Satin Bowerbird

A reader sent in this beautiful photo of a Satin Bowerbird's bower discovered on his property at Central MacDonald.

Satin Bowerbirds are amazing birds who build these intricate 'bowers' as a way to entice and court female birds in order to mate. The males are a brilliant glossy blue-black and the females are more of an olive green with a buff yellow underside with brown 'scale' pattern. Both genders have blue - almost violet eyes.

The male bowerbird decorates his bower with an array of coloured objects (mostly blue) including feathers, berries, flowers and pieces of household detritus. In this photo we can see plastic caps and pieces of blue

masking tape snavelled from some building work that was being done on the property.

Johnson Road Community Meeting

Hornsby Shire Councillor Tania Salitra invited Galston community residents to gather at 3 Johnson Road in Galston on Sunday 11th August 2024, to express our community interest inretaining the site for local 24/7 community enjoyment, and to hear about her motion to Council to WITHDRAW their plans to pursue assessing the site for rezoning to General Industrial E4.

Around 58 residents were able to attend. and appreciated Cr Salitra's stand in support of the many community and environmental benefits offered by the site as it now stands.

Galston residents believe that our constant communications with Council about our value of and need for the site, as our



local community park, are being heard and understood by Council. At Council's monthly meeting on 14th August, Council majority vote was against supporting Councillor Salitra's motion at this time. However,

Council made it clear that they ARE hearing and taking into account our community's views, and will be seeking further community input regarding Council's possible development proposal when their site assessment process is

completed in around March 2025.



Arcadia & Galston Resident Association (AGRA)

AGRA held an AGM and general meeting in August. Thank you to those who attended. All positions were filled, and no contestants were present. The AGRA Committee is formed by the following:

President: Sonja Cameron

Vice President: Michael Hutchence

Treasurer: Suellen Lister Secretary: Kathy Carter-Jones Public Officer: Andy Cameron

Off-Leash Dog Park - Fagan Park

The meeting resolved that AGRA request the Council to review the dog park in Fagan Park in 12 months. The review should include water testing, impact on native wildlife, and land conditions, with baseline water quality tested before the park's opening and results made public. Additionally, the review should consider access for local residents (e.g., free entry for 2159 residents, access outside park hours) and ensure parking and accessibility meet community needs.

Galston Domain Master Plan

The meeting resolved AGRA's ongoing request for the Council to provide accessible public toilets in Galston and within the design of the Galston Domain master plan.

Johnson Road, Galston

Councillors present were asked to provide their view on the Johnson Rd development. Clr Tania Salitra was the only councillor present,

and she provided her views and answered questions from the floor. Clr Salitra and Olivia Simons (standing for council) were asked to leave the meeting so a general and open discussion could occur. The members present spoke for an extended period, deliberating the issues.

The meeting resolved that AGRA requested the Council not to progress the Johnson Road development proposal beyond the feasibility study. Any further consideration of this, the Johnson Road development proposal be suspended till after the Local Government election and commencement of newly elected representatives. The feasibility of the proposal and any other relevant studies underway will be presented to the community to inform them of their position and provide a basis for ongoing consultation.

With this motion, it was decided that once AGRA could read the feasibility study results, further discussions and decisions would be made based on this additional information.



You can use it to establish a quick and easy network of support with three key contacts, review the risks relevant to where you live and create checklists. Watch a video and discover more at hornsby.nsw.gov.au/emergencies.

The NSW Local Government elections are on Saturday 14 September. Enrolling and voting is compulsory if you are 18 years and over so, please remember to check if your enrolment is up to date.

To vote in person on election day, visit a polling place between 8am and 6pm on Saturday, 14 September. If you are unable to vote in person on election day, you can vote early in person at a pre-poll location. You can also vote by post, if eligible. If you are blind or have low vision, you can vote by telephone.

To find out more about how and where to vote at the 2024 NSW Local Government elections, go to the **NSW Electoral Commission's** website at elections.nsw.gov.au or call 1300 135 736.





