ARCADIAN ARCHIVES PLANE CRASHES AT ARCADIA

A RECOLLECTION BY GLENN GILLIS OF GALSTON

I well remember as a 5 year old sitting next to my Grandfather in Church on 13 June 1953. Grandfather, Joe Gillis was sitting beside the window when we all heard a screeching in the sky.

Grandpa looked out the window and saw a Mustang fighter plane nose diving towards the ground. This curious boy could not see the plane, but we all heard the big BANG as it hit the ground.

We rushed home to our property in Cobah Road, Arcadia and found the wreckage about 200metres from our property, in what is now Henstock Road.

It was fascinating to see the crater in the ground about 2m deep and 5m wide. Bits of the plane were scattered over an area of about 400m and I observed gory bits and pieces of Roderick Norman, the pilot, scattered around and hanging from tree branches.


Those graphic scenes are still clear in my mind after 70 years. Apparently the pilot went too high, blacked out, falling forwards onto his joy stick.

Dad had an orchard at the time and a tractor which had the same wheels as those on the plane. While the RAAF came to investigate and clean up the site, they left many parts behind and Dad ended up using one of the Mustang's wheels on his tractor trailer.

There was so much wreckage left, I guess it has either been covered up or disintegrated by now.



Allergies occur when a persons immune system reacts to harmless substances in the environment that do not bother most people. These substances are known as allergens or allergic triggers.

Hayfever also known as allergic rhinitis can be catergorised into two groups: 'seasonal' allergic rhinitis when you experience symptoms mainly during spring and summer time and perennial allergic rhinitis when you experience symptoms all year around.



Exposure to pollen from trees, grasses and weeds can commonly trigger hayfever or seasonal allergic rhinitis.

The pollen which triggers someone's hayfever symptoms varies between individuals and from region to region.

In most cases however, the imported grasses, weeds and trees which are wind pollinated are the predominate cause of symptoms. Pollens of highly flowering plants, which are insect pollinated are usually to large to remain airborne, and do not usually trigger hayfever.

Tane started swimming from an early age and always did well at Glenorie Primary School and School Sports Australia swimming carnivals. He joined Galston Swim Club and it became apparent he was more than just good. He received a sports scholarship to Knox Grammar School which allowed him to further enhance his swimming skills. After Galston Swim Club he moved to Abbotsleigh Club, then to Knox Pymble Swimming Club. By Year 9 he was medaling at National competitions.



In April, he swam at the Gold Coast qualifying events for the World Junior Championships and was selected onto the Australian Junior Swim Team. Tane has recently returned from Europe where he competed at the Mare Nostrum Swimming Tour in France, Barcelona and Monaco.

On 24th August Tane leaves for Cyprus to start training with the Australian Swim team. They then travel to Israel on 4th September for the World Aquatics Junior Championships. Tane will swim the 50m freestyle and potentially earn a spot on the relay team.

Tane is only 18 years old and hopes his performance in Israel will consolidate his abilities on the world stage. Next year he hopes to qualify for the 2024 Paris Olympics.



FIRST AID EVERYDAY COURSE

To be held on Friday, 17th November, 8.30am to 3.30pm at Galston Adventist Community Hall, Arcadia Road, Galston.

The course is Titled HLTAID011 Provide First Aid, and provides instruction and practical training in line with legal, workplace and community considerations, Australian Resuscitation Council guidelines and other Australian National Peak Clinical Bodies, this auto injector for anaphylaxis, administering asthma medication, assisting someone choking, using appropriate immobilisation techniques for envenomation, fractures, dislocation, sprains and strains, managing casualties with non-life-threatening bleeding and shock.

You will learn basic anatomy, physiology and the differences between adults, children and infants relating to CPR, the importance of the chain of survival, written and verbal reporting of incident details, reviewing incidents to improve own skills and response times, to recognise psychological impacts and seeking help required.

Pre Course Study: Students maybe required to undertake online pre course work prior to attending the face to face session depending on the course delivery mode.

Online Study: Students mush have access to a computer, smartphone, tablet or other electronic devices with access to the internet to complete the online pre-course studies.

Students will be assessed on the following: To perform CPR on an adult including the use of an AED and placing a casualty into the recovery position.

Complete a first aid incident report form based on the simulated first aid scenario, Perform CPR on an infant, Manage a casualty with anaphylaxis, Manage a casualty with asthma, Manage a choking casualty and manage a casualty with non-lifethreatening bleeding and shock, requiring minor wound cleaning.

