SUSPICIOUS FIRE ROCKS GALSTON COMMUNITY

Residents of Galston awoke to an unpleasant surprise on Sunday 21st June, discovering a recently opened business in the Galston Village shopping centre ablaze. Local homeowners rushed to extinguish the fire before emergency services arrived on the scene. Neighbouring food premises, Thai Square Cuisine escaped relatively unscathed except for some apparent smoke damage to the front facade.

NSW Police provided the following statement:

About 5.40am on Sunday (21st June 2026), emergency services were called to a business on Galston Road, Galston, following reports of a fire.

Officers attached to Ku-Ring-Gai Police Area Command attended the business and found the fire had been extinguished by residents nearby.

There was minor structural damage to the building with no injuries reported.

A crime scene has been established with an investigation into the cause the fire underway.

Inquiries continue.

NEWS FROM NETHERBY

Winter Camellias at Netherby

Winter has arrived at Netherby and the camellias in the house garden are opening their white, pink and red flowers.

Garden beds surrounding the house feature both roses and camellias, in particular the sun loving camellia sasanquas. On the east side is a rare camellia, known as the Waratah camellia, grown from seedling plants brought to Australia in 1831, grown on by William Macarthur in his propagating nursery at Elizabeth Farm. The deep pink/red flowers resemble the native Waratah.

If anyone knows how our Waratah camellia came to Netherby, we would love to hear your story!

Slightly further afield, visitors who venture down the brick path towards the road will find a treasure trove. The beautifully shaped flowers of Camellia japonicas need shelter from harsh sunlight. Here in the protective shade of big old trees dozens of camellia japonicas are in full flower right now. It's the perfect time to see them.

There's a new section of this garden to visit too. The Friends of Fagan volunteers and Council staff have worked together to clear an overgrown area, and replant with camellias, hydrangeas, and spring bulbs. We have been lucky that we have had some good rain since planting. Council staff have put down a thick mulch, and the young camellias are flowering already.

If you are wondering what will grow well in your garden, and flower in winter,

now's the time to see camellias, small, medium and large, growing in a natural environment. It's good to know just how big your favourites are likely to become.

MORE ARRESTED IN BAGHSARIAN MURDER CASE

Robbery and Serious Crime Squad detectives have charged another two men following an investigation into the alleged kidnapping and murder of Chris Baghsarian.

Just after 5 am on Friday, 13th February 2026, officers from Ryde Police Area Command received a report that an 85-year-old man had been kidnapped from his home in North Ryde.

Local police attended before detectives attached to State Crime Command's Robbery & Serious Crime Squad began a coordinated response to recover the man under Strike Force Chabot.

Early inquiries established that Chris Baghsarian was not the intended target of the kidnapping and had been taken in a case of mistaken identity.

Mr Baghsarian's remains were located about 8 am on Tuesday, 24th February 2026 near a golf club in Pitt Town.

Four people have previously been charged and remain before the courts.

Following further extensive inquiries, about 7.15 am on Tuesday, 16th June 2026 strike force detectives, with assistance of Northwest Metropolitan Operations Support Group, executed a search warrant in Shalvey, where they arrested a 19-year-old man.

A short time later, strike force detectives arrested a 21-year-old man in Silverwater.

Both men were taken to Mt Druitt Police Station, where they were charged with murder and take/detain in company with intent to ransom occasioning actual bodily harm.

The 19-year-old man was also charged with failing to comply with a digital evidence access order direction.

They were refused bail to appear at Mt Druitt Local Court on Wednesday, 17th June 2026.

Strike Force Chabot inquiries are ongoing.

SUSPICIOUS VEHICLE

Police are appealing for information after a suspicious vehicle was seen near a Mid Dural school in the early morning hours of about 2.35 am on Tuesday, 17th June 2026.

Officers from The Hills Police Area Command were patrolling Old Northern Road when they spotted a vehicle parked outside Mid Dural Public School at the intersection of Mid Dural Road.

As police approached, two juvenile males wearing black hoodies, black tracksuit pants and face masks allegedly got into the vehicle before driving away at speed.

The vehicle travelled along Old Northern Road before turning left and was later sighted by another police crew on Castle Hill Road heading towards Pennant Hills Road, where it was lost from view.