Revitalise Your Garden: Spring Gardening Essentials

As nature awakens from its winter slumber, breathe new life into your garden! With the promise of vibrant blooms and bountiful harvests, dive into a series of essential spring gardening tasks that will set the stage for a flourishing summer.

Fertilising is critical in your gardening routine. Boost your plants by feeding them well -including your lawn, hungry fruits and vegetables, and roses, gardenias, and hibiscus. Strong nourishment now will ensure they thrive in the warmer months ahead.

Once you've fed your garden, re-mulch your beds to suppress weeds and preserve moisture during the heat of summer.

As temperatures rise, make sure to reprogram your irrigation timers and check your watering lines for functionality. This ensures your garden will receive the hydration it needs to thrive.

For those considering new shrubs and trees, don't delay! Planting them now allows ample time for roots to establish before the heat sets in.

Spring into action in the veggie patch! Plant summer vegetables including tomatoes, capsicums, chillies, cucumbers, and eggplants. If space permits, consider adding zucchini, pumpkins, sweet corn, and melons. To cloak an unsightly shed or fence, try choko or passionfruit vines.




At The Rise Longford, most of our heat comes from our woodburning fireplace. It's important to us to lessen our use of electricity and be more self-sufficient, noting that all the wood is from Taylor Firewood recycled from fallen trees and is available for quests to use during their stay.

The Rise Longford Farmhouse is a real unplug and unwind retreat, complete with a welcoming firepit in the backyard that is also home to another piece of art from Dave Hayes of Metanical Industries. 


Dural and District Historical Society Inc



Galston High School Celebrates Science Week with Innovative Activities and Discoveries



Science Week occurred at Galston High School in week 4. where the Science Faculty celebrated their passion for science. The week started with a special assembly featuring Maggie Clifton, an alumna from the class of 2020. Maggie, who excelled in Biology, Chemistry, Investigating Science, and Science Extension during her time at Galston High, shared her journey from high school to her current Honours project at the University of Technology, Sydney. Her research on 3D Source Attribution could revolutionise forensic science by tracing 3D-printed tools back to their sources, highlighting the real-world impact of scientific investigation.



The week continued with a Science Trivia Competition, challenging students to test their general science knowledge. Groups competed to answer ten science-related questions, with top performers earning prizes. High-ability students tackled questions from higher grades for bonus points, showcasing their scientific prowess.

Midweek, Fizzics Education presented "Tick Tick Boom!", an explosive incursion that delved into the science of explosions and chemical safety, aligning with the NSW Science Syllabus. This engaging performance deepened students' understanding of various scientific domains, including the Physical World, Earth and Space, Living World, and Chemical World.

On Friday, Year 7 students visited Taronga Zoo, linking their studies of Living Things to real-world biodiversity and conservation. Through workshops and animal encounters, students explored classification, adaptations, and the critical role of these concepts in understanding wildlife.

To conclude Science Week, Galston High participated in BioBlitz, a citizen science initiative where students and teachers documented local biodiversity. This activity promoted environmental awareness and scientific engagement, with the hope of discovering unique species, as was the case when an echidna was spotted on school grounds last year.

PHILIP RUDDOCK STATEMENT

Property developer interests see Mayor and former federal minister ousted over his stance to protect Hornsby shire's environment

I have always advocated for appropriate development that respects the built and natural environment of the Shire of Hornsby and is in keeping with its amenity.

That has been seen as unacceptable by property developer interests, supported by some senior party members, in the Hornsby Local Government Liberal Party preselection.

In recent months it became clear to me that I could choose to either allow developers free reign over the shire I have fought to protect, or to stand by my principles and face certain replacement as the Liberal Party candidate.

I chose to stand for preselection as an example that politicians should not bow to vested interests, and instead should fight even unwinnable battles on behalf of those they are supposed to represent.

My time in politics and my upbringing have taught me that the community should always come first.

From a very young age, my late father Max instilled in me a great love of the Bushland Shire and its unique importance, as Sydney's lungs,

with its location between three great national parks: Lane Cove to the South, Kuring-Gai to the East and Berowra to the West. As a 16 year-old I identified the planning laws that prevented the industrial development of the area west of Thornleigh now known as Westleigh.

