
Nev: What do you like best about your job?





Glenorie Probus Club Activities

In its program of varied and interesting activities The club visited the Ebenezer Church, the oldest extant church building in Australia, built for £400 in 1809 on 4 acres donated by a landholder, all monies contributed by local families. A multi-denominational church, it was built from sandstone quarried nearby. A timber dividing wall separated the front of the church and the rear, which was used as a school.

The adjacent Schoolmaster's Residence is believed to have been constructed in 1817.



A plaque at the step into this building indicates the level of the great flood of 1867.

Following free time to explore the Schoolmaster's Residence and cemetery it was onto the second stop, the nearby Tizzana Winery for wine tastings before a lunch of sandwich platters and hot apple pies. A very pleasant way to conclude another successful outing.

The guest speaker for August was Marie Palmer from the Sydney Harbour Federation Trust, a Federal Government entity. She gave a short overview of the properties around the harbour managed by the Trust, being Cockatoo Island, the largest in the harbour, the nearby Snapper Island, the smallest in the harbour, Woolwich Dock, the Submarine Base Platypus, Headland Park stretching from Chowder Bay, past George's Heights to Middle Head, Macquarie Lighthouse and the subject for today North Head Sanctuary, Manly.

She spoke of the Traditional Owners of the North Head Sanctuary, the Gayamagal People. Rock engravings, rock art, burials and shell middens are evidence of their connection with the area. Then the story of the North Fort Battery established in 1936. Until 1952 the fort featured two 9.2 inch calibre guns with a firing range of 26 kilometres. These were serviced



by a network of tunnels and a nearby Plotting Room located 8 metres underground

The area is a rich haven for flora and fauna. It features sand dunes dating back 140,000 years and a hanging swamp which now support rare Banksias, heathland, littoral rainforest and wetlands. It is a refuge for echidnas, reptiles, frogs, long-nosed bandicoots, pygmy possums, brown antechinus and bush rats. An interesting and entertaining talk.

The Club meets on the at 11.00am on the 4th Wednesday of the month at Glenorie RSL and new members are welcome.



A statement from Mayor Philip Ruddock

As I approach the end of my second term as Mayor of Hornsby Shire, also marking the end of over 50 years of public service, I reflect on my deep-rooted connection with local government and passion for my beloved Hornsby Shire. Like my Shire President father before me, who I watched preside over Council meetings in the 1960s, it is my strong belief that there is nothing more satisfying than to serve my community. I have dedicated my life to improving the lives of others.

Hornsby Shire is a special place. I am passionate about preserving its unique character – both from an environmental and heritage point of view. I have always maintained that our role as a Council is to ensure we meet the development demands that are put upon us in a way which has respect for the special character for the Shire, and in doing so, there needs to be constructive community engagement.

I am proud that during my term of office, I successfully oversaw the adoption of the Hornsby Town Centre Masterplan. More recently I have advocated on behalf of Council to the NSW Government around its medium density housing reforms. It is important that we get the balance right between development and preserving our precious bushland and open spaces.

Following in my father's footsteps, who famously coined the phrase 'The Bushland Shire', I have tirelessly campaigned to preserve and grow Hornsby Shire Council's tree canopy – the lungs of Sydney. Under my guidance, Council initiated its successful 'Greening Our Shire' campaign, which saw 30,000 trees planted across the Shire, ensuring our bushland is preserved for future generations.

Hornsby Shire has a well-deserved reputation for sound financial management, a strength that has been built upon further during my term of Council. Indeed, during my tenure, my fellow Councillors and I have made tough decisions to ensure continued financial sustainability. I'm proud that Council's most recent Long Term Financial Plan puts it in good stead to maintain financial sustainability for the next 10 years.

During my time as Mayor, Council progressed major projects for our community including the ambitious plan to build a major recreation space at Hornsby Park, soon to see the first stages come to fruition; the Galston Aquatic Centre upgrades; a new boat ramp at Wisemans Ferry; Storey Park Community Centre; public domain improvements in Asquith and countless parks and playgrounds.

My time in Council has not been without its challenges and shocks. It has been my privilege to be a steady hand, successfully steering Hornsby Shire through the many trials of recent years including the COVID-19 pandemic with all its uncertainties and complications, severe storms and multiple unprecedented floods. My campaign with other Sydney Mayors saw the NSW Government commit substantial funds to repair flood-damaged roads across Sydney, including Hornsby Shire's rural areas, helping to keep Sydney moving.