Police described the vehicle as a cream-coloured Ford Falcon XF.

Investigators are urging anyone who owns a vehicle matching that description and believes it may have been stolen to contact police.

Residents and businesses along Mid Dural Road, Old Northern Road and Castle Hill Road, as well as in the Galston, Dural, Mid Dural and Castle Hill areas, are also being asked to review CCTV footage recorded from around 2am onwards.

CASTLE HILL MURDER

On Sunday, 14th June, Detectives investigating the death of man at Castle Hill last month have charged a fourth person with murder.

Strike Force Sunbach was formed to investigate the death of a 44-year-old man, who was found critically injured outside a unit complex in Crane Road about 2.40 am on Sunday, 17th May 2026.

The man was treated by NSW Ambulance paramedics at the scene; however, he could not be revived.

Officers attached to The Hills Police Area Command and North West Metropolitan Region, assisted by State Crime Command's Homicide Squad, commenced an investigation.

Since then, detectives have arrested and charged two men, aged 30 and 38, and a 34-year-old woman with murder; they remain before the courts.

About 2.45 am on Sunday, 14th June 2026, officers attached to Kings Cross Police Area Command arrested a 31-year-old man on Forbes Street, Woolloomooloo, on an outstanding warrant for the offence of murder.

He was taken to Kings Cross Police Station and has now been charged with murder.

He's been refused bail to appear at Bail Division Court 7 on Monday, 15th June 2026.

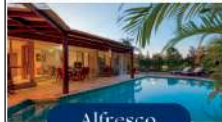

There is not doubt of the increasing interest in our local history. More than 100 were in the audience at the Society's meeting on the 13th June, to hear member, Judy Horton give the story behind those stone cottages, cenotaphs and fences that are a feature of our landscape. They are the work of Joseph Aaron Booth.

Judy's meticulous research took her down many "rabbit holes" as she made connections between this local resident and master mason; his family, his clients, his search for the perfect stone and long gone residents, whose influence reached far beyond our community. A most informative and entertaining afternoon.

The guest speaker for the 11th July meeting will be the ever popular Malcolm Johnston, who will tell the story of The Round Corner Dural. This junction of roads was an important setting off point for the early settlers, with Coach changes, supplies and early settlement making it a place of interest for all local history.

A date for the diary is the **June Roughley Memorial Lecture** on the 8th August. Dr Michael Griffith, will tell of the life and work of Francis Webb, whom Les Murray described as "one of Australia's greatest poets". Webb lived for a time in our community and wrote a quartet of poems set in Galston.

Meetings starting at 2.00pm, are held in the Galston Uniting Church, School Road, Galston. Entry is free with a gold coin for afternoon tea. All welcome.

Warrah is one of those special places in our community, providing a specialist school, housing and support services for children and adults with a range of disabilities.

I was honoured to attend the official opening of two new purpose-built classrooms at Warrah Specialist School on 12th June. This well attended event marked the culmination of renovations at Kaltenbach Cottage to create custom-designed classrooms to support students' sensory regulation and enable small group learning and high staff-to-student ratios.

Investments like these enable Warrah to continue its 60-year vision to forge an exemplary community, way of life and education for people with intellectual disability. The rooms will help staff better meet the multi-faceted needs of their students and have a lasting impact of the entire Warrah community.

Full circle moment

It was particularly special for the many current and past school families, students, teachers and community members present to meet Hannelore, one of Warrah's original founders. In 1965, Hannelore and Karl Kaltenbach established a suite of educational and vocational programs to provide support for adults and children with disabilities on a bushy block in Dural. Today, Warrah continues to create a welcoming space for its community and advocate for their needs.

Stronger together

Part of what makes representing the Hornsby state electorate so meaningful to me is witnessing the impact of what a community of values-driven individuals working together can achieve for the betterment of those around them.

Without the enthusiasm, sacrifice and dedication of those who contributed their time, expertise, finances, in-kind support and at times – weekends, these classrooms simply wouldn't have been built. This service to the community means 14 more students and their families will have access to Warrah – along with the respect, integrity, community and excellence that are its core values.

Community Leaders Come Together for New Line Road Upgrade



I recently brought together community leaders and representatives from local schools, sporting clubs, cultural organisations, churches, and community associations to discuss the long-awaited

widening of New Line Road.

