

Fagan Park Children's Forest

to foster 'connection and responsible stewardship of nature'



Hornsby Shire Council in association with the NSW Government have proudly unveiled a new Children's Forest in Galston — only the second of its kind in Australia and an innovative new feature of the Shire's already treasured Fagan Park.

Featuring educational discovery pods, timber animal interactions, an outdoor learning space, Yarning Circle and a pond with stepping stones, along with grassed picnic areas and accessible pathways, the Children's Forest provides an educational model showcasing the value of trees and was designed in close consultation with schools in the surrounding area.

Students from five schools, including children with physical or sensory needs, took part in interactive sessions submitting their ideas before an official exhibition period of the proposed design.

The Children's Forest will also claim the title of the first park in New South Wales designed specifically to nurture children's relationship with the natural world — a concept that Hornsby Shire Mayor, the Hon Philip Ruddock AO says is crucial in ensuring our future generations' sense of "connection and responsible stewardship of nature."

"Growing up in Hornsby Shire myself, I still often cast my mind back to my childhood connection to trees, nature and Hornsby's unique Blue Gum and Turpentine Ironbark forests," says Mayor Ruddock.

"So I'm very proud to bring to life this space that is reflective of our Shire's strong connection with nature and sees an innovative approach to strengthening this for future generations. Our thanks to the NSW Government for their support."

Minister for Planning and Public Spaces Paul Scully said the NSW Government's \$450,000 funding contribution will help connect young minds with their established surroundings.

"This unique addition will provide a new and exciting learning space for children to experience for decades

to come, and I thank Council and the local schools for bringing this innovative space to life," Mr Scully said.

Attending the opening, Parliamentary Secretary for Planning and Public Spaces Stephen Bali MP, said the new children's forest will be an educational model showcasing the value of trees for local kids.



Roses in the **Netherby Garden**

Many visitors know and love the roses that grow in the Netherby homestead garden. These roses have been here for many years, withstanding droughts, excessive rain, and Covid, when there were no visitors or gardeners for months.



At either side of the entrance to Netherby stand large bushes of a fragrant pink heritage Tea rose, named the Comtesse de Laplante, welcoming visitors to a bygone era. The multipetalled flowers nod

down, a soft contrast to the old paling fence.

Walking towards the house, the path curves to the right, beside the west verandah, enclosing a wide garden bed. This protected site is perfect for roses, with abundant sunshine.

Here you'll find The Fairy, a low growing rose from 1932, with clusters of very small bright pink flowers and a slight apple fragrance. In this garden modern and heritage roses mix happily, a testament to both the origin of

Netherby, built in 1900, and also to its long life as home to the Fagan family, until 1980, when Bruce Fagan and his sister Ida donated their property to the people of NSW.

The generous spirit which inspired this gift makes the house and garden very special. A team of four gardening members of the Friends of Fagan enjoy caring for the Netherby garden, keeping it blooming for visitors.

The path passes bright pink Bonica, then three large bushes of that great favourite rose, Iceberg, in burgundy and white. The combination of the warm bricks of the old home and the bright profusion of flowers are a pretty background for visitors' photos.

The front of the house faces south, with beautiful old camellias which flower

in Autumn. Further around, the east side gets morning sun. Here grow a mix of roses, names unknown, with a new planting of Perle d'Or, an apricot rose with pink undertones, and a strong fragrance. Known as an excellent robust rose with good disease resistance, the team believes this rose will grow to rival the established roses on the west side.

Over one of the old iron sheds below the house we've planted two Renae climbing roses, hoping their fragrant blossoms will one day cover the entire shed and fill the air with perfume.

Our most recent introduction is Queen Elizabeth, planted in front of the original cottage, in the spot where a large palm tree used to grow. Surrounded now by lavender and succulents, our new rose is thriving.



Autumn is a great time to see roses in flower before they rest for the winter. We hope you pay a visit soon and enjoy all the roses of Netherby.

NSW Koala Strategy Review

The NSW Koala Strategy is reviewing their Strategy, inviting the public to make submissions to give new information and inform of gaps in the approach of the NSW Koala Strategy.

This gives everyone a chance to comment on what is and isn't working, and to put in a voice for the Hills, Hornsby and Hawkesbury region, which has so far been overlooked by NSW Koala Strategy. In fact, the NSW Koala Strategy does not list our region as an area of koala habitat at all, despite photographic, sound recorded and community reported presence of koalas in Hills. Hornsby and Hawkesbury region.

The Hills-Hornsby Rural Koala Project (HHRKP) and Glenorie Progress Association (GPA) has written submissions and encouraged the community to also do so!

