Remembrance Day



Remembrance Day is on Saturday, 11th November. On this day, we pay respect and pause for one minute to remember the service and sacrifice of our veterans and current serving personnel.

Originally known as Armistice Day, Remembrance Day marks the signing of the peace agreement between Germany and the Allies that ended the Great War of 1914-1918.

The Second World War began just 21 years later. Almost one million Australians served during that conflict, which lasted close to six years. Armistice Day was then renamed Remembrance Day. Remembrance Day is now a day to remember and honour all Australians who have served.

The Official 2023 NSW Remembrance Day service will take place at the Cenotaph in Martin Place, Sydney, at 10:30am on Saturday 11th November. The event is open to the public and everyone is encouraged to attend the service to pay their respects to the fallen. Local Remembrance Day services will also be held at Glenorie and Galston.

GLENORIE FIRE FAMILY

A video of a fire started by a bolt of lightning engulfing a Glenorie home stunned everyone who saw it but for the Zeaiter family, the loss of two family homes on the same property in less than an hour is something they are still coming to terms with.

Adele Zeaiter, her husband George and four children

(Olivia, 25, twins Georgia and Alanna, 23, and son Nicholas 19) were living with Adele's mum Janette while their home was being renovated when the lightning storm struck their property on Cattai Ridge Rd.

Not everyone was home that evening (September 27th) but Adele said her mother was watching television and she and her daughter Alanna were both working online when the storm began.

"We saw the lighting and the sky was white, the noise was like a bomb going off and immediately there was a blackout. It was frightening."

She said the three of them decided to go to her sister's house nearby because she had power while her husband stayed behind to investigate if there was any damage to the renovated home they were just three weeks away from moving back into.

"There was a bit of smoke coming from the roof and that's all you could see."

Adele said her husband called emergency services and was in their house trying to hose it down to prevent it spreading to her mother's house when the ceiling started to collapse and he escaped through a window. "That's when we saw the flames, there was no time to get anything." George called Adele to alert her to the situation and she returned to see the flames engulfing both homes.

"It was the most heartbreaking thing I have ever seen," she told the *Hills to Hawkesbury Community News*. "I was inconsolable, we went from one lightning strike to the loss of two houses in just 45 minutes."

"It's nobody's fault. It's like a one in 20 million chance."

She says the community support has been humbling. She said on the night, neighbours appeared from everywhere with hoses to help and one neighbour took the family dog.

"We lost everything but we are so grateful we got out. My children are grieving, we all feel very empty and sad. It's the things we lost that we can never replace, the photos of the children growing up, my dad's wedding ring, his diary. It was such a happy place. My mother has four children, 12 grandchildren and a great grandchild. We have so many joyous memories."

She said while they wait for the insurance process to go through they have been very humbled by the support of friends, community and strangers. The boxes of fruit and food that have been dropped off and the clothes and shoes. She said a group of teenage girls dropped off a voucher for \$1,000 for her girls to buy new clothes with.

"I am still trying to process it all while we decide what happens next but we are so grateful that when we reached rock bottom, the community held us up. Amid the sadness there have been a lot of beautiful moments."

Her niece Larissa has started a Go Fund me page to help the family pull together the basics. https://www.gofundme.com/f/the-zeaiter-family So far it has raised over \$40,000.

Nev: Downsides?


PB & S: We don't like getting yelled at when we walk on top of the laptop keyboard.

During her 9 years of racing her best results have to date been 1st Place Junior World Title in Spain, 2nd Place Women's F2 World Title in New Zealand and 4 consecutive annual 1st Place wins in Open Women's Catalina Island Ocean Race USA from 2016 to 2019 as well as many other achievements along the way.

After a few years break Rachael is back and has competed in the Australian Selection Races for 2023 Worlds Ski Racing Championships





and has successfully qualified to represent Australia as NO 1 F1 Open Women's Class Skier to compete with her Team consisting of Driver Jason Walmsley a previous Open Men's World Champion, Observer Kevin Boyland who has several World titles as an observer and the owner of the boat Team Coldys F1, 24 year old Jack Coldrake who is competing in F1 Open Men's Class. ROGER ALLAN FOY OAM



A special ceremony was held at Fagan Park on Sunday the first of October at 2pm during the annual heritage open day.

The special occasion was to recognise the contribution that Roger Allan Foy OAM had made during his life time of 27 years to the volunteer group The Friends Of Fagan Park.

He was known as Allan, to all of us, he was a developmental engineer with British Motor Corporation and later with Leyland Australia. He was a lover of all things automotive and had an incredible knowledge naturally of British automobiles.

The former mayor of Hornsby, Ron Payne who started the Friends Of Fagan Park found the Leyland truck that Bruce Fagan owned in a paddock at Canowindra in the late 1980's.

