Glenorie Probus Club

Glenorie Probus Club in keeping with its objectives of varying its activities visited Fagan Park where they had morning tea and then explored *Netherby Homestead* and the surrounding buildings which form part of the Museum on the site.

The open-front Blacksmith shed contained anvils, a forge and other blacksmithing paraphernalia which was used in that era. Next to this was a large McDonald Imperial Diesel Roller, Made in Australia. Then a walk around the verandahs of *Netherby Homestead* revealed what a quality building it was; fine brickwork, bullnose corrugated iron roofing of the verandahs and multi-glazed doors; grape vines growing at the verandah edges gave a wonderful, enclosed feeling. In the grounds of the Homestead there are hand-operated pumps atop two wells. The home was constructed in the late 1800's from



bricks hand-made and fired on the property which the family called "Netherby", a large packing shed was also built. The property became the largest orchard in Galston, employing a large workforces. With the outbreak of the Great Depression in the early 1930s, the orchard established on the site systematically closed. The house is now restored and furnished in original style of furniture and furnishings and open on Tuesdays for viewings. An opportunity to see the lifestyle of the 1800's. This was followed by an enjoyable barbecue on the site.

KNIFE SEIZED

Hills Police detected and seized a knife carried by a teenage boy on the afternoon of April 1st, 2026.

This is in part of the police's knife-scanning operation at Castle Hill Metro under the state's new knife-detection laws.

A senior officer has declared Castle Hill Metro a designated area, allowing police to use handheld metal-detecting wands to scan people for knives and other weapons. These powers aim to deter knife-related crime and keep the community safe.

Police say refusing a scan without a reasonable excuse can result in a \$5,500 fine, and carrying a knife in public without lawful reason carries penalties of up to \$11,000 or four years imprisonment.

PURSUIT

Police arrested a 23-year-old woman following a serious incident in Castle Hill on Saturday, 28th March 2026.

Around 10:15 AM, officers attended a domestic-related incident at a Baulkham Hills address. Shortly after, the woman left in a vehicle and failed to stop for police.

A pursuit through Baulkham Hills and Castle Hill followed, with police alleging the driver travelled at excessive speeds and drove recklessly. POLAIR was deployed, and road spikes were used to stop the vehicle.

She was arrested in Castle Hill and taken to Castle Hill Police Station. Testing allegedly returned negative for alcohol but positive for cannabis and cocaine.

The woman was issued a Court Attendance Notice and charged with multiple offences, including police pursuit, driving while suspended, reckless driving, and assault, including assaulting police.

MARKETPLACE THEFT

Police are investigating a theft at Cherrybrook Village Shopping Centre after a man allegedly stole a gold wedding band during a pre-arranged meeting.

Between 3.30 pm and 3.50 pm on Sunday, 12th April, a person met with a prospective buyer in the centre's car park after responding to an online advertisement for the ring, valued at about \$1,000.

During the meeting, the alleged offender asked to inspect the ring before suddenly taking it and running across the car park towards a nearby road.

No injuries were reported.

Police have obtained CCTV from the area and are continuing inquiries. Investigators are urging anyone who was in the area at the time to review any available footage, including CCTV or dashcam vision from the shopping centre car parks, nearby driveways, access roads, and surrounding entrances.

Anyone with information is urged to contact Crime Stoppers.

DRINK DRIVING

At about 11.25 am on 8th April, officers were conducting stationary random breath testing on Annangrove Road near Annangrove Public School when a grey Ford Ranger was directed into the site.

Police alleged the female driver showed signs of alcohol consumption and admitted to drinking. She returned a positive roadside breath test and was arrested before being taken to Castle Hill Police Station for further testing.

A subsequent breath analysis allegedly returned a reading of 0.088, placing her in the mid-range PCA category. Police were told she had consumed alcohol overnight and had not eaten.

Her licence was suspended and she was issued a Court Attendance Notice to appear at Parramatta Local Court in May.

WORKPLACE INCIDENT

A man died following a workplace incident on Monday, 20th April 2026.

At about 11.30 am, emergency services were called to a home on Valencia Street, Dural, after reports of a workplace incident.

NSW Ambulance paramedics treated a 49-year-old man at the scene, however he could not be revived and died at the property.

Police attached to The Hills Police Area Command have been advised the man was delivering glass panes to the premises when several sheets allegedly collapsed onto him.

A crime scene was established and SafeWork NSW has been notified.

A report will be prepared for the Coroner.

FOURTH MAN CHARGED ON BAGHSARIAN'S MURDER

Robbery & Serious Crime Squad detectives investigating the alleged kidnapping and murder of 85-year-old Chris Baghsarian charged a fourth man.

