The Hills Shire Council received \$500,000 (from the Western Sydney Infrastructure Grants program) for an upgrade of the flood warning infrastructure around low lying bridges. The Flood Warning Infrastructure at five low-level bridge crossings will be upgraded to improve safety, reduce flood risk and help keep communities informed during flood events. Hills Council's five bridge crossings are located at: Pitt Town Road, Kenthurst (over Cattai Creek) - Pitt Town Road, Maraylya (over Cataract Creek - Cattai Ridge Road, Glenorie/Maraylya (over Cattai Creek) - McClymonts Road (over Cattai Creek) - Blue Gum Road (over Blue Gum Creek)

The works will consist of: Steel hinged road gates, signage, concrete median islands for single lane gates, electronic flood level warning systems, programmable trailer mounted VMS signs, portable traffic signals, road line-marking.

We understand that whilst the gates will still need to be closed manually by Council staff, the sensors under the bridges, which monitor river levels, will automatically activate the electronic signs and advise that the road is closed once the water reaches a certain level. The upgrade is not yet complete and we will advise residents as soon as the system is fully operational.

What are those black stains?

A resident recently suggested we take a look at some odd black staining around the base of trees and running down hill at the side of the small hut on Hayes Oval where many local children play soccer and softball. We took the following photos which do look as if some black waste has been spilled and washed down the hill. We also were alerted to some items disposed of in the nearby rubbish bins. The items in the bin indicate that







the stains may be Xtreme Black Concentrate Marking Liquid. The product information sheet did identify the product as non-hazardous, but further down it said that if the product was spilled and could contaminate water courses then local emergency services should be advised. We have raised this issue with Hornsby Council and we will publish the results of our investigations next issue.





Mother's D

Happy Mother's Day to all the Mothers, Step-Mums, Foster Mums and Fur child Mums in our community! I thought that I would pay tribute to my own Mother in this edition.

My Mother was born in 1937 in Leeton to parents Charles and Olive Keating. She was christened Mabelle Dawn but has been known as Dawn for most of her life. By the age of five the family moved to Bondi Junction and she completed her schooling at Sydney Girls High. Her father was conscripted to WW2 in 1939 and on his return was a changed man. He died tragically when Dawn was only 14. Her mother, Olive, continued living in the Bondi Junction terrace, taking on several paying boarders as well as four of her nieces and nephews whose family was no longer able to care for them.

After matriculating, Dawn enrolled in Teachers College to become a Primary School teacher and soon met a handsome young German immigrant named Rudi Brummer, who lived across

the road from her. She helped him with his English, and they eventually fell in love and married in 1961.

> Dawn's mother was able to get a bank loan for war widows and bought four acres of land in the little-known suburb of Glenhaven.

With a dirt main road, the area was predominantly one of orchards, chicken and pig farms. They built a small 'shed' and the family would travel the long way from Bondi to the Hills and stay there on weekends.

Eventually a house was built on the property and Olive, Dawn, Rudi and some of the kids moved in permanently. I was the first of three children - born in 1966 followed by Richard (1969) and Dieter (1976). Dawn was posted to several teaching positions across Sydney, including spending many years at both Annangrove & Glenhaven schools, teaching all of us kids at some point or another. We were allowed no special treatment and had to call



her "Mrs Brummer"! After retiring from teaching, she worked at Koala Park as a visitor hostess and spent nearly 20 years there.

Dawn had been a dancer in her youth and continued to be involved in the dance scene throughout her life. She spent many years involved in the Rookwood Rockers - a troupe of

interaction and soon found herself once again making costumes for this new group. Losing her husband in 2017 followed by the untimely death of her youngest son in 2021, she suffered some understandable health issues which was guite a worry for my brother and myself.

Now 88, Mum has bounced back Dawn and some of the and is still unstoppable, attending costumes she has made Tap lessons at the Galston Club each

Thursday night and sewing the multitude of costumes for the group, known as Alison's Tap Dazzlers. She is also passing

on her sewing skills to her 12-year-old granddaughter, lvy, who seems to have inherited the dressmaking gene. Still living happily in Glenhaven after some sixty years, but no longer driving, she walks to the local shops and if she needs to go further afield, she is a dab hand

gardening, old movies, going to the theatre, crafting and reading, and as she often says, "Age is just a number!"

Autumn Walks

Now that the hot weather has subsided, it's a great time to undertake some local walks. Being so close to the Great North Walk (which goes from Sydney to Newcastle), its a great opportunity to do some sections when you have time.

