# **The Privet Problem**

#### **By Karlene Brummer**

Each year as I travel around our beautiful suburbs I take particular interest in noticing what types of vegetation are exhibiting the best 'show'. This year I observed that Photinia and Azaleas were flourishing particularly well, but to my dismay so was PRIVET. I don't think I have ever seen as much Privet flowering with such force since I moved here in 2010. Obviously conditions have been just right for this pesky plant to not only spread exponentially, but to positively thrive!

The problem with privet is multifaceted. It is oftentimes used as a hedge or windbreak which is fine – but it must be trimmed before flowering to stop the spread of seeds by either water, bats or birds (particularly Currawongs).

#### Two types of Privet are prevalent in our location:

- 1. Smallleaf Privet (Ligustrum sinense)
- 2. Broadleaf Privet (Ligustrum lucidum)

The following information is reproduced from the Sydney Regional Privet Management Plan and the full pdf may be found by going to: https://sydneyweeds.org.au if you wish to learn more about this invasive species and how to mitigate it's spread.

Both species of Privet are widespread in bushland gullies and creek lines throughout the Hornsby Shire, extensively in the urban bushland areas. Generally Ligustrum sinense is more prevalent in the urban areas and Ligustrum lucidum in the rural areas (on both private and Council managed lands). In residential areas, privet is often found in well established, abandoned or poorly maintained gardens, more frequently in areas with fertile soils.

In the Sydney region, Privet is one of the worst environmental weeds in bushland areas. It poses a significant ecological threat through its progressive and permanent domination of indigenous vegetation, especially in disturbed areas and the more fertile soils of gullies, creeklines and rainforest edges where moisture and nutrient levels are often elevated due to stormwater pollution and sewage overflows. In higher rainfall areas with shale soils it is also known to infest relatively undisturbed bushland. Threatened species and endangered ecological communities are also at threat from Privet invasions. For example, Privet is threatening Persoonia mollis habitat and the Blue Gum High

Forest in the Sydney North region. Privet propagates easily from seed where suitable conditions exist. Small-leaved Privet seedlings can form a dense carpet of over 600 per square metre after a site is initially cleared (Buchanan, R. 1989). The young plants grow aggressively, have no natural enemies and are capable of displacing most native understorey species, forming dense thickets and competing heavily with native plants for light, water and nutrients - casting heavy shade under which little else can grow. An indirect impact of Privet and other fruit bearing exotic trees is that they support artificially high currawong populations, thus affecting other native bird populations. Privet pollen and perfume is also recorded as having significant human health impacts, being highly allergenic and a major contributor to asthma, allergic rhinitis and hayfever. Councils receive numerous complaints every year from residents reporting individual flowering specimens which they feel are exacerbating their condition. However, it has also been reported that these allergic reactions are actually related to the strong, sickly perfume of the flowers rather than the pollen. The leaves and fruit are also poisonous and dangerous to children. If Privet is kept pruned as a hedge with all flowers removed before full development, and thus eliminating the seed source, it does not pose a great environmental or human health risk. However with unchecked growth it will flower and fruit prolifically and spread to other areas.

#### Method and Rate of Spread

Privet readily reproduces by seed, suckers from damaged stems and roots, and regrows from cut stumps. Each shrub can produce more than 10 000 seeds a year, with seed viability up to 98%. The seeds are spread widely by water, fruit-eating birds such as currawongs, bats, and dumped garden Sydney Regional Privet Management Plan – 2005/2010 10 waste. Exacerbating this, ripe Privet seedheads are regularly sold at the Sydney Markets to florists for floral arrangements, and Privet seedlings are commonly found for sale at various retail outlets and market stalls. Often this can be as various cultivars but these are prone to revert to the wild type, and most seedlings produced are similar to the wild type.

#### **Species Management**

Small Privet plants and seedlings can be manually removed, digging up as much of the main root system as possible to discourage suckering. Over large areas, seedlings can be sprayed

using a Glyposate-based herbicide. Large specimens can be controlled using either the cut and paint, or frilling methods using an undiluted Glyphosate-based product. In bushland areas, Privet should only be controlled where follow-up maintenance and replacement native regeneration/planting can be undertaken, whether by agency staff, contractors or volunteers. Special care needs to be taken along creeklines and in areas at high risk of erosion, where control works should be undertaken with a catchment management focus and possibly with the selective use of the frilling method only.