Police were first alerted just after 5am on Friday, 13th February 2026, following reports an elderly man had been taken from his home in North Ryde.

Officers from Ryde Police Area Command attended the scene before State Crime Command's Robbery & Serious Crime Squad launched a coordinated investigation under Strike Force Chabot.

Early inquiries indicate Mr Baghsarian was not the intended target and was taken in a case of mistaken identity.

His remains were found about 8am on Tuesday 24th February 2026 near a golf club in Pitt Town.

Three people have already been charged and remain before the courts.

About 9.25 am on Tuesday, 21st April 2026, detectives arrested a 19-year-old man at Mt Druitt Police Station. He was charged with murder and detain in company with intent to ransom causing actual bodily harm.

He was refused bail and appeared in Mt Druitt Local Court on Wednesday 22nd April 2026.

HORNSBY, KU-RING-GAI VOLLIES RECOGNISED

In late-May, more than 40 NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS) volunteers from across the Hornsby/Ku-ring-gai District were honoured at a medal presentation ceremony at the district's Fire Control Centre in Cowan.

RFS Deputy Commissioner Peter McKechnie AFSM, along with other invited guests, presented 12 National Medals and Clasps, along with 31 Long Service Medals and Clasps.

Together, the awards recognised nearly 900 years of combined service protecting lives and property across Sydney's north and beyond.

Deputy Commissioner McKechnie said the ceremony highlights the remarkable dedication of volunteers who have committed decades to supporting their communities.

"These medals represent an exceptional level of service.

Behind each one is a volunteer who has stepped up during fires, storms and other emergencies to protect their community," he said.

"Many of those being recognised have also assisted in major incidents across NSW, supporting communities during significant fire seasons and natural disasters."



Three volunteers were acknowledged for more than 30 years of service. Mark Rodick from Berowra Brigade received the National Medal 1st Clasp, while Keith Koomen from Dural Brigade and Anthony Bouquet from Hornsby Brigade were each awarded the 30-year Long Service Medal 2nd Clasp.

Deputy Commissioner McKechnie congratulated all recipients and acknowledged the critical role volunteers play across the district.

“The Hornsby/Ku-ring-gai District spans bushland, waterways and urban interface areas, with volunteers responding to hundreds of incidents each year,” he said.

“Their experience, training and commitment help ensure communities are prepared for bush fires, storms and other emergencies.

“I also recognise the families, employers and friends who support our volunteers. Their support makes this level of service possible.”

Rock On, Reggie!

Stepping into Netherby Homestead is like crossing the threshold into history. Each room tells its own story, rich with echoes of the past. Among these, is a particularly interesting room that houses a collection of vintage toys, inviting visitors to imagine the laughter, dreams and adventures of bygone days.



Nestled amongst our collection in the toy room in Netherby, is a most unusual toy from the 1950's, "Reggies Racing Rocker", a bit like a bike but with no steering or brakes and little like a bouncy rocker. It was designed and produced by Christopher Daniels at their Precision Springs factory, Sydney. The idea was that the child's body weight compressed the metal arch which produced a springing action resulting in a forward

propulsion. The rockers were used as a marketing ploy by Channel 7's executive back in the day to advertise their children's television program run by Uncle Reggie (Reg Quartly) It is believed that Reggies Racing Rocker was

named after the children's presenter, Reg Quartly. Daniel's daughters appeared on the TV show riding the rockers their father made, along with Reg.

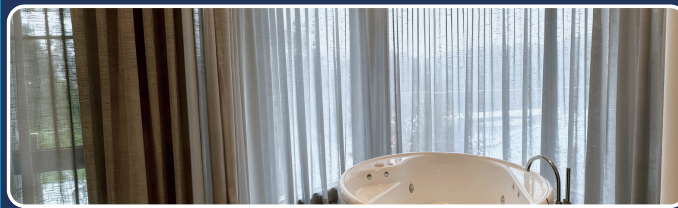
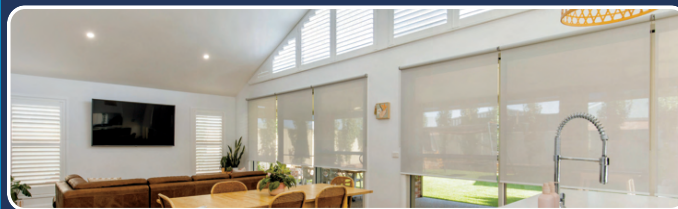

Ray became affectionately known as the "Mayor of Glenorie", a cohesive voice in our "split" LGAs working with State and Federal politicians for the good of our neighbourhood.