Bruce Fagan bought the "CUB" model truck at the 1932 Sydney Royal Easter show as it was the latest product Leyland wanted to introduce to the Australian market. Ron knew of Allan Foy and asked him to join the Friends and naturally bring his skills and knowledge with him, so in 1996 Allan joined the group, and commenced the 10 year project of restoring the truck to its former glory where it is proudly on display at Fagan Park in the mechanical museum today.

Allans lifetime involvement was not limited to Fagan Park, he has been involved with various Motoring Bodies, served on committees, involved with Council Of Motor Clubs, Leyland Heritage Group, and written books on automotive manufacturing in Australia.

He involved himself with many other projects at Fagan Park in addition to the Leyland Truck. He was an invaluable member of the group so much knowledge and willingness to share, assist and guide. He will certainly be missed, this unique Australian Engineer.

Late last year the Friends decided to nominate Allan for an Australia Day award, sending all the relevant information to the Secretariat in Canberra. No additional information was asked for. There was not enough room on the application to provide a comprehensive summary of his life's achievements.

Around the time of the announcing of the Australia Days awards this year Allan's health had declined, but he was well enough to know that

(Order Of Australia Medal) of which he was very pleased and honoured. He was not able to attend Government House for his investiture,

so the Governor Margaret Beazley made arrangements to go to the San Hospital and present to him at his bedside, sadly he passed away 7.30am that morning aged 93 years. What a wonderful gesture of Her Excellency.

So a memorial plaque was unveiled in the mechanical museum and a history of Allan for future visitors to know who he was and his contribution.



REMEMBER RAY

A fitting memory for November Remembrance Day is a story about Ray Whiteman the organizer of the Remembrance Day service at the Glenorie cenotaph for many years. Plus of course Anzac Day service where we all recall his singing of the National Anthem, Abide with Me and all the services songs.

FROM PAT SCHWARTZ:

Ray passed away on August 2019 and over three hundred people crammed into the Glenorie Mission Church to celebrate his life a testament to the huge number of people in our community who knew, loved and respected Ray. Ray was the thread that drew so many people together in maintaining the core values of our community. He worked in his own business as an electrician, served his years of National Service in the Navy, was a key player in the Scouts movement and sailed and owned sailing boats. He held many community roles included - President and public Officer of Eastbend Rural Communications Inc.: Chair of Glenorie Progress Association; a member of the Glenorie Maroota Bio-Regional Forum from its inception and member of Hills Community Aid Inc.

Ray main commitment was his stewardship of the Glenorie Memorial Hall and Wal Buckingham Park. He chaired the Hall Committee, created and maintained the gardens and lined the walls with photographs of homes that belonged to early Glenorie residents. All these photos he framed and maintained himself.

Those who knew Ray will know of other things that he did for them and the community.

FROM LILLY SCHWARTZ:

I saw him a fair bit growing up and he was always so kind and sweet and dedicated, particularly so to the garden there in Glenorie. He was so knowledgeable of Glenorie too. I remember he didn't like waste and loved his Church and religion. He always tried to do the right thing.

Our Uncle Ray will always be remembered dearly. He had a humble selfless nature, he set an example for us all, with his morals, Christian beliefs and standards, and the respect he displayed for others.

I loved travelling back to Glenorie regularly, to spend time with Uncle Ray. We would sit and talk for hours, and he bestowed me with his wisdom and advice.

Our family is so incredibly proud of the person he was and the tireless commitment and contributions he made to the community of Glenorie.

Uncle Ray was involved in so many community activities. Earlier on it was Scouting, and in later years it was, the Glenorie Memorial Hall. In the hall, he gathered and displayed numerous photos of the Glenorie families and the community of which he was so proud to be part of.

As a family we have so many beautiful memories of wonderful times spent together. Even though I continue to miss Uncle Ray, he will be in our hearts forever.

FROM DI COXON-ELLIS:

I have a picture in my mind of Ray on hands and knees weeding the gardens, tending to the gazanias that he had planted. He also arranged the Council planting of the Western Red Gums

that line the streets of Glenorie Village and give us a stunning display of colour in summer.

> Ray was affectionately known at the "Mayor of Glenorie" and was custodian of the Glenorie Memorial Hall. He handpainted the military emblems on the glass windows, compiled the photo display in the Hall and was President of the Hall Committee. I had large boots to fill when I took over from Ray as President of the Glenorie Progress Association, which he ran for countless years.

And, of course, we are planning the tribute to Ray by naming the wonderful carved sandstone heritage fence after him. Ray is an integral part of the heritage of this area and we hope to demonstrate in the 13 piers of this fence this rich heritage ranging from the First Nations people, the convict building of the Great North Road, the early settlers and the farming and agriculture, transport, sand mining, sport and other community services.