I consider myself to be a person for the people. It has been my great pleasure to preside over hundreds of Citizenship Ceremonies, coming face to face with thousands of new residents from all over the world. I have been proud to attend countless community and civic events and helped numerous people through regular Mayoral meetings, which I initiated when I first came to office. My goal to extend the capacity for community consultation has seen Council establish a new digital engagement platform and other initiatives to greatly increase the opportunity for residents' voices to be heard.

Importantly, under my leadership Councillors have worked together collaboratively to deliver positive outcomes for the people of Hornsby Shire. That's a rare achievement, where Liberals, Greens and Labor have come together in the best interests of the community.

It has been my pleasure and privilege to dedicate my life to service, and to see out my career in public office by making a difference in my own community has been incredibly special to me. I thank my family – my wife Heather and daughters Caitlin and Kirsty – for their continued support. I also thank my fellow Councillors, the staff of Hornsby Shire Council, and most of all the community, for the opportunity to be your Mayor – it has been an honour.

Sign of the Times

Many live in the area for its semi-rural charm and open spaces. Why then, are some hell-bent on turning it into an overgrown ugly advertising billboard?

There is no reinforcement of advertising signage regulations. All manner of businesses place their A-frames and promotional flags 24/7 on land which isn't theirs, outside property boundaries and on Council green spaces.

Throughout the Galston, Glenorie and Hills districts, signage is screwed or nailed into electricity poles, a practice which is illegal and dangerous. The Electricity Supply Act 1995, The Electoral Act 2017 and Ausgrid's own network standards all prohibit the attachment of material to electricity assets without approval.

In 2023 a Brisbane man was lucky to be alive after he tried to nail an illegal sign to a pole. It punctured a 11,000v cable which caused a 19,000 degree electrical arc explosion as well as cutting power to 1,500 homes.

Spare a thought for electricity crews who often have to climb poles at night and during severe weather in pouring rain with low visibility. The nails, screws and signs themselves can damage protective clothing and put the workers in a very dangerous situation.

There are other legitimate and economical ways to advertise. Letterbox drops still work, even in this digital age of limitless communication and websites.

Pleasant semi-rural streetscapes are now fast becoming advertising graffiti corridors, thanks to the actions of self-centred business owners.

And before they start whinging about "tough times", death by misadventure is a sure way to solve it.







Selling at Auction Discover essential auction tips for sellers

Selling at auction creates excitement and competitive bidding, which can often result in a higher sale price.

Whether it's your first time selling at auction or your tenth, it's natural to feel a bit jittery. The lead-up and the day of the auction can be quite stressful and overwhelming.

However, understanding the auction process can significantly boost your confidence. With this support, you'll navigate the auction more effectively and feel more assured about the outcome.



Property marketing for selling at auction.

The success of selling at auction largely depends on the marketing strategy leading up to it. A good marketing campaign is crucial because the more people who know about the property selling at auction, the more people will sign up to bid.

What to expect before an auction.

In NSW, potential bidders must register before the auction starts to get a bidder's number.

The auctioneer sets the expectations for what bidding increments will be accepted, but bidders can offer any amount.

When the bidding reaches the reserve price, the auctioneer will accept the highest bid. The auctioneer will then declare the property sold with a hammer drop. If the property doesn't sell at auction, the auctioneer will pass it in. Then, the auctioneer and agent will try to negotiate a sale with the highest bidder.

Top auction tips for sellers.

- Book your auctioneer in advance: Make sure to book an auctioneer in advance so they can get to know the property. Attend a few of their auctions if you're curious to see their selling style.
- **Prepare properly:** Auctions start with an open for inspection to give potential buyers an opportunity for one final walk-through. Ensure your property looks its absolute best, inside and out, drawing attention to the home's key selling features.
- Set an appropriate reserve price: Bidders may lose interest if the reserve price is too high, so it's important to be realistic and heed your agent's advice.
- Attend the auction: If the property doesn't sell at auction, the highest bidder can negotiate with you afterwards. Being present or close by on auction day is important. Watching the auction will also give you an insight into how invested bidders seem.


The **12th October** meeting is the Society's AGM. Rather unusually attendance at our AGM is a well





Since using this system he hasn't lost or had any damaged plant due to excessive heat.

He installed uv protected nylex tubing with several different misting tips every metre.

The system can be preset to turn on up to 12 times a day or can be turn on manually.

Still Creek Landcare The Creeks and Critters Project

The Creeks & Critters project, which employed cutting-edge eDNA technology to connect people with their local environment, recently concluded with a final presentation to its dedicated citizen scientists. This grant-funded initiative brought the community together to explore the biodiversity of 41 creekline sites across Hornsby's Bushland Shire.