As President of GPA for many years liaising with both Councils on countless projects. Notable are footpaths built around the village and arranging the avenue of western reds along Old Northern Road.

Leading the Glenorie Hall Committee, Ray was a driving force behind the Save the Hall action group in 2016. Ray left a lasting legacy in the framed photographic history of the District and the hand-painted stained-glass windows.

As a faithful member of the Glenorie District Church (originally Methodist church).

As President of the Glenorie RSL Subbranch, Ray kept the spirit of ANZAC by running the dawn services at the cenotaph year after year.



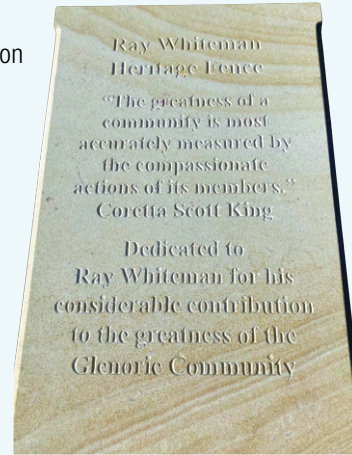

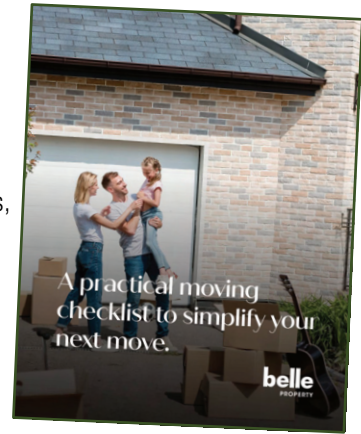

Hello Residents,

The opening of the Crusher Plant Precinct at Hornsby Park on 28th March marked an exciting milestone, with the first stage of the long-awaited park opening to the community. The former quarry has been transformed into a welcoming space featuring scenic lookouts, picnic areas, lawns and walking paths. A little-known fact is that the quarry was compulsorily acquired by Hornsby Shire Council under direction from the state government. This opening is the first step in a staged rollout, with more features to come as the park evolves into a major destination for recreation and community connection.

While Council maintains many local and quieter streets, Old Northern Road, Galston Road and Newline Road are owned and maintained by Transport for NSW. Maintenance on these roads is undertaken on a reactive basis, meaning issues are addressed once they're reported. If you notice potholes or other concerns, please report them directly so they can be scheduled for repair. You can contact Transport for NSW on 131 700 or lodge a report online at transportnsw.info/help-contact.

In March, James Wallace State MP and I held a community listening post in Asquith, where we had the opportunity to speak directly with local residents about the issues that matter most to them. Held at the lovely Corner 5 Café, the listening post created an informal setting for locals to share feedback and raise concerns. Topics discussed included pedestrian safety, traffic conditions and local development, with many residents highlighting the need for improved crossings and safer connections around the Asquith centre. Thank you to those who came along to meet with us.

Recently, the inaugural Mars Wrigley Hornsby Community Heroes Awards (announced March/April 2026) recognized three local volunteers, each receiving a \$5,000 donation for their selected charity. The winners announced were: Pauline Wong (NSW SES Hornsby Unit) was named Emergency Services & Frontline Volunteer Hero, Leisa Liddelow (The Dish of St John's) received the Community Service Hero award, and Ross Anderson (West Pennant Hills Cherrybrook Cricket Club) was honoured as Community Sport Hero for his dedication to community sport.

Apprentice Shortage Puts Local Small Businesses at Risk



Across Berowra, small businesses are facing a perfect storm and nowhere is this clearer than in the growing struggle to attract and retain apprentices.

In conversations with local operators, alongside Jacinta Nampijinpa Price, Shadow Minister for Small Business and Shadow Minister for Skills and Training, it was clear that workforce challenges are now one of the biggest threats to their viability.

At Camerons Nursery, the issue starts even earlier. I was told *"it's not flagged at school, and it's not really thought of as a career pathway."* As fewer young people enter trades, businesses are left competing for a shrinking pool of workers.

Mitchell Burge from Licensed to Chill A/C highlighted just how broken the pipeline has become: *"Last year I contacted 17 schools... only two responded, and only one we went into and took an apprentice from."* For businesses trying to train the next generation, the lack of engagement is both frustrating and unsustainable.