If you don't want to mess around with organising pick ups or drop offs, the Thornleigh to Hornsby is a great option as you can start at Hornsby station





and finish at Thornleigh Station and return to your car by train.

This trail is around 10km in length and travels through some beautiful bushland, including Fishponds and the Blue Gum Trail. If you don't want to end your walk walking up lots of steps, then start at Hornsby and walk to Thornleigh. The walk is considered moderately challenging. Dogs are not allowed on this trail. There are some creek crossings, so maybe don't go after lots of rain. Leeches can also be more common after rain. The walk goes through Berowra Valley National Park and the feedback on All Trails App is that the trail is well maintained but good walking shoes are recommended.

An offline map is recommended as there are some other walks that cross this trail and you don't want to head off in the wrong direction. Time for moderately fit people is 3-4 hours.

FEDERAL ELECTION

If you hadn't noticed the Federal Election is about to get into full swing.

VOTING

On election day you will receive two ballot papers: a white one for the Senate.

Senate and a green one for the House of Representatives.

On the white ballot paper, you have a choice of two ways to vote:

If you choose to vote above the line, you need to number at least 6 boxes. Put the number '1' in the box for the party or group that is your first choice, a '2' for your second choice and so on until you've numbered at least 6 boxes. If you choose to vote below the line, you need to number at least 12 boxes, from 1 to 12, for individual candidates in the order of your choice.

On the green ballot paper, you need to put a '1' in the box beside the candidate who is your first choice, '2' in the box beside your second choice and so on, until you have numbered

every box. You must number every box for your vote to count



Strzelecki Desert Ultra Run - 501kms

Many people know Mel Tunbridge as a lifelong member of the community, Melinda (Min) Bowerman. Her Dad, Greg Bowerman, was the local barber in Galston and Glenorie for more than 50 years.

In an extraordinary display of endurance and compassion, Mel is set to embark on the Strzelecki Desert 501, a 501-kilometre ultra run through the harsh terrain of the Strzelecki Desert in South Australia. This solo endeavour, scheduled for July 2025, aims to raise funds and awareness for Wings4Kidz, a charity dedicated to providing free flights for seriously ill children from rural areas to access essential medical care, and support the flooded small town of Innamincka and surrounding areas.

The Strzelecki Desert 501 will see Mel traverse the iconic Strzelecki Track, starting from Innamincka and concluding in Lyndhurst, in an official Guinness World Record attempt. Mel will then run on to the historic town of Farina to finish at the underground bakery, which is open for just 8 weeks per year. This route, known for its challenging conditions, will test Mel's physical and mental limits as she strives to complete the distance in record time.

Mel will be accompanied by her husband Jason who is by her side in "all of her greatest achievements". "Jason has seen me at my very best and most vulnerable through these ultra runs. He anticipates what I need before I have even thought about it. And when my brain fails me and my emotions are at their peak, his logical problem solving and intimate knowledge of how I respond to circumstances will get me to Farina".

Mel Tunbridge is no stranger to extreme challenges. She has previously completed several Ultra-Trail events in Australia and internationally. Mel is no stranger to running in Australian deserts, having run multiple distances in the Simpson Desert and the Kanku Breakaways of Coober Pedy, and she has run the Kokoda Track in Papua New Guinea.

In addition to her athletic achievements, Mel is a successful executive. She is the Executive Director of the number one Business School in Australia at the University of NSW (UNSW) and is often seen running to and from the Randwick campus on her commute. Residing in Canoelands, she is also an active member of Maroota Rural Fire Service.

As a Mum of 2 young girls, Mel believes it's important to demonstrate to girls in particular, "it's cool to do hard stuff". With notable achievements of their own, it's clear to see Heidi and Eloise embracing this lifestyle and mantra. They are often seen on the sidelines and finish line of many of Mel's races and will be part of the support crew for the Strzelecki Desert 501.

Mel remains resilient, using her experiences to fuel her passion for encouraging others and her partnership with the charity Wings4Kidz is no exception. Her ability to juggle her professional responsibilities, athletic pursuits, and family life is a testament to her strength



and determination. With the Strzelecki Track currently closed and under floodwater, the planning and training continues.

The ultra run is not just about setting records; it's about making a tangible difference in the lives of children and their families. By supporting Wings4Kidz, Mel hopes to ensure that more children can receive the medical attention they need without the added stress of travel logistics and costs.

Hornsby Council needs to hear from us all NOW if we are to save this valuable area and ensure children and local residents along the western side of our village can continue using the former Pony Club site for their social and recreational use.