It is commonly recommended that Privet on private property be replaced with another non-invasive species – some native tree alternatives include Blueberry Ash (Elaeocarpus reticulatus), Lilly Pilly (Acmena smithii), Water Gum (Tristaniopsis laurina) or Cheese Tree (Glochidion ferdinandi). For hedging, Lilly Pilly (Acmena smithii), Syzigium sp and Photinia (Photinia glabra) are good alternatives.

# Lost History of Arcadia

A recent 'off the cuff' conversation with a long term resident of the area regarding the lack of any identifying presence of indigenous occupation/footprint in our local area, sparked a passionate response, when she told me that i was absolutely incorrect in this assumption. I have seen with my own eyes rock carvings at both Maroota and Canoelands, but was unaware of anything further south than these. Unfortunately at some time in the 1960's/1970's, scaremongering

rumours began to spread that if anyone had any sites of Aboriginal significance on their properties that they may be open to their land being repossessed or having a caveat placed upon the title and so many landowners began a subtle (and sometimes not so subtle) process of covering up any identifying artefacts. Luckily history has recorded one such local discovery for posterity, and I include some excerpts from article below:

## **Excerpt: The Parramatta Press** Thursday, January 3, 1957

#### Local Aboriginal Art Found Aboriginal Cave Drawings FIRES PREVENT NEW RECORDINGS

#### Parramatta Pressman, Collingridge Rivett, was guided to one of the biggest aboriginal art finds for decades early this week.


Farmers from the Fiddletown-Annangrove area formed an expedition and cut their way into thick, rough country in Northern Arcadia to enable the pressman to fully record the valuable discoveries.

Well-known Arcadian farmer, Mr. Kenneth Peebles, originally found the fascinating cave with a friend, Alan Gillis, seventeen years ago. After Mr. Peebles heard of the discoveries of rock carvings in this locality some months ago, he informed friends and Parramatta Press. The party, interested in preserving the ancient art of the Australian aboriginals, set out at dawn in a successful attempt to fully record the cave's art. However, bush fires forced the party to return back from the wild hilly country, while sketches and photographs were being made of rock carvings nearby.

The cave, some five miles west of uninhabited Calabash Bay, overlooks a magnificent tropical-like native paradise of lush vegetation and wildlife. The position of the cave suggests it was selected by abo. Elders, as a "royal box", overlooking picturesque ceremonial grounds.

Some thirty paintings were found in the cave, nearly all depicting local wild life. Among the modern-like works were three wallabies, an emu, porcupine, blue-tongued lizard, fish and snakes. There were also five strange man-like characters without necks drawn at the foot of the largest mural. Largest figure seen was a wallaby, about 40 inches long. Some 80 square feet of the cave, which faces south, is decorated with the drawings produced in orange, red and yellow ochres and black pigments. Many figures are 'super-imposed' over each other, showing an abstract pattern. The dyes or ochres used have preserved the stone faces upon which the drawings are produced. Where no drawings show on the wall, the face of the rock is 'sanding' away. Damp, moss and age have ruined many works and the remaining art appears to be fading. It would be correct to assume the art is hundreds of years old. The aboriginal artists certainly selected a fine art gallery for the production of their interesting compositions.

Rock carvings depicting a huge fish-like creature, some 27 feet long, numerous wallabies, an emu, fish and a porpoise were recorded along upright rock faces after the cave was vacated. These carvings were seen by Mr. and Mrs. Peebles some weeks ago. They were found about a mile north-east of the cave. Most significant find of the recording party was a number of fresh water holes above a cliff face. Alongside the holes, well-worn grooves were found. Aboriginals obviously carved and sharpened their axe-heads there.



Experienced bushmen of the party warn people that the area is just not an ordinary Australian 'bush-walker's delight!' Several would-be rock carving finders have become lost and police and locals have had to rescue them from the rugged, little-known ranges of primitive Marramarra. It is understood very few white men have ever penetrated this aboriginal "Lost Horizon."





# **Glenorie Progress Association**

The Hills-Hornsby Rural Koala Proiect (HHRKP) has been working since 2018 to investigate koala presence in the Hills-Hornsby areas. HHRKP aimed to establish whether we have a breeding population of koalas in the area again, as we did prior to the 2002 fires. Also to gain knowledge on the distribution, health and population density of koalas in the area, to gain information required to protect them. The project works closely with the community and has received many reports from community over the years, as well as some absolutely crucial evidence such as photographs and recordings to build evidence for a population.