Students will need to complete all their pre-course/theory online and on the day will be assessed practically. This reduces the amount of time they spend onsite.

Registration is essential by Friday 27th October.

GALSTON RESIDENTS ASK COUNCIL TO SAVE 3 JOHNSON RD AS PARKLAND

When bad decisions are made by government, good people lose their weekends and evenings having to fight it. For weeks, months or years. It was this realisation that led to my interest in local government.

Since the June 2023 Council decision to progress rezoning of No. 1 and No. 3 Johnson Rd Galston and well before the consultation process had started, Councillors have received an outpouring of protest from Galston residents to save their precious but unofficial parkland at No. 3 Johnson Rd, known as the Old Pony Club.

So, when I was asked to table a petition of 832 signatures to stop the rezoning of No. 3 at our next meeting, I was happy to oblige. I believe our role as a Councillor is to listen and act. After the meeting I suggested catching up with some residents on site to find out more about their needs and use of the site. It was incredible to meet with not just a few as I'd expected, but over 120 residents.

Having based my original decision on information of this land being unused and Galston residents needing space to grow their businesses; it was clear to me from the petition and emails alone, Council needed to stop and reassess.

So, after working with council staff, I put forward a workable motion to address resident's requests and offered Council the opportunity to say we hear you and we will investigate your proposal.

This motion sought to pause the current planning proposal to rezone No. 1 and No. 3 (with a view to developing with industrial units);



before spending hundreds of thousands of dollars going down a path clearly unpalatable to residents.

It asked Council to conduct a feasibility analysis of developing only No.1 with protection of No. 3 as community parkland and conservation of the forest. This would provide councillors with all the information needed to make an informed decision, when the time came.

It was reasonable and pragmatic, just as Galston residents have been. Now that Councillors were aware of the community's love for this greenspace, I believe it should have received enough support to pass.

Disappointingly, it didn't - despite there being no reason why it couldn't have progressed. We know due process would still be followed, it has to. This motion just added an extra step to ensure good governance, accountability and fair democratic process.

Despite the commitment to consultation, the amended motion on 9th August does nothing to change the original Council decision to work towards developing both parcels of land with industrial units.

Residents of Galston are now left to continue the fight for their valued, beautiful parkland. I believe our community deserves better.



consider its historic timeline? Over the last month, Year 9 and 10 Galston High School studying the Physical Activity and Sports Studies elective took part in an exciting self-defence program led by Sven Midri, an expert Krav Maga instructor from Krav Maga Self Defence,

Castle Hill and a former student of the school. The lessons fostered physical fitness, self-confidence, and personal safety skills.

Krav Maga emphasises practical defence techniques and instinctive responses, with the program consisting of four age-appropriate lessons, introducing the basics of self-defence, including strikes, kicks, and releases from common grabs and chokes. There was emphasis also on situational awareness and decision-making in potentially dangerous scenarios.

In addition to physical techniques, the program explores self-defence's psychological and social dimensions. Students learn to understand and assert personal boundaries and manage aggressive or threatening behaviour. These skills are invaluable not only in hazardous situations but also in everyday social interactions.

Feedback from students was overwhelmingly positive. Comments have praised the engaging teaching style of Sven and the practical knowledge gained. One student noted, "I really enjoyed it; it was very helpful. I would never put myself in a situation where I need to use it, but knowing what to do is good."

With a focus on physical fitness, mental fortitude, and empowerment, especially for women, this program is an exciting addition to Galston High School's curriculum, equipping students with the skills they need for personal safety and self-assurance.



PREPARE FOR THE BUSHFIRE DANGER PERIOD

The Greater Sydney Bushfire Danger period commences on 1st October. To prepare for this bushfire season I strongly encourage all residents, landowners and businesses to prioritise their bushfire preparedness.

We have been very lucky in the past 20 years to have had no major bushfires in Hornsby area, and after several very wet summers, I have noticed a concerning level of complacency amongst many in the community.

The Hornsby local government area is the Bushland Shire which we all love. However, because of this we will always be exposed to the risk of bushfire. The upcoming summer will bring an escalated potential risk in our region due to increasing bushfire fuel levels.

To assist with protecting lives and property the RFS emphasise the need for residents to plan and prepare themselves, and their property for the upcoming summer. To support these efforts, they are holding their annual state-wide 'Get Ready Weekend' on **16th and 17th September**. This aims to provide the community an opportunity to connect with their local brigades to discuss their specific bushfire risks. The event underlines the significance of individual responsibility to create bushfire resilience.