At the same time, the burden on employers continues to grow. Apprentices require supervision, cannot work independently for years, and often don't contribute enough to cover their cost. Training gaps are compounding the problem, with one employer noting *"they're learning more at work than what they are at TAFE."*

Despite this, many business owners feel current government responses are missing the mark, focused on announcements rather than practical, on-the-ground solutions that make it easier to hire, train and retain apprentices.

If we want strong local economies, we must back the small businesses carrying the load by rebuilding the apprenticeship pipeline and making it viable to train the next generation.

In the past year alone, she responded to more than 190 storm incidents, often working through the night, before returning to her day job as a high school mathematics teacher. She also contributed more than 350 hours to training and mentoring new volunteers, helping build a stronger and more capable team.

It was great to see a local business with strong ties to the area giving back in such a meaningful way, and recognising the people who help make Hornsby the community it is today.

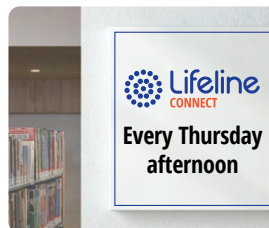

The Future of Galston Road Through the Gorge

Result of work in 2022

Recently contactors for Transport for NSW completed their fifth major works project in Galston Gorge in less than a decade. The road has been closed for road/bridge/embankment work and upgrades for a total of 17 months during that period.

Heritage listed Tunks Creek Bridge work included:

- strengthening Tunks Creek Bridge by replacing the heritage bridge's timber decking
- removing temporary bracing structure installed on the bridge in 2024.



Result of work in 2026

I am certain that Transport for NSW do not fully appreciate the serious interruption to people's lives and local businesses that closing Galston Road through the Gorge has. Particularly with New Line Road still not funded in the State Government's budget for its long-promised upgrade.

Work on slopes, mainly on eastern (Hornsby) side involved:

- major stabilisation of slopes at three locations
- removal of vegetation from the slope face & large loose rocks
- installation of bolts to stabilise slopes & protect the road
- installation drains at the base of the embankment alongside the road

In addition, the question has to be asked, has the work over the past 9 years guaranteed us that the road through Galston Gorge and its bridges, will not suddenly fail like the Great Western Highway has recently? That Highway closed on 5th March 2026 after defects were discovered in the road and there is currently no reopen date available.

After being contacted by various local residents with concerns, I will be requesting Hornsby Council seek information and assurances from Transport for NSW about any risks associated with Galston Road (first opened in 1895) and Berowra Waters Road (first opened in 1902).

Details of work on Galston Road through the Gorge, from 2017 are as follows;

2017, July to August – night work to develop & design full slope & drainage improvements

2020, October to December – upgrade & replace drains as well as stabilize embankments

2022, 28th February to 11th October – emergency work to repair rock falls & landslides that occurred during large & prolong storms

2024, 17th November – 13th December – night work to undertake bridge maintenance on Tunks Creek Bridge

2026, 11th January to 14th March – work on Galston Road & Tunks Creek Bridge

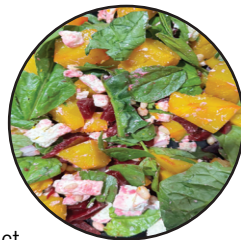

Hidden in the Hills

Geebung

Numerous native plants found in local bushland are edible.

It is said that the Narrow-leaved Geebung (*Persoonia pinifolia*) which is a small to medium shrub of open habit is one that its fruit may be eaten. It can be found in open forest, scrub and woodland habitats and is usually in flower from December to July.

However, it is not recommending that people go out into the bush and sample any of these plants, their fruits or their flowers simply because they look tasty.



It is wise to first carry out some research into which plants are, or are not, actually able to be eaten, as there are a number of similar species that could be mistaken for the edible ones. Unpleasant side effects could result if eaten.

Nevertheless, the fruits of Geebung, were known to be food for the indigenous people who previously lived in local bushland areas.

It is understood that the fruit, in the form of a small berry about 5 to 8 mm in size, must have first ripened, then freshly fallen to the ground and having a dark purplish colour, before being edible.

Another feature of this plant is its bark. The outside layers are flakey and dark brown to black in colour. When the outer layer is lightly scraped, there is revealed underneath a rich red coloured bark.

Indigenous Australians were known to use this bark for medicinal purposes as it reported as possessing healing qualities.

There are two related species, the Broad-leaved Geebung (*Persoonia levis*), flowering July to December and the Pine-leaved Geebung (*Persoonia linearis*), flowering March to July. They also grow nearby to each other in the same area. When in flower, their unmistakable yellow flowers make quite a show when growing along a bush track.

God later gave instruction concerning the altar in the tabernacle. It was the one place where God said He would meet with His people.