A major focus of our submissions is requesting that the NSW Koala Strategy recognises the Hills, Hornsby and Hawkesbury region as koala habitat. Pillar 4 of the NSW Koala Strategy is all about gaining knowledge about the distribution of koalas throughout NSW, so the review is the perfect chance to let them know that koalas exist in our area.

Aside from our immediate area, we can help to support Heathcote and Appin koalas by requesting that the high koala vehicle

strike rate on both Heathcote and Appin roads are addressed. Between 2022 to July 2022 to February 2024 there were 30 koalas killed on Appin Road and 11 on Heathcote Road. Local environmental groups, koala protection groups and wildlife carers

have been reporting on these tirelessly, and they need our support! Pillar 3 of the NSW Koala Strategy focuses on the health and safety of koalas, so they should be made aware of the high death toll on these roads.

Pillar 2 of the NSW Koala Strategy aims toward supporting some Councils in koala mapping. Perhaps suggestions can be made that they could work with Hawkesbury Council.

Comments were also made about Offsets, land clearing, transparency regarding expenditure and any part of the NSW Koala Strategy that could be improved or changed.

GPA does koalas, DAs and builds fences... soon we hope

Glenorie Progress Association is about reflecting the views of our community on various issues.

NSW Koala Strategy Review

Elsewhere in this magazine you can read full details on our Environment Centre volunteers' work with The Hills-Hornsby Rural Koala Project (HHRKP), led by members Lilly and Pat.

HHRKP & the GPA has written submissions and encouraged the community to comment on the NSW Koala Strategy Review to give new information and inform of gaps in the approach of the NSW Koala Strategy. We put in a voice for The Hills, Hornsby and Hawkesbury region, which has been overlooked by the NSW Koala Strategy. In fact, the Strategy does not even list our region as an area of koala habitat, despite photos, calls recorded plus reports from community members around Glenorie, Maroota and other areas in this region.

Besides being a great opportunity to let them know that koalas do exist in our area, we also support Heathcote and Appin regions by asking the Strategy to address the high koala vehicle strike rate on those roads.



Many submissions were sent by email, post or via the online form on the NSW Koala Strategy website. Submissions were due 26th April 2024.

Be a Part of Glenorie Heritage

The GPA has a focus on the Heritage of our region in the planned fence which will tell the story in sandstone carvings, of our history from the





The Ferry Artists is a not for profit community gallery showcasing the work of artists and artisans in our local and surrounding region. Membership is available to interested artists by contacting the gallery





You will learn basic anatomy ,physiology and the difference between adults, children and infants relating to CPR, the importance of the chain of survival, written and verbal reporting of incident details, reviewing incidents to improve your own skills and response times, to recognise psychological impacts and seeking help required.

Pre Course Study: Students will be required to undertake online pre course work prior to attending the face to face session depending on the course delivery mode.

Online Study: Students must have access to a computer, smartphone, tablet or other electronic devices with access to the internet to complete the online pre-course studies.

Students will be assessed on the following: To perform 2 minutes of CPR on an adult (Incl. the use of an AED and placing a casualty into the recovery position.

Complete a first aid incident report form based on the simulated first aid scenario, perform CPR on an infant, Manage a casualty with anaphylaxis, Manage a casualty with asthma, Manage a choking casualty, and manage a casualty with non-lifethreatening bleeding and shock, requiring minor wound cleaning. Students will need to complete all their pre-course/theory online prior to the day to be assessed practically. This reduces the amount of time they spend onsite.

How fortunate we are to have, within our community, a person who has intimate knowledge of the history of the establishment of the war memorial at Hell Fire Pass on the Thai Burma railway.

While working in Thailand, Ken Bradley, our guest speaker, was able to draw together much valuable information on the location of events, personal recollections and rare photographs associated with the construction of the railway during World War Two. This resulted in the unveiling of the memorial now so significant to Australia. The audience at the well attended meeting was enthralled by the material presented. It is a valuable resource for research, which Ken hopes to present the Australian War Memorial.

Currently the Society library is being reviewed and it is expected there will be books of historical content that may be of interest to readers; a list of some will be published. Copies of the Dural Roundup and Glenorie, Galston and Hills Rural are now on line at the State Library of New South Wales. These can be opened guite easily while earlier editions are not yet available in this way.

The Society guest for the 11th May will be Judith Dunn OAM. Judith is a widely respected author, historian and guide; she is also a most entertaining speaker. She will tell the stories of some of the 25,000 convict women transported to the colonies between 1788 and 1868. Their crimes, the society in which they lived and how they overcame the many obstacles they met, make for an interesting afternoon. The Government facilities, such of the Female Factory and the Orphanage, played an important role for many families and they are of special interest to their descendants. A tour of Parramatta by Society members and friends later in May, will be visit these.