Mayor Warren Waddell first proposed the rezoning of this site to General Industrial at a council meeting in July 2022 where he described the site as an 'industrial storage facility', 'Council Depot and adjacent land' and 'surrounded by similar infrastructure comprising industrial uses'. It was not explained that since 2009, the 3 Johnson Road portion of the site has been constantly used as an informal park by the local community, especially local children and dog walkers - and is used every single day.

At the Council meeting last week many locals spoke up in defence of their park. One local mother and daughter spoke convincingly about how they use this valuable open space and that, "turning this space into a loud, busy area will make it more dangerous for children and ruin the most favourite part of their day – walking through this warm, sunny bushland (after school)". They outlined how the community is, 'in disbelief' because last year they were told to 'trust the process' and believed their voices were being heard.

Other speakers outlined that the Galston community is not anti-progress but that this rezoning is 'deeply irresponsible, deeply unpopular and deeply at odds with what Galston village needs'.

The original Notice of Motion also failed to mention the Sydney Turpentine-Ironbark 'Critically Endangered Ecological Community' which surrounds this open space.

The Planning Proposal currently on exhibition outlines a proposal for 28 industrial units and up to 68 car parking spaces with the entrance on Johnson Road itself. If this proposal isn't bad enough, local residents are also savvy enough to know that being classified as Operational land means if the site is rezoned entirely as E4 Industrial Use, council would be *legally entitled to sell off the whole site to the developer with the most money*. Council does not have the \$14 million plus dollars needed to develop this site so any plans for this site cannot be guaranteed by Councillors.

Galston is not a densely populated area and Old Northern Road and Galston Gorge are NOT suitable commercial road networks to support an industrial complex. This plan seems ludicrous.

The only proposal that has been investigated by Council is for this entire site to be rezoned for industrial use. A Motion that was put forward last year to rezone the trees separately with C2 Conservation Zoning and for the open space to be considered for RE1 Public Recreation zoning was rejected despite this being a way Council could ensure the true attributes of this site are preserved and protected.

This land is used every single day and residents want this Council to put the community needs before profit-driven planning. We hope our councillors take heed.

Closing day for submissions is Sunday 11th May 2025 – please make the effort to contact each individual Councillor, our State MP James Wallace and Federal MP Julian Leeser to tell them your thoughts on such inappropriate rezoning. ABANDONED UTE

Police patrolling Carrington Rd, Castle Hill, on the evening of 4th April, and saw a man leave a rental vehicle and run into a nearby building site.

An inspection of the bag in the rear tray identified an amount of wiring, along with a 'Specialised' brand mountain bike.

An inspection of the adjoining building site identified an electrical box that had been stripped of wiring, along with another bag of copper and various plastic tubing with the wiring stripped out.

A police search of the site with the assistance of a police dog handler failed to locate the male who had been sighted earlier. The vehicle has been seized for forensic examination, with inquiries to continue to identify the driver.

CARS CRASH



Given the potential for a serious incident, resources from Oakville Rural Fire Brigade, Annangrove Rural Fire Service and rescue firefighters from Fire and Rescue NSW Station 071 Castle Hill were all called to attend.

The Hills Police Area Command had the road closed in both directions to allow access for firetrucks and NSW Ambulance

The NSW Rural Fire Service established fire protection whilst Fire and Rescue NSW crews used hydraulic rescue equipment to assist Ambulance Officers gain access to a patient.

Fortunately, there were no serious injuries, and the occupants of the vehicles were transported to the hospital for further checks.

MASSIVE CLEAN UP

A massive clean-up was made along Annangrove Road and Bannerman Rd Glenhaven after an unknown vehicle deliberately ran down several garbage bins on Friday, 4th April.

According to GPS tracking, the earliest truck in the area was a recycling truck around the affected properties on Annangrove Road.

The Hills Council and Hills Police are calling for anyone in the area to check their CCTV and DashCam footage on the early morning of 4th April to help narrow down the offending vehicle.

DRINK DRIVING CHARGES

Police are warning people not to drink and drive. At around 12.05 am on Thursday, 10th April, a 57-year-old male driver was stopped on Kings Rd, Castle Hill, while driving a 2018 white Holden station wagon.

He returned a positive roadside breath test. He was arrested and taken to Castle Hill Police Station. A breath analysis was conducted, returning a reading of 0.107 grammes of alcohol in 210 litres of breath. As a result, the driver's licence was suspended, and he was charged with drink driving.

In another incident a woman failed a breath test after the car collided with multiple vehicles.

At around 5.40 pm on Friday, 4th April, a 20-year-old woman driving a blue Toyota Camry collided with multiple parked vehicles on James Mileham Dr, Kellyville. The driver continued driving after each collision, eventually stopping against a tree.