A considered approach to the way Hornsby manages the balance between urban growth, its rural areas and its natural environment was the reason I re-entered politics and stood for Mayor seven years ago. It was about giving back to my community not about any self-interest or ego. My commitment has been my ongoing public service to the diverse voices of the people of Hornsby Shire and in what I believe are their shared concerns about sustainability, heritage and growth to achieve positive outcomes for the whole community.

Hornsby Shire Council urges residents to get emergency prepared

As EmergencyRedi Week approaches (16th-22nd September), Hornsby Shire Council is calling on residents to take proactive steps in safeguarding their families and houses in emergencies by downloading and completing an emergency plan on the Australian Red Cross' Get Prepared app.

The free, easy-to-use app is designed to help residents make important decisions ahead of time by creating a personal emergency plan. Individuals can establish a network of key support contacts, add vital information into one place, set up simple survival checklists and emergency actions, as well as share their emergency plan with others.

Spring is also a good time to start taking steps to protect your homes as the bush fire season approaches. The top five actions to make your home safer are:

- Trim overhanging trees and shrubs to stop the fire spreading to your home (with approval where required).
- Mow grass and remove the cuttings and have a cleared area around vour home.
- Remove material that can burn around your home, such as door mats, wood piles, mulch, leaves, paint and outdoor furniture.
- Clear and remove all the debris and leaves from the gutters surrounding your home.
- Prepare hoses that will reach all around your home.

Hornsby Shire Council's General Manager, Steven Head emphasised the importance of being prepared for emergencies.



"With natural disasters becoming more frequent and severe, Hornsby Shire isn't immune, and it's more important than ever to make an emergency plan and prepare your home. Emergencies often happen quickly, without a lot of warning and being prepared can help protect yourself and your loved ones," said Steven.

"You can take practical steps like preparing a survival kit with what you would need for an emergency, keeping your garden well maintained and creating a plan using the Get Prepared App."

The Get Prepared app is co-created by the Australian Red Cross and NRMA Insurance.

The war on graffiti

Earlier this year some local residents and shop owners talked with me about the level graffiti in Normanhurst. Like many of you, I have seen the amount of graffiti grow in our suburbs this year. On shop fronts, fences, in parks and community spaces, it was there and just like in Normanhurst, graffiti right across our area is a problem that has been overlooked.

For shop owners and local small businesses, the presence of graffiti gives an impression of the area being run down or neglected and that doesn't help attract new or return



business. On people's fences and in community spaces the graffiti made it feel like our area was unsafe or not the great place to live that it actually is.

Something had to be done. I began looking into the problem and devising a solution.

After speaking to local Police, Hornsby Shire Councillor Sallianne McClelland and Wahroonga MP Alister Henskens, I convened a meeting with community leaders about how we tackle graffiti around our area. We developed a plan of attack and began to rally the troops.

I put out a call for volunteers and was overwhelmed with support from community organisations, local church groups, small businesses and families. We assembled our local graffiti-busting army and we prepared for battle.

What I didn't realise until then was just how easy removing graffiti is once you have the right supplies and know what you're doing... perhaps that's why graffiti has been left so long and has only gotten worse across Berowra.

Roger Norman from Turramurra Rotary provided the expertise and knowhow and trained over 30 volunteers to get the job done. Together we donned gloves and masks, and scrubbed and scraped. Volunteers from Hillcrest Uniting Church and St Agatha's Pennant Hills joined local Rotarians along with families and friends from across the community and we got the job done.

Local businesses were also on hand to support the war on graffiti with Dulux, Southern Cleaning Supplies, Kennards Thornleigh, Inspirations Hornsby, Uni-Pro, Bunnings Thornleigh, R Hair 4 U, On Dough, Wooden Mill and Jo from Well Versed Homes all providing supplies and sustenance.

We started in Normanhurst and Thornleigh but I know this is a problem across the electorate.