For their end of term activity, the Cubs had a great night at Hayes Oval looking at the starry sky, learning a bit about Astronomy and playing wide games.


Their goal was to learn something about the Southern Cross and use it to find the direction South.

Every Friday, the boys get to work alongside a Men's Shed mentor, diving into practical projects in various trades. Among them, there are budding welders, electricians, wood turners, and a group keen on mechanics, currently working on restoring a rally car.

Besides hands-on trade experience, the program is also teaching the boys important life skills such as:

- Persistence and resilience to keep improving their work until it meets required standards;
- The ability to stay focused on a project throughout the day; and
- Improved interpersonal skills through interactions with their mentors.



A significant benefit of the program has been the interaction with positive male role models from the Men's Shed. The rapport between the boys and the volunteers has grown quickly, with the boys keen to learn from the life experiences of their mentors.

FROM THE DESK OF MATT KEAN

MATT KEAN - NSW MEMBER FOR HORNSBY

Residents in the Glenorie area are eager to have safe pedestrian/cycle access along Old

Northern Road between Glenorie and Dural. A shared pathway in that area would allow the local community to increase their walking and cycling opportunities and decrease their reliance on using motor vehicles, particularly for shorter trips.

The previous State Government introduced the Active Transport Strategy to identify and provide funding for these major shared pathway opportunities and I will be working hard with the current Government to have this section of Old Northern Road included in the Active Transport plan.

The recent NSW police boundary changes have relocated the Glenhaven/Cherrybrook areas from the Eastwood Local Area Command to the Hills Local Area Command. This will reduce response times to Glenhaven/Cherrybrook area, and I know it is a very welcome change as a number of residents previously contacted my office with concerns on this issue.

I am pleased to see Hornsby Council rolling out significant road repairs across my electorate. These repairs are being funded as part of the previous State Government's \$500 million Regional and Local Road Repair Program for NSW councils to support emergency patching to roads damaged from last year's severe storms. Through this funding, announced in February this year, Hornsby Council received \$6.5 million as a boost to their existing repairs budget for roads that fall under their responsibility.

VULNERABLE PEOPLE CONTINUE TO SUFFER AS LAW REFORM STAGNATES

Over recent weeks it has come to my attention that property developers and energy retailers are able to establish energy contracts that leave tenants paying inflated energy prices.

This exploitation of tenants is due to the establishment of an Embedded Network where services for the basics of water, gas and electricity are installed by an energy company, instead of the developer. The developer therefore saves money by not having to build this infrastructure and allows the energy provider to embed a long-term contract that tenants cannot negotiate, leaving them tied to the profiteering of that energy company.

One resident of an embedded network received a hot water bill for \$2,000 for a 9-month period, while another was charged \$9,700 for a 14-month period! When a resident complained about their exorbitant prices, they were threatened with disconnection despite knowing the customer was registered for life support. This racket is causing mental and physical harm. Vulnerable people on fixed incomes are going without hot showers or essentials such as food and medicine, and many are having to turn to charity for support to manage their bills.

Embedded Networks are not new and are common practice in shopping centres, retirement villages, apartment complexes and caravan parks. However, regulation has not kept up, and with the rise in residential apartments, the consumer/tenant is getting ripped off.

Consumers are becoming trapped into energy agreements that are overpriced, uncompetitive and impossible to exit and there is no obligation for the seller or agent to disclose whether a complex is on an Embedded Network or not.

There have been many enquiries into Embedded Networks over the last six years with many recommendations including calling for an immediate ban on charging for hot and chilled water. While the NSW Government dawdles at a sluggish pace, the Victorian Government has realised this is an issue and banned Embedded Networks in most new residential apartments!

The laws governing Embedded Networks are not fit for purpose so if you would like to get involved, please send me an email **mball@hornsby**. **nsw.gov.au** so we can collectively put pressure on the NSW Government and look after the most venerable members of our community.



GALSTON DISTRICT GARDEN CLUB

I would like to thank the garden owners, volunteers and the public for making the recent Open Gardens weekend such a success.

I have been in my garden and have noticed how dry everything is, especially the soil. During this dry weather, it can be difficult to make sure plants get the water they need to survive, much less thrive.

Most plants absorb very little moisture through their leaves. Almost all the water they need has to get absorbed through their roots. So the more roots they have, the better equipped they are to find and absorb moisture. A well-developed root system with lots of little sponge-like root hairs is a plant's best insurance for survival in drought conditions. For a plant to develop a good root system, the roots need to be able to push out into the soil. In addition, to do that they need to be working in a loose, friable soil – not one that is hard and compacted. Gardeners can help create good conditions for root growth by breakinghard packed soil with a fork, and most of all, by adding organic matter. Mixing organic matter with native soil particles loosen up the soil and makes it much easier for roots to stretch out in all directions.