The presentation highlighted some fascinating findings from the Spring 2023 and Autumn 2024 eDNA sampling, showcasing the diverse range of species detected in our local waterways.

As a proud project partner, Still Creek Catchment Landcare believes this initiative has provided an invaluable baseline of the existing life in our creeks and surrounds. The results were astounding in the number of creatures detected and reinforced our knowledge of the biodiversity in our creeks in a number of catchments something we've never had before and is available to all, students, scientists and land developers.

The importance of this baseline information cannot be underestimated as a window to what we have and help in managing the land we hold so dear.

Hidden In The Hills

Bird Nesting Hollows



By Lachlan Turner

Very old and large trees have the capacity to provide nesting hollows for all manner of Australian wildlife including mammals, reptiles

and of course birds. But naturally formed hollows in trees have become scarce due to the removal of these old trees to make way for housing development and agriculture.

Not just any tree hollow will suit a particular bird. Factors such as the angle of entry access, as well as the size of that entry and the depth of the hollow, all have an influence on whether a particular bird species will feel adequately protected in order to successfully breed a new generation.



It has been suggested that it may take up to 200 years for hollows to form that will enable larger birds and animals to find a suitable hollow in which to make their home. Trees which have been subject to a disease or insect attack, as well as having weather or fire related damage, are ideal

The Kenthurst Mens Shed may still have a range of hand made boxes that have been designed to meet the needs of a variety of birds.

Religion or Salvation

It is over 115 kms from Jerusalem to Galilee. Yet some of the Pharisees walked that distance just to criticise Jesus. (Mark 7: 1-13). The Pharisees were a group of men who, while they believed in God, made a great many more laws or rules than God ever made for His people. They thought that by doing certain things they scored points with God. All they cared about were outward things. But their hearts were not right with God.

It is tragic when men and women go through life doing things which they think will please God when all the time God is looking for the love and worship of their hearts.

Because the Pharisees had added so many new rules of their own to the law which God had given, their rules had taken the place of God's law. Christ mentioned this when pointing out what they had done to the commandment regarding parents (v.9).

Christ wanted to cut through their man-made rules and help people to see the need of obeying God and having a right relationship with Him. Christ always taught that God wants our fellowship, with no sin between us and Him. The Pharisees thought that sin was a failure to keep their rules. It was some thing on the outside of a person. But Christ said sin is in the heart. It is not just common dirt on our hands, but the stain of sin deep within our hearts.

Do you understand the difference? Religion is only something we do. Salvation is something which deals with the heart, and only God can do that.

'What can wash away my sin? Nothing but the blood of Jesus.

What can make me whole again?

Nothing but the blood of Jesus.'

What is Faith and Why is it so Important?

The word "faith" is often spoken in conversation but at the same time can be quite difficult to define or explain.

So I checked the dictionary meaning and found some useful example sentences.

- ** Her supporters have accepted her claims with blind faith.
- ** Lending him the money to start his own business was a step of faith.
- ** It requires a giant leap of faith to believe that she is telling the truth.
- ** Nothing is more important to him than his faith in God.

Everyday we have faith that the lift in the shopping centre will take us up or down just by the press of a button! When we fly in an aeroplane, we have faith that it will take off, fly and land at our chosen destination. We have faith in the pilot that he is experienced and knows what he is doing!

The pressing question comes when we look at the big picture of our lives and how we choose to live it.

** Where will we put our faith?

We exercise faith everyday in the things we SEE - but what about the things we DON'T see, like what will happen tomorrow or next year? We can't control or even organise time in the future and we can't 'make' our dreams come true.

The Bible defines faith as: "the assurance of things hoped for; the conviction of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1).

This means that true and lasting faith can be understood as: choosing to believe in God and HIS CHARACTER and then living life in ways that honour, trust and hope in Him.



Three examples:

** Psalm 34:8 says, "Taste and see that the Lord is GOOD. Blessed is the man who trusts and takes refuge in Him."

So we have faith that God is good, even through tough times when it feels otherwise.

** Lamentations 3: 22-23 says, "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is His FAITHFULNESS." So we believe that God is faithful even though we don't know the future nor how things will work out.

** John 3:16 tells us that "God so LOVED the world that He GAVE His only begotten Son Jesus Christ, that whoever BELIEVES in Him will not perish but have everlasting life." So we have faith in God's loving promise that when we believe in Jesus Christ as our Saviour and Lord, we will be in heaven after we leave this earthly life.

Let's be encouraged to focus always in the God of truth and hope. God bless.