Hidden In The Hills



Trigger Plant

Frequently when out walking and looking for any wildflowers it is probable that the bushwalker may notice a small low growing plant with pink flowers on a stem protruding upwards from what appears to be a tuft of fairly thickly leafed grass.

More than likely this plant is one of the Trigger Plants, which are fairly common perennial herbs. There are two very similar varieties of this plant that grow in sandy soils in sheltered locations of open woodland forest.





One is simply known as Trigger Plant (Stylidium productum) which flowers from November to January.

The other is known as Grass-leaf Trigger Plant (Stylidium graminifolium) which generally flowers from September to December.

These two plants are very difficult to separately identify due to their similarity in growth habit and the colour and form of their flowers. Added to this is their overlapping flowering periods, which make a guick identification difficult.

To explain how the name "Trigger Plant" is derived requires some simple botanical terminology.

There is a small tube in the flower containing the style with two anthers that are usually bent backwards below the flower. An insect lands on the flower's centre which activates the tube to flick up and strike the insect, thus depositing a layer of pollen on the insect. The insect will visit a neighbouring Trigger Plant and unsuspectingly deposit the pollen onto another flower.

The trigger mechanism usually resets after a short period ready for the next visiting insect.

Walking and praising God

Wouldn't it have been thrilling to see this man (read Acts 3.v 1-11) jumping around trying out the new strength in his feet and ankles and at the same time shouting hallelujah? No wonder a crowd gathered to see what it was all about (v.11). In Acts 4:22 we are told that the man who was healed was over forty years of age.

A miracle of healing like this is wonderful and would always attract attention. But the miracle of salvation which Peter went on to talk about (3:12-19) is even more wonderful.

Yet sometimes we do not realise that truth.

Supposing in one of our church services a man was healed of a serious illness and another man gave his heart and life to Jesus Christ and was saved. Which man would people talk about the most as they went home? They would talk more about the man who was healed rather than the man who was saved, don't you think?

Yet what did Jesus say to the disciples in John 14:12? He promised that they would do even greater works than those which he had done. How? Because their work would be to bring men and women to the place of salvation and that is even greater than just healing their bodies.

Salvation lasts for ever and ever. Physical healing only lasts as long as we are here on earth. Salvation carries us on into heaven and eternity with Christ.

God doesn't give healing to everyone but he does give salvation to anyone who asks for it in the name of Jesus. Have you asked Jesus Christ to come into your heart and life and save you from being separated from God forever? Read Acts 4:12 and see for your self that there is no-one else who can save you, only Jesus Christ.

If you will do this just now, there will come happiness and peace into your life. It may not come immediately, but as you learn to trust God's word for yourself, that peace and joy will grow in your heart!

God's Safe **Boundary Lines**

Isn't it a challenge to be stuck in a line of traffic. especially when we are time poor or when we are due at an appointment at a certain time? Our attitudes can be tested and our patience can wear thin!

At the same time we are grateful for road rules to keep us as well as those around us safe.

Stating the obvious to every driver...

"Roads have lines: one on each side and one in the centre. These lines provide margins for our safety while we're driving. If we go over the line on one side, we risk going into the ditch! If we cross over the line in the middle, we risk getting hit by oncoming traffic. We appreciate those lines because they keep us safe." (a good description from an article I was reading recently).

It's like that in other areas of our personal lives too. A few months ago I wrote our magazine article about the Bible being GOD's book!

I explained how "ALL Scripture (each Bible passage) is GOD-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training us in righteousness", so that we are equipped for life.

Just like the lines on the road, when we have clearly marked boundary lines to follow in our daily lives, in the decisions we need to make and in our relationships with others, we can experience less anxiety and more peace.

God knows what is good for us - and also what can get us into trouble!! An old adage about God answering prayer says, "Sometimes He says 'yes'; sometimes 'no' and sometimes 'wait'. He always answers us when we chat to Him, but we need to realise that, just like the lines on the road are there to keep us safe, when God says 'no' or when we don't understand what's happening; when things don't work out in the way we want them to, God is not

- The returning Christ gives us hope for the future