Organic matter – such as compost, peat moss, and shredded leaves – works in two other important ways to help roots access moisture. Adding these materials will make your soil more porous, so water that is applied to the soil surface will not run off but rather will move down into the root zone. Soil that contains a large amount of organic matter can also retain much more moisture.

Absorbing moisture is the task of the youngest, most tender part of a plant's system – the growing roots tips and root hairs. When moisture conditions alternate radically between wet and dry, these root hairs are stressed and damaged. Covering the soil surface with a thick layer of mulch reduces water loss due to evaporation, and just as importantly, helps maintain a consistent moisture level in the soil to keep delicate root hairs healthy.

OTHER TIPS FOR GARDENING IN DRY WEATHER:

Water early or late. Morning time is best because moisture doesn't sit on the leaves and encourage disease. Use a drip hose to water at the base of the plant. By doing this, you are getting more water to the roots, reducing water loss through evaporation and reducing the amount of moisture left on the leaves. Strong, deep roots are vital to healthy plants. Watering deeply encourages roots to follow the moisture further into the earth, rather than remain at the surface of the soil where they are more susceptible to heat and drought.

Water as needed, not on a set schedule. This kind of goes hand-in-hand with watering deeply. By watering a few times each week, you encourage deeper root growth. Plants in containers will require more frequent watering. Reduce your watering when rainfall is abundant (obviously) Too much water can be as detrimental to plants as too little.

If you are walking along one of the many tracks in our bushland reserves between October and December you may chance across a Kunzea ambigua (White Kunzea or Tick Bush).

This bush is fairly common, particularly in open scrubby woodland and heath with sandy soils. It is one of the first to regrow after its habitat has been disturbed by clearing.

In ideal conditions, this bush which may grow up to 3 metres tall, and in season, can be covered with a prolific crop of delicate white flowers with very long stamens which conceal the petals.

These flowers provide a welcome source of nectar for all sorts of insects as well as small nectar feeding and insectivorous birds.

When taking the time to look into the bush it is possible to observe some of the insects that prefer to live in its vicinity.

This particular species is sometimes used in gardens, especially those featuring a variety of native plants. When kept compact by pruning it presents well as a seasonal specimen plant.

The name "Tick Bush" apparently comes from people observing that some native animals like to lay below the bush. It was thought that the aromatic oil content of the foliage may deter ticks and mites.

Growing in a similar habitat is the less common Kunzea capitata (Pink Kunzea). This smaller variety may grow to around 1.5 metres high, and will be in flower generally from September to October.

The deep pink flowers have small white pin head size globular dots at the ends of the stamens. Several flowers are clustered together towards the ends of branches which have a distinctive reddish-brown colouration.

This shrub is usually more compact than its relative. It too can be grown as an ornamental specimen in a home native garden.

OUR ANCHOR OF FAITH

Recently, we spent a few days by the ocean where I enjoyed watching boats of various sizes coming and going. In the calmer waters, two boats anchored overnight - which caused me to think about a Bible verse in Hebrews 6:19, referring to Jesus Christ. It says, "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul; both firm and secure."

This thought took me to the dictionary, which describes an anchor as "a device normally made of metal, used to secure a vessel to the bed of a body of water, to prevent the craft from drifting due to wind or current." (Wikipedia).

GALSTON UNITING CHURCH CONGRATULATIONS RAY AND EVELYN CUNNINGHAM... ON 70 YEARS OF MARRIAGE AND RAY'S 100TH BIRTHDAY

In September, the Church Family celebrated with Ray and Evelyn at a special morning tea. Their lives have been great examples of faith in action!



Ray was born in Sydney in 1923 and had active service during WW2 in PNG, Morotai and Labuan. When Ray's division returned for further training at Wagga in 1944, he met Evelyn who then lived in Wagga. Ray then returned to the war in Morotai and Evelyn completed her BEc. degree before entering high school teaching. After the war, Ray trained as a wool classer and then entered Bible College to train as a missionary, before going to Sarawak with the Borneo Evangelical Mission. Evelyn followed four years later and they were married at the mission base in 1953, 9 years after their first meeting.

Their service was to the tribal people; the Kayan, Kenyah, nomadic Penan and Iban, in their own language and culture. Transport was by river, often over rapids. Their animistic religion was full of prohibitions, fears of omens and the spirit world with its associated customs. Many of the tribal people gladly replaced these destructive customs with a meaningful trust in Jesus Christ, their Creator God who loves them and so had died for them, rose again and was now alive and more powerful than the evil spirits they feared. As Ray and Evelyn say, "the good in their culture was in this way enriched and not destroyed".