While the organisations represented different parts of our community, the message was remarkably consistent: congestion on New Line Road is worsening and the impacts are being felt by everyone.

School representatives spoke about the challenges families face during peak drop-off and pick-up times. Community groups highlighted the difficulties many seniors experience travelling to activities and events, while sporting organisations described the impact traffic has on members travelling across the region for training and competition and how it restricts their growth potential.

A key concern raised throughout the discussion was the growing pressure being placed on local roads as surrounding areas continue to develop. Participants also highlighted how worsening congestion is creating "rat runs" through residential streets, with motorists increasingly diverting through local neighbourhoods to avoid traffic delays. This is placing additional pressure on roads never intended to carry significant through traffic and raising concerns about safety for local families and pedestrians.

Safety was another recurring theme, with concerns raised about pedestrian access, busy intersections and increasing traffic volumes. Many attendees also noted that congestion now extends well beyond traditional peak periods and affects people throughout the day and on weekends.

The meeting reinforced what local residents have been telling me for years: our community has waited long enough for action. That is why I am continuing to advocate for the widening of New Line Road and encouraging residents to support the community petition calling for this critical project to be prioritised.

Community spirit was on display at the Hello Hornsby Knit-In at Hornsby Library, bringing residents together for creativity, connection and friendship. A highlight was hearing from Marilyn Pryor of **Wrap with Love**, which makes and distributes handmade blankets to people in need across Australia and internationally. The event also showcased the Hornsby Knitting Group, whose volunteers knit and crochet blankets for people experiencing hardship, highlighting the vital role of volunteers in strengthening community support. Residents interested in joining are welcome at Hornsby Library (Fridays 10am–12pm), Pennant Hills Library (Thursdays 10am–12pm) and Berowra Library (Mondays 1.30pm–3.30pm).



At its recent meeting, Council expressed concern about proposed statewide planning reforms, emphasising the importance of local community consultation in planning decisions. Council also endorsed progression of the **Glenorie Village Planning Proposal**. The Glenorie Village Place Plan sets out a long-term vision for sustainable growth while protecting its rural character, promoting greater housing choice, improved services, enhanced public spaces and pedestrian links, and opportunities for local business, ensuring a vibrant and resilient community.

Planning is also progressing for the **Galston Village Plan**, which aims to create a more vibrant, accessible and sustainable centre while retaining its semi-rural character. Improved pedestrian connections and traffic-calming measures will make it safer and easier for older residents and people with disability to move around and enjoy upgraded public spaces and landscaping, while additional parking improvements will support local businesses and future growth.

I recently attended the **Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command Community Safety Precinct Committee meeting** at Hornsby Police Station. The meeting was well attended by various community groups. While 2025–26 crime statistics show no significant overall increase in reported crime, assault, domestic violence and stealing remain areas of concern across some areas of the Shire. Residents are reminded that statistics reflect only reported incidents, making community reporting vital. Police also provided practical safety advice, including the '9 o'clock lock-up' routine and use of sensor lighting and security cameras as deterrents. The NSW Police Marine Area Command also presented on its important work, including search and rescue, missing persons investigations, counter-terrorism operations and combating drug smuggling, alongside its waterways policing role.

The **Brooklyn Public Wharf upgrade** is another welcome development, improving safety, accessibility and functionality while supporting tourism, recreation and local connectivity along the Hawkesbury River, with benefits for residents and visitors.



Our residents are encouraged to stay engaged with local projects and participate in consultations that help shape the future of their neighbourhoods. Community feedback

plays a vital role in guiding Council priorities and ensuring local needs are reflected in planning decisions across the Shire.