In recent years there have been many more reports of koalas which have been collated into verified and non-verified sightings. A verified sighting must be accompanied by a photograph or sound recording. Nonverified sightings, also very important, are recorded but cannot be viewed with the same certainty.

The work of HHRKP has been very successful as there is now evidence to show that there are populations of koalas in the bushland of The Hills and Hornsby Shires and not just 'transient 'individuals passing through.

The key is community engagement community is the eyes and ears of the Koala Project.

So if you think you hear a koala bellowing

or if you are lucky enough to see one, please record/photograph if possible and report it to Hills-Hornsby Rural Koala project facebook page or call/message 0424 844 740.

And as anyone involved with winter sport will tell you after the wet winter the drainage on too many of our fields is not up to standard.

Since I have been elected, I've taken up this fight for a lot of local clubs and I'm so pleased with what we've been able to achieve working together. New club houses, returfing, equipment, storage facilities, bathrooms and upgrades and improvements totalling around \$5 million worth of local investment are some of my proudest achievements as your local MP.

I've lost track of the number of times I've spoken about local sports clubs in Parliament and the reason is because when I'm in Canberra I'm there fighting for Berowra; I'm telling my parliamentary colleagues about the fantastic groups in our area and reminding them that they need support to continue.

Despite how much we've managed to achieve together, there's still lots to do.

Last week I met with representatives from a couple of local clubs and community groups to talk about how they're travelling and what their plans for the future are. I met with representatives from West Pennant Hills and Cherrybrook Football Club - the Lions. # Galston Garden Club

Next meeting will be on 6th November Guest speaker will be Amanda Trulove Talks about "Florist's Art"

November meeting will be on the 6th November a week earlier than usual and will be the last meeting for the year. We are taking a break and the first meeting will be in February, 2025 the 2nd Wednesday of the month. But we are not finished yet we still have a garden ramble to go and a Christmas Party. At the November meeting we have a guest speaker, Amanda Trulove speaking about "Florist's Art". Visitors and new members are always welcome, even for our last meeting for the year.

In my garden at the moment, the Iris are coming into bloom. Iris flowers begin blooming in late winter to early spring. Iris care is minimal once the growing iris is established. Iris plant care consists mainly of dividing the iris plants to assure continued blooms. Iris plants are abundant multipliers but once the rhizomes of the plant become crowded, the iris flowers may be limited, and the rhizomes need to be separate.

**Tips for growing iris:** Plant rhizomes of the iris in a sunny location with well-drained, rich soil for optimum flowering. Leave room for growth between the rhizomes and do not bury the entire rhizome. Make sure roots are covered but allow the iris rhizome to remain partially above ground to avoid root rot.

Once blooms fade, leave the foliage to yellow before removing it from the flowerbed. As with many spring blooms, the foliage is sending nutrients to the rhizome for next year's flowers. This is one of the difficult parts of iris care, as many gardeners wish to immediately remove foliage once flowering is done.

Other iris plant care includes watering during dry spells, fertilization before flowers appear and deadheading of the spent blooms. However, most clumps of iris provide flowers with no maintenance. Iris is drought-tolerant and may be part of a xeric garden; keep in mind even drought-tolerant plants benefit from occasional watering.

**Xeric Garden:** This type of landscaping uses as little water as possible. This has the advantages of making the xeric garden easier to plant and maintain, while also being more cost-efficient for the owner and less harmful for the environment.

# **Ferals and Invasives**

Hills district residents may be surprised to know that there are a considerable number of feral animals roaming unchecked

## throughout the region.

Residents may also be surprised at the number of invasive garden escapee plant species that are colonising our bushland and adjacent areas.

Most feral and invasive pests are the direct result of historical human decisions, some supposedly made with good intentions. Some were to help eradicate other introduced species. Recent history has proven otherwise. It has now become the responsibility of everyone to be aware of the devastation caused by these exotic species which have no place in the Australian environment. All have the potential to destroy various elements of our unique Australian Biodiversity. Many have toxic effects on humans, domestic animals, livestock and native Australian birds, mammals, fish and insect species. By doing nothing about the adverse consequences of these species, the sad history of feral infestations continues to be perpetuated.

It is illegal to keep, sell and trade (swap) many of these declared plant and animal species designated as having a detrimental effect on Australia's biodiversity.

There are strong requests for community members to notify appropriate authorities where any of these species are observed in their locality, as well as in other environmental situations elsewhere.