There is no altar for us to bring our sacrifices to today. The last blood-stained altar that God recognised was the cross on Calvary’s low hill. It is the only place where God can receive a sinner. Have you ever been there by faith? God will meet you and welcome you if you come in the name of Christ and in faith. Believe that He can be your Saviour. Why not come today?

(a message by the late Rev Ed. Long.)

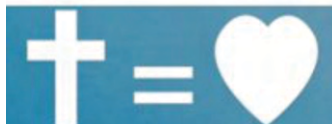

What is Gratitude?

Recently, I've been challenged again to be thankful about the small everyday blessings that are part of life.

The Bible is full of verses that encourage us to give thanks with a grateful heart. That thought sent me on a little 'research project' to discover why gratitude is so important and why God speaks about it so much in the Bible.

I found a very helpful article by a leading gratitude researcher, Dr. Robert Emmons. The following extract summarises his main ideas:

"Gratitude combines two key elements:

- *recognising the good in our lives and
- *understanding that many of these good things come from outside ourselves.

When we practise gratitude regularly, we strengthen our ability to:

- *notice & appreciate everyday positive moments.

*acknowledge the people & circumstances that contribute to our well-being.

*savour experiences instead of rushing past them.

*find meaning in both big achievements and small wins."

So I realised once again that the more we actively are thankful for the good things in our lives - from a refreshing shower, morning cuppa & daily walk, to family & friendships and above all, a relationship with God through Jesus Christ, the more contented we can be in a world that often seems so full of negatives!

Dr. Emmons also outlined the benefits of an attitude of gratitude "rippling through every area of our lives from our relationships to our work and personal well-being."



2 Corinthians 9:15 says, "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift."

What IS this gift? Our church noticeboard sign declares it - "Life forever through Jesus Christ." A relationship with Jesus as Saviour & Lord of your life is the best gift ever - He is worthy of our deep thanks every day.

Hard wired and interconnected alarms are best, however, if not possible, use smoke alarms with in-built 10 year lithium batteries, but avoid older models that require annual



battery replacement. Stay safe and check your smoke alarms today.

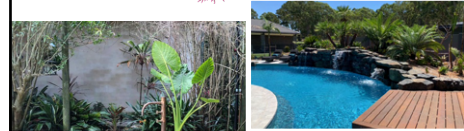

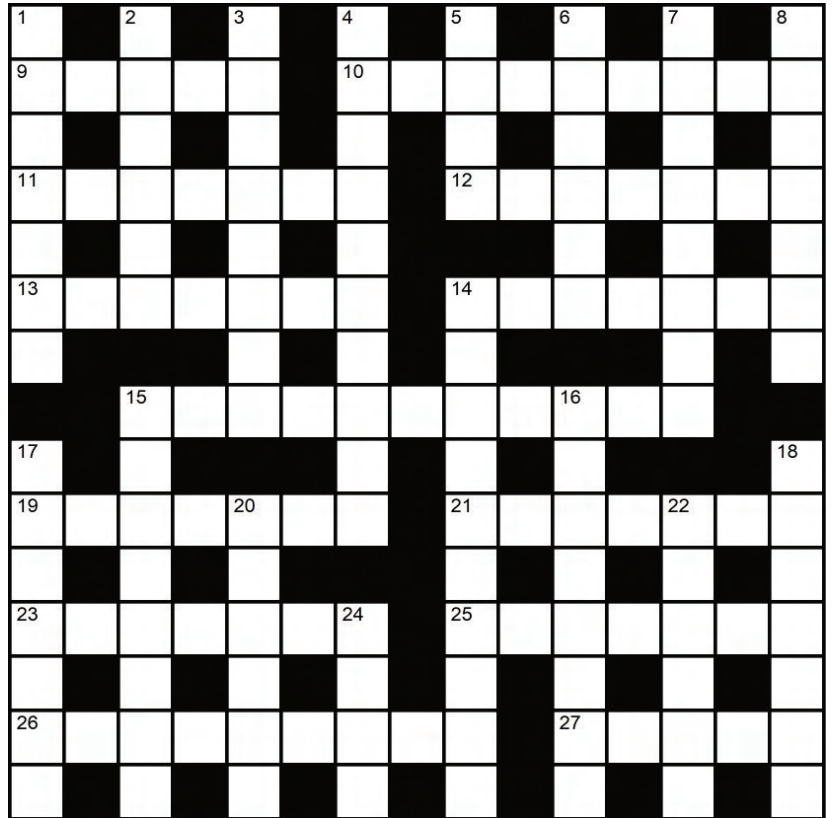