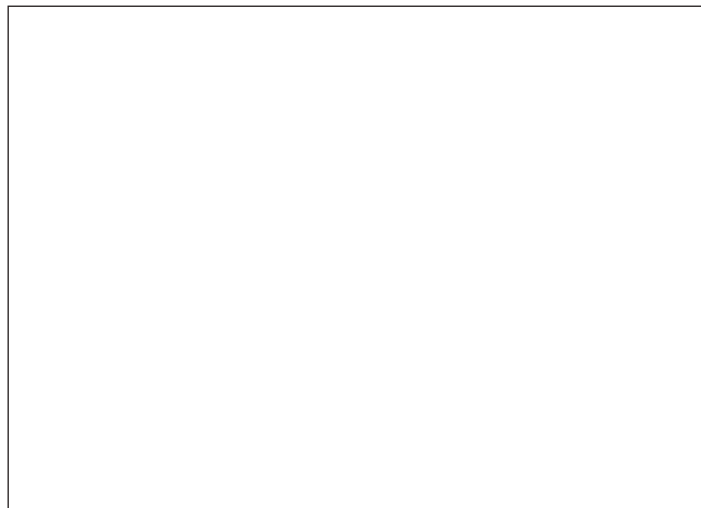

Galston District Garden Club

Our Guest Speaker for the Club's June meeting was our very own Chris Jones. Chris has a garden in Kenthurst which was open to the public last year during our Open Garden Weekend in October. Chris spoke about "Successful Composting" a subject you might fall a sleep in, but no, Chris kept our interest and gave great information to successful composting.

Our Speaker for July will be Rebecca Darly - "Working safely in the garden". Come and join us as a visitor or member to enjoy this talk and a cuppa with members at the end of the night. Our meetings are held on the 2nd Wednesday of the month in the Galston Community Hall, 34 Arcadia Road, Galston at 7.30pm.

Do you know that most items destined for landfill can be transformed into valuable nutrients for the Garden? Cardboard, newspaper, kitchen scraps, rotten fruit and veggies, grass clippings and fallen leaves can all go into the compost bin. What comes out is nutrient-rich, crumbly 'garden gold' that can be used to improve and enrich soil or potting mixes. There are many ways to compost and various systems to suit a space, no matter how big or small.

Gedye compost bin is a simple but effective way to compost. It's large enough to make most household and garden waste.

Tumbler Bin is a raised bin with a crank or similar mechanism to allow you to easily rotate the unit and aerate the mix. Turn regularly to accelerate the composting process.

Compost bays are an ideal solution for those with a large backyard and access to a large amount of garden waste and other materials. A little more physically demanding as it requires regular turning and moving materials from one bay to the next.

Compost bins need a good balance of nitrogen or 'green' waste, carbon or 'brown' waste, air and moisture for the process to be effective. Alternate layers of green and brown materials, top with a layer of cardboard or newspaper and give it a good spray with water. Use a garden fork or compost aerator to fluff the mix weekly: this will help the waste break down faster.

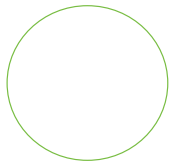
Things to avoid are meat, dairy and bread, weeds, deceased plant material and large quantities of grass clippings.



If your bin smells there are too many wet or green ingredients so add dry or brown matter and aerate to thoroughly turn the pile. If nothing is breaking down the compost may be too dry. Add a handful of pelletised organic matter, give it a good road and mix well. If the compost is matted and clumpy the compost is moist and will benefit from being regularly turned. Add a small amount of dry matter if it's more on the wet side.

If you have never tried making your own compost why not have a go.

Hidden in the Hills

Silky Needle Bush

When venturing along walking tracks in our local bushland it is always a pleasant surprise to come across an unexpected wildflower. One of the more noticeable and abundant varieties during cooler months would be the Silky Needle Bush (*Hakea sericea*).

This attractive spreading, open shrub may grow up to 3m high in favourable conditions. It can be found in both open forest and scrubby heathlands which have sandy or clay soils.

Depending upon its habitat, flowering may commence in June and continue into September.

The narrow, fairly rigid leaves are about 50mm long, right angled to the branch, having a sharp tip at the end. Hence the word "Needle" in its name. The other word in its common name appears to be derived from the silky hairs that are present on new growth.

Delicately formed white flowers are mostly clustered towards the ends of reddish brown branches. These flowers possess a mild scent that can be detected if you are able to get close enough to them without coming in contact with the sharp spiky leaves while doing so.



The fruits of this shrub develop into a rounded and wrinkled, woody hard shell reminiscent of a walnut shell. The matured fruit may remain on the plant for several years before it opens to reveal a flat, winged seed.