For an entertaining, informative and uplifting read on the subject of Female Convicts and how they coped, it is worthwhile reading "The Floating Brothel" by Sian Rees. It is the story of the convict transport ship Lady Julian bringing 237 women to the Colony in 1789. The humanity and pragmatism shown is a message to those who might think only the worst.








Resilience in the Face of Change

Change is an inevitable part of our lives, and it is often quoted that change 'is as good as a holiday.' Yet, that is not always the case and our level of resilience in the way we deal with change can affect our everyday lives, health, and wellbeing. It is often the small changes within big changes that make a difference. There is no escaping the stressors that big changes such as marriage, divorce, bereavement, losing or changing jobs and moving house can bring to our lives. Moving house maybe a welcome big change but often it is the loss of good neighbours, missing regular catchups at the local coffee shop and perhaps not having a garden that can have a negative impact. For younger family members, the changing of schools is a big adjustment but it is the making of new friends, interactions on social media and adapting to new routines and unfamiliar situations that can have a greater impact. Retirement introduces a new freedom and identity, but can also bring loneliness, the missing of morning tea office chatter and loss of responsibilities.

If difficulties are experienced in readjusting to new circumstances, then a feeling of belonging in our community is difficult, difference is felt, and marginalisation is experienced. That feeling of difference and marginalisation can hurt and increase the pain already being suffered from change. Our resilience to change may then depend on our ability to reach out to access mental and financial support and use social support when it is needed.

Local representatives jointly call for New Line Road upgrade

Local MPs today have called on the Minns Government to honour the previous Coalition Government's commitment to upgrading New Line Road.

\$70 million is required to convert New Line Road to dual carriageway between Purchase Road and Hastings Road. However, the Minns-Labor Government have yet to support this planned upgrade.

Today, various representatives, at all three levels of government, have come together to jointly call on the NSW government to upgrade New Line Road.

 "People throughout the Berowra electorate have been calling for the
 upgrade of New Line Road since before I was elected. I was proud to

 the Minns-Labor Government is letting down everyone who has
 fought for this project for almost 2 decades."

- ➤ Peter Gangemi, Hills Shire Mayor said, "The upgrade of New Line Road is a critical project to help people get to and from the rural suburbs in The Hills. As more families choose to call The Hills home, it is important that the State Government remain committed to key infrastructure projects such as the upgrade of New Line Road".
- ➤ Nathan Tilbury, Hornsby Shire Council Deputy Mayor said, "Despite the desperate need, the new NSW Government have yet to commit to upgrading New Line Road to make it fit for purpose for the existing population. They cannot only consider new developments in the area without also considering the required infrastructure."

From the desk of Matt Kean



Matt Kean - NSW Member for Hornsby

Recently I was very pleased to be joined by other politicians, from our local area, at all levels of government and together we have called on the NSW government to honour the previous Coalition Government's commitment to upgrading New Line Road. On behalf of our constituents, we will continue to make strong representations to fix New Line Road, until a result is achieved.

One of the most special places in my electorate of Hornsby, is Fagan Park and it was my pleasure to be part of the opening of the Children's Forest playground at the park recently. This unique play experience, largely funded by the previous NSW Government, has proved to be a great success.

There were students from both Galston and Arcadia Public School at the Children's Forest opening. During the school holidays many more kids have given it a good work out and I have already received so much positive feedback.

Instead of trees being cleared to deliver a new recreation facility, it's so pleasing to see how the playground's designer, Fiona Robbe, managed to include the trees as part of it.

Situated in the southeast section of the park, in an area that was previously under utilised, it is exciting to think that this is just stage one. The Children's Forest will ultimately



include tree climbing, a cubby building area, treetop canopy walk, bird hide, tree house with a slide and much more.

The next new facility to be delivered in Fagan Park will be a dog park and this should be available for use later this year.

My favourite part in Fagan Park is Carrs Bush. This is a preserved area of remnant bushland that includes over 120 species of plants. There is an impressive, elevated boardwalk with interpretive signage for people to eniov the bushland. I can tell you from firsthand experience, it is an amazing place to visit.

When he donated the land for public use in 1979, Bruce Fagan described his vision for Fagan Park, as being a "Park for the People". Without a doubt his vision has become a reality.

For many years, it has been a key priority of mine to champion a better deal for our area from the telcos – for more towers and fewer blackspots.

Only weeks ago, we got a new phone tower in Glenhaven. This is a cause of celebration after years fighting for the tower, including a community campaign for the tower to be located at Glenhaven Green.

As the Minister for Communications Michelle Rowland said about a communications blackspot in her own electorate, reliable communications is not "a nice to have, it's a necessity". I agree with her.

In recent months, it has become apparent to me that the Government's decision to shut down the 3G network has not been totally thought through. It's also a deep concern to local residents.