Police arrived around 6.10 pm and found the driver seated on a small brick wall nearby. A breath test returned a positive result, and she was arrested for a secondary breath analysis, which showed a reading of 0.144 grammes of alcohol in 210 litres of breath.

The driver was charged with Mid-Range PCA, her licence was suspended, and she was issued a 'Notice of Suspension.

On Saturday 5th April at 9.30pm a stationary RBT unit on Mile End Rd Rouse Hill stopped a red Toyota Camry April. The red P-Plate driver admitted to having some beers with a mate and returned a positive breath test. Due to his level of intoxication police say he vomited in the back of the car. At the station he returned a reading of 0.116. He will face cort at a later date on a mid-range drink driving charge.

On the above date and time. police received information from a resident that a white Porsche Cayenne was seen casing houses near the mentioned address. Upon attending the location, police observed the vehicle, which immediately began to flee at high speed upon seeing the officers.

Numerous police resources attended the area



of Old Northern Rd, New Line Rd, and surrounding streets, obtaining visuals of the vehicle traveling at high speed. However, due to the speed of the vehicle, police were unable to get close enough to engage in a pursuit. At one point, the vehicle was seen traveling in the opposite direction to police, where officers observed two offenders wearing hoodies and face masks. The vehicle was sighted on several roads, including Derriwong Rd, Langford, Mid Dural Rd, Old Northern Rd. and Galston Rd.

Police were able to obtain footage from the resident of the offenders jumping fences to his house before entering the vehicle. however we are asking residents to check their cctv to see if they have better images.

SECOND MURDER CHARGE

A woman has been charged in connection to the alleged murder of Johnny Birch at Glenorie last month.

Police arrested a 35-year-old woman on the morning of 3rd April, at a property on Gleness Place, Glenorie.

She was taken to Castle Hill Police Station, where she was charged with accessory after the fact to murder and larceny - accessory before the fact.

Strike Force Halderen was established by The Hills Police Area Command and the State Crime Command's Homicide Squad to investigate the circumstances surrounding the death of 39-year-old Johnny Birch, whose body was found on the property on Gleness Place on Friday, 14th March.

The woman was refused bail to appear in Parramatta Local Court on Thursday, 29th May.

She is the second person to be charged in relation to the man's death. A 24-year-old man remains before the courts charged with murder.

Drink Driving Arrest Glenhaven

On Friday, April 18th, 2025, at approximately 10:00 AM, Hills Highway Patrol were conducting Random Breath Testing (RBT) at the intersection of Old Northern Rd and Gilbert Rd. During the operation, a driver of a Mazda BT 50 was stopped and returned a reading of 0.075, marking their second offence.

PAVER TALES Local families can record their family names in stone at the entrance of the Glenorie memorial Hall. One such family has purchased two single and six double pavers to record their heritage in Glenorie District. Here is their story:

GLENORIE SHORE FAMILY 1909-2025

The significance of the Shore Family's contribution to the development of Glenorie cannot be over emphasised. James Cullen Shore, our grandfather (The Patriarch of the Glenorie Shores) was born of English parents at Lanarkshire Scotland in 1875. He moved to Middlesex, England, from where he immigrated to Australia in 1902. He settled in Chatswood where he set up a horse drawn coach service.

Here he met and married Georgina Scranton (1905). They lost their first child, Mary, in her year of birth. Our father (James Leonard) was born next in 1907 followed by his brother, Dudley 1908. In 1909 Grandfather moved the family to a farm 5 miles along Cattai Rd, Glenorie at "Hillside" where he farmed and added Gladys, 1910, Charles, 1912, Sydney, 1913, Margaret 1914 and Jean 1916 to the family.

In 1918 Grandfather purchased another 20-acre farm near present day Gleness Place. In 1924 he added 80 acres which backed onto his holding. During this period, while still living at Hillside. the family worked hard developing their citrus orchard and adding some poultry. The children had to walk 5 miles each way to Glenorie School. Grandfather, along with the Halcrows and other local parents, partitioned the Dept. of Educ. to open a new Primary School at Hillside. This was successful in 1926 much to the children's delight. Now the walk to school was only half a mile.

Our father James Lenard Shore, the eldest in his family married our mother Eileen Stanlie Mobbs in 1930. Her proud ancestry dates to 1797 when a convict William Mobbs of Mobbs Hill fame, Carlingford, arrived on the HMS Barwell.

Their first home was the small cottage which still stands opposite the entrance to Garemyns Lane. After starting a family, they moved to Baulkham Hills where Dad worked as a truck driver for Herb Mobbs. The children attended Castle Hill Public School.