In addition to the Get Ready Weekend, many local RFS brigades are holding street meetings that connect long-time and new residents with local firefighters. These gatherings intend to facilitate detailed discussions about the risks, consequences and steps residents must take to prepare for the impact of bushfires.

Aimed at raising awareness and motivating early pre-emptive measures, these RFS events are designed to engage, inform and change behaviour in the community.

It was a special privilege to represent Hornsby Shire on Veteran's Day. The occasion marked the 50th Anniversary of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War, and with the day itself, (18th August), marking the anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan in 1966.





In addition, to the Hornsby service in Railway Park, a local service was held at the recently refurbished cenotaph in Glenorie's Wal Buckingham Park. Joined by RSL subbranch members and Hills Deputy Mayor, Mitchel Blue, a fitting memorial was delivered for the 60 000 Australian service personnel that served over a 10-and-a-halfyear period and recognising the 523 lives lost and the 3000 wounded.

Importantly, it was a reminder of how the declining support for the war resulted in the poor treatment of our returning veterans. This should never occur again.





With the cenotaph now restored, it is also fitting that the next stage of the park plan will now be rolled out. Improvements to paving, landscaping, furniture etc. will be features of proposed work. The eventual plan being an overall precinct upgrade from the Bus terminus to the Memorial Hall.

More welcome news this month included the State Government back down on changes to rural land use. Much of last years proposed changes increased opportunities for rural landowners to value-add to their existing activities. However, one change relating to visitor numbers on farm, has now been revised to remove the numbers cap. This has been a long journey and testament to the community and Government agencies working together for common-sense outcomes.

We look forward to our remaining rural businesses enjoying the opportunity to share farmgate experiences with the public.

STILL CREEK LANDCARE

USING FIRE TO MANAGE YOUR PROPERTY. HOTSPOTS FIRE PROJECT

The most valuable resource for managing properties in fire zones is the HOTSPOTS FIRE PROJECT, a joint program run by the NSW Rural Fire Service and the Nature Conservation Council of NSW.

Recently a group of local residents participated in the Hotspots Fire Project 2 day workshop. The workshop involved education on risk management, fire ecology, environmental impacts and the benefit of a longer term plan for managing fire risk. This was followed by field based exercises and participation in a demonstration burn.

We learned of the benefits of fire and its place in the ecology of the Australian landscape. Carefully planned and timed fires benefit the health of our lands and wildlife as well as protecting our valued assets.

In this workshop, participants were provided a large aerial image of their property and assisted in developing a fire management plan

for each of them. It was of immense value to all participants in documenting their assets, prioritising their protection, and developing asset protection zones and other fire protection actions.

It became abundantly clear that fire on the ground could be managed with low risk and maximum benefit for your safety, ecological regeneration and native animals. It also showed us that the burn area doesn't need to be large to be effective; our demonstration site at a property in Arcadia was only 750 square metres.

The workshop's success was a result of the cooperation of a large number of people from number of groups. The Hotspots Project team from the RFS and NCC, RFS Officers from the Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Fire Control Centre, The Regional RFS Support Group who supplied transport, the RFS Mitigation Crew who put in control lines around the burn site, the local Arcadia and Galston RFS Brigades who provided the group with demonstrations on the how to prepare control lines, support vehicles


and backup, The NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service, Metropolitan LALC Indigenous representatives who provided knowledge and understanding of fire in the landscape, Still Creek Landcare, the Hornsby Hills Koala Project, and above all a Hornsby Shire Council officer who recognised the community desire and need for such a program and who worked for 2 years behind the scenes to have this program delivered for the first time in a metropolitan area.

I cannot stress enough the importance and value of the Hotspots Project. I believe that the effort by our local brigades in assisting with Hotspots Burns will be paid back in the long run when emergencies occur.

If the Hotspots Program is effectively actioned by property owners in fire risk areas, it will provide the first line of defence for the whole community in fire emergencies.

Hidden In The Hills **CONESTICKS AND DRUMSTICKS**

Cream and yellow coloured flowers are quite common during spring and summer in bushland reserves.

Flowering around December to January one of the larger cream coloured flowers is the Common Conestick (Petrophile pulchella), which is characterised firstly by its cluster of elongated or globular shaped flower heads, and secondly by the distinctive rounded foliage which has bright yellow tips.

The seed cones can last for a number of years on the shrub, which may grow up to 3 metres tall in ideal situations, living for many years in its favoured habitat of open forest or adjacent heathlands. There exists a small number of other less common conesticks

living in the same region. However, there are similar looking species botanically related to the conesticks known as drumsticks. Drumsticks have a similar seed cone which is more spherical in shape.