Some known local feral animals include foxes, cats, rats, rabbits, dogs, deer, cane toads and possibly horses and goats. All are a death sentence to native birds, mammals, reptiles and riparian dwellers.

Some invasive plants known to overwhelm native bushland plants are Asparagus Ferns, Lantana, Blackberry, Privet varieties, Wandering Jew (Trad) and Scotch (English) Broom.

Feral birds such as Indian Myna, Starling and Feral Rock Pigeon harass and compete with native species for food and nesting spaces.


## On a sad note

# The Hopeful (part 2)

Last month many headed off to the cinemas around Australia to watch "The Hopeful." Set in the mid 1800s, the story (taken from real-life events) focuses on faith, courage, and hope. Thousands of Bible-believing Christians who faithfully worshipped every Sunday deeply hungered for the return of Jesus Christ. Baptists. Methodists. Lutherans, and many others from various faiths, studied God's word as never before.

The story begins with William Miller, a Baptist who miraculously survived the War of 1812, studied the scriptures; especially the prophecies regarding Christ's return. His method of Bible study was to methodically compare scripture with scripture; thus,

allowing the Bible to interpret itself. One passage commanded his attention, "Unto two thousand and three hundred days; then shall the sanctuary be cleansed" (Daniel 8:14). After studying the prophecies intensely for several years, and believing that the sanctuary meant the earth, Miller and many of his contemporaries came to the conclusion that Christ would return to cleanse the earth on October 22nd, 1844.

However, they didn't anticipate a bitter disappointment. Christ didn't then return, as they expected. Their calculations were correct, they just got the event wrong. They later discovered that their bitter experience was foretold in Revelation 10:8-10; and that they should continue to share the truth of God's word (V11). As they continued to study the scriptures, hope revived, and thus, those early Adventist believers'



became "The Hopeful." As they continued to study, the Holy Spirit revealed, not only deeper insights into the truth of Jesus (Gospel), but also the truths' of Jesus (the doctrinal teachings of His word).

Around that time a lady named Rachel Oakes, a member of the Seventh-day Baptist Church, challenged Pastor Frederick Wheeler, an Adventist Methodist, to step out in faith to keep all God's commandments. He and many others decided to follow the Biblical principle found in Acts 17:10, 11 which says, they "searched the scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so." As a result, through honest study of the word, many Methodist and Baptist preachers accepted the Sabbath truth; men such as Joseph Bates, Owen Crosier, Hiram Edson, including James and Ellen White. As the Apostle Paul says, faith doesn't make

'void God's law,' it established it (Romans 3:31).

Those men and women of faith, who built their hope on the truths of God's word, became the nucleus that formed the Seventh-day Adventist Church in 1863, nineteen years after the Great Disappointment. Check out **sabbathtruth.com** as we wait for the "Blessed hope and the glorious appearing of our great God and Saviour Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:13).

# **Glenorie Rural Fire Brigade** Safe Pile Burning



### **BEFORE**

### 1. Check you're allowed to burn

Contact your council or local Fire Control Centre to determine if burning is permitted in your area.

### 2. Obtain a Fire Permit

Fire permits are required during the Bush Fire Danger Period (generally October 1st – March 31st) to ensure safe fire management. They impose conditions on how fires are lit and maintained and inform authorities when and where landowners intend to burn, allowing for appropriate fire control measures. To apply for a permit, visit the RFS website: https://nswrfsprod.service-now.com/guardian\_csp

### 3. Notify Others

### **RFS Notification**

At least 24 hours before burning, notify the RFS of your intent to burn via the RFS website at www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/notify

### **Neighbour Notification**

Notify any adjoining neighbours (including those separated by a road, lane, or waterway) at least 24 hours before burning, unless otherwise specified in your permit.



# 1. Check weather conditions

Before burning, check the fire danger rating, wind, and temperature. Permits may be suspended during bad conditions. On Total Fire Ban Days, the lighting of fire is prohibited, and your Fire Permit will be automatically suspended. Suspended Fire Permits may resume after the Total Fire Ban is lifted.

## 2. Follow Permit Instructions

Ensure you're using fire

safely by adhering to any special conditions on your permit. Maintain a clear area around any material you're burning and monitor conditions closely.

## 3. Be Prepared for Emergencies

If the fire gets out of control, call Triple Zero (000).



# ► AFTER

## **1. Extinguish and Monitor**

Completely extinguish the fire and continue monitoring the area for any signs of reignition. Call Triple Zero (000) if there are any concerns.




