the true geranium is a much smaller flowering plant than we thought, the rest are Pelargoniums. So here are some Pelargonium tips from Robyn...tip prune them regularly, the plant looks better, produces more flowers and forces growth back down to the root. Mass plant them for best effect. Best time to prune is March /April, cut back just above the node, literally, just above the node otherwise the stem dies back, it is the node that produces new growth and if you cut too high up it won't produce the new growth and will most likely die back right down the stem. When you do make a cut for cuttings, use Metho to seal the cut of both ends and prevent moisture getting into the stem. Don't cut in the humidity or if there is too much rain, they don't like too much water once established, fertilize about every 4 months. Geraniums will grow in full sun to shade, but will produce more flowers in the sun. Robyn also left us with this advice, nothing needs to be perfect, yes, leaves get holes in them, plants get a little leggy, but step back, look at the overall picture your garden is showing and enjoy your garden whether it be an acre, small plot or a pot. And on that note we wish you all a Merry Christmas, Garden Club Meetings resume on the 14th February 2018 with a General Meeting and AGM.



Thinking of joining the Hills Branch, then the next few months will see various breeders being finished with their breeding season and assessing their birds; *offering surplus birds at reasonable prices for quality birds*. It is very rarely that good quality breeding stock will be found in a pet shop, that would be suitable for getting started in the budgerigar hobby.

Purchasing birds with particular features (not just colour, which attracts many people to the hobby) is a developed skill, which members of Hills Branch are only too willing to show and demonstrate to interested persons. Many people seek birds with no interest in breeding or showing and purely for the enjoyment

of having an aviary of budgerigars in the garden, providing enjoyment whilst enjoying a coffee. That backyard aviary subsequently attracts other native birds to add to the overall enjoyment of keeping budgerigars.