Residents have told me in emails: "All I know is that lately my signal bars have reduced to one bar only and I appear to only have 3G".

And "We don't rely on 3G unless 4G is down which happens. We seem to be in a black spot or hole. We need 3G when this happens"

Another resident wrote, "4G is very bad at our address. We needed to install a phone

booster. The phone booster works better on 3G than 4G.

Many residents across the electorate are still relying on the 3G network and cannot get the 4G or 5G network. And for those in boats on the Hawkesbury River, 3G is the vital link with emergency services.

There is not a shortage of technology, only a shortage

It's a cause I took up during the recent parliamentary sitting fortnight. I am pleased that Minister Rowland has formed a working group inquiring into the 3G shutdown - with a particular emphasis on triple zero calls.

Additionally, following my advocacy and the advocacy of others in the Coalition, the shutdown of the 3G network has been referred to the Senate's Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport References Committee.

The purpose of the inquiry is to review the impact that the shutdown will have on Australians who rely on the 3G network.

If you are impacted by this change, I encourage you to make a submission to the Committee. Submissions close on 31st May. If you would also like to share your thoughts with me, please don't hesitate to contact my office.

Galston District Garden Club

The Galston District Garden Club met again on the 12th April welcoming many visitors and two new members. The members enjoyed a very informative talk about "Soil" and in May the guest speaker's topic will be "Trees". You are more than welcome to come and enjoy the company of gardeners for a chat and supper. We meet on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 7.30 in the Galston Community Hall, 37 Galston Road, Galston.

I want to talk about growing your own passionfruit.

They are so expensive and there is nothing more rewarding than picking your own fruit. Not only is passionfruit great for fruit salads, but it can also be an added topping for a homemade cheesecake or Christmas pavlova.

Passionfruit is easy to grow. Infact, it's a hardy plant that can be grown by those new to gardening as well as experienced green thumbs.

There are several different types of passionfruit available. The type most commonly grown in Australia is the passiflora edulis. This passionfruit has dark purple skin, with a yellow to orange pulp surrounding its black seeds. Varieties of passiflora edulis include Misty Gem and Sweetheart.

Passionfruit vines love warm tropical and subtropical areas, which means they can be great for growing across many areas of Australia. So what are the steps to getting started?

Acquire your passionfruit seedlings or seeds. Prepare the soil. These plants enjoy having soil with plenty of organic matter for nutrients. You can also place straw on top to help insulate the plant if you live in a

less-tropical region. Choose a sunny spot with support. About 6-8 hours of sunlight a day is ideal. Passionfruit vines love to climb, so a space with a trellis is great. If you don't have space in your garden, or wish to have

the option of moving your plant when needed, you can plant your passionfruit in a large pot, with support sticks or a trellis. Plant your plant and water it well.

Be patient, it often takes between 12 and 18 months for a passionfruit vine to begin producing fruit, so don't be too worried if your plant doesn't produce any in the first year. Vines like frequent watering particularly when they have just been planted and when they are growing delicious fruit.

Tips for growing your passionfruit vine:

Plant in the Spring. Weed the suckers. Suckers can go a little wild if left in place and can cause damage to other plants in your garden. If you see these five-fingered plants with blue and white flowers popping up, remove them immediately. Train the vines. These plants like to have support when growing If your plants won't stay in place, gently tie them in place with soft plant ties.

I hope you've enjoyed learning a little bit about how to grow your own passionfruit vine. Why not think about growing your own passionfruit vine this spring. Next year you could be enjoying delicious passionfruit grown from your very own garden!

The variety of insects that can be found in a bushland environment is quite amazing. However, it does take a considerably sharp eye, coupled with much patience to be able to get close enough to many of them - the larger ones in particular.

Most visible insects do not stay very long in the same spot which makes it difficult to observe them closely. Even to get a clear photograph of an insect can be a challenge. Sudden movement can cause

them to take to the air without warning.

Some of the really small ones become evident only after a photograph of a flower has been downloaded to a computer and that flower has been

enlarged. The small size of these creatures is amazing. So too can be their colouration

which in some cases can match the colour in the flower.

Most are masters at disguising themselves to look like their surroundings. Some look like sticks (that move), while others with almost transparent wings are hard to discern when on a leaf or tree trunk.

Not all flying insects are pests as they do have a role to play in maintaining a balance in the environment. Some are a food source for both birds and reptiles whilst others are in the transition stage of their reproduction cycle.



In gravelly areas it is possible to come across a nest of red **Bull Ants** which may

be around 20 to 25mm in length. These ants have been observed launching themselves towards any source of disturbance at their nest site.

If you are an early morning bushwalker it may be advisable for you to keep a sharp eye out where the track may be narrow enough for bushland spiders to construct their web between closely growing trees and bushes.