One is the Broad-leaf Drumstick (Isopogon anenomifolius) whose flower is a brighter yellow with many short stems ending



in small globular heads. These heads appear to explode into a mass of minute fluffy flowers. Its flowering period is generally from August to December. This shrub can grow to around 1 to 2 meters in similar habitat to the Conesticks.

Yet another similar plant growing to around 2 meters tall, is the Narrow-leaf Drumstick (Isopogon anethifolius), which as its name suggests has a narrower leaf structure. Its flowering period is from September to December. Both plants produce spherical seed pods which initially have a grey fluffy covering.

Any one of these showy plant species can be grown as a massed planting in the home garden or as a feature plant in containers.

This statement is God's declaration of His eternal purpose for every person in our world.



2023 WORLD YOUTH DAY IN PORTUGAL 1-6 AUGUST

The first World Youth Day (WYD) was held in Rome in 1986 and since then this important gathering of young people of faith has been celebrated approximately every three years. This year's celebration in Lisbon, Portugal, was originally scheduled to be held in 2021 but was postponed because of the Covid pandemic. A special emphasis on Mary, mother of Jesus, this year acknowledged the unique place Portugal holds as the country where three children were said to be visited by Mary in 1917. Verses 5 and 6 tell us of the confidence we can have with the Lord as our shepherd. Even when everything is going against us, we can count on Him.




What is our response to the goodness of God? Do we take it all without thinking or without thanking Him? Remember what ever comes today, he is there with you always.

A GROUP WITHIN HORNSBY KU-RING-GAI SUPPORT BRIGADE (ADDITIONAL VOLUNTEERS NEEDED)

The advantages of a Fire-Spotting Tower is the ability to sight smoke long before the calls come in from the public.

THINKING OF VOLUNTEERING?

Requirements:

- Men or women over the age of 18.
- Desire to help the community.
- Being trained in Tower procedure and map reading
- Being on a two hour roster on Total Fire Ban days. Two persons per shift.
- · Help with the occasional working bee and participate in Brigade training sessions.

A Rural Fire Service uniform will be provided after the RFS training period.

HISTORY OF THE TOWER

The 60ft Galston Fire-Spotting Tower began operations in 1977. Located off Crosslands Road Galston. It had been a redundant electricity tower that members of the Galston Bushfire Brigade transformed. The cabin was built from steel at the Galston RFS station and lowered onto the tower with a crane. It operates in conjunction with the 100ft high Berowra Tower.


The equipment in the Tower is completely solar powered and has been since it was built.



From the Tower a 360 degree view takes in the lower Blue Mountains, the Central Coast and the North Shore. There are still some members of the team with over 45 years service. The summer fire season is from the 1st October to 31st March or extended when proclaimed.

ARE YOU READY FOR THE BUSHFIRE SEASON?

As we approach another bushfire season, the importance of preparation and planning cannot be overstated. The reality is that during a severe bushfire event, the availability of firefighting resources may be stretched thin. The Hills District is home to 17 Bushfire Brigades and approximately 65 firefighting appliances. There are limited fire trucks to go around, so it is important to understand the risk of living in a bushfire prone area and ensure we are prepared well in advance.

Here are some simple steps you can do to ensure you and your family are prepared:

- 1) Know Your Capability: Understanding your own abilities and limitations is the first step toward making informed decisions during a bushfire emergency. Factors such as physical fitness, age, and familiarity with the area and firefighting equipment should all be considered. It's important to assess whether you are adequately equipped to stay and defend your property or if evacuation is the safer option.
- 2) Develop a Comprehensive Plan: It is essential that every household has taken time to prepare and update their bushfire survival plan for this upcoming fire season. It is important to sit down with your family, discuss evacuation routes, and have a designated safe meeting point. Consider the needs of pets and livestock as well.

3) Stay and Defend or Evacuate: This decision is one of the most critical aspects of your bushfire survival plan. Staying to defend your property requires careful consideration of your skills, available resources, and the level of risk. If you choose this option, ensure you have the necessary firefighting equipment, protective gear, and a clear understanding of fire behaviour. However, it's important to note that defending your property should not jeopardise your safety your life is the top priority.

On the other hand, if you decide to evacuate, do so early and adhere to the advice provided by local authorities. Waiting too long to leave can result in being caught in dangerous conditions, hindering emergency services' ability to assist you. Remember that roads may become congested, and visibility could be severely limited during a bushfire.

If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your local brigade who will be more than happy to assist you.