In 1933 James Cullen Shore bought the stone from the demolished Glenorie School of Arts (where the present-day Memorial Hall stands.) With this stone he built the Shore family home (now Bells residence) at 56 Cattai Ridge Rd.


In 1941, Grandfather took ill which resulted in our family returning to live with him in the Stone House at Glenorie and taking over the running of the Farm.

After Grandfather, J. C. Shore passed away in 1942, Dad and Mum, over time, purchased the property from Dad's siblings Gladys and Margaret who married Christies from the Shetland Islands and settled in Glenorie. His brother Sid spent time



fighting in WW11 and remained as part of the Occupation forces in Japan and married June, a Japanese girl. He returned to Glenorie to raise his family. Jean the youngest member of the family married Frank Smith and spent much time living in Glenorie before moving away to Ettalong and later Granville.

Meanwhile back at the Stone House in Glenorie, Dad (Jim Shore) started a carrying business in Glenorie, picking up produce from local growers to drop off at the Hay Market, Sydney and brought back requested items such as boxes, fertilizer and stock feed. This further encouraged development of farming in the district.



At the same time, he started diversifying the farm from only citrus. He planted Granny Smith Apples and Summer Fruits, mainly Peach Varieties and introduced intensive crops such as cabbages, watermelons, pumpkin, peas, beans, turnips and tomatoes.

What fun we had picking & packing produce after working

the ground, planting, fertilizing, watering and spraying the crops as they grew!

Schooling posed some problems. The older children Les, Esme, Col and Beryl attended Glenorie Public School until a drop in enrolment at Hillside Public threatened its closure. The Headmaster, Mr Bridge, approached Dad and the Shores transferred from Glenorie to Hillside saving the school which continues to thrive today. Harold and I completed all our Primary School Education at Hillside.

Hornsby Woman of the Year **Myf Webster**

Myf Webster has been recognised for her long and exceptional record of philanthropic community work.

During her decadelong tenure as a centre leader at Fusion in Hornsby, Myf developed a food rescue program that salvaged surplus food from local supermarkets to provide community dinners twice a week for up to

70 people. The program also distributed food hampers to over 100 people weekly, powered by a dedicated team of adult and student volunteers.

More recently. Myf has founded The Social Local Collective. a charity dedicated to enhancing community wellbeing by creating opportunities for intentional connection and enjoyment. The charity started as a result of Myf's research into the profound health impacts of social isolation and loneliness.

Myf's guiding philosophy is simple: Be the change you want to see in the world. This is a philosophy that each of us in the Parliament should live by. Myf's work in our area has consistently driven positive change and strengthened our local community. 



Instead of bagging and disposing of leaves, mulch them with the mower and let them decompose.

Plant your spring bulbs so you can enjoy flowers next spring: daffodils, hyacinths, tulips, crocuses and more these are the hardy bulbs that need a cold period to bloom.

Hidden in the Hills

NATIVE CURRANT

Growing in the more open sections of dry sclerophyl forest the Native Currant (Leptomeria acida) has an unusual characteristic in that it can be parasitic off the roots of other shrubs and trees. It has no leaves as such, but rather there are short to lengthy green protrusions that extend from somewhat thicker branchlets. These protrusions are where the fruit is attached.

The fruit is known to possess a reasonably high level of vitamin C, and as such is edible, preferably when ripe and turning towards a reddish colour. These berries may be consumed earlier in spite of the somewhat bitter, acid taste. Indigenous people ate the fruit as a thirst quencher when it was in season. The flower is a yellowish-green colour and being very small it is often overlooked by the casual bushwalker.

Being an adaptable plant, largely because it relies on a host plant, it can tolerate a considerable range of temperatures, soil types and habitat conditions. Distribution is widespread, but not prolific, along the eastern Australian Coastal strip, extending up into the slopes of the Great Dividing Range where suitable habitats exist.

Propagation for both home gardens and for commercial use is possible but careful preparations are necessary. In these situations

it can survive relying on its own root system to gain nutrients from the soil. In ideal conditions the plant may reach up to 2m in height. It may be that the bushwalker could possibly confuse the berries of the Persoonia (Geebung) species as being the

Geebung fruiting periods overlap. Geebung berries have a distinctive small spike at the base and should not be consumed until they turn a purple colour.



creek line, working the northern edge. The crew worked hard, dragging hoses and digging into the peat. This section held,


which was great, however due to the drop in humidity and increasingly strong winds, other sections set on fire late in the afternoon.