As with many species of our native flora there are frequently similar varieties that may be growing in the same area making them difficult to separately identify as their flowers and foliage are somewhat similar. In the case of the Silky Needle Bush, one of these close relatives is known as the Warty Needle Bush (*Hakea propinqua*). Another is the Hairy Needle Bush (*Hakea gibbosa*), both of which may be mistaken for the Silky Needle Bush.

It is possible to propagate these *Hakea* varieties for use in a native home garden. They respond well to tip pruning.

Every minute matters in a cardiac emergency. When someone suffers a sudden cardiac arrest, fast action can make the difference between life and death. That is why community defibrillator programs are such an important part of local safety, especially in areas where ambulance response times may be longer than we would like. The Community Defib Project supporting Arcadia and Galston (Community 2159) was created to help communities install Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) that are accessible to the public 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

This is now an opportunity for our own community to get involved. Over the last 5 years the team has already placed 11 defibs around the local area see map.

A local defib program can only succeed when residents and volunteers come together with a shared purpose: making lifesaving equipment available when and where it is needed most.

It would be all right for others to go to the Feast just then, but not for Him. Sometimes it is hard for us to see others being allowed to do the things we would like to do, but the Lord doesn't allow us to do them. We need to follow what His will is for us personally and not look at what others are doing.

When God's time came, Jesus did go up to the feast at Jerusalem and God used Him and blessed Him there. When God's will and God's time come together, that is the time for us to act and that is when God will bless and use us.

In verse 17 Jesus says, 'If you are really willing to do God's will when He makes it known to you, He will always show that will to you'.

Are you really willing for God's will whatever it may mean? Or do you want to know what it is first of all and then decide if you want to do it or not?

Jesus says, 'If you want God to show his will for your life, first of all tell Him you are willing to do it no matter what it is. Then He will reveal it to you in His own time and way!'

Read Psalm 143:10 and make it your prayer today and always.

Wait for God to speak but don't make Him wait for you.

4. HEALTH IS WEALTH.

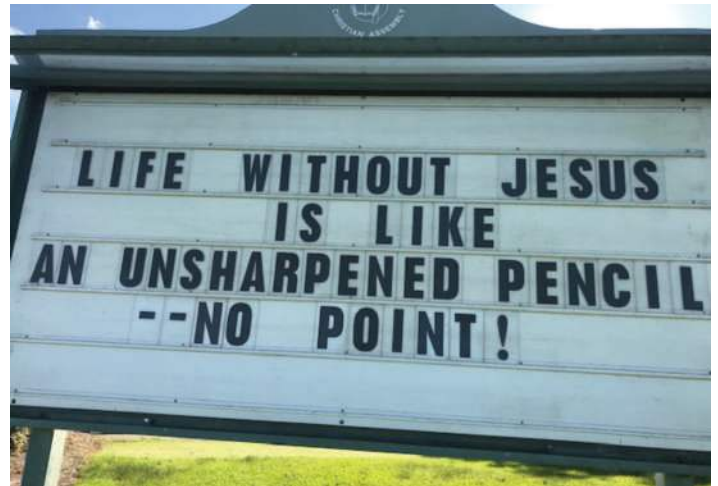
"Beloved, I pray that in every way you may succeed & prosper & be in good health." 3 John:2.

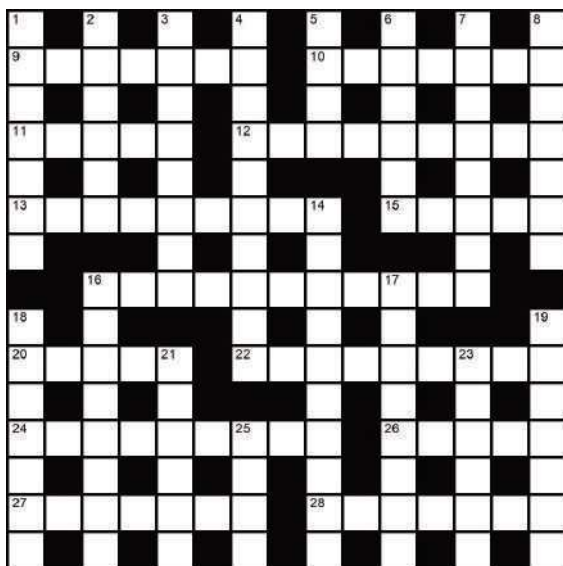
